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Marilyn Haight - a personal remembrance

▶ Norwalk resident Marilyn Haught was tragically killed in a hit-and-run the night before Thanksgiving. She left behind grieving family, friends and former co-workers.

> friend of mine has been on the local news recently for a very sad reason. She was the victim of a hit-and-run accident on Pioneer Boulevard the night before Thanksgiving.

Eleven of us had just been to Marilyn's house one week earlier for a regular monthly get-together. It is hard to accept how quickly life can change.

We heard that Marilyn did not want to travel on Thanksgiving, so her daughter and grandson were coming to Norwalk from Palm

Late Wednesday afternoon, Marilyn decided to walk four blocks to a local market to get a few last-minute groceries. She could have driven, but she often enjoyed the gentle exercise of a neighborhood stroll. There are traffic lights at the intersection and she crossed the busy street safely the first time. But it was much darker when she headed home and the images in the video from the street camera show car lights and street lights.

The TV reporter said she made it across to the center island and "was possibly confused." Perhaps this means she wasn't supposed to proceed. Perhaps the driver was not at fault for hitting her, but driving on without stopping is an egregious crime.

Marilyn died shortly afterwards at the hospital. Her daughter did not find out what happened until she arrived at Marilyn's house, found the car in the garage with no one at home, and contacted the

This is a tragic way to learn about the death of one's mother, especially since Marilyn was still a spirited and self-reliant person at age 79. As a friend, I console myself with knowing that she was living the way she wanted to.

Marilyn was from South Dakota and she flew back every summer to spend a month with her sister. She was a person who remained involved with friends and neighbors and liked to go on trips arranged for seniors groups. She had a strong sense of community.

Marilyn's small three-bedroom house where she raised her two daughters was immaculately maintained - regularly repainted and refreshed. The uncluttered, slightly eclectic décor had an elegant look. Hand-crocheted doilies protected the surface of living room end tables while an area rug with an abstract pattern covered the gleaming hardwood floor in front of her couch. Pictures of her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren graced chrome shelving and her upright piano. She told me that she used to play

Up until a few years ago, Marilyn had been an avid gardener and her backyard crops reflected her high standards. I was envious when I saw her romaine lettuce standing upright, at crisp attention, in perfect rows. The look and taste of all her produce could meet standards for Gelson's.

Marilyn was a modest, salt-of-the-earth person who shied away from the spotlight and did not want any special recognition when she retired after 45 years as a school cafeteria worker. But all who spoke at her memorial service echoed a common theme - Marilyn was generous with her time and effort and she made a difference in the lives of those around her.

I know with certainty that her behind-the-scene actions made a difference in the lives of many students at the school where I taught, and reflected the wisdom behind the saying, "It takes a village to raise a child." Marilyn's impact resulted from her daily approach to life - work hard, do your best, and help people when you can.

Hands-on Activities

I met Marilyn in 1997 in La Mirada. Our third-grade team of teachers was committed to hands-on activities as a way of helping students understand and retain cognitive learning skills. Classroom activities included gardening, sewing, music, artwork, and baking.

The month of Thanksgiving was a perfect opportunity for culinary activities. Every year, as part of our historical study of the Pilgrims coming to America, we planned a Thanksgiving feast for the last day before the holiday break.

We made cranberry sauce and apple sauce from scratch using a hot plate in class. Students peeled and cored the apples with a little gizmo, and everyone had to taste a bite of a raw cranberry to become familiar with this plant. This class-prepared food was part of our

cafeteria coolers for a few days before we were ready to eat. This was extra work for her because items had to be rearranged so there was always enough room for the daily supply of milk, juice, and certain lunch food.

We also made pumpkin pies in class as a way for students to apply their math and reading skills in a real-world situation. This ambitious activity required the assistance of parent volunteers - and Marilyn. The cafeteria still had a working stove and she agreed to bake our pies.

It would have been understandable if Marilyn had said no to our wild idea because her official duties required more than just passing out food and collecting money. Substantial paperwork was required for her to keep track of daily deliveries from the central kitchen and note which classes planned field trips so that less food was ordered for those days. Marilyn also kept count of students on special lunch programs and sent along sack lunches for those students when they were on field trips.

Marilyn could have nixed our idea of baking pies at school and her work day would have been much simpler. But she viewed our request as a way to help the teachers and the school.

Pumpkin Pies

The day before baking, we reviewed the recipe thoroughly in class. Working in groups of four, each student volunteered to bring an ingredient – a can of pumpkin filling, sugar, spices, eggs, etc. We teachers provided the premade pie shells. We never had any trouble getting parent volunteers to help with this activity.

We started first thing in the morning after taking roll and turning in homework. Tables were cleared and covered with clean butcher aper. Each table had its own set of measuring cups and spoons. Then the students worked cooperatively to prepare the filling.

It got pretty messy as students measured out the sugar, broke open the eggs, scooped the pumpkin out of the can, and sometimes argued over not getting a full turn at stirring.

When all the pies from a class were ready, parents placed them on cookie sheets, gathered up all the dirty mixing bowls and measuring items, put everything on a wheeled cart, and headed for Marilyn and the cafeteria. The walkways were bumpy and sometimes the soupier filling would slosh out. With 20 students per class, each class always had at least five pies.

Parents used the cafeteria dishwasher and tried to stay out of the way while Marilyn supervised the baking of the pies, even as kids stood in line for snacks at recess and meals for lunch. It was a lot of work to make sure the pies were done just right and there was also oven and counter clean-up. Then Marilyn saw that our pies were cooled and stored appropriately.

Thanksgiving Feast

The cafeteria coolers were bursting with our food the night before our Thanksgiving feast. More food was sometimes brought in the next morning, and our students made their own butter from cream. My class cooked sweet potatoes on the hot plate that morning and seasoned them with our butter and salt and pepper. We sent plates of food to the principal and office staff and aides.

For me, this yearly event was awe-inspiring because it had such Marilyn allowed our three classes to store this food in the a powerful effect on the students. It came about only through the cooperation of so many adults - and none of it would have happened without Marilyn.

Baking Bread

At another time of the year Marilyn also helped our students bake small, individual loaves of bread – again made from scratch. An agricultural organization provided the supplies. This time each student kneaded his/her own dough, let it rise during recess, and kneaded it again before we sent the 20 loaves to the cafeteria.

These classroom activities may seem trivial and non-academic to some, but learning how food is prepared is a profound experience for many children in today's world. My generation learned to do many of these things at home, and we brought this knowledge with us to class. We started our studies from a different place. This is not always possible for today's working parents.

Our cooperative school activities also promoted class bonding. Some students came from troubled families and occasionally we even had children who were homeless. Preparing food in a cooperative setting contributed to an atmosphere of peace and camaraderie.

These moments in school were a needed gift for some children, and they were made possible by Marilyn's generous spirit. I treasure these inspiring memories, and I know many parent volunteers feel

Friends and neighbors at Marilyn's memorial service shared anecdotes with a similar theme - Marilyn made a difference in the world. She paid it forward in the ways she knew how. It was my good fortune to have known her.

Sheriff's deputy charged with 2016 shooting

NORWALK- A Los Angeles he returned to the driver's side County sheriff's deputy was charged Tuesday with voluntary manslaughter for an on-duty fatal shooting of an unarmed motorist two years ago at a convenience store gas station in Norwalk.

Luke Liu, 40, was charged with one count of voluntary manslaughter and was arraigned at the Foltz Criminal Justice

On Feb. 24, 2016, Liu was on patrol in the 10900 block of Alondra Boulevard in Norwalk when he spotted a vehicle that he believed may have been stolen and pulled up behind it, prosecutors

Liu approached and stood near the driver's side door, according to prosecutors. Liu then went whether an officer is charged for to the rear of the car and when shooting someone.

to drive away at approximately 5

Liu then allegedly drew his service weapon, ran alongside the car and fired seven shots at Garcia, who was struck four times and killed.

The estimated time between when Liu approached Garcia and the shooting was about 20 seconds, prosecutors said. Several civilians witnessed the incident, a portion of which was captured on

District Attorney Jackie Lacey said the manslaughter charge was warranted because the use of force was not reasonable -- the criminal factor that often determines

"We believe the officer's use door, Francisco Garcia, 26, began of deadly force was unjustified and unreasonable under the circumstances," Lacey said.

> "There is an inherent danger for law enforcement officers every time they put on the uniforum, added. "We applaud Lacey their dedication and bravery to split-second decisions in potentially life-threatening situations. But we must also hold them accountable when their conduct is unlawful."

If convicted, Liu faces a possible maximum sentence of 21 years in state prison.

Earlier this year, the L.A. County Board of Supervisors approved a \$1.75 million settlement with Garcia's family.

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Does 'Merry Christmas' matter?

Is "Merry Christmas" a thing of the past, a greeting from a bygone era, a remnant of a past with which we no longer want to be associated? We might not be there yet, but if current trends continue, we're not far off. If so, it's a shame, a further coarsening of the culture — and worse. It is yet another example of the on Christmas — or, more precisely, a war on the religious nature removal of religion, specifically Christianity, from a country that has long been the most religious major industrialized democracy in the world.

Proponents of "happy holidays" argue that this is no big deal. They say the advocates of saying "merry Christmas" are making a mountain out of a molehill. There is no "war on Christmas," they say. But the "happy holidays" advocates want it both ways. They dismiss promoters of "merry Christmas" as hysterical while simultaneously replacing "merry Christmas" with "happy holidays"; "Christmas vacation" with "winter vacation"; and "Christmas party" with "holiday party."

or not?

The answer should be obvious. It's very important. That's why so much effort is devoted to substituting other words for "Christmas." And these efforts have been extraordinarily successful. In place of the universal "merry Christmas" of my youth, in recent decades I have been wished "happy holidays" by virtually every waiter and waitress in virtually every restaurant I have dined; by virtually everyone who welcomes me at any business; by flight attendants and pilots; and by just about everyone else.

When I respond, "Merry Christmas!" I often sense I have created tension. I suspect many of those to whom I wish "Merry Christmas!" are probably relieved to hear someone utter what has become the "C" word, but all the sensitivity training they've had

to undergo creates cognitive dissonance.

The opponents of "merry Christmas" and other uses of the word "Christmas" know exactly what they're doing. They're disingenuous when they dismiss defenders of "merry Christmas" as "fabricating" some "war on Christmas." Of course there's a war of America. The left in America, like the left in Europe, wants to create a thoroughly secular society, not only a secular government - which is a desirable goal and which, in any event, has been the case in America — but a secular society.

Most people do not realize that the left believes in secularism as fervently as religious Christians and Jews believe in the Bible. That's why "merry Christmas" bothers secular activists. It's a blatant reminder of how religious America is — and always has been. That's why I predict activists on the left will sooner or later seek to remove Christmas as a national holiday.

Now, the left doesn't announce that its agenda is to thoroughly So, is all this elimination of the word "Christmas" important secularize American and European societies. Instead, it camouflages what it is doing by offering the "inclusiveness" argument: "Merry Christmas" or "Christmas party" or "Christmas vacation" is not

> This inclusiveness argument plays on Americans' highly developed sense of decency. But the argument is preposterous: Who, exactly, is being "excluded" when one wishes someone "merry Christmas"? Non-Christians?

> I'm a non-Christian. I'm a Jew. Christmas is not a religious holy day for me. But I'm an American, and Christmas is an American national holiday. Therefore, as an American, it is my holiday though not my holy day — as much as it is for my fellow Americans who are Christian. It was a Jewish-American, Irving Berlin, who wrote "White Christmas," one of America's most popular

Christmas songs. In fact, according to a Jewish musician writing in The New York Times, "almost all the most popular Christmas songs were written by Jews."

Apparently, all these American Jews felt quite included in

And while on the subject of Jews, here's a question for those Jews disturbed by "merry Christmas": Should Israeli radio and TV stop saying "Shabbat Shalom" to be more inclusive of Israel's non-Jewish minority?

It borders on the misanthropic, not to mention the meanspirited, to want to deny nearly all of your fellow citizens the joy of having Christmas parties or being wished a merry Christmas.

By not wishing me a merry Christmas, you are not being inclusive. You are excluding me from one of my nation's national

But even if Christmas were not a national holiday, I would want pilots to wish their passengers a merry Christmas, companies to have Christmas parties and schools to continue to have Christmas vacations. Just because I don't personally celebrate Christmas, why would I demand my society drop the word "Christmas" when the holiday is celebrated by 90 percent of my fellow Americans?

The vast majority of Americans who celebrate Christmas — and who treat non-Christians so well — deserve better.

Please say "merry Christmas" and "Christmas party" and "Christmas vacation." If you refuse to, you're not "inclusive." You're hurtful to most of your fellow Americans.

Will the Supreme Court overturn Roe vs. Wade?

When the Supreme Court declined on Monday to hear cases brought by Louisiana and Kansas attempting to exclude Planned Parenthood and other abortion providers from their Medicaid programs, legal soothsayers were out in full force opining about what it means for the future of abortion rights under the newly constituted court

The decision drew a dissent from three conservative justices, Clarence Thomas, Neil Gorsuch and Samuel Alito, who suggested that the court was ducking the cases because they involved Planned Parenthood and touched on abortion. But, intriguingly, the court's two other conservatives, Chief Justice John Roberts Jr. and the court's latest member, Brett Kavanaugh, sided with the court's liberals in rejecting the case.

What are we to make of it?

It's not easy to read the tea leaves here because the cases didn't pose a direct challenge to the constitutionality of abortion restrictions. Instead, they centered on whether those states could exclude Planned Parenthood from providing contraception and other health services in the Medicaid program. Those states object to Planned Parenthood providing access to abortion outside Medicaid, which does not cover the procedure. Had the court accepted the states' arguments, tens of thousands of indigent women could have lost the health care they receive from

the group.

In that sense, supporters of access to reproductive health care were right to be relieved on Monday. But there is still substantial reason to be concerned that when the court does take up a case on abortion, it will seek to undermine the right to one.

Here's what we know. Chief Justice Roberts was in dissent in the court's decision two years ago in Whole Women's Health v. Hellerstedt, in which the court struck down restrictions that served no legitimate health interest and would have shuttered 75 percent of the clinics in Texas. President Trump promised to appoint justices who would overrule Roe v. Wade. Justice Kavanaugh, when he was an appeals court judge, voted to allow the federal government to delay the abortion of an unaccompanied immigrant minor held in federal custody. State legislatures are racing to pass abortion restrictions. And the court is now being asked to take up cases challenging those restrictions. So supporters of abortion rights have reason to worry. The court's decision on Monday doesn't take that away.

But we also know that the chief justice cares about the court's institutional legitimacy. He has often expressed concern about how partisan confirmation hearings for court nominees can damage the court's reputation as an independent arbiter. He has spoken of his obligation to try to achieve consensus, and in the 2016-17 term, nearly 60 percent of the court's decisions were

unanimous. That often means narrowly drawn decisions that make only incremental changes. Most recently, Chief Justice Roberts rebuked President Trump for attacking a judge as "an Obama judge," declaring that there are no Obama judges or Trump judges — only judges.

The court's legitimacy, of course, rests on more than unanimity or incremental change. It rests on respect for precedent and the idea that court's decisions don't swing with each new president. That means that the court doesn't lightly upend precedents like Roe v. Wade, now in place for nearly half a century, and already reaffirmed once against a concerted effort to overturn it. And most important, the court ought to be especially careful about upending settled expectations about core constitutional rights such as the right to choose an abortion — that have played a central role in the ongoing struggle by women for equal status.

The question now is not what the Supreme Court soothsayers will tell us, but whether Chief Justice Roberts and his fellow conservatives uphold the integrity of the court, or use their new majority to deliver on Trump's promise.



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

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

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School board considers shutting campus

► Facing declining enrollment, Downey Unified faces the possibility of closing Carpenter Elementary.

Another option is to transition the campus into a dual immersion school.

DOWNEY - As it faces declining enrollment, Downev Unified School District has begun discussing significant changes to Carpenter Elementary School in an attempt to avoid a school

At October's State of the Schools address, Superintendent John Garcia noted that schools region and state-wide are all facing enrollment shifts as families continue to have less children and move farther inland.

Discussions on how to combat declining enrollment in Downey have been taking place since the summer, with the district even upping marketing efforts to draw new students to the district.

Specifically, Carpenter Elementary School currently has the lowest enrollment numbers in the District with a little over 400 students.

According to DUSD Public Relations Coordinator Ashley Greaney, the District is trying to avoid having to close down a school but admitted there are "lots of things on the table."

She says that the District has been talking to staff since the beginning of the year, and wants to talk to the community and get feedback before moving forward on any position.

Greaney did, however, confirm that one potential option was to transition Carpenter to a dual immersion / international baccalaureate

Should that change take place, it would start with the T-K and Kindergarten classes next year and grow with those students. Those currently enrolled would finish their normal curriculum.

Curriculum would then be 90 percent Spanish and 10 percent English, said Greaney. While some training would need to take place for teachers and staff, Greaney explained that most teachers already possess Cross-cultural, Bilingual, Language and Academic (BCLAD) Development credentials.

Carpenter Elementary currently schools only 4th and 5th grades and is fed into by Alameda, Imperial, and Ward Elementary Schools, teach up to grade three.

Greaney added discussions at Alameda, Imperial and Ward would take place later this week.

Details about a possible closure gained exposure Monday after a post on the community-run "Positively Downey" Facebook page.

The post, made by Downey resident and group member Kathleen Gargas, said,

"School board meeting is tomorrow night. Parents did vou know that they're closing Sussman Middle School??"

In a later comment, Gargas said that she first heard of the possible closing from a school employee.

Gargas, a retired Special Education assistant who still occasionally substitutes, declined to be interviewed.

Greaney said that the District hopes to come to an answer by

Cal High boys water polo team wins first-ever CIF championship

WHITTIER - The California High School boys' water polo team celebrated its first CIF-Southern Section Division 5 title, edging out Brentwood High 10-9 at the William Woollett Aquatics Center in Irvine in November, capping a successful year in which the team compiled a

The Cal Condors were led by senior utility player Jesus Padilla, who scored seven goals during the Nov. 10 match, including the eventual game-winner with 1:29 remaining in the fourth period, and senior goalkeeper Adan De La Loza, who recorded seven saves. For his superior effort, Padilla was named the San Gabriel Valley Tribune Boy Athlete of the Week on Nov. 12.

The CIF title is the first for Cal High in any sport since 2000, and only the fourth title in the school's 65-year history. Cal High advanced to the CIF SoCal Division 3 Boys' Water Polo Championships, held Nov. 16-17, where the team captured second place.

"I could not be prouder of our student-athletes and Coach David Brown and his staff, who have worked tremendously hard to build a championship-winning program," Cal High Principal Bill Schloss said. "Winning the title has really brought the campus together. Condor spirit is sky high.'

Cal High's title run caps a remarkable month of November for Whittier Union athletics, with many student-athletes distinguishing themselves with personal bests and triumphs.

Whittier Union cross country teams made strong showings at the CIF-SS Championships, held Nov. 17 in Riverside.

Cal High, led by senior Angel Salinas and junior Ethan Ruiz, finished in seventh place in Division I, qualifying for the CIF State Championships. La Serna High, led by junior Gerald Baltzer and senior Marco Perez, finished in eighth place, narrowly missing the cut. Whittier High, led by senior Josiah Mrla, finished in 16th place in Division 3. Pioneer High – 605 League champions – finished in 11th place in Division 4 while junior Nathaniel Estrada qualified as an individual runner for the state meet.
