

# Penny rushes for career high against Rams

► **ANALYSIS:** Norwalk's Rashaad Penny had his breakout performance of the season last Sunday. Now it's Pete Carroll's responsibility to continue giving him minutes.

**NORWALK** – Norwalk's Rashaad Penny had a breakout performance last Sunday in his return home against the Rams, rushing for 108 yards and scoring his first professional touchdown.

The 27th overall pick in this year's draft has been quiet all season until last week's standout effort at the Coliseum, which put him in contention for "Rookie of the Week" for Week 10.

Penny rushed for an average of nine yards per carry Sunday. He exploded for a 38-yard gain on a play that looked like it was going to be a loss in the backfield. He has now accumulated 254 yards on 54 carries all season.

It is week 10 and the Seahawks have played nine games now. Out of the first nine games of his career, Penny is averaging just six carries a game. The last game against the Rams in Week 5, Penny didn't touch the ball once even though he did not appear on the injury report.

It's hard for any rookie running back to gain the confidence and experience when trapped in a system that rarely runs the ball, but Pete Carroll finally caved and fed Penny the rock against the Rams' leaky rush defense (ranked 24th in the league).

It was only the second game Penny reached double digits in carries and the first since Week 2. It seemed as though Carroll's high hopes were fading week by week with his rookie's production sinking every game, but Penny's last performance may have proved him right by drafting him so soon into the draft when he was projected as a third rounder.

There were two games this season Penny did not get the ball. It is unacceptable in my opinion, considering that the kid is averaging 8.3 yards a catch and over 4.5 yards a carry.

Penny is exactly who the Seahawks thought they drafted, he just needs the opportunity to make the big plays, like the 38-yard shifty run against the Rams. It is ludicrous to think that he gained more yards in that run alone than he gained in six of his nine career games in the NFL after demolishing San Diego State University's single season rushing records last season.

I understand the disappointing start may have discouraged the Seahawks to run the ball through the rookie who only managed to scrounge together 43 pathetic yards on 20 carries after three games, but I think he proved that he can breakout for the big gains that made him stand out in college.

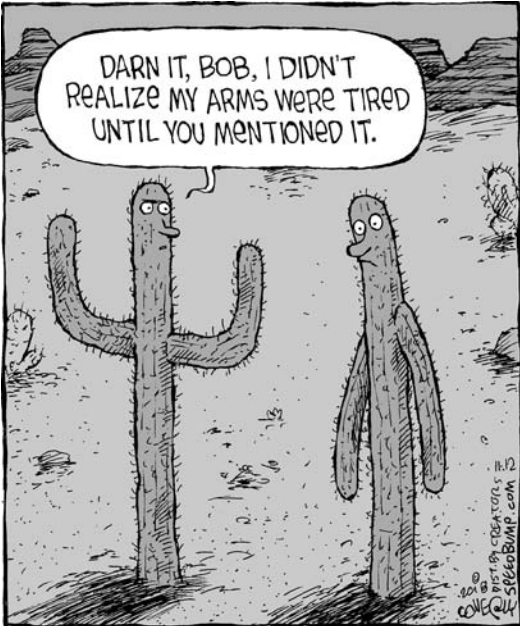

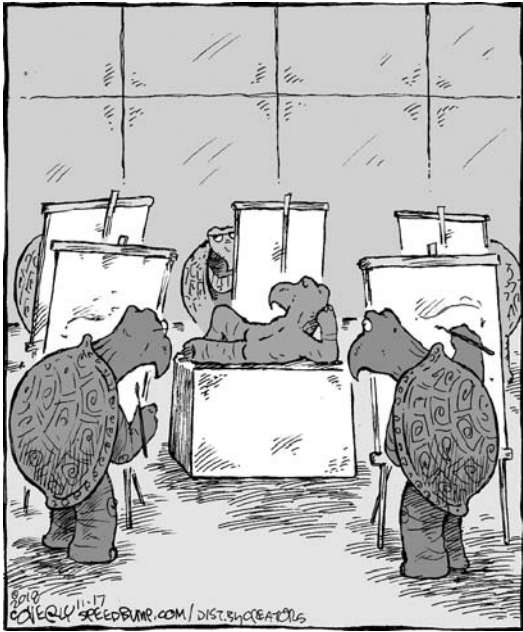

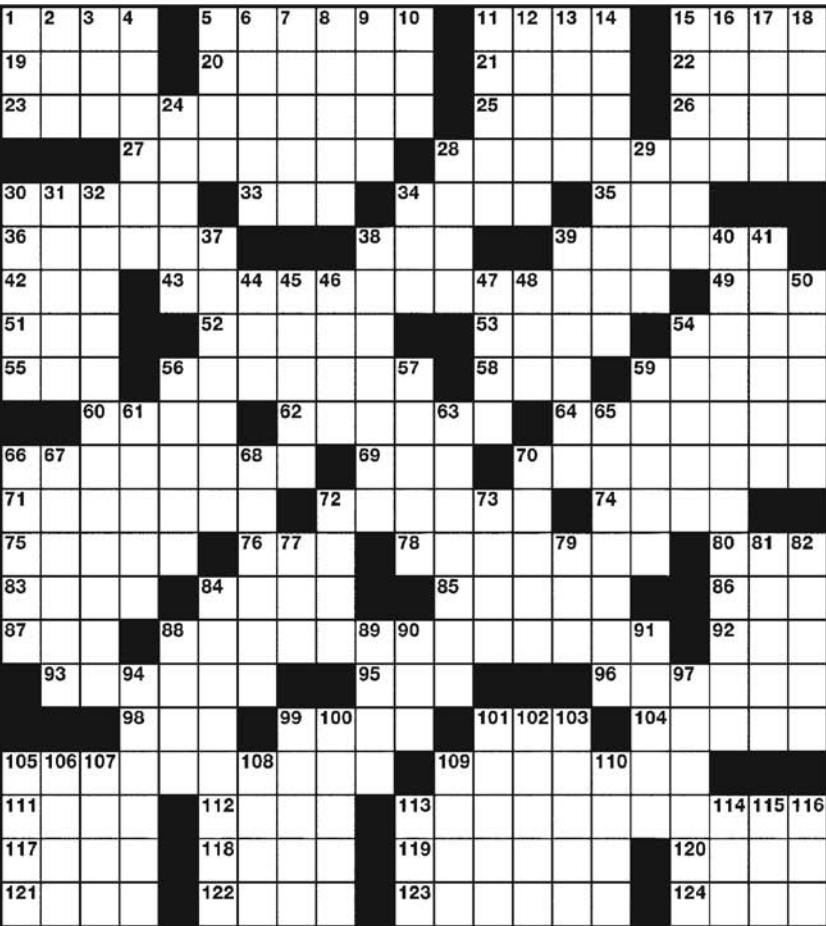

# Downey extends deal with theater management

►Council members give VenueTech a new 3-year contract but will look elsewhere for the theater’s marketing and presenting series.

DOWNEY – VenueTech will continue management of the Downey Civic Theatre, however it is likely that the theatre’s marketing and presenting series

will be handed off to someone else.

San Francisco based Venuetech is currently responsible for the management and operation of the 738-seat “midsized” community theatre.

The City Council voted Tuesday to extend VenueTech’s contract to manage the theatre for another three years. However, it seems that the general consensus amongst council members and

staff that its in areas other than management where VenueTech is lacking.

“The majority of the work is the management of the theatre, which they’ve done and I think it seems like everyone thinks they’ve done a good job on the managing part,” said Councilmember Alex Saab.

“Where I think there is some room for improvement is the Presenting Series; the eight to 10, six to eight [or] 10 performances

that it appears the city of Downey is putting on...I think that’s where they’ve fallen short. It’s not to say that the management has fallen short.”

City Manager Gilbert Livas said that the theatre’s Presenting Series has been “hit or miss.”

“If they’re not doing so well and it’s costing us money, we’d rather instead of having eight presenting series maybe you’d have three but they’re legitimate

shows,” said Livas. “It’s better to shrink that and pay for more elaborate shows.”

The theatre’s subcommittee – made up of council members Saab and Blanca Pacheco – are currently looking in to ways to enhance not only the Presenting Series, but the venue’s marketing as well.

It’s likely that the city will soon be putting out requests for proposals, or RFP’s, to find a partner to aid in these areas.

“The RFP that will probably be going out is going to be somewhat broad because we don’t know yet,” said Saab. “We’re not experts on theatre. When we put that out it really is truly awaiting proposals from people who are experts in that...obviously it’s going to go back to the council eventually and then we’ll go from there.”

# South Gate, Downey clash over housing development for homeless veterans

►The controversial development would create apartment homes for veterans; residents of South Gate are not pleased.

DOWNEY – The controversial Hollydale housing project materialized at Tuesday night’s City Council meeting, forcing city officials to once again fight back claims that they were dumping a homeless shelter onto a South Gate neighborhood.

The affordable apartments for veterans – called Homes for Heroes Hollydale – were not on the scheduled agenda at Downey’s meeting, however as protestors lined up outside of City Hall and filed into Council Chambers it became clear fairly quickly that council would come face to face with several ruffled Hollydale residents.

The project in question has already been the center of confusion and debate as the current residents of the property – the American Legion – prepared to vacate by Nov. 15.

The property falls within Downey city limits but is owned by Los Angeles County and borders South Gate.

While the project is ultimately led by the County, Downey has agreed to work in assisting with the development. However, it has been a challenge for both entities to get their stories straight with one another. That confusion meanwhile has stirred the pot for the project’s objectors.

Downey, specifically Mayor Pro Tem Rick Rodriguez, previously described the project as short-term transitional housing for veterans, where veterans – including those who may be currently homeless – could receive varying forms of aid to get back on their feet. Rodriguez was even quoted as saying that residents of the housing could only stay a maximum of one year, a claim he made on a televised news broadcast.

This has worried many of the property’s immediate South Gate neighbors. They say that the project would negatively affect their neighborhoods without affecting Downey.

South Gate residents have also been up-in-arms due to the close proximity of the project to a proposed homeless development within their city but that project is currently on hold and is not moving forward at this time due to litigation, county officials said. That project could resume when litigation finishes, although it could take years.

Through all of the debate, L.A. County has stood its ground, saying that the project is neither a homeless shelter nor transitional housing. Now, it seems that LA County and Downey are finally on the same page, however the project’s neighbors are still not satisfied.

The Hollydale conversation took place primarily during non-agenda public comment.

Before anyone from South Gate approached the council, LA County Supervisor Janice Hahn’s Field Deputy Ivan Sulic spoke.

“First and foremost this project is not a homeless shelter, period. There’s not going to be homeless individuals coming in and out at different odd hours of the night. This is not that type of project,” said Sulic.

“This is affordable apartments for veterans, for the men and women that served in our armed forces that [with the] rising rents and housing crisis that we have here in LA County, this will provide them an apartment to support themselves and if needed get the services they need...”

While most comments simply asked for the relocation of the project, the Mayor Pro Tem also found himself in the crosshairs.

“All these homeless organizations start off with saying

these homeless facilities are all about veterans; that is their calling card so that communities can’t complain, including founding Mayor Pro Tem Rick Rodriguez and his wife Lupe’s nonprofit Living Tree and Courage Forward nonprofit that Mayor Pro Tem Rick Rodriguez and Councilmember Blanca Pacheco are on the board,” said one speaker, Virginia Johnson.

“I hope they are not in collusion with this deal, even if it might not be for money but for fame, maybe for next election.”

Living Tree is a nonprofit organization founded by Rick and Lupe Rodriguez that provides assistance to organizations which provide for the needs of current military personnel and veterans. Courage Forward is a nonprofit support network organization that helps veterans with various resources they may need after the end of their service.

Another speaker, Andrea Paulino, said Rodriguez needed to “work on his poker face” before moving on to her comments.

“I would just like some honesty from anybody on this council. We just want the truth of what’s going to happen in our neighborhood. So far nobody has been able to give us an answer,” said Paulino. “We’re not fighting against anything to do with homeless. We’re not

fighting against anything to do with shelters. We are fighting against location.

“You have a huge city, twice as large as ours. You have more money than we do. There’s someplace else that this place can be built.”

When the dust settled, it was Councilmember Fernando Vasquez – not Rodriguez – who spoke up.

“I actually grew up in an affordable housing complex, so I know what it is to grow up in those units...I’m the case study of what actually comes out of these affordable housing units so I take that very personal when people demonize or talk negatively about affordable housing,” said Vasquez. “What we’re hearing today is no different than what we went through as a city council body about four to six years ago. The community was opposed to it, and we actually built it in the heart of Downtown Downey.”

Vasquez was alluding to the affordable housing apartments built on 2nd Street.

“You walk through there today, and our Police Department can attest to we get the least amount of police response calls in comparison to any other apartment complex in Downey... what I’m hearing everything now,

it’s really about the nimbyism; ‘not in my back yard,’” said Vasquez. “The reality is there are very few finite land opportunities. I don’t blame you for feeling the way you do. When there’s an unknown factor is to have fear.”

City Manager Gilbert Livas also chimed in, including an almost uncharacteristic snap back when interrupted by a member of the audience. When a South Gate resident shouted out “put it in your city,” Livas replied with “It is in our city,” before adding “that’s the wonderful thing about having sovereign borders is that you can determine where it is.”

Livas’s argument was rooted in a need to serve those who have served their country.

“We stick a gun on an 18-year-old, we send him overseas, they come back, they protect us, and we say ‘Sorry, but not in my back yard,’” said Livas. “Downey is different, we have Character Counts. It’s called responsibility. It’s called trustworthiness, citizenship, caring and fairness. That’s what we think those veterans deserve.”

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# *The history of Thanksgiving*

Thanksgiving Day is a national holiday in the United States, and Thanksgiving 2018 occurs on Thursday, November 22. In 1621, the Plymouth colonists and Wampanoag Indians shared an autumn harvest feast that is acknowledged today as one of the first Thanksgiving celebrations in the colonies. For more than two centuries, days of thanksgiving were celebrated by individual colonies and states. It wasn't until 1863, in the midst of the Civil War, that President Abraham Lincoln proclaimed a national Thanksgiving Day to be held each November.

## Thanksgiving at Plymouth

In September 1620, a small ship called the Mayflower left Plymouth, England, carrying 102 passengers—an assortment of religious separatists seeking a new home where they could freely practice their faith and other individuals lured by the promise of prosperity and land ownership in the New World. After a treacherous and uncomfortable crossing that lasted 66 days, they dropped anchor near the tip of Cape Cod, far north of their intended destination at the mouth of the Hudson River. One month later, the Mayflower crossed Massachusetts Bay, where the Pilgrims, as they are now commonly known, began the work of establishing a village at Plymouth.

Throughout that first brutal winter, most of the colonists remained on board the ship, where they suffered from exposure, scurvy and outbreaks of contagious disease. Only half of the Mayflower's original passengers and crew lived to see their first New England spring. In March, the remaining settlers moved ashore, where they received an astonishing visit from an Abenaki Indian who greeted them in English. Several days later, he returned with another Native American, Squanto, a member of the Pawtuxet tribe who had been kidnapped by an English sea captain and sold into slavery before escaping to London and returning to his homeland on an exploratory expedition. Squanto taught the Pilgrims, weakened by malnutrition and illness, how to cultivate corn, extract sap from maple trees, catch fish in the rivers and avoid poisonous plants. He also helped the settlers forge an alliance with the Wampanoag, a local tribe, which would endure for more than 50 years and tragically remains one of the sole examples of harmony between European colonists and Native Americans.

In November 1621, after the Pilgrims' first corn harvest proved successful, Governor William Bradford organized a celebratory feast and invited a group of the fledgling colony's Native American allies, including the Wampanoag chief Massasoit. Now remembered as America's "first Thanksgiving"—although the Pilgrims themselves may not have used the term at the

time—the festival lasted for three days. While no record exists of the historic banquet's exact menu, the Pilgrim chronicler Edward Winslow wrote in his journal that Governor Bradford sent four men on a “fowling” mission in preparation for the event, and that the Wampanoag guests arrived bearing five deer. Historians have suggested that many of the dishes were likely prepared using traditional Native American spices and cooking methods. Because the Pilgrims had no oven and the Mayflower's sugar supply had dwindled by the fall of 1621, the meal did not feature pies, cakes or other desserts, which have become a hallmark of contemporary celebrations.

## Thanksgiving Becomes an Official Holiday

Pilgrims held their second Thanksgiving celebration in 1623 to mark the end of a long drought that had threatened the year's harvest and prompted Governor Bradford to call for a religious fast. Days of fasting and thanksgiving on an annual or occasional basis became common practice in other New England settlements as well. During the American Revolution, the Continental Congress designated one or more days of thanksgiving a year, and in 1789 George Washington issued the first Thanksgiving proclamation by the national government of the United States; in it, he called upon Americans to express their gratitude for the country's war of independence and the successful ratification of the U.S. Constitution. His successors John Adams and James Madison also designated days of thanks during their presidencies.

In 1817, New York became the first of several states to officially adopt an annual Thanksgiving holiday; each celebrated it on a different day, however, and the American South remained largely unfamiliar with the tradition. In 1827, the noted magazine editor and prolific writer Sarah Josepha Hale—author, among countless other things, of the nursery rhyme “Mary Had a Little Lamb”—launched a campaign to establish Thanksgiving as a national holiday. For 36 years, she published numerous editorials and sent scores of letters to governors, senators, presidents and other politicians. Abraham Lincoln finally heeded her request in 1863, at the height of the Civil War, in a proclamation entreating all Americans to ask God to “commend to his tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife” and to “heal the wounds of the nation.” He scheduled Thanksgiving for the final Thursday in November, and it was celebrated on that day every year until 1939, when Franklin D. Roosevelt moved the holiday up a week in an attempt to spur retail sales during the Great Depression. Roosevelt’s plan, known derisively as Franksgiving, was met with passionate opposition, and in 1941 the president reluctantly signed a bill making Thanksgiving the fourth Thursday in November.

## Thanksgiving Traditions

In many American households, the Thanksgiving celebration has lost much of its original religious significance; instead, it now centers on cooking and sharing a bountiful meal with family and friends. Turkey, a Thanksgiving staple so ubiquitous it has become all but synonymous with the holiday, may or may not have been on offer when the Pilgrims hosted the inaugural feast in 1621. Today, however, nearly 90 percent of Americans eat the bird—whether roasted, baked or deep-fried—on Thanksgiving, according to the National Turkey Federation. Other traditional foods include stuffing, mashed potatoes, cranberry sauce and pumpkin pie. Volunteering is a common Thanksgiving Day activity, and communities often



hold food drives and host free dinners for the less fortunate.

Parades have also become an integral part of the holiday in cities and towns across the United States. Presented by Macy's department store since 1924, New York City's Thanksgiving Day parade is the largest and most famous, attracting some 2 to 3 million spectators along its 2.5-mile route and drawing an enormous television audience. It typically features marching bands, performers, elaborate floats conveying various celebrities and giant balloons shaped like cartoon characters.

Beginning in the mid-20th century and perhaps even earlier, the president of the United States has “pardoned” one or two Thanksgiving turkeys each year, sparing the birds from slaughter and sending them to a farm for retirement. A number of U.S. governors also perform the annual turkey pardoning ritual.

## Thanksgiving Controversies

For some scholars, the jury is still out on whether the feast at Plymouth really constituted the first Thanksgiving in the United States. Indeed, historians have recorded other ceremonies of thanks among European settlers in North America that predate the Pilgrims' celebration. In 1565, for instance, the Spanish explorer Pedro Menéndez de Avilé invited members of the local Timucua tribe to a dinner in St. Augustine, Florida, after holding a mass to thank God for his crew's safe arrival. On December 4, 1619, when 38 British settlers reached a site known as Berkeley Hundred on the banks of Virginia's James River, they read a proclamation designating the date as "a day of thanksgiving to Almighty God."

to the American public, and especially to schoolchildren. In their view, the traditional narrative paints a deceptively sunny portrait of relations between the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag people, masking the long and bloody history of conflict between Native Americans and European settlers that resulted in the deaths of millions. Since 1970, protesters have gathered on the day designated as Thanksgiving at the top of Cole's Hill, which overlooks Plymouth Rock, to commemorate a "National Day of Mourning." Similar events are held in other parts of the country.

## Thanksgiving's Ancient Origins

Although the American concept of Thanksgiving developed in the colonies of New England, its roots can be traced back to the other side of the Atlantic. Both the Separatists who came over on the Mayflower and the Puritans who arrived soon after brought with them a tradition of providential holidays—days of fasting during difficult or pivotal moments and days of feasting and celebration to thank God in times of plenty.

As an annual celebration of the harvest and its bounty, moreover, Thanksgiving falls under a category of festivals that spans cultures, continents and millennia. In ancient times, the Egyptians, Greeks and Romans feasted and paid tribute to their gods after the fall harvest. Thanksgiving also bears a resemblance to the ancient Jewish harvest festival of Sukkot. Finally, historians have noted that Native Americans had a rich tradition of commemorating the fall harvest with feasting and merrymaking long before Europeans set foot on their shores.

## History.com
