Back in 1973, while my mother was searching for an escape route to divorcing my father after 28 years of marriage, I was searching for a way to get my boyfriend of three and a half years to commit to

She and I were directed in our paths, unknowingly, when my mother was called back to her hometown of Provo, Utah. Who says you can never go home again? Sometimes one must go back to their roots to reclaim their lives and start anew.

My mama Jeri's father Benny had just died, so we would be taking him back to his hometown in Utah to bury him.

Three days later, Mom and I hopped on a Greyhound bus, carrying only two suitcases apiece, and set out for the 700-mile trip. We knew we were going to Provo, but we were oblivious as to where our lives would head after the funeral.

Grandpa Benny's funeral was lovely, as funerals go. Luckily, we were invited to stay with Keith and Shirley Jacobson for a few weeks. They were childhood friends of my parents.

During that time my mother never brought up the idea of divorce. I never spoke of my wanting an ultimatum from my guy.

Instinctively I guess we just knew what needed to be done. Within weeks we both got a job together working at Signetics, an electronics company located in Orem, making a whopping \$2.00/

hour. Soon we found the cutest little one-bedroom apartment for the outrageous amount of \$90 a month. We split the rent. The apartment was fully furnished. We didn't have to buy even one piece of furniture.

It was Christmas Eve in Provo and the air was fresh and crisp and freezing. But we bundled up accordingly. The coldness was something I had never experienced in sunny California. I loved it. I never felt so alive.

From the sweet smile on my mother's face, she looked like she had just returned to her roots. She was home.

Since we didn't have a car yet, we decided to walk the six blocks down the street from our apartment to where the tree lot was located. Families were laughing and tying Christmas trees on top

There are so many themes in this story by Kacie Cooper – a mother and of their cars, happily throwing snowballs at each other. We saw all these huge 8- and 9-foot trees, some flocked, some green.

> "Well, we can't carry them home. They're too big," I told Mom. Then it suddenly began to snow and we decided we'd have to choose a smaller one quickly.

> Then we saw it - our Christmas tree. It was standing there all alone, away from all the other larger trees as if it were being punished for its short height.

> "How rude," I thought. But it looked like it was ready for a new environment - like we had been. It looked so lonely. But it looked the loveliest to my mother.

> I quickly paid the man and while the snow kept falling even faster, together we carried this cute, pudgy little 4-foot Douglas fir tree back to our little castle.

> We entered the front door with the tree in our arms as if it were a baby coming into its new home. It smelled like the woods, it smelled like heaven. It was fresh and full of life. It was made by God. It was the only thing we would actually own in our little furnished apartment.

> As I heated up the hot chocolate, Mother sprinkled her favorite silver tinsel onto our 4-foot Douglas fir. It was fun watching her decorate the tree. It felt as though she were throwing magic fairy dust onto our lives.

> After stringing the white lights around the tree and plugging them in, we opened the drapes behind our Douglas fir. Instantly we were transformed into a magical new world.

> In front of us was a huge, fenced-in yard with two of the most beautiful Palomino horses – my favorite, gold-colored horse. Beyond the horses, in the distance, our eyes caught sight of those beautiful, moonlit, snow-covered Utah mountains that actually illuminated our sweet little 4-foot Douglas fir.

> It was an omen. Things began to happen quickly after Christmas. My mother sadly received the divorce papers. Days after listening and crying to sad Patsy Cline records, she finally signed them. Also, my boyfriend agreed to get married in June of the following year. Thus, our new lives would finally begin.

> I have been living in my home in California for decades now. And you could say that I am living in a very fully-furnished home- too many material things. I don't need all this stuff.

> Then I think back to 1973 when the only thing Mom and I owned was a cute little God-made, 4-foot Douglas fir. It was really all I needed - a wonderful, 4-foot Douglas fir and an even more beautiful, God-made mother. Life was so simple, but amazing, back then.

Students raise awareness of global water crisis

student formed a partnership with the Thirst Project, a non-profit organization whose aim is to bring safe drinking water to communities around the world where it is not immediately

Participants included staff, faculty, community members, and more than 100 high school students from local high schools including Downey, Santa Fe, Southeast Academy, Lynwood, Firebaugh, Narbonne, Palos Verdes Penninsula, St. Paul, and Torrance.

Participants walked one mile with large gallons of water or 44 pound jerry cans to demonstrate the trek that many women and leaders children around the world make each day to collect clean water.

> The Thirst Project Walk for Water was held to draw attention to the scarcity of safe drinking water around the world and raise

funds to build wells all across the countries. continent of Africa and countries like India and El Salvador where villages do not have immediate drinking water.

Before the walk, a powerful presentation was given by Thirst Project Vice President for Student Activation, Evan Wesley. Some shed tears as they watched a video of the suffering that so many families go through in countries affected by the water crisis. In the end, all attendees were educated and inspired to take action to end the water crisis.

Participants were impacted and learned the severity of the water crisis is in third world

"We take water for granted here in the United States because most of us are just steps away to the nearest source of clean drinking water and in many parts of the world women and children have to walk more than 3 miles on average to find water," said Michelle Alvarez, a student at Downey High School.

The event culminated with lunch sponsored by Downey Mayor Pro Tem Rick Rodríguez. After lunch, KIWIN'S Diamond Division Lt. Gov. Baliscao and her student leadership team presented a \$4,000 check to the Thirst Project.

Students raised the money



themselves to help end the water high school students, they are crisis and save lives.

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On climate threat, states refuse to surrender

As large parts of America burn or drown under weird weather conditions made more extreme by global warming, California and other states are doggedly pursuing solutions. What do you say to those who deny climate change is happening — or who dismiss the scientific consensus that humankind is making the problem worse? You say nothing and move forward.

It's long past time to expect any guidance from the environmental saboteurs now running Washington. The Trump administration not only has refused to address the crisis but is reversing progress made by previous leaders.

The only remedy left — besides voting the wreckers out of office — is to help the states that are already doing the work. Much of the job now is preventing crazytown from vandalizing the states' efforts to save themselves and the world from climatic calamity.

In the wake of catastrophic fires fueled by higher temperatures, California lawmakers just passed a bill mandating 100 percent carbon-free electricity by 2045. But Hawaii was already there, having set a similar carbon-free commitment three years ago.

California already has a law requiring utilities to obtain 50 percent of their electricity from zero-carbon sources, such as wind, solar and nuclear, by the end of 2030. About 30 percent of its electricity

currently comes from renewables.

The new legislation seemed pretty radical. Gov. Jerry Brown signed it into law once he was convinced that it was doable. The wind doesn't always blow, and the sun doesn't always shine, so success will rely on developing means to store wind and solar energy.

On the other side of the country, Maryland is suing a broken Environmental Protection Agency for proposing to undo Barack Obama's Clean Power Plan. The acting EPA administrator says the Trump administration's plan to give states greater control over pollution from coal-powered utilities ends a "one-size-fits-all" federal mandate. That would sound less awful were mile-high walls erected along state lines to stop pollution from blowing in. As it happens, up to 70 percent of Maryland's smog floats in from other

In California, most of the greenhouse gas emissions come from cars and trucks. The obvious fix would be more electric cars, and if that is the case, then more cleanly obtained electricity is key.

Once again, the Trump administration does not want to help. Since 1967, California has held the right to set stricter fuel efficiency standards than the federal government's. Because more than a dozen other states follow its lead, California has, in effect, been calling the shots for the nation.

Donald Trump doesn't like that at all. His administration is working to strip California of the ability to tighten fuel economy standards. An epic legal battle has been joined.

Americans hungry for action on climate change can take comfort knowing that as an economic gorilla, California is uniquely positioned. California's economy just passed Britain's in size. The state is home to aggressive tech companies eager to make a buck off a carbon-free society (and good luck to them, too). It has an attentionfocusing phenomenon of firenadoes, tornado-like twisters of fire.

And California has a deep environmental ethic that reaches into parts of its Republican Party. It was Gov. Ronald Reagan who pushed for the state's right to set tough fuel standards. And as president, Californian Richard Nixon helped establish the EPA.

The bizarre climate-related events — from smoke-choked skies in Seattle to sunny-day floods in Florida — point to a very dark hour for the world's environment. On the warming issue, enlightened state governments find themselves fighting alone and against a hostile administration in Washington. Concerned citizens must let their responsible leaders know that they have their backs.

Don't kill scooters with overregulation

I just zipped down a city street on an electric scooter. It cost me 15 cents a minute. Fast and fun!

My scooter was just lying on the ground. I picked it up, activated it with my phone and rode away. When I was done, I simply abandoned

Won't it be stolen? No, because you need an app to activate the scooter and a GPS device keeps track of it.

My wife loves using the newish Citi Bike shared bicycles that are locked in a big dock near our apartment. They were a good innovation.

But then entrepreneurs came up with "dockless" bikes. They're

Better still are these shared scooters. They're small, flexible, cheap and convenient. Maybe these scooters will be the next revolution in urban transit!

But politicians may kill them off before we get a chance to find out how useful they are.

Some places have already banned the scooters. San Francisco said they "endanger public health and safety." City attorney Dennis Herrera complained about "broken bones, bruises, and near misses."

Sigh. Yet San Francisco also complains about not having enough transportation options.

In San Francisco and other cities, scooter companies tried doing what Uber and Airbnb did: They dodged destructive regulation by simply putting their services out on the street, hoping that by the time sleepy regulators noticed them, they would be too popular to

That worked for Uber and Airbnb. We consumers got cool new

ways to travel and alternatives to hotels, and investors got rich — all because they didn't ask for permission. Permissionless innovation brings good things.

But flying under the radar is harder for scooter companies. Scooters on sidewalks are very visible.

"Unfortunately," Mercatus Center tech policy analyst Jennifer Skees told me for my latest video, "cities haven't learned from their experiences with companies like Uber and Airbnb. They want innovators to come ask for permission and go through the regulatory processes."

But the "regulatory processes" take years. "That prevents consumers from accessing a transportation option that could be accessible now!" said Skees.

After a four-month ban, San Francisco granted permits to two small scooter companies. The politicians stiffed Lime and Bird, the innovators that started the business - presumably because they didn't kiss the politicians' rings and beg for permission first.

Still, even I acknowledge that there may be a role for government here. A public square needs some rules. Scooters, especially speedy electric scooters, can be dangerous.

"We haven't seen a large number of accidents or injuries," says Skees. "We don't ban bicycles because somebody might get hurt. ... Social norms (like hand signals) will evolve."

Whenever there's something new, the media hype the problems. The L.A. Times reports that some people hate the scooters so much that they "have been crammed into toilets, tossed off balconies and set on fire." Internet videos show scooters abandoned in the Pacific

But scooter companies say the vandalism isn't so bad.

"It's a low percentage," said Lime's Maggie Gendron. In one city, "we had 10,000 rides and 18 vandalism complaints."

I wanted to try out scooters in my state, New York, but I couldn't, because craven politicians who claim to represent me banned

So I took our camera crews to a city that's been more reasonable.

Oddly, that's a place that overregulates most everything: Washington, D.C. But the capital embraced scooters.

So, the district has transportation that is green and good exercise and takes up less space than cars.

Maybe politicians will find it in their hearts to leave scooters, their makers and customers alone.

One innovation can make many others possible.

Cars take people to jobs they couldn't do in their own neighborhoods, allowing them to collaborate with people they might never have met if they walked or rode horses.

Planes, trains and ships bring down costs by allowing inventors to use exotic materials they can't find in their own back yards.

If any of those forms of transportation had been crushed by regulation, we'd never know how many benefits we'd lost.

Don't kill scooters. Let's see where they take us.

In many ways, the 2016 election was a victory for capitalism, with an allegedly socialist intellectual president giving way to a real estate mogul whose understanding of business would unleash prosperity. is Nike, whose new ad features Kaepernick, a former San Francisco The economy and the stock market are indeed doing well. But though Donald Trump's administration may be good for capitalists, capitalists are not necessarily good for him.

Many a conservative has been inspired by the hero of Ayn Rand's "Atlas Shrugged," a brilliant businessman and a model of what she called "the man of violent energy and passionate ambition, the man of achievement, lighted by the flame of his success." House Speaker Paul Ryan professed to regularly giving the book as a Christmas present and making his interns read it to learn the "morality of

forget is that free market commerce is not always — or usually — a force for conservative values. It is often just the opposite, as Nike's embrace of Colin Kaepernick confirms.

in its camp. But conservatives are reminded every day that some of the most successful and innovative companies are led and staffed by people whose worldview is deeply at odds with conservative ideology.

There is Amazon, whose founder and CEO, Jeff Bezos, owns The Washington Post, a frequent target of Trump's animosity. There is Apple, where CEO Tim Cook has been a vocal critic of racial injustice and anti-gay discrimination. Facebook executive Sheryl Sandberg has written, "A truly equal world would be one where women ran half our countries and companies and men ran half our homes."

Starbucks responded to Trump's travel ban by pledging to hire 10,000 refugees. After the Parkland school massacre, Dick's Sporting Goods stopped selling military-style firearms. Google, under

pressure from employees opposed to creating "warfare technology," withdrew from a Pentagon project on artificial intelligence.

The right-wing The Republican Party has a large complement of corporate titans National Center for Public Policy Research claimed, "Nike is appealing to a small, radicalized market that supports Black Lives Matter and apparently hates the police." But a large minority of the public sides with the kneeling players, and most people think the protests should be allowed regardless. If the Kaepernick ad alienates some conservative customers, it will attract some liberals.

Free markets have a way of dissolving ancient prejudices and rigid customs. Politicians in red states may try to legislate against accommodations for transgender people, but businesses have been among the most active opponents of such measures. Many big companies provided benefits to the same-sex domestic partners of employees before the Supreme Court ruled for gay marriage.

Conservatives are often inflamed by the refusal of corporations to take their side. After Delta cut ties with the National Rifle Association, Georgia legislators exacted revenge by repealing a tax exemption on jet fuel — even though the airline is one of the state's largest private employers. Delta CEO Ed Bastian replied: "Our values are not for sale.'

What many big companies have figured out is that Trumpism is in conflict with the behavior and attitudes they foster in their employees and with the beliefs of most consumers. In the current polarized political climate, the striking fact is not how many corporations have challenged Trump. It's how few have defended him.

The sentiment among many conservatives is that the country is changing in a variety of ways that threaten their values. They're right, and the companies at the center of modern American capitalism are fine with that.

Ken Starr's unfair treatment

Twenty years after recommending to Congress that then-President Clinton be impeached for perjury and obstruction of justice, Kenneth Starr has written a book about it. Surely, with the passage of time and many other books exploring the Lewinsky affair and the other Clinton scandals, Starr can be treated with dignity and respect.

Back then, he faced ABC's Diane Sawyer calling his Starr report "demented pornography, pornography for Puritans.

Twenty years later, nothing has changed. In a Sept. 10 interview on "CBS This Morning," anchor Norah O'Donnell brought up one of his lawyers: "One of the things we've learned the Supreme Court nominee Brett Kavanaugh worked on your team, worked on this investigation of President Bill Clinton. He wrote and suggested some very explicit, salacious questions should be asked of President Clinton, but you didn't agree to do that. Why?"

Starr reasonably replied: "we wanted to respect the dignity of the presidency, and I think that we did that. But we at the same time had to get to the bottom of things.'

Here's another way of putting this: Clinton said under oath there was no sexual relationship between him and Monica Lewinsky. To CBS, asking Clinton about it was "very explicit" and "salacious.

O'Donnell also said: "Monica Lewinsky has said the release of the Starr report, the 445-page report, was one of the worst days of her life. She wants an apology. Will you apologize to her?" Starr said, "No, I won't, because, unfortunately, the facts are the facts." It was a perjury

Another way of putting it: Why is CBS asking questions as ridiculous

as Lewinsky's demand?

We wish Starr had noted that this taking offense at "salacious" material was a strange stance for CBS after "60 Minutes" jumped at the chance to get the first interview with porn star Stormy Daniels accusing President Trump of some "very explicit" stuff.

Starr was also interviewed on NPR's "Morning Edition" on the morning of Sept. 10. Anchor Steve Inskeep, best known for long, warm, fuzzy White House chats with President Obama, began by asking Starr about Lewinsky: "Do you think that the violation you found was worth more than four years of investigation?" Starr had to remind listeners that he investigated not only Lewinsky but also savings-and-loan corruption in Little Rock, sending to jail the sitting governor of Arkansas (Jim Guv Tucker) and crooked bankers Jim and Susan McDougal, thenreal estate business partners with the Clintons.

Inskeep argued "history" would ignore all of the non-sex stuff: "ultimately, what history is going to remember is that one charge, the perjury accusation involving Monica Lewinsky. Was that worth it?" So Starr should have ignored perjury committed by the president of the

The taxpayer-subsidized anchor was upset that Republicans seem to approve of Trump calling special counsel Robert Mueller's probe a witch hunt" ... because they approve of Trump's job performance. Starr disagreed, saying, "we agree with 80 percent of his policies" but not how he tweets. Inskeep attacked Starr's sincerity, saying, "Isn't that kind of dissembling, though, Mr. Starr, because that is the heart of his presidency, is what he says publicly and the attitude he strikes?"

How can Inskeep sound outraged about a president attacking a special counsel when he's interviewing Ken Starr, who was eviscerated publicly by Bill Clinton & Co.? Apparently that's fine, since 20 years ago the media compared Starr to Nazis, truck-bomb terrorists and Sen. Joseph McCarthy. Back then, "witch hunt" talk was all the rage.





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

Kaiser goes on lockdown after reports of shooting

► LOCKDOWN: A man reportedly upset about a missed doctor's appointment threatened hospital staff with a gun, prompting a lockdown and massive police response at Kaiser Permanente Medical Center.

DOWNEY brandishing a gun at the Kaiser Permanente hospital in Downey sent the medical center into lockdown Tuesday, prompting a massive police response and spurring concerns of a possible active shooter on the hospital

The suspect was taken into custody without incident. No shots were fired in the ordeal and there were no reports of injuries.

The incident began at around 11:34 a.m., when reports came in to the Downey Police Department of a disturbance at the hospital. The call was upgraded to a possible active shooter while officers were enroute.

"When our officers arrived on scene, they were directed to a building where the subject was believed to be located," said DPD Chief Carl Charles.

That building was the Orchard medical building, located east of the hospital proper.

Officers immediately confronted the suspect, who surrendered and was taken into custody without incident.

arrest, authorities said. He was run," Boughner added. taken into custody just outside the Orchard building after being called out by police.

At a press conference outside the Columbia Memorial Space Center, authorities said Chavez was causing a disturbance when one of the hospital's security guards contacted him. At this point, Chavez reportedly threw a chair through a window and brandished a handgun.

Witnesses reported hearing 6-7 gunshots but investigators determined Chavez never fired his weapon.

Chavez was booked for making criminal threats and transported to Los Angeles County Jail.

Officials were later able to confirm that Chavez was at the hospital for an appointment, but weren't able to say why he was carrying a handgun or what initiated his outburst.

A witness, Amber Boughner, told reporters that Chavez was upset over a missed doctor's appointment.

"He started pounding on the door, saying, 'I had an appointment at 11 o'clock! I deserve my appointment, where is that B.I.T.C.H. Make her let me in!' And he just kept pounding, pounding and pounding, Boughner said.

She said she saw Chavez kick walls and throw furniture out of a window until security arrived.

Hospital staff, patients, and visitors were held under lockdown while police cleared the scene. Police cleared four buildings on the hospital campus.

Meanwhile, several local schools and businesses also went into lockdown mode, preventing anyone from entering or exiting.

Several law enforcement agencies responded to the hospital, including the Whittier Police Department and deputies from the Norwalk's Sheriff's

The Sheriff's Department mobilized its Special Enforcement Bureau (SEB), also known as SWAT.

"We want to thank the Sheriff's Department, their SEB. They had assets here quickly from the surrounding police stations," said Downey Police Capt. Mark McDaniel. "It was just a great collaborative effort."

A press conference was held about 2-1/2 hours after the incident began, where it was officially announced that the hospital was secure and there were no injuries.

Questions remain as to how Chavez was able to get onto the

first place.

That topic was left to be tackled and answered by Jim Branchick, a senior vice president with Kaiser Permanente.

"I couldn't answer that," said Branchick. "I'm not sure if he was a member, or a visitor with us. I don't have any information on that.'

"I'm sure after this is over we will get together with our Downey Police and the Sheriff's Department to see if we could have done anything better and improve it that way," added

Branchick confirmed there are no metal detectors at the hospital's entrances.

Still, Chief Charles said from a perimeter type setting

that "Kaiser is not any more where the first responders can go dangerous than any other facility.

"Always be vigilant. You need to be aware of your added Charles. "They're aware surroundings," said Charles. "If something seems out of place, call the police immediately... we train for this. We would like to say, we hope that Downey is more secure than most cities, but you always have to be vigilant and this can happen anywhere."

The hospital had recently undergone active shooter training in April, which was initiated by Kaiser according to officials.

"Hospital staff was great," said McDaniel. "They had their roles blocking traffic, assisting

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in and do their job. It was a good team effort."

"They're good partners," of what's happening in today's world and they took steps to at least try and be prepared for it."

The city of Downey utilized its emergency alert system Tuesday to update subscribers on the unfolding situation via phone calls, texts and emails.

Rakdy Khlok, emergency manager for the city of Downey, said the city had not activated its emergency operations center but did open an incident command

Evacuees were interviewed by police at Independence Park and then allowed to return to the hospital.

In a statement, Kaiser said it was offering counseling to patients and staff affected by Tuesday's incident.

"The safety of our patients, employees and physicians are paramount," the hospital said. "We recognize the stress that can be brought on by a situation like this. We're offering behavioral health services and support to our patients, employees and physicians who were onsite. All appointments at the facility have been canceled for today.

'We are working closely with law enforcement and ask that all questions about this incident be directed to the Downey Police Department and L.A. County Sheriff's Department."

Kaiser and the surrounding streets reopened later Tuesday afternoon.
