## L.A. County vows to protect 'dreamers' from federal government

■ **DACA:** County supervisors file lawsuit challenging President's decision to rescind DACA.

**LOS ANGELES** – Moving across multiple fronts, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors voted Tuesday to intensify its support for immigrants in the face of federal efforts to roll back protections on vulnerable populations, including young "dreamers" studying and working under the DACA program.

The Board of Supervisors, acting on a motion by Supervisors Hilda Solis and Sheila Kuehl, voted unanimously to make immigration one of the county's key priorities. It joins other major issues such as homelessness, child protection, healthcare, justice reform and environmental oversight at the top of the action list for the local government serving the nation's Thomas abstaining. most populous county.

Supervisors also voted in favor of a motion by Board Chair Mark Ridley-Thomas to support litigation filed by the state of California and/ or other states challenging federal government actions to rescind DACA. That vote was 4-1, with Supervisor Kathryn Barger opposed.

In addition, the board approved a motion by Supervisor Solis and Supervisor Janice Hahn to impose a one-year restriction on most official County travel to nine states that threatened legal action to permanently end DACA, formally known as Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals.

The economic and human stakes are high, the motion said.

"Ending DACA and admonishing recipients from the labor force could cost the United States \$460.3 billion in GDP and decrease Social Security and Medicare contributions by \$24.6 billion over the next decade," according to the motion.

"Every state in the U.S. will feel the economic harms from ending

DACA. Los Angeles County, a virtual state in its own right, is especially susceptible to these economic harms and the human costs associated with them...Action by Congress in the next six months is critical to the future of this nation's DACA recipients and the people of Los Angeles County."

## Meet Hugo Miranda, the new executive chef at Sonoma Grill

**■ FEATURE:** Hugo Miranda overcame early adversity to realize his dream of flourishing in culinary arts.

NORWALK - For Sonoma Grill Executive Chef Hugo Miranda, his work in the kitchen is about more than just bringing top quality food to the residents of Norwalk and the guests at DoubleTree. His work is about family.

The 32-year-olds journey to the culinary arts began with a family

"Eighth grade, middle school. I went to Hill elementary, and my dad passed at the beginning of the school year," says Miranda. "At the time, I was 13...it came to a point where my 9th grade year, I really didn't know what I wanted to do with school."

with the loss of his father knocked Miranda extremely out of focus. He says he wasn't able to pull scholarships and grants to get an himself together until around his sophomore year.

"Honestly I was still kind of broken and sometimes I wouldn't go to school," says Miranda. "I had this program with the principal at school that I would be gone for a month and stuff like that. It need to progress in his career. was pretty much to gather myself because my dad was everything."

Then during his sophomore year, Miranda signed up for a home economics class.

"I met this wonderful teacher, Mrs. Webb. I'm never going to forget her," says Miranda. "She signed us up for cooking competitions, liked deviled eggs, chili competitions...that's when her husband kind of tagged along, and he was an executive chef."

This ended up being Miranda's opportunity into the culinary world, as Webb's husband Jack had connections at the development program for the Long Beach Community College for Culinary from Long Beach was his 6-year-old

The next several years saw Miranda "paying his dues," working

He started doing research and worked himself into positions working for high end restaurants and chefs, eventually moving himself from Long Beach to Bellflower to escape "everything that was going on at that time."



## L.A. Football Weekly Roundup: Rams show potential in season-opener

■ **FOOTBALL:** Rams offense is good for 46 points; Sean McVay to face old team Sunday.

The Los Angeles Rams brought in the Sean McVay era with a bang last weekend defeating the Colts at home, 46-9.

Indianapolis limped into the Coliseum without their star QB Andrew Luck and the Rams capitalized. They made a statement with the decisive victory to kick off the new season.

The Rams' stout defense scored more points than they allowed. The Rams defense scored 16 of their 46 points, including two interceptions that were returned for touchdowns



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## A trip to Oregon for the 2017 total eclipse

#### JOHN DAY, OREGON -

Arriving Sunday in John Day in the mountains of eastern Oregon, I looked at the mass of every kind of at the center of the Total Eclipse zone, one thousand and one mile from our Norwalk home.

After making the decision to alter our travel plans after having a setback in my left eye, and since my sister Eva and I were no strangers to camping and "roughing it," we made plans to move our first day's driving goal about a hundred miles north to the Chico area.

Calls were made to the area to find out what was available, fishing wise. I wanted to know where the salmon were running.

Switching our reservation from a mid size truck to a more full efficient Hyundai Elantra, I checked the drive distance to the community of John Day and came up with 890 miles.

At my best estimate, I allocated \$300 for the gas, with another \$185 for the rental.

The plan was simple. Pick up fire nearby, I thought. the Elantra as early as possible, return to the house; attach our luggage carrier for added capacity, load the car and we'd be on our way to our first scheduled stop, the Grapevine on Interstate 5. It worked out perfectly.

At the rental office, I was offered a Jeep Cougar instead of the unavailable Elantra. I did some quick re-estimates of gas mileage and determined that for the same rental price, the Jeep would be a better solution. It was also a four wheel drive and higher clearance vehicle.

After filling the tank and attaching the luggage rack We loaded up and were on our way.

We were completely selfcontained with camping, cooking and fishing gear. Additionally, we had enough drinking water for several days.

#### NO ROOM AT THE INN

After driving through the Sacramento area, I was starting to feel the effects of the eight hours on the road and traffic.

dinner Stopping somewhere south of our goal of Near the restaurant was a national motel branch that supposedly would leave the light on for us. They did, "The no vacancy" light. We drove on for another fifty miles.

Again, we stopped at the national chain with the big red six outside. Once more, there were no rooms. Then I thought, "the State Park down the road."

The Red Bluff State recreation and campground had closed its gates at 10:00 PM. It was an hour past that time. Our campout on the Sacramento River was not to be.

We refilled the tank and headed east. Lassen was only about sixty miles up a pretty good looking road. It was nearing midnight. We drove on for just about an hour.

We came upon a sign saying, "Scenic turnout ahead." Turning into the small road, I was hoping to pull over and sleep for the night. We slept for a couple hours.

At 4 am, I told Eva that we would be heading out. The entrance to Lassen was about ten or so miles ahead of us.

#### **VOLCANO, SNOW DRIFTS. MOUNTAINS**

Our drive to Lassen Volcanic National Park from our temporary slumber area was about another hour. It would have been sooner, except the road had been washed out from the over 200% of rain and snowfall it received last winter and drove behind an escort vehicle moving at 10 MPH for a good portion. We arrived at the main entrance about 5:00.

It was in the parking lot of the park entrance where we met our first "Eclipse Runners." They were young and from the Bay area.

> Thinking about the drive ahead, I told Eva we should make for the Eclipse zone directly for we wasn't familiar with the route.

> > She agreed.

We hit our first snow drifts at 8,000 feet. I stood atop one and estimated it was 12 to 25 feet high. It was a remnant of the record breaking year of snow in the northern Sierra.

More and more snow greeted us as we climbed to just over 9,000 feet and started our descent toward the Eastern Sierra and eventually connected with route

Stopping for breakfast and a shower at the north Park entrance, I cast my line into the lake we rested by and sighed. The air had a smoky hue to it. There must be a

#### THE ROAD TO JOHN DAY (ALMOST)

Leaving the National Park, we drove in a northeasterly direction with a goal of intersecting with US 395 on the eastern sierra at the intersection in Alturas.

The drive from Lassen had been a few hours of mountain twolane highways which left the pine a couple of cars pulled next to us trees behind and opened to mile after mile of hay farms.

California, I wasn't sure what to expect. The signs said we were never lower than 5,000 feet. Therefore, all of the houses and buildings had sharp steep roofs. That was to let the snow slide easily during the winter months.

Our stop along the way had us viewing slide damage in a gorge which wiped out a road that went along a mighty river just under a huge rock waterfall.

In that scenic turnout, we met our first international eclipse gazers from Germany. > After filling up in Alturas, I checked and saw we had about three hundred miles to cover before we got to John Day.

Many Eclipse chasers had done just that along the route. I said the next tree we see, I'll pull over. Fifty miles later, we came to another T in the road at Riley where the 395 veers to the east and joins US

Things are different in Oregon. had about 450 miles to go and I I noticed the price of gas had gone down to \$2.89 a gallon. I pulled the nozzle and started pumping gas.

> "Hey! In Oregon, you're not allowed to pump your own gas," shouted a woman who came up to me from somewhere.

"Too bad. I thought people were trusted in Oregon," is what I

She didn't laugh at my attempt to be funny. I was tired.

Looking around the store and trading post building, I noticed what looked like a camping area just about fifty yards from the pumps. I asked, "Is there camping

The gas attendant said "Yes."

My next question of course was," how much?"

"Eight dollars."

We were going to be camping in Riley Oregon our second night on the road.

#### THE 60's WERE GOOD TO YOU

No sooner had we pulled near the simple built shelter of plywood, with four people exiting laughing.

We made quick introductions Being our first trip to northern and I soon learned that one of them was from the Bay area like the couple we met in Lassen earlier that day.

I met more Germans, a couple Canadians, a woman from England, many more from too many places to name. All had traveled hundreds and some thousands of miles to witness a two minute event, the total eclipse of the sun.

Looking up again, the moon was covering about two thirds of the sun. I felt a chill. Eva put on a

Silently, I counted down the several minutes left.

I looked up again, now, only a shaving of light emerged from the sun, yet it was still rather light around me.

#### THE TOTAL ECLIPSE OF THE SUN

At 10:22 AM, I removed my protective glasses, not expecting much more than I had seen in those lenses. The orange ball had seemed so small and since I had never looked directly into the sun except when viewing one of our spectacular California beach sunsets, I looked up.

The man on the radio was right. I was in love and yet I cannot explain it. It was the most awesome and beautiful thing I had ever seen. It was Divine-like.

The sun had disappeared, a glowing corona around the pitch black ball was 365 degrees and I stood, staring up at the sky, frozen, along with 100 million of us across the country looking at the same

A lump developed in my throat. My eyes filled with tears.

And like all great short love affairs, then it was over.

#### **EPILOGUE**


