

Norwalk man faces life for drive-by shooting

Brian Altamirez, 23, provided the shotgun that another man used in a drive-by shooting that killed a Bellflower teenager.

NORWALK – A Norwalk man faces life in prison when he is sentenced this summer for his role in a drive-by shooting that killed a teenager in Bellflower four years ago.

Brian Jesse Altamirez, 23, was convicted last October of first-degree murder. His sentencing is scheduled for June 25, where he faces life in prison without the possibility of parole.

His co-defendant, 37-year-old Jesus Chavez of Los Angeles, also was found guilty last October. On Monday he was sentenced to life in prison without parole.

Chavez killed 17-year-old Sitani Sialeuvea in a drive-by shooting on Halloween night in 2015. The victim was standing in front of a mobile home park in the 16100 block of Bellflower Blvd. when Chavez shot at Sialeuvea with a shotgun from a car.

Sialeuvea died at a local hospital.

Chavez was located a day later and arrested. Prosecutors said Altamirez provided the shotgun to Chavez for use in the killing.

Historic Norwalk home hosting rose garden celebration

NORWALK – Norwalk’s historical D.D. Johnston-Haritt House Museum will open for its annual rose garden celebration this Saturday, May 4.

Event highlights include docent-led tours of the home, light refreshments, and activities for children.

Located at 12426 Mapledale St., the home was built in 1891 by one of Norwalk’s early families, the D.D. Johnstons. Darius David Johnston also founded the first school district in Norwalk.

Johnston was also responsible for the first real industry in town, a cheese factory, by furnishing Tom Lombard with the money in 1882.

The Victorian Eastlake home is currently listed on the National Registry of Historical Places and contains family heirlooms and artifacts providing a glimpse into Norwalk’s early history.

Saturday’s event is from 1–3 p.m. Admission is free.

Troubled Los Padrinos Juvenile Hall set to close this summer

The juvenile courthouse is also shutting down operations

DOWNEY – For more than six decades, Los Padrinos Juvenile Hall has served as the temporary holding facility for thousands of youth offenders, a detention center for teens (and pre-teens) charged with crimes as petty as shoplifting and as serious as murder.

But Los Padrinos may not exist for much longer.

The L.A. County Board of Supervisors intends to close the detention facility, one of L.A. County’s three juvenile halls.

It’s not clear what will happen to the youth currently housed at Los Padrinos, or if the closure is related to recent allegations of excessive use-of-force by Los Padrinos staff.

Also unclear is if the closure is temporary or permanent.

A representative for Supervisor Janice Hahn confirmed plans to close the detention center but stressed that details are still preliminary.

City officials declined to comment publicly on Los Padrinos’ expected closure. Privately, however, they said they expected L.A. County to repurpose the facility, located at 7285 Quill Drive behind Los Amigos Country Club.

Opened in 1957, Los Padrinos houses hundreds of boys and girls at any given time. Most of the juvenile defendants are awaiting court action or transfer to another facility.

Los Padrinos has been extensively criticized in the past, including for high incidents of depression among the population and youth suicides. More recently, six detention officers were arrested last month for assaulting teenage girls with pepper spray.

This past March, the Los Angeles County Probation Department -- which operates Los Padrinos -- reported a 214% increase in the use of pepper spray at Los Padrinos. Pepper spray -- also known as OC spray -- is the most significant force option authorized by the department.

A February 2019 report by the

L.A. County Office of Inspector General found that detention staff at Los Padrinos feared for their safety and “consistently reported feeling outnumbered and overpowered by youth.”

The county also has struggled to hire and retain staff, which has “destabilized” the facility due to workers going on sick leave and long-term absences.

In addition to the detention center, Los Padrinos houses a juvenile court. Victor H. Greenberg, presiding judge at the Los Padrinos courthouse, confirmed in a letter to law enforcement officials that Los Padrinos plans to close July 31 and the court will close Aug. 30.

“Consistent with the decline in juvenile hall population over the past several years, petition filings have also decreased,” Judge Greenberg wrote.

According to Greenberg, pending court cases at Los Padrinos will be re-assigned to the Eastlake Juvenile Court in Los Angeles and the Compton Courthouse.

Sanchez writes bill to lower retirement plan costs

The legislation would make it more affordable for small businesses to offer retirement plans.

employers and sole-proprietors participating in retirement plans administered in the same way to file a single aggregated Form 5500, a required annual return that provides important compliance information to DOL and Treasury.

Under current law, despite sharing a common administrative framework, each plan is still required to file a separate Form 5500 to satisfy reporting requirements under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act and the Internal Revenue Code. Sanchez’s proposal will eliminate duplicative reporting by plan administrators, which will reduce costs for small businesses that maintain retirement plans.

To file an aggregated Form 5500, the retirement plans would

\$12M sports complex coming to Downey

DOWNEY – Conceptual plans for a multi-use sports complex on county-owned property in south Downey is no longer a conception.

On Tuesday, the L.A. County Board of Supervisors awarded a \$9.66 million contract to begin construction of the fields, which will be located on the abandoned south campus of Rancho Los Amigos National Rehabilitation Center.

“City of Downey staff are working with County of Los Angeles staff on the design and layout of multi-use fields on the five acres of land offered by the County of Los Angeles,” said Aldo Schindler, director of community development for the city of Downey.

Plans call for three synthetic turf or grass soccer fields of various sizes to support youth through high school level of competition, with the largest field big enough to also accommodate football and lacrosse.

Lighting will allow nighttime use of the fields, and fencing will be installed along the project's boundaries. A 3,000 sq. ft. building will house restrooms, concessions, administrative offices, storage and meeting space.

The facility will have enough parking for 74 vehicles and drought-tolerant landscaping.

According to Schindler, temporary or permanent bleacher seating is still being contemplated.

When completed, the facility will be leased to and operated by the city of Downey.

As part of the project, two buildings currently occupied by the Downey Rose Float Association will remain untouched, Schindler said.

The project is budgeted at \$12.12 million: \$10 million will come from Supervisor Janice Hahn's 4th District discretionary funding while the additional \$2.12 million will come from the city of Downey.

need to have the same trustee, fiduciary, plan administrator, plan year and investment menu.

The self-employed, including sole proprietors and small business owners, are the most likely to establish a retirement savings plan that would benefit from and meet the requirements necessary to file an aggregated Form 5500. According to 2016 survey findings from the Transamerica Center for Retirement Studies, in collaboration with Aegon Center for Longevity and Retirement, only one-third of self-employed respondents indicated that they make sure they are saving for retirement.

To provide DOL and Treasury time to implement this change, this bill has an effective date of no later than January 1, 2023.

“Our goal today as a committee is to strengthen access to retirement security for hardworking Americans, and I'm proud to have contributed a piece to this puzzle,” Sanchez said.

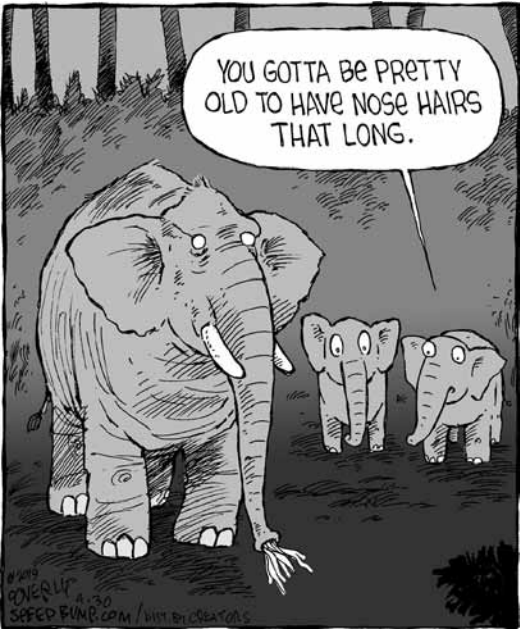

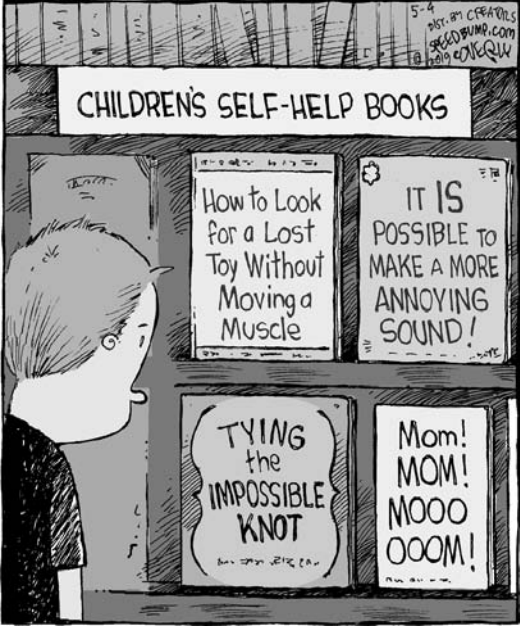
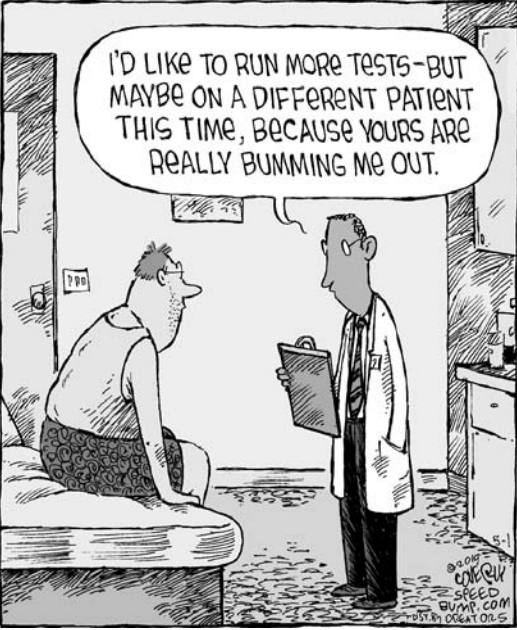
