# County promises to shut down unlicensed pot stores

WHITTIER - On Tuesday, the LA County Board of incidents involving active Supervisors passed a motion authored by Supervisor Hilda Solis and coauthored by Supervisor Janice Hahn to expand the county's efforts to shut down illegal cannabis is the important response dispensaries operating in unincorporated areas.

Even though all types cannabis-related businesses are banned in the unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County, over 80 businesses are illegally conducting cannabis activities in defiance of the county's ban, authorities said.

"Our current process for shutting down illegal, unlicensed cannabis in dispensaries our unincorporated areas is not working," said Hahn.
"We need a better and more effective strategy that uses every tool at our disposal to shut down illegal dispensaries quickly and permanently."

In a motion passed at Tuesday's Board of Supervisors meeting, Hahn and Solis instructed county staff to report back in 90 days with a comprehensive plan to permanently close unlicensed cannabis operations in unincorporated areas of the county.

The plan may also include outreach to property owners about the potential legal and financial risks of leasing space to an unlicensed business.

"For the past year and a half I have been working closely with many community members from my district to combat illegally operating marijuana businesses," said Solis.

"Before the County considers recommendations for expanding marijuana businesses, we must put into place effective measures to end illegal operators. Today's action is a step forward in this countywide game of 'whack-a-mole' and After a standoff, police arrested a reassuring our communities that LA County will protect our residents, consumers, and our neighborhoods."

Norwalk voted to restrict marijuana dispensaries within city limits but several marijuana stores are located minutes away, including in Bellflower, Paramount and Compton.

According to WeedMaps. com, unincorporated Whittier has nearly a dozen marijuana shops, including several on a stretch of Whittier Boulevard.

Although recreational marijuana is legal to possess in California, local governments still have abilities to regulate their sale and distribution.

# Norwalk school officials train for the worst

NORWALK - Local schools and agencies are staying proactive when it comes to campus and workplace shooters or violent intruders that are occurring with alarming frequency across the nation.

And what they're learning strategy of getting out of harm's way rather than just sheltering in place.

Two dozen representatives from area and out-oftown school districts and government agencies participated in a special certification training session recently hosted by the Norwalk-La Mirada Unified School District.

The two-day event at the district's Huerta School campus featured table-top classroom instruction, best methods for training employees, research active shooters and response scenarios using prop Nerf Blaster guns and replica pistols.

"The goal is awareness and preparation through empowering staff and students with strategies that will protect them wherever they may be," said Elaine Williams, chief of the NLMUSD School Safety Department.

"We want to change the victim mindset of staff and prepare them with the tools to react to a violent intruder In addition to enhanced incident and what to do until

addition to school systems and colleges, includes hospitals, churches, businesses and governments.

The approach, according to Eric Spicer, a Pittsburgh area police officer who led the Norwalk session, is to teach pro-active tactics that call for option-based responses.

"It's a natural reaction," he said about the tendency for people to initially be confused or freeze up. "Our mission is to save lives. We're preparing them to respond better to the situation at hand."

Spicer said the focus is teaching participants better decision-making in highstress situations. That means learning and practicing the evacuation procedures and survival maneuvers that state and federal guidelines now call for, not just the stationary "lock-down" strategies of hiding or sheltering in place.

problem stationery strategies is that certification by ALICE. they can create scenarios where those involved in violent events unwittingly become soft targets or "sitting ducks" for the intruders, he said.

"It was very important for our district to learn new strategies to ensure our students and staff are safe," he said.

The certification will allow the participants to serve as official trainers and implement training sessions for employees others, including community members, in representatives their jurisdictions or places of employment.

# 2 shot dead outside Downey motel

suspect, who was charged with two murders and now faces life in prison.

**DOWNEY** – Two people have been left dead after a shooting occurred at a motel over the weekend.

Police identified Raymond Joseph Penland, 29, as the suspect in two homicides that occurred at Rick's Motel, located at 9415 Firestone Blvd. where police responded to reports of shots fired at around 11:28 a.m. on Saturday.

The two victims were found in the parking lot and were pronounced dead at the scene.

They were later identified as 29-year-old Jaime Garcia Jr and 17-year-old Ivan Garcia, brothers who previously lived in Downey before moving to Diamond Bar.

Authorities say that Penland

and the victims were engaged in some sort of altercation before the shootings occurred, and that the incident did not appear to be a random act.

Penland fled the scene and was later located in Santa Fe Springs, where he had barricaded himself in a warehouse within the 13700 block of Bora Drive.

Downey Police Department, Whittier Police Department, and Los Angeles Sheriff's SWAT were able to take Penland into custody with no injuries shortly before 9 p.m. after a long standoff.

Police also spoke to two people of interest - 25-yearold Catarina Frances Barajas 32-year-old Vanessa Teresa Cardenas -- but both women were later released with no charges filed.

On Tuesday, the L.A. County District Attorney's office charged Penland with two counts of murder, with the allegation that he personally and intentionally fired a handgun which caused great bodily injury and death.

He was scheduled to be

arraigned Tuesday and is being held in jail pending his next court appearance. He faces life in prison if convicted.

Winters, a mother of four, was remembered as "a prolific freelance reporter and wellknown community resource," according to The Capital. After more than a decade writing articles as a freelancer, Winters became a full-time staffer in May 2013.

Her daughter Winters Geimer said her mother's life "was a gift to everyone who knew her and the world will not be the same without her."

#### Gerald Fischman, 61

Gerald Fischman, a 1979 graduate of the University of Maryland's journalism school, had worked at the newspaper for more than 25 years. He wrote editorials that the newspaper described as "scathing, insightful and always exciting."

"He was the guardian against libel, the arbiter of taste and a peculiar and endearing figure in a newsroom full of characters," The Capital wrote. Fischman was married to an opera singer from Mongolia who he had met

#### Rob Hiaasen, 59

Rob Hiaasen, an assistant editor at The Capital since 2010 and had a column published on Sundays, had previously worked at The Baltimore Sun as a features writer.

The Capital writes that Hiaasen celebrated his 33rd wedding anniversary last week. His wife's 58th birthday was also the day of the shooting. The couple had three children together.

#### John McNamara, 56

John McNamara, who went by "Mac," had worked at The Capital for nearly 24 years. His colleagues remember his "flexibility, concise writing and extensive knowledge of regional sports," the newspaper wrote.

He was a University of Maryland alumnus and authored two books on athletics about his alma mater. He found the love of his life while attending the university. The newspaper said they met at a bar after McNamara covered a football game. The couple didn't have children.

#### Rebecca Smith, 34

Rebecca Smith, the youngest of the victims and a new employee at The Capital, was remembered by her boss as a "thoughtful," "kind and considerate" person who made sure the sales office ran smoothly, the newspaper writes.

She lived with her fiance in eastern Baltimore County and actively posted images documenting her social life.

# Remembering the victims of the Capital Gazette

I love being a reporter, but it's desensitized me to the gray and black clouds that occasionally hang not only over our city, but the world in general. The negative is out there, I just don't let it affect me; not outwardly in the public eye, at least.

Take for example the shooting that just occurred over the weekend at Rick's Motel. While the Crime Watch pages frenzied and everybody and their mother tweeted us at The Downey Patriot, Editor Eric Pierce and I had a simple conversation that amounted to one text each:

"Need me to get over there?"

"No, just monitor online."

Working for a small community newspaper you kind of learn the flow of the city: how it breathes, how it moves, its pulse and heartbeat. You learn who to talk to, when, and how. You learn to expect what will be available to you.

It's like my editor told me while we talked about the role of small newspapers in preparation of me writing this article, "It's our job to stay cool when everyone else is panicking.'

As small-town journalists, most of our days aren't too As a result, you're exciting. Boston Globe reporter Maria Cramer said it best when news got to me; to us. she tweeted, "Local newspapers don't win tons of Pulitzers or cover flashy stories. They cover the zoning board, the town planning board, the town budget...'

That's not to say that we don't still get our fair share of strong opinions thrown our way. We get letters telling us why our articles are wrong. Phone calls asking why one argument was addressed over another. My favorites are the individuals who come into the office and hover over our desks, persistently asking us the same questions that we've answered several times already.

This is by no means a complaint at this kind of behavior, as it just comes as part of the territory and it's easy to let it roll off our backs.

But when reports came in last week that someone had opened fire on a local newspaper in Annapolis, Maryland it was hard to not take it personally. When stories broke of Milo Yiannopoulos "trolling" journalists by commenting on how he "couldn't wait for vigilante death squads to gun journalists down on sight," yeah, I took it damn personal.

As a result, you're seeing one of the rare instances where the

The purpose of this article (if you can even consider it an article in its purest form) is not to start a debate on gun control. It's not to call for the head of a shallow-minded political instigator. We want this to be the least political as possible.

That begs the question: What is this about then? It's something that I've sat at my desk wondering about for the last several minutes.

This is the product of mourning.

Small-paper reporters nationwide are mourning the loss of five similar, like-minded individuals to ourselves. We may not have known them before the tragedy, but our passion to keep our residents informed is the same; our motivations ingrained in pride and loyalty to our cities.

I hope to God that The Patriot is never the centerpiece to a story like that of the Capital Gazette. This week, say a prayer for Annapolis, Maryland.

# The values underlying Independence Day

The Declaration of Independence — which was signed on July 3, 1776, for public release on July 4 — was Thomas Jefferson's masterpiece. Jefferson himself wrote much about the declaration in the 50 years that followed.

Not the least of what he wrote offered his view that the declaration and the values that it articulated were truly radical meaning they reflected 180-degree changes at the very core of societal attitudes in America. The idea that farmers and merchants and lawyers could secede from a kingdom and fight and win a war against the king's army was the end result of the multigenerational movement that was articulated in the declaration.

The two central values of the declaration are the origins of human liberty and the legitimacy of popular government.

When Jefferson wrote that we are endowed by our Creator with certain inalienable rights, he was referring to the natural law. The natural law teaches that right and wrong can be discerned and truth discovered by the exercise of human reason, independent of any commands from the government. The natural law also teaches that our rights come from our humanity — not from the government — and our humanity is a gift from our Creator.

Even those who question or reject the existence of the Creator was Jefferson himself among them? — can embrace natural rights, because they can accept that our exercise of human reason leads us all to make similar claims. These claims — free speech, free association, free exercise or non-exercise of religion, selfdefense, privacy, and fairness, to name a few — are rights that we all exercise without giving a second thought to the fact that they are natural and come from within us.

The view of the individual as the repository of natural rights was not accepted by any governments in 1776. In fact, all rejected it and used violence to suppress it. To the minds of those in government in the mid-18th century, the king was divine and could do no wrong, and parliament existed not as the people's representatives but to help the king raise money and to give him a read on the pulse of landowners and nobility.

this type of ancient regime. Unlike the French, who destroyed their monarchy, the American colonists seceded from theirs and they did so embracing natural rights. Regrettably, they did not recognize natural rights for African slaves or for women. We all know and profoundly lament the sorry history of those errors.

natural rights by virtue of one's humanity is not just an cademic argument. It has real-life consequences, which Jefferson recognized. Those consequences are implicated when government seeks to curtail rights for what it claims is the protection of another's individual rights, the common good or the good of the government itself.

Jefferson recognized that you can consent to the curtailment of your rights but you cannot consent to the curtailment of mine. To Jefferson, government can take away your rights without your self-government. consent only if you have violated someone else's rights.

Surrendering rights is also implicated in the second radical idea that underscores the Declaration of Independence. It is the concept that no government is valid unless it enjoys the consent of the governed. This, too, was unheard of in 1776, because British kings did not claim consent of the governed as the basis for legitimacy.

Yet consent of the governed is perfectly consistent with natural law. Under natural law, what is yours is yours and what is mine is mine. If I attempt to take your land or car or cellphone, you can stop me, either directly or through the government we have both consented to. If one of us has not consented to the agent of the person whose rights are being violated — just as it does for bank depositors when it captures a bank robber.

This idea of consent of the governed was a serious issue in the days and years following July 4, 1776, because about one-third of the adults living in the United States in the last quarter of the 18th century remained loyal to the king of England after the

The idea that each human being possesses inherent government that took the British government's place. The new government was thrust upon them without their consent.

> The last letter Jefferson wrote was to his enemy-turnedfriend John Adams, in anticipation of the 50th anniversary of the declaration — a day on which both Jefferson and Adams would die. In that letter, Jefferson argued that the greatest achievement of the declaration was its arousing men to burst free from the chains imposed upon them by superstition and myth by bringing about a recognition of their individual rights and an embrace of

> In Jefferson's day, the voters knew all that the government did, and it knew nothing about them. Today government operates largely in secrecy, and it knows our every move and captures our every communication.

> In Jefferson's day, the government needed the people's permission to tax and regulate them. Today the people need the government's permission to do nearly everything.

# Abolishing ICE isn't radical, it's rational

As someone who was born and raised in the border state of New Jefferson and his colleagues had no difficulty breaking from Mexico, I'm very familiar with political speak about immigrants and the border, especially when it comes to talking about safety.

> After 9/11, concerns about safety led to the passing of the Homeland Security Act, which created a new cabinet department as well as a new law enforcement agency: Immigration and Customs Enforcement, or ICE. ICE was given a never-beforeseen level of criminal and civil authority — in theory, to keep Americans safe.

> It's now the largest investigative branch of the Homeland Security department. Unlike other law enforcement agencies like the FBI or DEA, ICE doesn't answer to the Department of Justice, which for decades has at least paid lip service to due process.

> Far from being a law enforcement agency, ICE has become the closest thing we have to a lawless organization.

> Rather than keeping Americans safe, the organization has become a menace, wasting taxpayer money while doing tremendous violence to communities that pose no threat. From separating families to having 3-year-olds stand trial for deportation, and from staking out churches to stealing immigrants' identities to open up fraudulent credit cards, ICE embodies cruelty.

> More worrying still, people are dying in ICE custody at alarming rates.

> In May, a transgender woman from Honduras named Roxsana Hernandez died in ICE custody in New Mexico. Roxsana came to the United States seeking asylum from persecution and violence in her home country.

Rather than being treated with the dignity and respect befitting all humans, and particularly those seeking asylum, she was detained by ICE and held in a freezing cold cell with the lights turned on 24 hours a day. This approach to detention is so common it has a name — the icebox, because the cells feel as cold **Fizz Perkal is a Next Leader at the Institute for Policy Studies.** as a freezer.

As a queer, gender non-conforming New Mexican, this hit close to home for me. Not only did Roxsana come to this country because she wanted the safety to live her life as her authentic self, but she died in Albuquerque, my hometown. She died a terrifying and lonely death due to complications of pneumonia, likely caused by the frigid conditions of her detention.

I have to say: Her death certainly doesn't make me any safer.

In another devastating case, Pablo Villavicencio, an undocumented man originally from Ecuador, was detained by ICE while he was delivering pizza to a military base in New York City. Pablo lives in New York with his wife and young children, all of whom are U.S. citizens. His detention and possible deportation certainly won't make me, or anyone else, any safer.


ICE was created to protect the U.S. from terrorism. But it seems the biggest threats they can identify are refugees and workers supporting their families. If you ask me, ICE is the one terrorizing people.

Unfortunately, ICE has become even more aggressive in the past 18 months — and not just against people from Mexico and Central America. The number of Haitians deported rose from 300 in 2016 to 5,500 in 2017 — as if almost the entire city of Aspen, Colorado were deported. The rate of deportation for people from Somalia nearly doubled during the same time.

To what end?

At this point, ICE's targeting of families and non-threatening individuals makes it clear that it's beyond reform. Immigrants aren't threats to the nation's security — they're people, just like you and me, who are trying to make the best of their circumstances.

We need to find better ways to make sure our communities are safe without relying on a lawless, violent organization. It can't be that hard — we did it for centuries before the Homeland Security Act. ICE must be abolished.


