

College board members unchallenged in November election

► **ELECTION CANCELED:** Three members of the Cerritos College Board of Trustees will receive new four-year terms after no one files to run against them.

NORWALK – Three incumbents on the Cerritos College Board of Trustees will serve another four years after they were unchallenged in next month’s election.

James Cody Birkey (area 3), Dr. Shin Liu (area 5) and Zurich Lewis (area 7) will serve a four-year term from 2018 to 2022.

It is the first time in the college’s history that all board incumbents are uncontested. Elections are held biennially in November of each even-numbered year; there is no limit on the number of terms that college board members may serve.

Cerritos College officials called the uncontested election a

sign of “stable leadership.”

Zurich Lewis was elected to the board in 2014 and is currently in his second year as board president. He is a lifelong resident of La Mirada and serves as president of the La Mirada Rotary Club. He works as a law clerk for the Law Office of Lewis & Lewis.

He represents area 7, which encompasses parts of Norwalk, Santa Fe Springs, La Mirada, Cerritos and South Whittier.

Dr. Shin Liu was first elected to the board in 2009 and is currently board vice president. She is a tenured professor of computer science at Rio Hondo College with field expertise as a software and network engineer certified by Microsoft and Cisco.

She represents area 5, which includes parts of Norwalk, Artesia, Cerritos and Santa Fe Springs.

James Cody Birkey was appointed to the board in June 2017. A resident of Bellflower, he is vice president at JLL, where he advises public institutions regarding strategic capital investments. He is active

in several non-profits and community initiatives across Southeast Los Angeles County.

He represents area 3, which covers portions of Downey, South Gate, Bellflower and Cerritos.

60-plus stores announce they will close on Thanksgiving

► **HOLIDAY SHOPPING:** As Thanksgiving Day shopping gains popularity, several retailers this year are giving their employees the day off, including Nordstroms.

Weeks ahead of Halloween, the holiday shopping season may seem far off.

But BestBlackFriday.com released its 2018 Thanksgiving Day store closings list Monday, a roll call of retailers that won’t open their brick-and-mortar stores Nov. 22.

Costco, Ikea, Sam’s Club, Home Depot and Lowe’s are among the big names on the popular holiday website’s third annual Thanksgiving closures list.

“At this point in the year, we have the most confirmed closures we have ever had with 60 retailers,” said Phillip Dengler, head of editorial and content marketing for BestBlackFriday.com, which began contacting stores in early September.

The stores on the list have traditionally kept their doors closed for the holiday, and Dengler expects the list to grow. Although the site hasn’t confirmed any new closures this year, Dengler said there were a few surprises last year.

In 2017, GameStop opened on Thanksgiving for the first time in years, and Stein Mart and Shoe Carnival closed after being open in previous years.

“While we do not expect any huge retailers to switch course, we do expect a middle-

tier retailer or two to potentially close,” Dengler said.

According to the National Retail Federation, 174 million people shopped in-store and online during last year’s five-day Thanksgiving weekend, which concluded with Cyber Monday.

ShopperTrak found Thanksgiving Day foot traffic to be down while Black Friday traffic remained stable in 2017. The market research firm projects this Black Friday will be the biggest shopping day of the year.

Black Friday gained its name because it was viewed as the day of the year retailers earned profitability, or were “in the black.” Nearly a decade ago, sales slowly started creeping into Thanksgiving and by 2012 most major retailers were open on the fourth Thursday in November.

Despite public outcry and shoppers threatening to boycott, the opening times have moved earlier. Last year, J.C. Penney started its sale at 2 p.m. Thanksgiving and Kohl’s, Macy’s and Best Buy started sales at 5 p.m.

Last year, a BestBlackFriday.com survey found 57 percent of Americans were against Thanksgiving openings while only 16 percent said they favored them.

“Many people are still strongly against the idea of retailers opening their doors on Thanksgiving,” Dengler said. “Since Thanksgiving is all about family, a majority of people believe stores should be closed

on the day.”

While still a minority, the website’s new survey shows more people may be getting used to the idea. Nearly a quarter of the 1,069 surveyed this year said they were in favor of the holiday openings, close to a 9 percentage point increase over last year.

What time stores will serve up Thanksgiving in-store sales this year isn’t public yet.

“Stores are always reluctant to tell us if they will be open on Thanksgiving and what their hours will be,” Dengler said. “Since most major national retailers are open on Thanksgiving, we think it is because the competition is much more fierce.

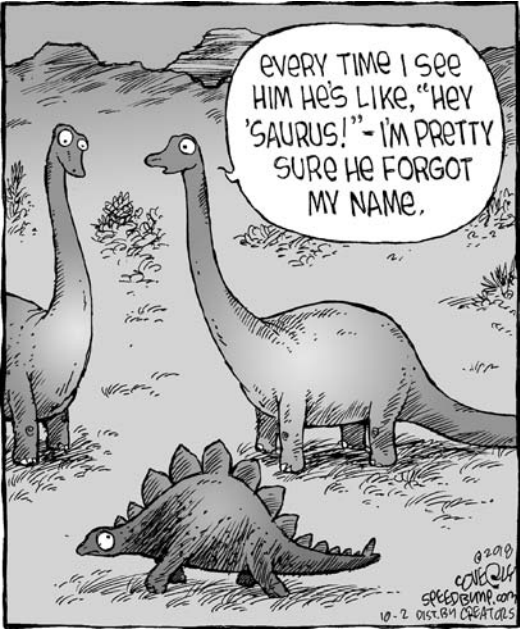

Whittier school district considering change to trustee area elections

► **ELECTION CHANGE:** Whittier school board is considering changing from at-large elections to trustee areas.

A public discussion is scheduled for Tuesday.

WHITTIER – The Whittier Union High School District Board of Trustees will consider during its regular Oct. 9 board meeting a resolution to shift from At-Large elections to By-Trustee Area elections, effective November 2020.

In recent years, school districts and cities have moved to by-trustee area elections in

response to federal and state voter rights laws designed to ensure underrepresented groups have equal opportunities and access to voting and representation.

The consideration by Whittier Union board members is in response to a demand letter from a local attorney arguing that “at-large election schemes dilute the ability of minority groups to elect their preferred candidates,” violating the California Voters Rights Act (CVRA).

The boundaries of the Whittier Union High School District include the communities

of Whittier, Santa Fe Springs, unincorporated Los Angeles County communities of West Whittier, South Whittier, East Whittier, Los Nietos, and Avocado Heights, as well as portions of Norwalk, La Mirada and La Habra Heights.

Hispanics make up 67 percent of eligible voters and non-Hispanic Whites make up 24 percent.

Under the District’s current at-large election model, residents may vote for any board candidate on the ballot irrespective of where in the Whittier Union District boundaries they live.

Under the by-trustee area voting system, residents vote for a candidate residing in their newly drawn trustee-area, which is typically one-fifth of the entire district.

“Our community is diverse and ensuring our leadership is also diverse has always been a priority of the Whittier Union Board of Trustees,” Superintendent Martin Plourde said. “As always, students are our first priority – so supporting diverse representation and keeping money in classrooms rather than in courtrooms is important to us.

“The parameters of the CVRA are very prescriptive. We are presenting an option to the Board that implements the CVRA process and intent. This recommendation is both fiscally prudent and responsible to our community.”

If the board approves moving to by-trustee area elections, the district is “committed to a transparent, community-focused process that creates voter-area districts that best represent the community the district serves,” officials said.

Whittier native puts computer skills to use with U.S. Navy

► **PROFILE:** Manuel Corona, a 2012 Cal High graduate, is an information systems technician, helping support the Navy’s combat ships.

WHITTIER – A 2012 California High School graduate and Whittier native is serving in the U.S. Navy as part of the staff assigned to Commander, Littoral Combat Ship Squadron One Naval reserve unit, supporting one of the country’s most versatile combat ships.

Petty Officer 2nd Class Manuel Corona is a Navy information systems technician serving under Commander, Littoral Combat Ship Squadron One Naval reserve unit based in San Diego.

As a Navy information systems technician, Corona is responsible for computer repairs, networking, and system defense of the LCS computer systems.

“I really like knowing how

computers interact with each other,” said Corona.

Corona credits success in the Navy to lessons he learned in Whittier.

“The people are very friendly in Whittier. I try to be the same to others when I meet new people,” he said.

COMLCSRON ONE NR is the Reserve unit working alongside their active duty counterparts at COMLCSRON ONE to man, train and equip LCS, in addition to leading Navy-wide change to support the minimally manned rotational crews and mission packages for littoral combat ships.

Designed to defeat threats such as mines, quiet diesel submarines and fast surface craft, littoral combat ships are a bold departure from traditional Navy shipbuilding programs, supporting multiple missions,

such as surface warfare, mine warfare, or anti-submarine warfare. The LCS sustainment strategy was developed to take into account the unique design and manning of LCS and its associated mission modules.

“I continue to be impressed with the high caliber of sailor that the LCS community attracts,” said Capt. Matthew McGonigle, Commander, Littoral Combat Ship Squadron One.

“When these sailors join LCS, they already know the reputation of our ships as fast, agile, maneuverable and soon to be the largest class of vessel on the waterfront. They also know the credentials of our sailors as being highly trained, talented, mature and versatile. So the ships’ unique capabilities and the high quality of LCS sailors appeals to those who are eager to be a part of a community which affords them qualification opportunities and chances to excel that they might not get anywhere else.”

Through innovative planning, the design of systems, and crew requirements, the LCS platform allows the fleet to increase

forward presence and optimize its personnel, improving the ability of the Navy to be where it matters, when it matters.

“The community has been fun and they’ve been very helpful, especially the higher chain of command,” said Corona. “Whether it’s completing personal paperwork or training, they are very supportive.”

As part of that LCS community, Corona explained that he and the other sailors of the unit are helping to build a legacy that will last beyond their

lifetimes, including helping to develop new war-fighting capabilities to continue the Navy’s success on the world’s oceans.

“Serving is all about lending a helpful hand, whether it’s the person next to you or a stranger,” said Corona. “If I am able to do it, I will always help others.”

New sports stadium reaches halfway point at John Glenn High School

► **CONSTRUCTION:** A new 2,500-seat athletic stadium at John Glenn High has reached the halfway point of construction.

NORWALK – The halfway point has been reached in the construction of a new sports stadium and athletic fields for John Glenn High School.

The project is one of several major outdoor renovations taking place at campuses around the Norwalk-La Mirada Unified School District.

When completed, the Glenn HS project will feature a 2,500-seat synthetic turf stadium with lights, a press box, baseball fields, a ticket booth and concession stand. The makeover for the 1960s-era Eagles campus on Shoemaker Avenue will encompass about 20 acres of school property.

Funding for the Glenn project — which includes planning and development work — is being provided through Measure G, NLMUSD’s capital improvements bond passed in 2014.

“This is a modernization project that will meet a lot of our campus needs. It’s also a

smart, long-term investment for our community,” said Francisco Ramirez, principal of the 1,000-student high school that features Project Lead the Way and other college and career readiness programs.

“These renovations are going to look great when done and no doubt there will be a lot of students and families who will take new interest in our school.”

Among the other big projects in progress, which are also being funded by Measure G as well as by a similar bond, Measure S, which was passed in 2002, is the outdoor renovation at Corvallis Middle School, also in Norwalk.

The Corvallis project features extensive field and landscaping improvements along with new work to upgrade parking lots, shade shelters, and pedestrian walkways.

In addition, the 750-student STEAM magnet campus on Leffingwell Road, which opened in 1962, will be getting an outdoor electronic marquee.

“The campus is looking amazing, with a new synthetic track, fitness equipment, an

outdoor stage and upgrades to our basketball and volleyball courts,” said Corvallis Principal Bob Easton. “The beautiful exterior of the campus, and the improvements to the overall curb appeal, definitely contributes to a positive learning environment and creates a stronger sense of pride for our school.”

Renovations similar to Corvallis are being done at Benton Middle School in La Mirada. At Benton, built in 1952, in addition to a new concession/restroom building, an outdoor marquee and perimeter fencing, there is extensive modernization work underway on the campus athletic fields, including a new synthetic running track.

“Things are looking good so far and there have been a lot of improvements, like the nice new front landscaping and the new running track, which make a huge impact on how the school looks and how kids feel about the campus,” said Ben Webster, principal of Benton, a 530-student visual and performing arts magnet campus located along Santa Gertrudes Avenue near Imperial Highway.



At nearby La Mirada High School, work is expected to commence sometime before the end of the year on a major expansion of the campus gym, which in addition to doubling the seating capacity to about 1,400, will include new locker rooms and training facilities.

“These wonderful projects, when completed, will further boost the pride that our students, staff and alumni have in their schools,” said NLMUSD Superintendent Dr. Hasmik Danielian. “The renovations will add to the strong reputation of our campuses and further build

our attractiveness as a school district that provides 21st-century learning and academic programs to help all our students be future ready.”

Commentary: New construction is transforming John Glenn into an elite campus

NORWALK – I am excited! The work on the athletic fields and facilities ongoing on the campus at John Glenn High

School is impressive.

Answering an invitation from vice principals Shanon Cruz and Leonard Shryock at a recent Eagle football game, I called Cruz and asked if an on-campus visit could be had.

Cruz accommodated my request and I spent an hour touring from above the facilities for the future, football and soccer

stadium, the varsity and junior varsity baseball and softball fields.

From the second floor of the newest addition to the campus, we were able to see in the distance, the soccer practice field as well.

What was taking shape was the lighting for the football, baseball and softball stadiums,

athletic locker facilities, equipment storage attached to new baseball player dugout, a running track, concession stands and everything else associated with one of the best athletic high school facility west of the Mississippi.

According to a news release by Norwalk La Mirada spokesperson Rick De la Torre, “When completed, the Glenn HS project will feature a 2,500-seat synthetic turf stadium with lights, a press box, baseball fields, a ticket booth and concession stand. The makeover for the 1960s-era Eagles campus on Shoemaker Avenue will encompass about 20 acres of school property.”

Not bad for \$25 million. That is what Vice Principal Leonard Shryock said the value of the bond-funded project is.

From what I saw during my travels as a community college journalist seven years ago, these facilities will easily surpass those of several local colleges and will be the envy of every local high school within miles.

This will definitely be a decision helper when a family is deciding what school to attend for their athletic needs.

Walking with Vice Principal Cruz, we ran into another staff member named Cruz, who coincidentally happened to be the other half of this husband-wife teaching team.

David Cruz is an assistant football coach and joined the teaching staff at the same time as Principal Cruz back in 2002.

Both met in Oklahoma when David was stationed at Fort Sill, an Army base north of Oklahoma City.

After starting a family, they both agreed to move nearer to David’s roots in Pico Rivera. Now they have been here for over 16 years and have seen all three of their daughters go through the educational program at John Glenn, graduating as Eagles.

The athletic fields themselves

are expected to be ready sometime in May of 2019.

“We hope that our graduating class will be the first to use the stadium,” said Vice Principal Cruz.

The athletic teams have found other temporary facilities to use like converting a class room into a weight room and having football practice across the street at Southeast Academy.

Add in the newly designed and rebuilt Don Knabe Golf Center and Junior Academy across the street and John Glenn is in a position to provide top notch training and playing facilities in all mainstream and some lesser followed sports.

All in all, the facilities at John Glenn are a great addition to the Norwalk high school campus.
