L.A. County vows to protect ‘dreamers’ from federal government

■ **DACA:** County supervisors file lawsuit challenging President’s decision to rescind DACA.

LOS ANGELES—Moving across multiple fronts, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors voted Tuesday to intensify its support for immigrants in the face of federal efforts to roll back protections on vulnerable populations, including young “dreamers” studying and working under the DACA program.

The Board of Supervisors, acting on a motion by Supervisors Hilda Solis and Sheila Kuehl, voted unanimously to make immigration one of the county’s key priorities. It joins other major issues such as homelessness, child protection, healthcare, justice reform and environmental oversight at the top of the action list for the local government serving the nation’s most populous county.

“As the rhetoric and negative action directed toward immigrants increases at the federal level, the County must become increasingly attentive to the crisis impacting more than one million of our residents,” the motion said. Identifying immigration as a priority will make sure the County’s cross-

departmental focus on legislation, litigation, resources and services “remains concentrated and consistent.”

Supervisors also voted in favor of a motion by Board Chair Mark Ridley-Thomas to support litigation filed by the state of California and/or other states challenging federal government actions to rescind DACA. That vote was 4-1, with Supervisor Kathryn Barger opposed.

In addition, the board approved a motion by Supervisor Solis and Supervisor Janice Hahn to impose a one-year restriction on most official County travel to nine states that threatened legal action to permanently end DACA, formally known as Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals.

Supervisor Barger voted against the motion, with Supervisor Ridley-Thomas abstaining.

Supervisors unanimously directed the County’s Office of Immigrant Affairs to continue its outreach and support for DACA recipients, and to work with the County Counsel to explore immigration relief and residency options for County employees in the DACA program, which the Trump Administration said it will

terminate in six months.

The economic and human stakes are high, the motion said.

“Ending DACA and admonishing recipients from the labor force could cost the United States \$460.3 billion in GDP and decrease Social Security and Medicare contributions by \$24.6 billion over the next decade,” according to the motion.

“Every state in the U.S. will feel the economic harms from ending

DACA. Los Angeles County, a virtual state in its own right, is especially susceptible to these economic harms and the human costs associated with them...Action by Congress in the next six months is critical to the future of this nation’s DACA recipients and the people of Los Angeles County.”

Meet Hugo Miranda, the new executive chef at Sonoma Grill

■ **FEATURE:** Hugo Miranda overcame early adversity to realize his dream of flourishing in culinary arts.

NORWALK – For Sonoma Grill Executive Chef Hugo Miranda, his work in the kitchen is about more than just bringing top quality food to the residents of Norwalk and the guests at DoubleTree. His work is about family.

The 32-year-olds journey to the culinary arts began with a family tragedy.

“Eighth grade, middle school. I went to Hill elementary, and my dad passed at the beginning of the school year,” says Miranda. “At the time, I was 13...it came to a point where my 9th grade year, I really didn’t know what I wanted to do with school.”

The heartbreak that came with the loss of his father knocked Miranda extremely out of focus. He says he wasn’t able to pull himself together until around his sophomore year.

“Honestly I was still kind of broken and sometimes I wouldn’t go to school,” says Miranda. “I had this program with the principal at school that I would be gone for a month and stuff like that. It was pretty much to gather myself because my dad was everything.”

Then during his sophomore year, Miranda signed up for a home economics class.

“I met this wonderful teacher, Mrs. Webb. I’m never going to forget her,” says Miranda. “She signed us up for cooking competitions, liked deviled eggs, chili competitions...that’s when her husband kind of tagged along, and he was an executive chef.”

This ended up being Miranda’s opportunity into the culinary world, as Webb’s husband Jack had connections at the development program for the Long Beach Community College for Culinary Arts.

The next several years saw Miranda “paying his dues,” working

as a butcher “to make a quick buck” (though he admits he didn’t last six months in the position), using scholarships and grants to get an education, and eventually finding himself an internship at the Queen Mary. He eventually was hired as a line chef after his internship.

While Miranda was indeed working hard, a rough environment back at home only accelerated his need to progress in his career.

“Growing up in Downtown Long Beach between 21st Street and Long Beach Boulevard there was a lot of gang related areas around there...even staying at home you’d hear gunshots,” says Miranda. “It came to a point, like, I need to figure out what I want to do with my life.”

He started doing research and worked himself into positions working for high end restaurants and chefs, eventually moving himself from Long Beach to Bellflower to escape “everything that was going on at that time.”

Another big influence, both to establish his career and move away from Long Beach was his 6-year-old daughter.

“She goes to Lindstrom Lion Elementary School in Bellflower,”

says Miranda. “I was looking into that for her, because like me growing up I didn’t have that privilege, meaning packing her lunch, taking her to school; everything I had to do I had to do myself...I’m giving that aspect to my daughter, to my family. I want her to get away from that.”

Then, around seven months ago while commuting to LAX through hours of traffic, Miranda found an opportunity to be closer to home: “a beautiful property in Norwalk that needed an executive chef.”

That “beautiful property” was the Sonoma Grill, part of the DoubleTree by Hilton.

Miranda now leads a team of kitchen and front of house workers, many of them young individuals

themselves, and has full control of the menu – which he chooses to change every three months in an attempt to keep things fresh and seasonal.

He says that he wants the community to “see what we’re doing here.”

“The city of Norwalk, just noticing, for me the culinary world is kind of flat,” says Miranda. “I want to introduce the young-comers, or the city of Norwalk to let them know that there are chefs out here that we do get fresh ingredients, we do make everything in house...my vision here at the Sonoma Grill, I want them to try Italian-Costa Rican fusion cuisine.”

Norwalk man charged in fatal hit-and-run

L.A. Football Weekly Roundup: Rams show potential in season-opener

■ **FOOTBALL:** Rams offense is good for 46 points; Sean McVay to face old team Sunday.

The Los Angeles Rams brought in the Sean McVay era with a bang last weekend defeating the Colts at home, 46-9.

Indianapolis limped into the Coliseum without their star QB Andrew Luck and the Rams capitalized. They made a statement with the decisive victory to kick off the new season.

The Rams' stout defense scored more points than they allowed. The Rams defense scored 16 of their 46 points, including two interceptions that were returned for touchdowns

Jared Goff was sensational in his first NFL win, throwing for over 300 yards and a touchdown. More importantly, he didn't throw an interception in the game. He looked composed in the pocket and was accurate throwing downfield, connecting on 21-of-29 attempts.

Goff looked in midseason form as he utilized his new weapons on the outside and made smart reads. Coach McVay has already earned a reputation of molding young raw talent into formidable QBs and looks like he has already made an impact on his second year QB.

As the season continues, the chemistry between Goff and his new weapons will continue to improve. Sammy Watkins, rookie Cooper Kupp, and Robert Woods will help Tavon Austin stretch defenses, which will inevitably open up some holes in the running game for Todd Gurley to exploit.

Every other team in the NFC West lost last weekend, so the Rams are in first place and look to continue their winning ways this Sunday against McVay's old squad, the Washington Redskins.

McVay is at least partially

responsible for Kirk Cousins' success in Washington. If anyone knows Cousins' weaknesses, it is McVay. He will be scheming with Rams' defensive coordinator Wade Phillips to insure their stingy defense can put them in position to string together their second win of the season.

The Chargers:

The Los Angeles Chargers were dominated through three quarters at Mile High Stadium last Monday night by the Denver Broncos, but in true Philip Rivers fashion, it came down to a tipped fourth quarter field goal.

The Broncos have arguably the best defense in the league, but Rivers is one of the most competitive QBs in the history of the league and loves to show out in inner divisional matchups.

Broncos QB Trevor Siemian suddenly seemed to be constantly under fire in the fourth quarter, and his wideouts well covered.

The Chargers defense forced two late turnovers that led to a couple of quick touchdowns.

Chargers' standout defensive end, Joey Bosa, managed to get better and better penetration as the game wore on, creating havoc in the backfield.

On the other side of the ball, the Chargers' Keenan Allen was ready

to make an impact after being hurt last year and being relatively quiet all game. Allen caught a touchdown making the game interesting late in the fourth.

But the Chargers' hope of a comeback win was deflected by Denver's defensive end, Shelby Harris, when he managed to tip rookie kicker, Younghoe Koo's second attempt to force the game into overtime.

Bronco's first year head coach Vance Joseph attempted to ice Koo by calling a timeout a split-second before Koo booted his first try through the uprights, wiping off the tying three points from the board and forcing the South Korean kicker to make the biggest kick of his life, twice.

This time Harris got a better push and put an end to the Chargers' courageous comeback attempt.

It was a tough loss that will sting for a while and could haunt them later down the road.

The loss puts them in last place in the AFC West as the rest of the division won their respective games.

Next game is Sunday at home against the Miami Dolphins at the StubHub Center in Carson. The Dolphins game against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers was postponed last week due to Hurricane Irma that ripped through the entire Sunshine State.

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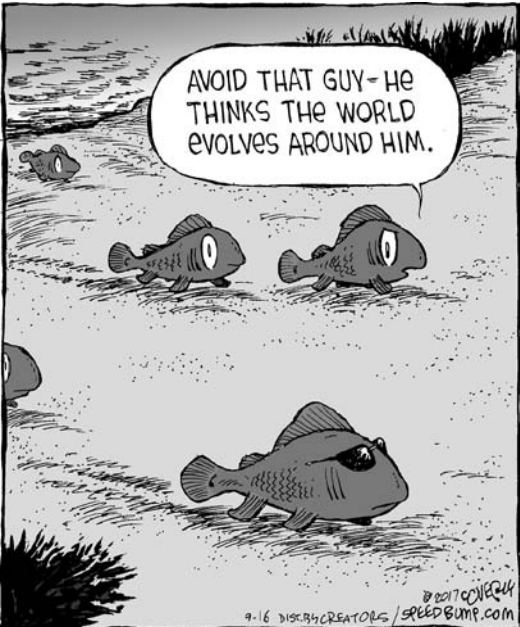
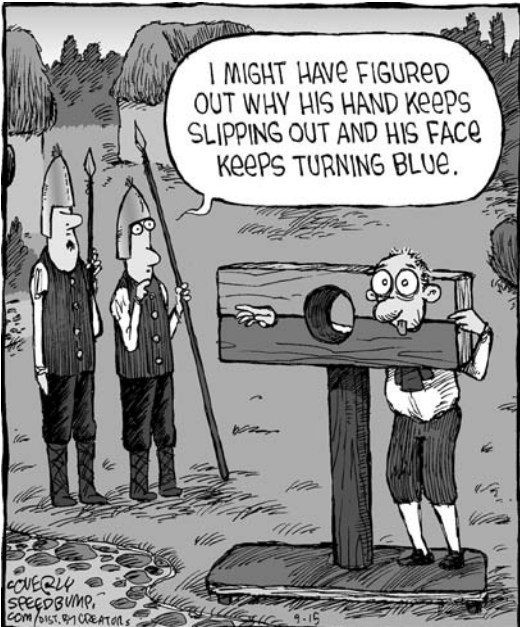

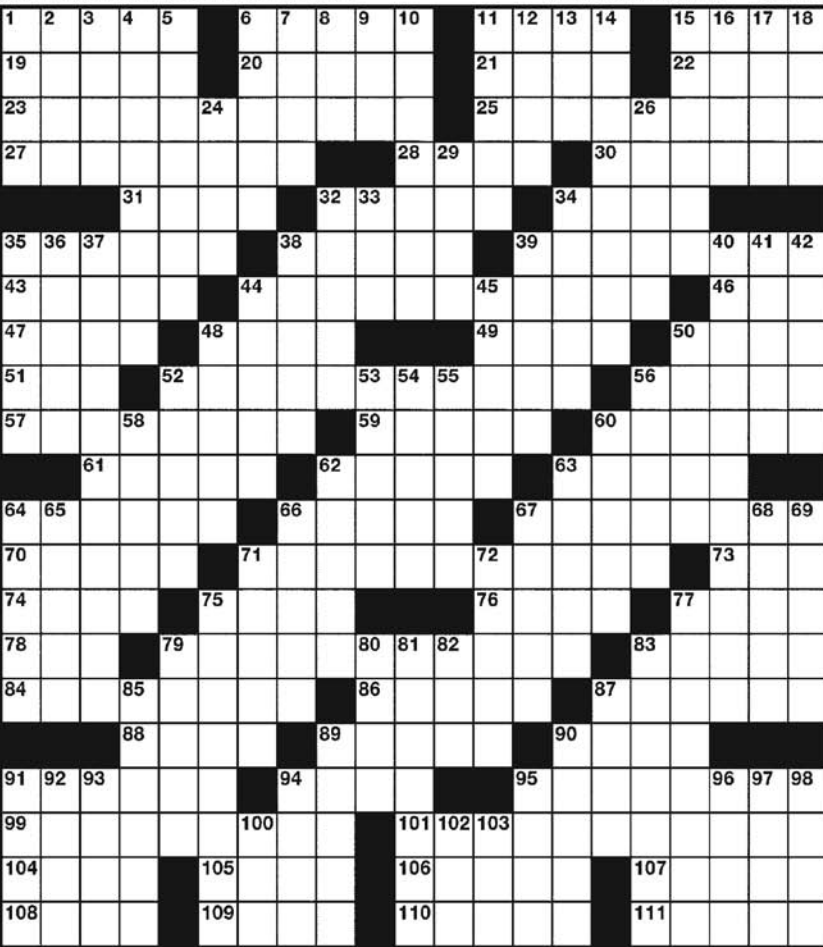

Boxing fans are in for a real treat this weekend as two of the best pound-for-pound boxers are finally set to meet in the T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas after nearly two years of anxious anticipation.

Mexico's Saul "Canelo" Alvarez will face undefeated Gennady "Triple G" Golovkin this Saturday for both the WBA and IBF world middleweight championship belts on HBO pay-per-view.

As of Wednesday, Sportsbook had 'Triple G' favored to win, but many pros and analysts believe that Canelo may be able to pull off the upset.

British boxer Amir Khan said, "I honestly think he beats Triple G. A lot of people underestimate him, I don't know why. I've been in the ring with Canelo. I've never been in the ring with Triple G, but I've been in the ring with Canelo and he's hard to hit."

Khan was knocked out in the same ring by Canelo in 2016 after making the mistake of jumping up two weight classes to face the hard punching middleweight.

If the 27 year-old from Jalisco can beat the undefeated Kazakhstani, Canelo would claim both the WBA and IBF world middleweight championships.

Canelo has the only loss out of the 88 combined fights in their



respective professional careers, which came in 2015 against Floyd "Money" Mayweather.

Unlike the Mayweather McGregor fight, both of these guys have earned the hype behind the "mega-fight" in the ring rather than on the microphone.

Each let their fighting do the talking and refrain from bashing each other on social media. No need for the desperate attempt to create the controversy needed to get people to watch because this is the REAL fight of the year.

"Do I think Triple G can beat

Canelo? Absolutely not," said Mayweather. "I think there's a few guys that can beat Triple G, and Canelo is on the top of the list."

"It should be a great fight because they are two of the best boxers in the game right now," said Adrian Del Rio, a lifelong boxing aficionado. "Canelo is in his prime, but 'Triple G' has that knockout power that is going to test Canelo's chin."

Golovkin has won by knockout in 33 of his 37 victories. The heavy-handed, babyfaced champ is seven years older than Canelo, but has

fought in 14 less professional bouts.

Keys to Victory: Canelo needs to protect his chin and out box Golovkin. Canelo will have to capitalize on his counter punching prowess. Triple G must look to end the fight early.

Bold Predictions: It is Canelo's time to reign supreme. It will go the distance, but Canelo will be crowned in a split decision that features a couple knockdowns and battered, blooded brows on both sides.
