# Toddler shoots mom with shotgun

NORWALK - A mother in Norwalk was hospitalized after her child accidentally shot her while he was in the backseat of their car Wednesday.

Los Angeles County sheriff's deputies and crime scene tape surrounded Ramona Preschool in the afternoon hours following the shooting in the parking lot.

"We received a call of an assault with a deadly weapon gunshot victim. When deputies got there, they found an adult female Hispanic with what appeared to be a gunshot wound to her upper torso," Deputy Marvin Crowder said.

The woman was shot while sitting in the driver's seat of a black Honda outside the school. Her children were in the backseat when her son, who is under the age of 5, somehow got hold of a shotgun.

"It appears to be an accident with the young kid pulling the trigger of the shotgun in the backseat of his own car and striking his mother," Crowder Crowder

The mother who was shot is listed in fair condition. Her children were placed in the custody of Los Angeles County Department of Children and Family Services.

Authorities are investigating how a loaded shotgun ended up in a vehicle full of children.

# Man hurt in drive-by shooting

**NORWALK** – A man is expected to survive after he was struck in a drive-by shooting Sunday night.

Authorities said the shooting took place at about 8 p.m. on the 11100 block of Ratliffe Street, between Fairford and Dalwood

The shooter fired his weapon from a passing car, striking the victim, officials said.

No description of the shooter of the vehicle was released by authorities. A motive is not clear.

The victim was transported to a local hospital where he was listed in stable condition. His name was not released.

# \$10K reward renewed in 2012 killing

**NORWALK** – The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors renewed a reward Tuesday for information that helps detectives solve the killing of a tow truck driver gunned down more than six years ago in Norwalk.

Supervisor Janice recommended extending a \$10,000 reward, set to expire Feb. 1, in the case of 22-year-old Robert Garcia, who was shot just before midnight on June 28, 2012, after finishing up a shift at Vernola's Tow in the 13500 block of Norwalk Boulevard.

Security video from the tow yard showed three men confronting Garcia near a parked

"Robert fled eastbound on Front Street toward the business, but was fatally shot multiple times at the front door of the building. Robert was a hardworking provider for his budding family, and had two small children at the time of his death," according to a sheriff's statement issued last year.

The suspects were described only as Hispanic males in their early to late teens, with thin builds. Two wore dark clothing, and one wore light clothing. Garcia's mother spoke at a June 2018 news conference at the Hall of Justice.

# Talon Marks posts entire archive online

Cerritos College's student newspaper completes a monumental task: posting every edition from its 62-year history online.

NORWALK -The Talon Marks's entire catalog of newspapers — 62 years' worth of stories chronicling life on the Cerritos College campus - is now online and available to the public.

Each print edition, from the very first publication in 1957 to the most recent issue, was scanned and made into a searchable PDF using OCR technology, school officials said.


The archives are available at talonmarks.com/ online archives, where the editions are categorized by academic year.

The project was a collaborative effort between the college's Mass Communications Department and the Cerritos College Library after they both recognized a need to digitally archive the newspapers as historical documents.

The entire process took eight years to complete. Each newspaper had to be prepared for scanning and then digitally processed for

"The Talon Marks Digital Newspaper Project is vital in preserving the history of our college," said Fine Arts and Communications Dean Gary Pritchard. "I am proud of Alicia Edquist and the tremendous effort that went into digitizing 62 years

The idea for a digital archive came about in 2010, when the newspaper archives in the library were damaged by a leaky roof.

"Being able to preserve our campus history was a priority for us when we began this project,' said Edquist. "Some of the print editions of Talon Marks had been damaged and we knew it was time to make sure our newspaper's legacy was preserved. It was vital of Talon Marks. # The Supreme Court just ended my military career

On Tuesday, the Supreme Court ruled, 5-4, that the Trump administration could reinstate its policy barring most transgender people from serving in the military while several cases challenging the policy are being decided. The decision was both a devastating blow to me personally, and a disturbing sign of what is to come for transgender people in the United States.

I graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 1997, and was on active duty for over a decade. When I began transitioning in 2010, I transferred from the Naval Reserves, which I had joined in 2008, to the Individual Ready Reserves, an administrative status that allows service members to deal with medical issues before returning to full duty. By spring 2012, I had resolved the "issues" at my own expense, and was ready to return to full duty — in my case, as a Navy helicopter pilot.

The problem was that at the time, the military's medical regulations prohibited transgender people from serving. I then set off on years of volunteer work on my own time researching transgender military issues. This included educational outreach, research, policy development and coordinating with the Pentagon to build an evidence-based standard for transgender service, based on the lessons learned from the other 18 countries that allow transgender people to serve.

In 2015, the Department of Defense stopped discharging people for being transgender and began the open and transparent process of researching how to institute an inclusive policy. This included an assessment of the costs, in terms of both money and readiness, of integrating transgender troops. Researchers found both impacts to be negligible.

By 2016, a policy was in place for transgender people already serving. Two years later, the military put in place a process for new recruits, officer candidates and people on inactive status like myself. The day after that, I contacted my recruiter to begin the process of rejoining the military.

Over the past year, I've had countless medical and psychological exams in my quest to return to the job I was trained to do: flying Blackhawk helicopters. This involved a lot of time off work and considerable travel, all at my own expense. At every turn, the people examining me reached the same conclusion: I was "aeromedically adapted" — fit to fly — and able to return to the service. There was, finally, a chance that I might be able finish my career after 16 good years of service.

I was hoping against hope, throughout this process, that I'd be able to join my friends who had fought alongside me for the right to serve openly. Nearly every week I would see pictures of them in Syria, Iraq and Afghanistan. It gave me a thrill in December to see a picture of four of them together at Bagram Air Base in Afghanistan. One was an airborne ranger, and one was Special Forces.

All of this makes the administration's dogged attempt to undo everything achieved over the last few years even more baffling. The ban was developed in secret, without the sort of careful study that went into the policy it reversed. It does not reflect any current medical understanding of transgender people, and it has been denounced by the American Medical Association, the American Psychological Association and the American Psychiatric Association.

No one, including the lawyers for the Trump administration, has been able to show that inclusion of transgender service members or providing care to them has had any measurable negative impact on morale, readiness or unit cohesion. The chiefs of staff of all four

service branches of the military have testified to Congress that there have been no issues.

The Supreme Court decision isn't about me, though. It isn't even about the dozens of people I advised to follow a path back to service similar to mine. It is about what this means for transgender people in the United States as a whole.

While it is true that the high court's decision is not final—and that, in fact, it may have had more to do with lower court injunctions against Mr. Trump's policy, rather than the policy itself—the signal it sends is clear. The cruel pointlessness of the president's policy, which had led to the injunctions, was not pressing enough to move the court's five conservative justices.

Their decision signals a weakening of any shelter transgender people might find under the Equal Protection Clause of the 14th Amendment. The court is saying that government discrimination based not on evidence, but solely on animus against transgender people, is permissible.

trying to find a way to serve my country in uniform again. The court also rejected the administration's request for a quick hearing on the ban itself, which means at least another year of waiting. By then I will have likely aged out of my eligibility.

For me, however, it probably marks the end of almost 10 years of

If this were through some failing of mine, I could accept it. But it speaks volumes about where we are as a country that the opportunity for many to serve should be denied by the prejudices of a few.

The longest government shutdown in U.S. history continues today.

Wrapped up in the DACA discussion should be a critically important debate on border security. As a nation we all can agree that maintaining the sovereignty of our country is a priority. Whether you are affiliated with a political party or not, the mere fact that drugs, weapons and gang members can make it across our borders should be terrifying. One is one too many.

Congress has a real chance at securing our borders by allocating funding to hire additional border patrol, pay for more training and new equipment and technology. And yes, for a barrier in places where the security experts that have been asked indicated they needed it (calling it a wall is instant fighting words for some so let's say fencing or barrier of some kind). This is not an immigrant issue, this is a safety matter in certain places. Again, both parties at some point in time have said the same thing.

Which leaves debate and funding for comprehensive immigration reform.

Policy on this issue should be viewed from a lens of compassion towards those seeking a better life. The manner by which we currently process applications and intake applicants is not compatible with our values systems and our integrity as a leader in the world.

Political leaders on both sides should find common ground within these issues and work on the areas where they are close to compromise. These are not just wins for their parties, they are wins for our nation. Working on national solutions in a bipartisan way brings the rest of us closer together as a nation. Immigration reform, DACA reform and border security all sound like a win-win for everyone.

Now is the time to put everything on the table and reopen the government by bridging divides through real negotiations and agreements on issues on significance to us all.

# More self-inflicted presidential legal woes

Last week, the investigative arm of BuzzFeed sparked a media frenzy with a report claiming that two federal law enforcement sources had informed its reporters that Michael Cohen, President Donald Trump's former lawyer and confidant, had told special counsel Robert Mueller that Trump counseled him to lie to Congress about the status of Trump's attempts to build Trump Tower Moscow.

The BuzzFeed piece also claimed that the sources revealed that Mueller's folks had received documentary evidence from Cohen to back up his allegations.

The reason for the media frenzy was the realization by House Democrats that counseling someone to lie to a tribunal constitutes the crime of subornation of perjury and, if the tribunal is engaged in a legitimate investigation, the crime of obstruction of justice — and both of those crimes are impeachable offenses.

After the BuzzFeed piece had stirred the pot of media interest and Democrats' lust for Trump's political scalp, Mueller issued a very rare one-liner stating that the references in the BuzzFeed piece to what he had received from Cohen were "not accurate."

So, did Mueller's use of "not accurate" mean that Cohen did not, in fact, tell Mueller that the president of the United States had counseled him to lie under oath, or did it mean that Cohen made the allegation that Trump had counseled him to lie but Cohen did not, in fact, give Mueller any corroborating evidence of his allegation? Here is the back story.

In addition to tax evasion and bank fraud, Michael Cohen pleaded guilty late last year to lying to Congress. Cohen lied under oath when he told congressional investigators that Trump's efforts to build Trump Tower Moscow ceased in January 2016 — because, according to Cohen, they actually ceased in June 2016. Cohen said he lied because Trump had asked him to do so and because Cohen wanted his testimony to be consistent with Trump's public campaign

narrative that he had no business dealings in Russia.

The BuzzFeed saga is not all black-and-white and has been exacerbated considerably by the president's public-facing lawyer, Rudolph Giuliani. We know that Mueller's PR person knew of the BuzzFeed piece days in advance and had numerous texts and emails with the BuzzFeed reporters. He did not discourage its publication or challenge its conclusions until 24 hours after publication. We know that neither Cohen nor his lawyers challenged the accuracy of the BuzzFeed piece.

We also know that Giuliani actually went beyond the BuzzFeed allegations. He explained to a reporter for The New Yorker that Mueller has not claimed that the Cohen allegation that President Trump counseled Cohen to lie was inaccurate; rather, the inaccurate statement in the BuzzFeed piece was its reference to the existence of texts and emails corroborating what BuzzFeed claims Trump told Cohen.

Giuliani also told the New Yorker reporter that Trump did, in fact, speak with Cohen about his testimony in advance of it. Do you think Trump told Cohen to tell the truth? That's what the New Yorker reporter asked Giuliani. Giuliani said he knows that Trump did not counsel Cohen to lie because he listened to the tapes. Tapes? What tapes? There are tapes of the Trump-Cohen conversations about Cohen's intended congressional testimony?

Then Giuliani said he misspoke. There are tapes — Cohen infamously recorded his conversations with his most famous client — but not about this. Giuliani then said he had examined emails and text messages and other documentary evidence and he had not found any that corroborated Cohen's claims; so that's what Giuliani says Mueller said was not accurate in the BuzzFeed article. "There is no corroboration that the president told him to lie."

By narrowing the application of "not accurate," by admitting Trump spoke to Cohen about his testimony in advance of it, by suggesting that there are tapes of Trump and Cohen discussing Cohen's testimony but then saying he misspoke, and by stating that the Trump Organization was negotiating with Russian officials for Trump Tower Moscow up to the date of Trump's election and then saying that that was just "a hypothetical," Giuliani has reinforced his own image and the image of his client as being unconcerned with the truth.

Giuliani may be overly histrionic, but he is not stupid — though his legacy as a prosecutor and mayor is unraveling. My guess is he knows that Mueller has much evidence of a criminal conspiracy to receive something of value (the Hillary Clinton emails) between the Trump campaign and Russian intelligence and subtly is trying to tie Trump personally to it. Such a conspiracy would be a felony and produce criminal charges against all who were a part to the agreement. Giuliani also fears that Mueller will use the Trump-Cohen conversation as evidence of obstruction of justice by the president.

So why is Giuliani revealing all this to the media? Here's why. He is following an age-old trial lawyer practice. If the government has evidence harmful to your client, it is easier for the public and the jury to accept the harmful evidence if defense counsel reveals it first, drop by drop, rather than permit the government to release it all at once like an anvil falling into a pond.

Giuliani has told friends that from time to time during his negotiations with Mueller on Trump's potential interview by Mueller and his team, Mueller has shown a few of his cards. Stated differently, Giuliani probably knows some of the damning evidence Mueller has on his client and has chosen to leak it out slowly and even goofily to friendly audiences so that once Mueller unloads his findings, the shock will have been dulled.

Giuliani has also told friends that he has a client who is not paying him and who does not take his advice. Does any of this look good for Trump?

# Worried about robots? The solution is to become one

# By Jim Hightower

We humans have got to get a whole lot smarter, says Elon Musk, the billionaire founder of Tesla automobiles and CEO of SpaceX rockets.

Musk isn't merely reacting to humanity's recent tendency to elect lunatics to lead our countries. Rather, he's trying to warn us about the rapid rise of a radical new technology: artificial intelligence.

In common parlance, he's referring to robots, but these aren't the clunky, somewhat cute machines performing rote tasks. AI essentially has evolved to become an electronic brain — a web of evermore-complex super-computers interacting as one cognitive unit that can program itself, make decisions, and act independently of humans.

These thinking machines are rapidly increasing in number and geometrically advancing their IQ, prompting Musk and others to view AI technologies in apocalyptic terms. As algorithms and systems inevitably grow more sophisticated, he says, "digital intelligence will exceed biological intelligence by a substantial

margin."

In graphic terms, Musk warns that profiteering humans are "summoning the devil" by creating a new superior species of beings that will end up dominating humanity, becoming "an immortal dictator from which we would never escape."

What's weird isn't his dystopian prognosis (other experts agree that runaway bot intelligence is a real threat), but his solution. The way for human beings to compete with AI, says Musk, is to merge with it — not a corporate transaction, but a literal merger: Surgically implant AI devices in human brains with "a bunch of tiny wires" that would fuse people with super intelligence.

Uh-huh... and what could go wrong with that? It's good to have technological geniuses alert us to looming dangers, but maybe the larger community of humanists ought to lead the search for answers




