

# For Norwalk's Miguel Rivera, taking the easy road was never an option

► A decision to drive drunk left Miguel Rivera a quadriplegic but today he's working to regain his

NORWALK - Miguel Rivera could have easily died the night of August 15, 2009, but there was too much life left to live, too much work to be done, and hope to be spread, for him to take the easy

Miguel was only 18 years old, just graduated Norwalk High School and just a few days away from beginning his next chapter at UC Santa Barbara when he became a C6 quadriplegic.

Miguel had everything going for him before that fateful Friday night. He was popular, athletic, and had good grades, but one inebriated decision nearly took that all away in an instant.

Miguel made the life altering decision to get behind the wheel while intoxicated and wound up driving off the 605 freeway. His car flipped and crashed into a ditch separating the north and southbound freeway, near the Firestone exit.

Luckily no one else was seriously injured, but Miguel remembers being told by doctors that he would never walk again.

alive, really," explains Miguel.

He was used to being social and active, but his injuries tarnished his spirit and left him immobile and alone.

Miguel credits the love of his family, the team of Paralysis Specialists at A Perfect Step, and the uplifting words of a neighbor, comedian Eric Blake, that inspired him to turn his curse into a blessing by reframing his state of mind.

"When I started going to my rehab and seeing the community of people with similar injuries all working towards recovery I began to feel empowered. Slowly, I started feeling my confident and wasn't ashamed to be seen," explains Miguel. "I wanted to do as much as I could do, however I could do it."

He realized he was going to have to work, just like everybody else. Wake up and grind every day out just like the rest of us.

He understood his new circumstances and obstacles.

There was no time to feel sorry for himself. Now he would have to work a little harder, a little different, but with greater purpose.

culture. We want to normalize positive growth in the community," says Miguel. Last week, Miguel was

invited to share his story with the students at John Glenn High School in Norwalk in efforts to bring awareness to the legitimate dangers of drinking and driving, but most importantly, to remind the future to never give up and to always dream big.

The organization has raised thousands of dollars through fundraisers and private donations. Miguel and his organization has given hundreds of school supplies, including backpacks, to Norwalk's underserved and underprivileged youth.

On July 27 the organization will be hosting its first annual scholarship awards ceremony at the Norwalk Arts & Sports Complex.



# Shared Stories: One breath, one step

One fall morning in 2004 was marked by a life-changing event for Mary Nieraeth – she lost consciousness while driving. Shared Stories is a weekly column featuring articles by participants in a writing class at the Norwalk Senior Center. Bonnie Mansell is the instructor for this free class offered through the Cerritos College Adult Education Program. Curated by Carol Kearns.

"Don, what happened!?" I screamed. I am in my van alone. Don is at work. It is mid-morning on Friday September 10, 2004. My van is sitting off the main street, partly on the sidewalk and lawn right outside my medical group.

My left arm and shoulder are pinned into the smashed-in driver's side door. I have no clue about what just happened. My body is aching all over and I cannot move without feeling

I look down at my left shin and see a big gash. Blood is running down my lower leg and staining my white sock. What's going on? Why are my coupons scattered all over the carpet? Why is milk all over the front seat? When is someone going to help me? All I want to do is drive my van home but I am stuck on the lawn.

I look out the front van window, positioned on an angle towards my medical group office. I see many people staring out the window down at my car. Then, I hear a tapping on my driver's side window and see a police officer, which startles me. He tries to open the door but it is stuck.

I mumble, "No." I am still not sure why he is there or asking me questions.

"Mam, you have been in an accident. I need to ask you some questions." I do not believe him! I remember driving to my children's school to drop off items for the festival that starts tonight.

How did I miss the turn into the school? I have been there hundreds of times and could do this in my sleep. I am feeling stressed about taking care of many tasks before the festival. I just want to get this situation over so I can continue with my day as I had planned it.

The officer takes out his clipboard with an Accident Report form attached. He asks me one question after another which feels like a long interrogation. I feel so drained and tired.

I ask him, "Why can't I drive my van home?" Little did I know the dire condition of my van and the dangerous proximity to the busy intersection and traffic signal just 20 feet ahead in the direction I was heading.

The officer asks me to sign the Accident Report form. He He asks me, "Are you all right? Do you know what tells me he will submit the form to the DMV because I had loss of consciousness while driving.

> Suddenly, a wave of alarming energy moves through my body as I realize that my driver's license will be confiscated! Thoughts of gloom and doom are rushing through my mind. I just want to escape and drive my van home, hoping I have woken up to a nightmare that will vanish.

> The paramedics arrive, pry open my van door, transfer me to a stretcher and into the ambulance. They drive less than one block to the Emergency Room. This day is the beginning of a long and winding medical journey in search of treatment options for seizures.

I learn how to take one breath and one step at a time.

# Pioneer road work nears completion

NORWALK - The longawaited completion of the Pioneer Boulevard median and resurfacing project nudged closer to completion Wednesday as crews were replacing access hole cover assemblies up and down the east side of Pioneer.

City Engineer Bill Zimmerman, in an on-site interview, said that the, "median [final paving] lanestriping will be done within three

The new street signals at Hopland and Ferina Streets is currently backlogged by four months, according to Edison, completion is the improvements Zimmerman added.

The electrical work will include the necessary wiring required for the median watering systems as

Additionally, the primary "cat tracking" (the outline of lanes prior to painting) has been done and is waiting for the city to approve their layout before painting occurs.

## LAPD charged with murder for DUI crash that killed 3 people

WHITTIER - An LAPD officer was arrested last week and charged with causing a traffic collision that killed three people in Whittier last

Edgar Verduzco, 27, was allegedly drunk when he was speeding southbound on the 605 Freeway at 10:15 p.m. on Sept. 26, 2017.

His 2016 Chevrolet Camaro slammed into the back of a 2014 Nissan that was traveling in the carpool lane. The Nissan was propelled into the center-divider wall and burst into flames.


All three occupants of the Nissan were killed: the driver, 52-year-old Maribel Davila; her 60-year-old husband, Mario; and her 19-year-old

After hitting the Nissan, Verduzco's Camaro drifted into the No. 2 lane and struck a 2010 Scion, occupied by a 32-year-old Wilmington woman and her 1-year-old son. They were hospitalized with non-life threatening injuries.

Verduzco was initially arrested and later released pending the completion of an investigation.

Investigators concluded Verduzco was operating his Camaro while under the influence of alcohol and traveling at an excessive speed when he struck Davila's Nissan from behind.

He was arrested April 20 and charged with three counts of murder and vehicular manslaughter, and one count each of driving under the influence causing injury.

## The GOP's hostile language

It's an established American tradition to call people what they wish to be called. That's why after he converted religions, nearly everyone — except a few die-hard bigots — called the heavyweight champion Muhammad Ali instead of Cassius Clay. Marion Morrison chose to become John Wayne. Ilyena Lydia Vasilievna Mironov would later become Dame Helen Mirren, and Caryn Johnson would achieve fame and fortune as Whoopi Goldberg.

But some Republicans, included among them the current GOP president, regularly choose to ignore this national custom by refusing to address or refer to their political adversaries as belonging to — what it has been almost universally called since 1828 — the Democratic Party. Instead, by deliberately dropping the last two letters and ungrammatically substituting an adjective for a noun, some partisans seek to disparage the party of Thomas Jefferson and Andrew Jackson.

Recently, Marc Short, the presidential assistant with the challenging responsibility of managing this White House's relations with the House and the Senate, was interviewed one-on-one on PBS NewsHour by Amna Party" in the platform. Then-Mississippi Gov. and committee Chairman Nawaz. Facing an election year in which the Republican congressional

majority is clearly threatened, Short insisted on referring to the presidencies is," a position endorsed by one Indiana committee member who argued, of Bill Clinton and Barack Obama as "Democrat administrations."

President Trump had tweeted late last year about getting "no Democrat votes" in the Senate for his budget plan and the "Wacky Congresswoman" who was "killing the "Democrat Party" — a term which is harsher to the ear than the more melodic "Democratic" and supposedly robs the Democrats of all popular identification with the appealing virtues of social equality and anti-snobbishness.

Ever since Wisconsin's redbaiting — and, eventually, censured Joseph R. McCarthy popularized the epithet "Democrat Party," conservative partisans have mostly employed it publicly as a sort of secret verbal handshake to prove one's GOP credentials while disparaging the

There have been happy exceptions. In 2008, the year Republicans nominated Arizona Sen. and maverick John McCain, the Party platform committee voted down a proposal to call the opposition the "Democrat Haley Barbour explained, "We probably should use what the actual name

"We should afford them the respect they are entitled and call them by their legal name."

Just as most Irish-Americans reject being called "micks," and Catholics don't like to be referred to as adherents of the "Church of Rome" any more than Jewish Americans appreciate being told they are "of the Hebrew persuasion," members of the Democratic Party do not like to be told they belong to the "Democrat Party."

If the Republicans are sincerely interested in winning in 2020, for what would be only the second time having a majority of the national vote in the last eight presidential elections, they — and their leader, President Donald J. Trump — could begin by calling their fellow Americans across the aisle members of the Democratic Party. Sometimes it's not just how you say it; it really is what you say.

# Fear of the left: The most powerful force in America today

The dominant force in America and many other Western countries today is fear of the left.

This is a result of the fact that the most dynamic religion of the past 100 years has been neither Christianity nor Islam. It has been leftism. Whoever does not recognize this does not understand the contemporary

Leftism — in its incarnations, such as Marxism, communism and socialism; expressed through egalitarianism, environmentalism and feminism; in its denigration of capitalism and Western civilization, especially America and Israel; in its supplanting of Christianity and Judaism; through its influence on Christianity and Judaism; in its celebration of race; and in its replacing of reason with romanticism — has almost completely taken over the news and entertainment media and institutions of education.

There is a largely (though not entirely) nonviolent reign of ideological terror in America. In almost every area of life, people fear antagonizing

Last week, before my speech at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, a man employed by the university (I will not say in what department) walked over to me, looked around to see whether anyone was watching and whispered in my ear, "I'm a conservative."

This happens just about everywhere I speak. People whisper — yes, whisper — that they are conservative or they support Trump. The last time I experienced people looking around to check whether they were seen speaking to me was with dissidents in the Soviet Union.

People call my radio show from all over the country to say that their fellow musicians, nurses, teachers or employees do not know that they are conservative, let alone that they support the president.

I have called contemporary conservatives in America Marranos, the name given during the 15th-century Spanish Inquisition to Jews who hid their Judaism while appearing to be Catholics, lest they be persecuted. I do not compare the consequences: Losing one's friends or employment is not the same as losing one's home or one's life. But otherwise, the label

Because of my widely covered conducting of the Santa Monica Symphony Orchestra at the Walt Disney Concert Hall last summer, members of some of the most prestigious orchestras in America have opened up to me, telling me they are conservative but would never reveal this fact to their fellow musicians. They fear either losing their position or, more likely, being socially ostracized.

Why are so many Democrats shocked when a Republican is elected president? Because, as they themselves say, they "don't know anyone" who voted for the Republican. The primary reason for this is the people in their life who voted for Donald Trump — professional colleagues, and even friends and relatives — are afraid to tell them.

There are two reasons the left labels most conservatives and all Trump supporters "white supremacists," "neo-Nazis" and "racists." One is to defeat conservatives without having to defeat conservative ideas. The other is to instill fear: Speak out and you will suffer the consequences.

Parents call my radio show and ask what they should tell their children at college when they ask whether they should risk receiving a lower grade for divulging their conservative politics in a paper or on an exam.

It is becoming more and more common for leftist mobs to gather in front of a conservative's home, scream epithets at the conservative's family members and vandalize the home. Just last week, the Associated Press reported: "Protesters are targeting the northern Virginia home of the National Rifle Association's top lobbyist ... Chris Cox ... as well as his wife's nearby decorating business. ... Libby Locke, a lawyer for the Cox family, said the vandalism included spraying fake blood and defacing the home with stickers."

Left-wing student mobs routinely take over the offices of university deans, professors and even presidents. The few non-left-wing professors on any campus understand their lives will be made miserable if they speak out. The widely reported case of liberal biology professor Bret Weinstein at Evergreen State College in Washington is directly on point.

In May 2017, professor Weinstein was surrounded by about 50 left-

wing students, who screamed curses at him outside of his classroom for refusing to participate in an event during which white people were asked to leave the campus for a day.

On May 24, 2017, Weinstein tweeted: "the police told me I am not safe on campus. They can not protect me."

Within a few months, left-wing students and the left-wing Evergreen administration made life so miserable for the lifelong liberal professor he left the university.

Since the left began spreading the lie that a white police officer in Ferguson, Missouri, shot a black youth because he, like most police officers, is a racist, police officers in many cities have feared taking proactive measures to prevent violent crime in black neighborhoods. They fear the left-wing mob known as the news media will ruin their reputation

In the recent case of a Philadelphia Starbucks manager who asked two black men to purchase something before giving them the code to the restroom, Starbucks immediately appeared the left-wing mob. The company didn't wait until any facts came out; it simply abandoned the manager and announced it would close every U.S. store one day in May to educate all Starbucks employees about "unconscious bias."

These are only a few examples of the left-wing intimidation that dominates much of American life.

It does so in large measure because liberals are either too afraid to confront the left or they don't understand that the American left, not the American right, is the mortal enemy of liberalism.

# Stopping drivers without a legal justification is unconstitutional

justification and frightens her to the verge of tears, the local press portrays the incident as charming rather than alarming. You know what that means: Prom season is upon us.

The cop-assisted promposal, in which police help a teenager carry out a prank that ends with an invitation to the big dance, has become a familiar springtime ritual, documented in online videos and feel-good newspaper stories. But beneath the warm and fuzzy images of adolescent couples lurks a disturbing willingness to tolerate abuses of power by police officers as long as their motives are pure.

When a cop makes a traffic stop, he is using his special powers as an armed agent of the state to forcibly detain someone. Under the Fourth Amendment, which prohibits "unreasonable searches and seizures," he needs a good reason to use those powers — typically, "reasonable suspicion" of a crime or traffic violation.

There is no promposal exception to the Fourth Amendment. Yet police officers across the country are happy to make traffic stops in the name of young love.

Last month, for instance, Isaac Nusbaum, a student at White Knoll High School in Lexington, South Carolina, enlisted the help of South Congaree Officer Eddie Stone to arrange a "fake traffic stop" for his girlfriend, Candice Derrick. Nusbaum was hiding in Stone's police truck with flowers and a sign that said, "Will you be my partner N crime and go to prom with

The State, a newspaper based in Columbia, South Carolina's capital, covered the incident as a heartwarming human interest story, although

My friend Lauren Krisai, a policy analyst at the Justice Action Network, picked that last example as "this year's most outrageous promposal." Despite the positive press coverage such stunts receive, she says, they "are neither cute nor legal."

Though the cuteness of these prom pranks is in the eye of the beholder, their legality is not. Stopping drivers without a legal justification is unconstitutional, and overlooking that point for the sake of something as frivolous as a prom invitation invites cops to cut corners when the stakes are more serious.

Police are supposed to abide by the Constitution even when doing so makes it harder to convict someone they're convinced is guilty. # Fighting back in the war on the poor

What's the first thing that you think of when you think of Martin Luther King, Jr.? Perhaps the "I have a dream speech"?

That's what we learn about in school. But what was King's dream at the end of his life?

It was to build a massive movement of all poor people, united across lines of division, challenging conditions of poverty, systemic racism, and militarism — which sucks our resources into endless wars. Shortly before he was assassinated, King and many allies launched the first Poor People's

In many ways, the first Poor People's Campaign marked a departure from the broader civil rights movement up until that point.

For King, it was a transformation in his thinking from a focus on the civil rights of African Americans to the human rights shared by all. It meant no longer addressing racism as an isolated issue, but instead recognizing that systemic racism, poverty, and militarism are closely connected. Together they keep people of all races down.

It marked a shift from a period of reform to what he called a period of revolution. These might sound like radical words — and indeed many people around King at the time felt that this new campaign was a bit too

But King and his allies could see that despite the huge victories of the civil rights movement, major societal problems still weren't resolved. They realized that it would take a broad-based movement of all struggling people to change the conditions in our communities.

In many ways, conditions are worse now that they were 50 years ago

According to a new Institute for Policy Studies report, 140 million Americans are poor or low-income. Yet 53 cents of every discretionary tax dollar goes to the military, compared to just 15 cents to fight poverty. Meanwhile, nearly half of all states have passed laws making it harder for poor people and people of color to vote.

People are definitely feeling that in my state of Pennsylvania.

The most recent State of Working PA report finds that the bottom 70 percent of Pennsylvania workers saw their wages decline between 2009 and 2014, during what was termed the so-called "recovery." Pennsylvania is in the top four states for opioid overdoses, and over 3 million people in our state are living below or close to the federal poverty line.

Pundits and politicians like to preach about what we should do to get out of poverty while blaming us for experiencing it. But they haven't explained how it's possible to have an economic recovery without things getting better for our families.

If "the economy" can recover without real people recovering, then whose economy is it really?

What can we do about all this? The first thing we can do is to change our mentality, and drop the shame and stigma that's associated with not being able to make ends meet.

The second thing that we can do is to connect with others. A new Poor People's Campaign is being organized to fight back against the war on the poor today, and it's coming to over 30 states — including mine and maybe yours — this spring. To learn more, check out poorpeoplescampaign.org.



Petty Officer 1st Class Carlos Escalera is a culinary specialist responsible for meal preparation and service.

'The best part of my job is the smile people's faces while eating and after cooking a great meal," said Escalera.

Portland is a San Antonio-class amphibious transport dock ship that embarks, transports, and land elements of a landing force for a variety of expeditionary warfare missions. These ships provide the Navy and Marine

Corps with modern sea-based platforms.

Amphibious transport dock ships support amphibious assault; special operations or expeditionary warfare missions, and can serve as secondary aviation platforms for amphibious ready groups. Because of their inherent capabilities, these ships have been and will continue to be called upon to support humanitarian and other contingency missions on short notice

Escalera has carried lessons learned from his hometown into his military service.

"My hometown taught me hard work ethic and commitment," said Escalera.

Sailors' jobs are highly varied aboard Portland. More than 400 men and women make up the ship's crew, which keeps all parts of the ship running smoothly, from handling weaponry to maintaining the engines. An additional 700 Marines can be embarked. Portland is capable of transporting the Marines and landing them where they are needed via helicopters, vertical takeoff and landing aircraft and landing craft.

Escalera has military ties with family members who have previously served and is honored to carry on the family

"Both my nephew and I serve in the military," said Escalera. "My proudest accomplishment was achieving the rank of first class petty officer. It's the highest rank I wanted to accomplish."

As a member of one of the U.S. Navy's high-tech amphibious assault ships,Escalera abd other Portland sailors are proud to be part of a warfighting team.

"Serving in the military means I can serve for those who can't serve themselves," said Escalera.

Portland, the third Navy ship named to honor both the Oregon seaport and Maine's largest city, will be commissioned on April 21 in its Oregon namesake city. During a commissioning ceremony the warship will be officially placed into active service. The ceremony includes "bringing the ship to life" and other orders rooted in centuries old naval

# Closure of Long Beach hospital would hurt community

LONG BEACH - A report by Los Angeles County's Emergency Medical Services Agency confirms concerns long expressed by Supervisor Janice Hahn and members of the Long Beach and Signal Hill communities that closing Community Medical Center Long Beach would negatively impact local residents' access to emergency medical and psychiatric services, officials announced.

The Impact Evaluation Report was written based on information gathered at a community hearing requested by Supervisor Hahn and held in Long Beach on April 11 on the proposed hospital closure. MemorialCare announced recently that they plan to closure the hospital a full year earlier than previously planned by July 3, 2018.

"This report confirms what we have been worried about since the beginning," said Hahn. "Closing Community Medical Center will hurt Long Beach and Signal Hill residents' access to medical care in emergencies and put a strain on the entire county's emergency services system."

The report details impacts of for the hospital. closing Community Medical Center Long Beach including:

- · Longer travel times to reach emergency services
- · Longer out-of-service times for EMS personnel engaged in patient transports to more distant hospitals resulting in possible delays in emergency services.
- Loss of geographic availability of basic emergency department services for residents of east Long Beach, Signal Hill, and northwest Seal Beach.
- · Longer wait times for patients experiencing non-life-threatening illness or injury in emergency departments of surrounding
  - · Loss of 30 critical care beds.
  - · Loss of 28 psychiatric beds.
- · Relocation of only Sexual Assault Response Team in Long Beach which currently operates out of Community Medical Center Long

Hahn has backed a proposal by Assemblyman Patrick O'Donnell to extend the state deadline for seismic retrofitting of the hospital and give the City of Long Beach more time to find a new operator



Long Beach Community Medical Center is scheduled to close this summer.

# REVIEW: The stakes have never been higher for the Avengers in 'Infinity War'

► The blockbuster juggles an array of Marvel Comics superheroes and manages to advance a storyline 10 years in the making.

We may not have initially known it when we sat down in theaters and were introduced to Tony Stark / Iron Man (Robert Downey Jr.) back in 2008, but this is the moment that we've been slowly building to over the last decade: The Infinity War.

This movie isn't for those who have never seen a Marvel Cinematic Universe (MCU) movie before (and if you haven't, what rock have you been under?). The film isn't built for epic story progression or character development – all of that can be found between Iron Man (2008) and Black Panther (2017).

No, instead Infinity War thrusts you immediately into the chaos that is left in the wake of Thanos (Josh Brolin) and his quest for the Infinity
