Officials provide glimpse into Norwalk's development future

► **DEVELOPMENT:** Norwalk officials have identified 10 areas that will be the focus of redevelopment.

NORWALK - An economic development forum held at City Hall on Tuesday, giving residents and business representatives a peek into what projects lie ahead in Norwalk's near future.

The forum was held in the U.S. Constitution room to around 30 attendees, and was moderated by City Manager Jesus Gomez and Community Development Director Michael Garcia.

Gomez opened up by establishing the three goals that City Council has given him in terms of city development.

"One is economic development, infrastructure which is really streets, and third is public safety," said Gomez.

"Today is just an overall overview. What the City Council will do is they will prioritize for us, for me, some of the economic nodes...that have been selected, and they'll prioritize those 10."

According to Gomez, the city will likely focus working on the top three or four developments, however he later added that some projects may also develop organically.

"It does take resources in terms of staff time, it takes resources financially because we have to develop either specific plans or a more detailed plan in those areas with more civic engagement, more community engagement to be able to deliver whatever development is going to be proposed.'

In no particular order, the 10 potential areas to be developed include:

- Professional Office **Development Center**
- California Youth Authority
- Tank Farm
- Front Street

We do see that a lot of activity could occur within the civic center area, just given the available land and interest from property owners that are in that area" said Garcia.

As well as with the California Youth Authority, Garcia added that "we want to control our own destiny" with the tank farm.

Garcia described the Alondra and Pioneer area as "exciting.'

"There's a lot of property there," said Garcia. "The people that own that property...we're trying to get them to expand their vision.

"They were going to come California Youth in with housing. [We said] 'We

He added that there is a desire to focus on Firestone Boulevard.

Garcia said that each potential development area was analyzed in terms of strengths, weaknesses, potential opportunities, and threats.

Shared Stories: The Number 9 Car

Not everyone knows that Los Angeles used to have a very effective mass transit system up until 1963. The Los Angeles Railway System left a big impression on Anthony Caldwell as a young boy. I grew up in Los Angeles with its trolley car system. It was known as the Los Angeles Railway System. Little railroad-type, electricpowered rail cars went all over Los Angeles.

About four years ago, I was browsing through one of Manhattan's last remaining independent bookstores, when my cellphone rang. I didn't recognize the incoming telephone number, with its 202 area code, but I assumed it was a Fox News colleague from our Washington

When I answered the phone, a somewhat familiar but somber voice said: "Judge Napolitano, your reward for what you did today will not come from your colleagues or viewers or even on earth but in heaven."

What had I done to deserve this?

Earlier that day, Dianne Feinstein, a Democrat from California who was then the chair of the Senate Intelligence Committee, had defied her own committee members, congressional leadership from both houses of Congress and from both political parties, officials of the CIA, and even the Obama White House when she released on the floor of the Senate a 6,000-plus-page report detailing the use of torture by CIA officials in the George W. Bush administration — all

She actually made the report public while physically standing on the floor of the Senate, where her speech is absolutely protected from government retaliation by the Speech and Debate Clause of the

That clause recognizes and protects for members of Congress their complete freedom of speech while on the floor of the House or Senate, while doing congressional work and while traveling to Capitol Hill. Thus, even though she revealed top-secret materials in the report — which, if you or I had revealed them or if she had revealed them in Los Angeles rather than in Washington, would have constituted the crime of espionage — she was immune from all

and friend Shepard Smith and I spent about 30 minutes on-air that afternoon on his Fox News Channel show discussing the criminal behavior Feinstein had revealed, the constitutional protections she, as a member of the Senate, enjoyed, and the political firestorm she

As a believer in the rule of law and the bodily integrity of all people, I was full of praise for what Feinstein had just done. When the government breaks the laws it has sworn to uphold, Shep Smith and I argued, the people have a right to know about it.

But many of Sen. Feinstein's colleagues did not see it that way. Many of those who never endured torture and those believing that the end justifies the means accepted the myth that torture works that the victim tells the truth; and in their view, obtaining the truth is worth the cost in lawbreaking and body-breaking.

Only one Republican senator publicly supported what Feinstein had just done. He was my caller that afternoon in the bookstore, John

I thought of his call and our many ensuing conversations when I learned of his death this past weekend, a few days shy of his 82nd

McCain and I had hundreds of conversations. He knew that I knew that he was a bellicose warmonger and an uncritical supporter of unlimited military spending; and he was often indifferent to the consequences of those views.

But he was also the victim of prolonged and horrific torture during the Vietnam War, which he could have avoided. He told me many times that torture so distorts the mind that the victim's consequent speech is utterly unworthy of belief.

He had become the leading congressional critic of torture, the Andrew Napolitano is a senior judicial analyst for Fox News. prime congressional mover of making it all unlawful — the Bush Department of Justice notwithstanding, it already was unlawful at the In response to the Feinstein revelations, my Fox News colleague time Bush ordered it — and one of the few Americans anywhere who

could speak on this detestable subject from the personal experiences of a victim.

Platitudes aside, the essence of the telephone conversation we had that day was that Bush had committed war crimes; that torture is absolutely prohibited by the Constitution, several treaties to which the United States is a party and numerous federal statutes; and that Sen. Feinstein had performed a positive public good by revealing it.

It was Sen. McCain's view that even if he was powerless to prevent government lawbreaking, it is better for the American people to know painful truths than to remain in the dark.

Shortly after our phone conversation, McCain went to the floor of the Senate and delivered one of his classic tirades against torture. In it, he attacked President Bush, who ordered and authorized it, and President Barack Obama, who covered it up.

This week, those two former presidents. firmly in McCain's crosshairs four years ago, are each delivering a eulogy at McCain's funeral — willingly, dutifully and at his request.

The John McCain I knew discussed only torture, the right to life, and immigration with me — perhaps because he knew we disagreed on nearly all other matters. But this tough old Arizona bird, this lifelong warrior, this unorthodox maverick who really was neither a Republican nor a Democrat, knew how to keep friends and monitor

He was a multidimensional man in a secular era, and he was not happy about America at the end of his days.

Yet in this age of few heroes, and on topics that intimately touch the human heart and soul, he was the genuine article.

The left's long war on conservative free speech

In the competition of ideas, you can't win the game if you're not on the playing field.

That's why Silicon Valley bigwigs' stubborn refusal to put business above their own personal partisan biases doesn't just rankle. It reeks. Equal access to social media is not just about sharing food pics, pet videos, makeup tutorials and travelogues. It's about ensuring the ability to disseminate and distribute political speech on the world's

Although I started in the metro newspaper industry in 1992, my years as an independent conservative blogger and internet entrepreneur have been the most journalistically enriching. I launched my first website in 1999, my namesake blog in 2004, my first group blog and video content platform HotAir.com and my YouTube channel in 2006 (where I broadcast reports from Iraq), my Twitter account in 2008, my second group website Twitchy.com in 2012, and my documentary-style web series, "Michelle Malkin Investigates," for CRTV.com in 2016.

I don't just preach the First Amendment. I practice it for a living.

Early adopter status was important for us non-leftists who saw the disruptive influence and narrative-setting opportunities that new media and social media offered. I was ridiculed by mainstream media colleagues for wasting time on the internet, derided as "just a blogger" (which I proudly turned into a hashtag), and mocked for starting a Twitter aggregation business long before corporate media outlets copied the idea.

Over the years, I've joined other independent conservative social

media users in exposing coordinated "flag-spamming" campaigns against right-wing personalities and causes. Pro-life, pro-border security and anti-jihadist journalists and activists have all been selectively gagged on Google/YouTube, Facebook and Twitter. I've worked with a few good-faith employees at these companies who tried to treat conservatives fairly. But in the unhinged era of the anti-Trump resistance, intermittent purges, "accidental" suspensions and suspicious deletions of conservative content have spiked to a level of systemic censorship.

Twelve years after its founding, Twitter has abandoned its corporate motto of "Defend and respect the user's voice." Twitter co-founder Jack Dorsey, set to testify before Congress in two weeks, admitted his company's left-wing bias and dismissed revelations from his own engineers, who confided to undercover Project Veritas journalists that they were creating algorithms to "ban a way of talking," "down rank" users based on politics and employ "machine learning" to create special triggers and keywords — "the majority of (which) are for Republicans.

In April, the brilliant anti-leftist street artist Sabo disappeared from Twitter without warning or explanation.

My friend and CRTV.com colleague Gavin McInnes was silenced on Twitter recently for absolutely no good reason and remains suspended.

Prager University, with whom I collaborated on a new video about immigration and border security, has been suppressed on Facebook and it's clear it was no accidental glitch. One of the videos yanked was piece called "Make Men Masculine Again."

Author and philosopher Stefan Molyneux, whose video podcasts have 250 million views, was also silenced by speech suppressors on YouTube, which arbitrarily issued community guideline violation strikes against him for videos including an interview with British journalist Katie Hopkins and a discussion on the Death of White

My friend and conservative social media guru Nick Short, of the Security Studies Group, was one of thousands of conservative activists who discovered they've been throttled by Twitter's use of a 'complex and opaque Quality Filter algorithm that has the effect of disproportionately restricting the voices of conservatives under the guise of limiting harmful or abusive users.'

Same as it ever was. For three decades, the far-left has waged continuous war on conservative free speech in every available space.

They have organized militant boycott campaigns against the right's most effective advocates on talk radio — including Rush Limbaugh, Sean Hannity, Michael Savage and Laura Ingraham. They pressured advertisers to withdraw from Dr. Laura Schlessinger's national TV show when she was at the height of her popularity and

Democrats have exploited national tragedies from the Oklahoma City bombing to the Tucson massacre to try to regulate lawful, peaceful conservative free speech and enact an Orwellian Fairness Doctrine under the guise of decency, diversity and equality.

The "new" war on conservatives on the internet is the same old attempt by desperate liberals to shut down their competitors in the marketplace of ideas. If you can't beat 'em, deplatform 'em. That's the progressive way.

The right-wing solution is not to lie down, but to win over more converts, find new ways to disseminate our news and views, and turn up the heat. I've been doing it for 25-plus years and have no intention conservative millennial vlogger and CRTV.com host Allie Stuckey's on cooling off, giving in or shutting up. Speak for those who have no voice. Support those speaking for you.

> And one last action item: Remember this in November. The ballot box is one of the mightiest platforms we have. Use it or lose it.



Trump's disdain for the mainstream media is personal

Whenever the president complains about "Fake News," always capitalized and often punctuated with exclamation points, rest assured that he doesn't mean the actual sources of fraudulent information that infest the internet and haunt American politics.

No, Donald Trump's definition of "fake" has nothing to do with factuality or responsibility in media. It merely means news he doesn't like, usually truthful reporting about him, his family, his administration or his cronies produced by credible newspapers and

It's easy to dismiss these outbursts as simply more of the daily spew of falsehoods on his Twitter feed. And it's comforting to pretend that they don't matter. But Trump's conscious campaign to discredit honest journalism is dangerous to our democratic culture. Does that sound lofty and academic? It isn't. The denigration of real reporting and the elevation of fraudulent conspiracies have real consequences in the everyday life of Americans.

Indeed, the most compelling example right now is the sexual abuse of children - a major news story that also exists as a phony right-wing meme. It is instructive to compare and contrast how the fake-news outlets praised by Trump and the real news organizations excoriated by him are dealing with that most unspeakable of crimes.

Websites and Twitter personas that back Trump — and are supported in turn by him and his family — have spent the past few years fabricating and promoting a nasty fantasy that they call "Pizzagate," which claims that Democratic elites including Hillary Clinton, George Soros, former Clinton campaign manager John Podesta and a variety of Washington, D.C., and Hollywood personalities are guilty of child sex trafficking or worse.

Thanks to conspiracy broadcaster Alex Jones, a Trump favorite who spread this toxic mythology without a scrap of evidence, and his imitators, Pizzagate reached enough gullible minds that one man traveled to Comet Ping Pong pizzeria in Washington, where he believed child sex slaves were being held, and discharged a rifle. Nobody was harmed except that pitiful dupe, who is now in prison.

Fearing legal action, the cowardly Jones scuttled away from Pizzagate after the 2016 election. But he and kindred voices on the far right continue to spread fake stories about pedophilia, weaponizing a smear that distracts from real news and mesmerizes an idiot constituency. It is a parody of journalism and as foul a misuse of the

First Amendment as we have seen in decades.

Notwithstanding that torrent of politically motivated lies, child sexual abuse exists in our society, perpetrated over many years by such trusted figures as priests, athletic coaches and even doctors. Those heinous crimes have been exposed not by hucksters and con artists on Infowars or Fox News but by established news outlets that spend thousands of hours and hundreds of thousands of dollars to find the truth, and prove it.

Without the dedicated and courageous journalists who reported out the crimes of a former House Speaker, an Ohio State wrestling coach, an Olympic gymnastics physician and hundreds of Catholic clergymen, nobody would ever have held those monsters accountable.

Anyone who wants to understand the difficult and oftenwrenching work behind that kind of investigative journalism should watch "Spotlight," the remarkably realistic 2015 feature film that shows how a team of Boston Globe reporters ripped away the Catholic Church's scandalous cover-up of pedophilia in the priesthood.

Their work required knocking on doors, searching out documents, forcing institutions to account for their failures, taking risks. It is work that sometimes leads to errors, which must be acknowledged

But it is the best and often the only way to address and remedy wrongdoing in government and business, and across our institutions, including the press itself.

The newspaper editor who led The Globe investigation is Martin Baron — who now runs the Washington Post, where his reporters produce the best reporting on national issues and politics under the slogan "Democracy Dies in Darkness.'

Of course, Trump hates the Post and every decent newspaper. For his own self-serving reasons, he would prefer a nation that gets all of its information from crooks like Alex Jones and Rupert Murdoch — a nation more like Russia, where lies suffocate freedom.

But that would be a society most inhospitable to the welfare of children and all other living things.

Housing crash not likely anytime soon, economist says

► ECONOMIC FORUM: The 2008 housing crisis was created by overborrowing and over-building, which is not happening today, said economist Christopher Thornberg.

Thornberg made the comments at the Gateway Cities Economic Forum at Downey's Rio Hondo Event Center.

DOWNEY Today's economics suffer from a constant focus on the wrong questions and issues, according to one economist.

Financial Partners Credit Union hosted its second annual Cities Economic Gateway Forum last Thursday at the Rio Hondo Event Center, featuring economist Christopher Thornberg as its keynote speaker.

Thornberg set the tone early, making it clear that his speech would not surround current economic policies in Washington

"It's amazing all the things we're not talking about because, of course, all our conversations are wrapped around what's happening on a day-to-day basis in the White House," said Thornberg. "To think of Trump as a cause is a mistake; he's not a cause, he's an effect. He's president in large part because he basically rode into the office [due to] the incredible partisanship that existed prior to him even arriving on the stage. We have to remember he's a reflection of these underlying problems in our party."

"It's not labor demand, it's labor supply," said Thornberg.
"The unemployment in the

"Thirty years ago we would agree as a nation on what the problems were, but we would debate on how to fix those problems. Today, the partisanship, the divide between left and right is so great that we can't even agree with what the problems are.'

followed a theme of "asking the workers, particularly qua wrong questions," however, workers to fill those holes." he noted that "the economy is great" currently.

"The economy has been great for the last, four, five, six years. Things have been going at a very good, stable path," said Thornberg. "This year, 2018, is all of 2017's strong economy with the addition of fiscal stimulus."

Thornberg added that he saw no chance of recession in the next 12 months, with a very limited chance of one in the next

However, addressing the bad elements of the economy, Thornberg said that are debating issues that are completely irrelevant."

"For example, we're not talking about under investment and infrastructure. We're not talking about rising wealth inequality. We're not even having any serious conversation about healthcare cost inflation, entitlement pension and reform,' said Thornberg. "We're too busy arguing about manufactured issues that don't actually exist than to actually turn around and confront the problems that do."

He added that while shortterm he's optimistic about the economy, he's worried about the national basis... Between 2012 medium term.

One of the biggest issues facing the economy - and currently a big misconception surrounds jobs.

United States right now is 3.9 percent...the job openings rate in the United States right now is 4.1 percent. In other words, there are more job openings than there are people looking for work. We don't have a shortage of jobs, we have a shortage of workers."

> Part of the solution, Thornberg says, is immigrants.

"If you want to debate how they come to this country, who comes to this country, fine," said Thornberg. "But in the end, the right answer is more, not less. Anybody who think immigrants are a problem for our economy, you're out of your mind. They're part of the solution.

"If you don't want them here...accept the fact if they don't come our economy can't grow fast...have the honest conversation."

Some of the consequences of labor shortage include the increase of labor costs.

"Watch the corporate profits, watch the Stock Market because that's where it's gonna hit,' said Thornberg. "The other part of it...if you can't hire someone, you got to buy a machine, and that's what's going on."

Statewide, Thornberg claimed California to be the eighth fastest growing economy in the last five

"We've added 2 million plus jobs, 2.6 percent growth per year," said Thornberg. "Our state output is growing faster than the and 2016, we added 1.3 million full-time jobs. Of those 1.3 million full-time jobs, 600,000 are paying over \$100,000 a year... right now 18 percent of California households make over \$150,000, compared to 11.6 percent for the rest of the nation.

Still, Thornberg noted the slowdown in the rate of job growth within the region, and the related factors contributing

"The slowing we're seeing boils down to a lack of bodies... if you don't have a person, you can't hire them, and we hit that wall," said Thornberg. "Labor



force is basically growing at a fairly slow basis.

Some of this issue boils down to homes, or as Thornberg alluded to, a lack thereof.

"Everybody talks about housing, and you should. But how we talk about it is fairly important," said Thornberg. "It's not a bubble; bubbles are overbuilding or over-borrowing; nothing like that is occurring.

"We need more housing, and we're just not building it.'
