Margarita Rios takes over as Norwalk mayor

Rios, elected mayor by her city council colleagues on Wednesday, makes public safety her top

Luigi Vernola, who is up for reelection next year, was named vice mayor.

NORWALK – Councilmembers Margarita Rios and Luigi Vernola will serve as mayor and vice mayor of Norwalk for the 2019-20 term.

Rios has spent the 2018-19 serving as Vice Mayor. While it is not always guaranteed that the Vice Mayor takes the Mayor position the following year, Rios was enthusiastically and unanimously voted to be the next head of the council after a nomination from outgoing Mayor Jennifer Perez.

Rios led off her vision statement by honing in on a continued emphasis on public

"At the top of my priorities is public safety," said Rios. "I have a vision that the wonderful families, all the people that live, work, play and visit Norwalk, enjoy one of the safest communities. It is possible, and I am hopeful that the best days are ahead of us."

"In my profession as a law enforcement official, I firsthand understand the value and necessity of establishing close relationships with our sheriff's department, as well as our public safety officers. When we work together, we make the biggest impact. For this reason, I want to continue and expand programs that take services directly to the community, such as our community forums and coffee with a cop.

Rios said she also wishes to emphasize partnerships between schools, businesses, and public safety resources.

"Together we will strengthen the programs for youth prevention, and our business watch program is only going to get better," said Rios.

The mayor also stated that the council will continue the momentum on a comprehensive infrastructure plan, including upgrading walkways to ADA requirements, enhancing streets, and improving parks.

Rios also touched on grant

"We recently received news



that the City of Norwalk was awarded \$336,000 to clean up the San Gabriel Riverbed, Robert White Park, and Norwalk Park," said Rios. "This grant funding will help the city augment the number of hours our team dedicates to these areas.

In the area of community development, Rios said that the city "now has a blueprint that will guide our actions when drawing businesses into our great city.

"With the economic development plan, we will work with developers to bring stores, restaurants, and other businesses that fill a need within our community. My vision for community development includes community driven efforts to improve the health and wellbeing of our community.

Rios closed by saying that "We are working together as a team for the betterment of our community."

"The power of community... enables each of us to reach our success," said Rios. "I look forward to working with our city staff, commissions, businesses residents, and stakeholders, and all of Norwalk for a thriving year."

It may come as a surprise to some that Vernola will serve as Vice Mayor for the following year and not Ayala, considering Vernola served as mayor in the 2017-2018 term and is up for reelection next year.

Ayala - who came in as one of the council's fresh faces with Perez and Rios in 2017 - is the only member of the '17 council

electees to not serve in either of the mayoral positions thus far. Yet, it was he who made the nomination for Vernola at Tuesday's meeting.

When asked why he nominated Vernola instead of pursuing the position himself, Ayala chalked it up to a difference in strengths and backgrounds.

'I think with the things that we're doing right now, that is so heavily economic development, Luigi being a businessman and whatnot, I think he would have had stronger skills than I do in that area," said Ayala. "My area is mostly the government side, and he's more private sector development side. I think he had the stronger skills, and I'm fine with that...I'm willing to take one for the team if it's the best thing for the city.'

Tuesday's meeting also served as a chance for the community to thank Councilmember Perez for her service leading the community as mayor over the past year.

Perez was obviously emotional, however kept a strong chin and ear-to-ear smile through most if not all of the proceedings.

She thanked the community for the opportunity to serve as mayor, but said "We are not done."

"Serving my community as mayor has been an absolute honor and privilege, and I am eternally grateful for your commitment and support not only to me, to my family in this time, but to our city," said Perez. "This is just the beginning. The momentum is strong, and we are continuing to move forward."

Downey congresswoman brings back Dream Act

The bill would extend protections for Temporary Protected Status and Deferred Enforced Departure recipients, providing work permits and blocking deportation for immigrants from countries dealing with war or natural disasters.

DOWNEY - Congresswoman Lucille Roybal-Allard (CA-40), who represents Downey and other Southeast communities in the U.S. House of Representatives, introduced H.R. 6, the Dream and Promise Act, on March 12.

The bill is the 116th Congress's version of the Dream Act, which has been introduced since 2001 to allow the U.S.-raised immigrant youth known as "Dreamers" to earn lawful permanent residence and American citizenship.

H.R. 6 includes protections and a path to citizenship not just for Dreamers, but also for Temporary Protected Status (TPS) and Deferred Enforced Departure (DED) beneficiaries.

Rio Hondo College hosting Dreamers conference

The public conference will feature guest speakers, immigration updates, and a resource fair.

"Education is everyone's right," says college president Teresa Dreyfuss.

WHITTIER - Rio Hondo College will host Dreamers Conference 2019, themed "Together We Dream," from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Friday, April 5 - the first of a trio of events designed to assist undocumented students to pursue their dreams.

The conference is open to all students who support equity and their undocumented classmates, as well as to the community.

It will feature remarks by Board of Trustees President Gary Mendez; a keynote address by Board of Trustees Vice President Oscar Valladares; a Dreamers Panel; an immigration update; resource fair; college finance presentation; mental health presentation; a second keynote from Coalition for Humane Immigrant Rights California Dream Network Statewide Youth Organizer Melody Klingenfuss and an "Undocumented and Unafraid" rally.

The event will be followed by Pathways for Citizenship on April 12 and April 19, events that teach students about different pathways to residency and citizenship.

"Rio Hondo College is committed to ensuring all our students have the opportunity to pursue their goals for education, regardless of residency status," Board of Education President Gary Mendez said. "This Dreamers Conference is part of our commitment to providing students with the resources and support they need to achieve those goals."

Valladares, a former Dreamer, grew up in East Los Angeles after arriving from Guatemala as a child. He is a deputy public conservator with the Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health.

The Dreamers Panel will be facilitated by Counselor Edward Henderson and includes a Rio Hondo College Student, a Cal State Dominguez Hills graduate student, a Cal State Los Angeles alumnus and a Cal State Long Beach graduate student.

Immigration updates will be provided by Yesenia Acosta, an immigration attorney with the Law Offices of Scott Warmuth.

Klingenfuss was born in Guatemala City, Guatemala and grew up on the frontier with El Salvador. She holds a master's degree in nonprofit leadership and management from USC.

The resource fair will include

representatives from Cal State Dominguez Hills, Cal State L.A., Cal Poly Pomona, UC Irvine, UC Santa Cruz, UCLA, UC Riverside, UC Merced, UC Davis, University of La Verne and Whittier College, as well as multiple departments and services from Rio Hondo College. Also attending will be representatives of the Mexican American Legal Defense and Education Fund, the office of U.S. Rep. Linda Sanchez, Community Health Alliance of Pasadena and Peace Over Violence, a legal advocacy project.

continuously living here for the last four years. Dreamers must be employed, pursue higher education, or serve in our military to adjust to Lawful Permanent Resident status. The bill provides a direct pathway to LPR status for current DACA recipients and individuals who already meet these requirements.

"Our bill helps Dreamers to access in-state tuition and gives them access to federal student financial aid. The bill also establishes a grant program for nonprofits, includes new due process provisions, and permits certain eligible Dreamers deported by the Trump Administration to apply for relief.

Wireless companies sell your location data. Federal regulators should stop them.

When you signed up for cellphone service, I bet you didn't expect that your exact location could be sold to anyone for a few hundred dollars. The truth is, your wireless carrier tracks you everywhere you go, whether you like it or not. When used appropriately, this tracking shouldn't be a problem: location information allows emergency services to find you when you need them most.

But wireless carriers have been selling our data in ways that allows it to be resold for potentially dangerous purposes. For instance, stalkers and abusive domestic partners have used location data to track, threaten and attack victims. This industrywide practice facilitates "pay to track" schemes that appear to violate the law and Federal Communications Commission rules.

Companies are collecting and profiting from our private data in hidden ways that leave us vulnerable. As you carry your phone, your wireless carrier records its location so calls and texts can reach you. And you can't opt out of sharing location data with your carrier, as you can with a mobile application. Your carrier needs this data to deliver service. But, according to recent news reports, this real-time phone location data has long been available to entities beyond your wireless carrier, for a price. In one alarming example, reported by Vice, a bounty hunter was able to pay to track a user's location on a map accurate to within a few feet. In another case, a sheriff in Missouri used location data provided by carriers to inappropriately track a judge.

In other words, an ability that seems to come right out of a spy movie is now apparently available to just about anybody with your phone number and some cash. The pay-to-track industry has grown

in the shadows, outside of the public eye and away from the watch of regulators.

Senator Ron Wyden, Democrat of Oregon, first raised the alarm last year, sending a letter to the F.C.C. on May 8 demanding an investigation into abuses by the pay-to-track industry. The Times reported on the issue the same week. Senator Wyden also demanded answers from the major wireless carriers. After that, the top wireless companies said that bounty hunters and others would no longer have access to their customers' locations.

But months later the reports continue. Other recent articles suggest that highly accurate GPS location information from our phones — which, according to F.C.C. rules, should be used to send help to 911 callers — is available on a location—data black market. Since then, wireless companies have said they'll stop selling our location information completely — eventually.

The misuse of this data is downright dangerous. The harms fall disproportionately upon people of color. According to the Pew Research Center, people of color rely more heavily on smartphones for internet access, so they create more of this data, which makes them more vulnerable to tracking. Researchers also know that location data can be used to target them with misinformation or voter suppression tactics. It can also lead to assumptions about a person's race or income level, assumptions that can feed into discriminatory automated decision

What is the government doing to protect us? Congress passed laws years ago protecting this kind of information and entrusted the F.C.C. with the responsibility of enforcing them.

It is unquestionably the F.C.C.'s job to protect consumers and address risks to public safety. Our location information isn't supposed to be used without our knowledge and consent and no chain of handoffs or contracts can eliminate the wireless company's obligations. This is particularly true for the misuse and disclosure of GPS-based 911 location data — which is squarely against F.C.C. rules.

The F.C.C. says it is investigating. But nearly a year after the news first broke, the commission has yet to issue an enforcement action or fine those responsible. This passage of time is significant, as the agency usually has only one year to bring action to hold any wrongdoers accountable before the statute of limitations runs. Some may argue that the F.C.C.'s authority to take action against wireless carriers for this activity has gotten weaker in recent years, with the repeal of consumer-focused privacy and net neutrality rules during the current administration. But I believe that the commission still has ample authority to address these egregious pay-to-track practices.

Federal action is long overdue. As a Democratic commissioner at the Republican-led agency, I can call for action, but the chairman sets the agenda, including deciding whether and how quickly to respond to pay-to-track schemes. The agency's inaction despite these increasingly troubling reports speaks volumes and leaves our duty to the public unfulfilled. The F.C.C. must use its authority to protect consumers and promote public safety, and act swiftly and decisively to stop illegal and dangerous pay-to-track practices once and for all.

Stop denying global warming

Even after Hitler invaded Czechoslovakia and Poland, a strong pacifist movement in Britain opposed a military buildup to confront Nazi Germany. It vilified Winston Churchill as a warmonger for pushing one.

"What is it that Britain and France are fighting for?" Churchill asked rhetorically in a March 1940 broadcast. "If we left off fighting you would soon find out."

Five months later, bombs started dropping on London. Britain found itself alone and teetering on the edge of an invasion by Nazi Germany. And in these dark hours, when a militarily weak Britain suffered frightening losses on the battlefields, politicians who opposed preparing for war blamed Churchill for being a poor wartime leader.

Climate change is a very different kind of peril, but it, too, is menacing our planet with catastrophic consequences for both our natural environment and built civilization. The warnings have been coming fast and furiously for years as the powers in Washington lifted not a finger to deal with the danger. Worse, many denied it is real.

Now listen to Cathy Crain, mayor of Hamburg, Iowa, whose Missouri River town was inundated to the rooftops by apocalyptic flooding.

"I'm looking at global warming — I don't need to see the graphs," Crain said. "I'm living it and everybody else is living it."

Americans are finding out why they must fight. They see the devastating fires, droughts, hurricanes and tornados. They watch towns and beautiful farmland in Iowa, Nebraska and Missouri disappear under the water.

And it's just started. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration says 25 states could see moderate to major flooding through May. Some will surpass the infamous floods of 1993 and 2011.

Natural disasters have always been with us. Responsible climate scientists are careful not to place all the onus for these events on rising temperatures. But they do insist that climate is playing a part, and that as the Earth gets warmer, these calamities will grow in degree and number.

Still, the appeaser politicians have no answer other than to spend zillions of taxpayer dollars on fixes that won't work for long. And where will that money come from? Many of these same officials lustily supported the Trump tax cuts, which are draining the Treasury of needed revenues.

Case in point is Missouri Sen. Josh Hawley. When the subject came around to climate change, the Republican pointed fingers at the all-purpose "radical environmentalists" for killing jobs. Now he blames them for allegedly forcing the Army Corps of Engineers — which oversees flood control efforts — to favor wildlife over farmers.

The corps serves several constituencies, but as its deputy $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) \left(1\right) \left$

commanding general for civil and emergency operations said in a recent statement, "The Corps's No. 1 priority in its operations is life safety."

Thing is, for over a century, the corps has been building, building, building levees, spillways and other infrastructure to control the waters. This system is crumbling under the pressure of climate-induced flooding. You could build levees seemingly halfway to heaven with more borrowed money, but in many cases, they won't meet the growing challenge.

And even when levees — built or sometimes removed — succeed in preventing floods in one place, they can create problems elsewhere. After all, the water has to go someplace. When a levee was demolished in 2011 to save Cairo, Illinois, from a rampaging Mississippi River, some 100,000 acres, mostly farmland, was flooded.

In his previous job as Missouri attorney general, Hawley joined a suit against Barack Obama's Clean Power Plan, designed to contain global warming. President Trump applauded.

With leadership like this, the war against climate change hasn't even reached the end of the beginning. Surrender and blaming others is not a winning strategy.

Is the Affordable Care Act constitutional?

"If the provisions of the Constitution be not upheld when they pinch, as well as when they comfort, they may as well be abandoned."

— Justice George Sutherland (1862-1942)

Here we go again. The legal battle over the constitutionality of the Affordable Care Act — Obamacare — will soon be back in court due to the largely unexpected consequences of a series of recent events.

When the ACA was enacted in 2010, it was a stool with four legs. The first was a declaration that access to professional health care treatment — even for preexisting conditions — is a right to be guaranteed by the federal government. Second, that all people in America are legally required to have health insurance or be assessed for the cost of an insurance policy by the IRS — this is the so-called individual mandate. Third, that all employers of 50 or more full-time employees provide health care insurance to their employees. And fourth, that the federal government would micromanage the delivery of health care and, along with the states, orchestrate and subsidize health care for those who did not receive it from an employer.

When the legal challenge to the ACA was before the Supreme Court in June 2012, the core issue was does the Commerce Clause of the Constitution — which delegates to Congress the power to regulate interstate commerce — empower the Congress to compel people to engage in it by purchasing a health insurance policy. As the late President George H.W. Bush liked to ask: Can Congress force me to eat broccoli?

When the Supreme Court took a preliminary vote after oral arguments on the constitutionality of the individual mandate, the tally was 5 to 4 to invalidate it. Then Chief Justice John Roberts had second thoughts. He saw the polls, which showed Mitt Romney safely ahead of President Barack Obama in the then upcoming presidential race, and Republicans looking good to capture Congress. He reasoned to his colleagues that it would be better for history and the court's legacy if the political branches invalidated legislation as controversial as the ACA, rather than the court.

So, he went along with the finding that the Commerce Clause does not confer the power to compel entry into interstate commerce, but he needed a way to salvage the individual mandate. Breaking with the five-member conservative majority on the court, he reasoned that while Congress cannot regulate everything under the sun (its powers to regulate are limited by the Constitution), it can tax anything under the sun. So, if the IRS assessment visited upon those who fail to acquire health insurance is a tax, the individual mandate is constitutional.

This was a novel argument, in large measure because the litigants challenging the constitutionality of the individual mandate and the Department of Justice defending it all argued to the court that the IRS assessment was not a tax. President Obama had promised voters that the federal micromanagement of health care would not add to individuals' tax burden, and the challengers called the assessment a penalty so as to trigger a hearing for each person as to whom the IRS imposed an assessment.

Can the court characterize a statute as a tax when all the litigants in the case, including the government, have insisted it is not? If a jury is hearing an intersection collision case and all witnesses testify that the traffic light regulating the plaintiff's vehicle was green, the court must instruct the jury that it may not find that the light was amber or red because the jury and the court are bound by the evidence before them.

But the Supreme Court is infallible because it is final, as Justice Robert Jackson once observed. It can do what it wants and call a penalty or an assessment or a command to eat broccoli a tax. By doing so, the ACA was saved.

Then, in 2016, Donald Trump was elected president, and a Republican Congress in 2017 enacted new tax laws that invalidated the individual mandate; there is no longer any IRS consequence for individuals who fail to obtain health insurance. When the ACA, minus the individual mandate, was challenged last year, a federal judge ruled the ACA unconstitutional because there was no tax in there to salvage it. Notwithstanding President Trump's views, the Department of Justice defended the Affordable Care Act, as is its lawful obligation.

Now, on appeal, the DOJ says it will not defend Obamacare. It is almost unheard of for the DOJ not to defend on appeal a constitutional challenge to a federal statute, particularly a statute that the Supreme Court has upheld, and especially a statute that the DOJ just finished defending in a trial court. The courts are incredulous, and skeptical, when the DOJ changes its position 180 degrees during a case. That change can seriously undermine the credibility of the DOJ. Also, it can undermine the president's fidelity to his oath of office — to uphold and defend laws whether he agrees with them or not.

Yet, the present statute is not the same statute that the Supreme Court upheld in 2012. The feds cannot order me to wear a red necktie, but they can tax me if I don't. No tax, no red necktie. What will the courts do?

Politically, this is a serious problem for Republicans. History shows that once a governmental benefit — here, subsidized health insurance with guaranteed coverage for preexisting conditions, now enjoyed by 21 million Americans — begins to flow, it is nearly impossible politically to stop it.

Thomas Jefferson and Alexander Hamilton, who hated each other, did have one public point of agreement. Namely, if the public treasury becomes a public trough, and the public recognizes that, voters will only send to Washington those who promise to bring home the biggest piece of the pie — even if it is unconstitutional.

Breakfast isn't important

I skipped breakfast again this morning. I won't worry about it.

Yes, I've heard the advice. "It's the most important meal of the day."
It balances blood sugar levels, kick-starts your metabolism, stimulates the brain etc

A Harvard University study said men who regularly skip breakfast have a 27 percent higher risk of suffering a heart attack. 27 percent!

But I'm not worried, because I now know there's no proof that skipping breakfast causes heart attacks or any other problem.

In my latest video, nutritionist Dr. Ruth Kava points out that just about all the claims about breakfast being especially important are unproven.

Those Harvard researchers actually say it "remains unknown whether specific eating habits ... influence ... heart disease risk."

Strokes and heart attack news persists in part because people who skip breakfast tend to have other bad habits, like smoking.

But the breakfast bunk keeps coming.

Several years ago, the government announced that skipping breakfast may make you fat. Of course, the media jumped on that one. "Missing breakfast tricks your brain into thinking you want higher-calorie foods," says WebMD

"Far from making you fat, breakfast actually helps activate your metabolism so you start burning fat," says StepToHealth.com.

But it's not true, shows a new analysis by the British Medical Journal.

"They looked on a number of different studies, and they did not find that eating breakfast ... helped people lose weight," says Kava.

The government has backed away from its claim.

Why did researchers and the government get it so wrong?

Partly because eating habits are hard to study. You can't follow test

subjects for years, continuously controlling what they eat.

So, many studies are based on what people say they ate. Some people

forget. Or lie.

Many of us have been suckered by studies funded by cereal makers. Five of 15 studies mentioned by the government in its breakfast push were funded by General Mills or Kellogg.

"Yeah, well, they're the ones that are interested in having their products sold," says Kava.

On its cereal boxes, Kellogg touted that study that found people who didn't eat breakfast could lose weight by starting to eat cereal or breads for breakfast instead of skipping breakfast altogether or eating meat and eggs.

"Don't get your nutrition education from cereal boxes," says Kava.

In fairness, cereal companies don't always try to spin the results. One study funded by Quaker Oats found skipping breakfast was associated with weight loss in people who were overweight. Instead of ignoring the result, Quaker Oats actively pushed the researchers to publish the data.

Even cereal boxes might be better sources of information than levision, though

"Sesame Street" is more reliable than most shows, but even there, Michelle Obama told Grover he was probably tired because he hadn't had a "healthy breakfast!"


While it's true that a hungry child may not do well in school, Obama tells Grover, "(START ITAL)Everybody should have a healthy breakfast."

Not true. You need nourishment, but there's no good evidence it has to come at a specific time of day.

"Eat breakfast if you're hungry. If not, eat a little later," advises


Of course, the key to good health isn't just to do whatever you feel like doing. Our appetites can lead us astray. Smoking kills. Some tempting foods are unhealthy.

But years of consumer reporting have taught me that moderation and common sense are better guides than the hyped warnings from government and the media.








