Donors gift Family, colleagues mourn sheriff's deputy killed in 'cowardly murder'

The L.A. County Sheriff's deputy died Wednesday after he was shot while off-duty.

ALHAMBRA – A Los Angeles County deputy who was killed this week while off duty is being remembered as a kind-hearted family man who gave 13 years of "selfless service," the Los Angeles County sheriff said.

Deputy Joseph Gilbert Solano, 50, was shot while off-duty at a Jack in the Box in Alhambra on Monday afternoon, and died on Wednesday at the same hospital where he had last been assigned to work, said Sheriff Alex Villanueva.

"Deputy Solano was known as a kind-hearted and generous family man, a provider for his mother and an exemplary father to his children," Villanueva said. He called the slaying a "senseless and cowardly murder.

Villanueva was joined at a news conference on Wednesday with members of Solano's family, who at times were overcome with

"Thank you to everyone that has had him in his prayers,' Solano's son, Matthew Solano, said. "Continue to pray for him

and my family, please."

Deputy Solano's daughter, Jessica, said, "he has been in my life for over 11 years. And not only did I lose a father figure, but a best friend."

"Don't forget about him," she said. "He was a hardworking man and was loved by many.'

Rhett Nelson, a 30-yearold from Utah, was arrested on Tuesday as a suspect, after a revolver matching the gun used in the attack on Deputy Solano was found in Nelson's car, authorities said.

Clothing found in Nelson's car appeared to match the outfit seen on the gunman in surveillance video, authorities said.

The sheriff said there's no indication that the suspect knew Deputy Solano was a law enforcement officer.

"The deputy was alerted in the restaurant that someone was following him and that's when he turned to confront it," Villanueva said. "He confronted a threat not knowing what it was and in a split second he lost his life.'

No motive is known, the sheriff said.

Meanwhile, Los Angeles Police Chief Michel Moore said that Nelson is also considered a suspect in the murder of a 30-year-old man in Los Angeles that occurred about one hour before Deputy Solano was shot.

San Diego authorities also said they're investigating if five armed robberies in the San Diego area over the weekend could be linked to Nelson.

It was not immediately clear if Nelson had an attorney. He was due to appear in court on

As Army turns 244 years old, lessons of D-Day still relevant today

The U.S. Army celebrates a significant birthday while paying tribute to those lost in Normandy,

WASHINGTON – As Army Chief of Staff Gen. Mark A. Milley spoke to veterans at the 75th anniversary of the D-Day invasion, he asked what lessons they had learned from hitting the

beach in that deadly campaign. "Never let it happen again," a 96-year-old veteran who earned

two Silver Stars told the general. Milley called it the "single most violent conflict in human history" when over 150,000 allied troops stormed the heavily fortified coast of France's

Normandy region on June 6, 1944. By the time the campaign ended in early August, nearly 37,000 ground troops had been

On Wednesday, while at a cake-cutting ceremony at the U.S. Capitol to officially kick off events for the Army's 244th birthday, Milley said that sacrifice should

not be forgotten. "I think that's the lesson of great power competition, great power war," he said. "Let us never forget that 75 years ago the world was amass in violence. And the way to keep that peace is to maintain an incredibly strong military for the United States.

CONGRESS FORMS ARMY

On June 14, 1775, the Second Continental Congress formed the Continental Army under the command of George Washington to unify the 13 colonies in their fight against British forces.

When the Revolutionary War ended, the Congress of the Confederation created the U.S. Army to replace the disbanded Continental Army on June 3, 1784.

Father's Day concert "Boleros De Noche" celebrates Los Angeles' history with Latin American bolero

DOWNEY -"Boleros De Noche," a musical and cultural experience that seeks to preserve, uplift, and celebrate Latin American bolero music history in Los Angeles, will be presented this Sunday, June 16, at the Downey

The three-hour show begins at

Curated by its founder Robert Carlos, a young Los Angelesbased artist and promoter who has committed his career to bolero music and its traditions, "Boleros De Noche" is now in its fourth

This concert is a celebration of boleros from Cuba and Mexico and will feature the Latin Grammynominated Cuban singer Lily Hernandez and the Mexican-American singer Julian Torres.

Latin American bolero music is recognized for its romantic lyrics and lush harmonies, and is considered by some to be the most romantic music genre of Latin

The genre originated in Cuba

in 1883 but gained international notoriety once the music reached Mexico in the 1940s, and was interpreted by romantic trios: three-piece bands composed of three voices accompanied by a guitar and the complex instrumentation of a requinto, a smaller guitar typically tuned a fifth higher than a standard guitar.

Lily Hernandez

Known as "La Amazona," Lily Hernandez started singing over 15 years ago in her home country of Cuba. Although as a child she had a love for the art, she rarely sang in public because she was never given an opportunity.

As an artist, she was "in the closet" until Calixto Oviedo discovered her through her first EP. Since then, she has performed at jazz festivals in Spain, Austria, Germany, Switzerland, Finland, Norway, Denmark, Italy, and the U.S. as well as at important jazz clubs in Europe and the U.S.

She was nominated for a Latin Grammy for her participation in an album with Raul Lara y Sus Soneros, and she has received praise for her salsa performances from Jerry Rivas and Ralph Irizarry, who named her "La Amazona De La Salsa."

In addition to boleros, she sings son, salsa, timba and bossa nova. Her charismatic personality and dynamic singing abilities are immediately felt by audiences.

Julian Torres was born in Hawthorne to Mexican parents who instilled within him a love for Mexico's music. As a child, he became a mariachi musician and began his career singing at community events and church

Man gets life for killing witness

BELLFLOWER - A Bellflower Frazier of first-degree murder man was sentenced last week for killing a man who was scheduled to testify as a witness in his robbery

Jahmal Lydel Frazier, 29, was sentenced by Los Angeles County Superior Court Judge Raul D. Sahagun to life in prison without the possibility of parole.


In April 2019, a jury convicted Bellflower on October 23, 2010.

On April 5, 2011, Frazier shot the victim, Roshan Bhandari, multiple times at a 7-Eleven in Bellflower. The victim was scheduled to testify that day in Frazier's robbery trial at the Los Angeles County Superior Court in Norwalk.

Frazier robbed 7-Eleven store clerk Bhandari at gunpoint in

The crime was captured by a store surveillance camera. Frazier was arrested by deputies a short distance away from the 7-Eleven and was found with a gun, money, a mask and gloves, according to evidence presented at trial.

Bhandari testified before a jury in the robbery case on April 4, 2011, while Frazier was out on bail. Bhandari was ordered to complete his testimony the next day.





Joe Biden needs to apologize

Joe Biden, the perennial presidential candidate, revealed a character flaw deeply hidden from all except those who know the 76-year-old Democrat of Delaware well.

The early 2020 campaign already told us the secret truth from that well: Biden can't apologize for anything. It's embedded in his

Such an ego is not OK in an old person governing a country rocked by change, roiled by inequity, divided by Civil War lines. President Trump has, in a way, started a new civil war. To heal scars, the next president must be wisely willing to bend, turn and sail with the wind in

The grace to fess up and learn from the past is crucial, as young President John F. Kennedy did days after the Bay of Pigs operation went south, saying, "Victory has a hundred fathers, and defeat is an orphan." All along, Biden's bright genial manner masked a failure to admit to poor judgment.

Hear him for his cause, a few days ago: "I make no apologies for my last position, and I make no apologies for what I'm about to say.

That was the former vice president's about-face of affirming the Hyde Amendment (restricting reproductive rights) one day and then opposing it the next. The stumble horrified his campaign before he stepped foot in Iowa. Despite the bravado, there's talk among Democratic strategists that Biden's not ready for a game bigger than Delaware — the only place he's ever been a winner.

No humility in the retreat or much explanation of why Biden embraced the Republican Hyde position for decades. Denying federal funds for reproductive health care harms poor women and military women overseas. Biden camouflaged the class point by an odd leap to women's "ZIP codes," which he crafted out of thin air shortly before

Nothing seems worth saying sorry in his public career. But Biden has made grave mistakes — with consequences to this day — that call out the issue of forgiveness.

Advisers on his third presidential campaign will wrestle with the two that can't be shrugged off with a smile and "Aw, shucks, folks." We know them well: his "aye" Senate vote on the Iraq War in 2002 and his inept conduct of the Anita Hill hearing on Clarence Thomas' fitness for the Supreme Court in 1991.

Rep. Seth Moulton, D-Mass., is running himself, as a critic and veteran of the Iraq War. At 40, Moulton is sounding the call for Biden to seriously apologize for having supported that tragic war of aggression. Biden has only conceded that it was a mistake to trust then-President George W. Bush. That's not good enough. It takes courage to vote against any war in the well of the Senate. Biden never became a profile

The Clarence Thomas confirmation hearings were the worst government farce that ever happened while the nation's eyes were watching. Biden, then the wishy-washy Senate Judiciary Committee chairman, let Republicans railroad Hill, the dignified witness of Thomas' alleged sexual harassment as her boss. One trio of senators was so bad that I called it "Thunder, Lightning and Rain" while watching transfixed from San Francisco fog.

Biden loudly assured Thomas he'd have "the benefit of the doubt." Sen. Robert Byrd, D-W.Va., later spoke up: No, the country does.

Some say 1991 is history, yet the angry Thomas remains on the court's right wing.

But Biden recently refused to apologize for his treating Hill like the help. In fact, he said, "I'm not sorry for anything I've ever done." That

Biden's strategy, more than that of other candidates in the crowded field, relies on "electability" style more than substance, winning personal connections with voters. Everybody likes Joe, especially Joe.

Then again, the last time he ran in the Iowa caucuses, he didn't

Biden is prouder than we knew, even Washingtonians who have lived here as long as he has, since the 1970s. That's when he first became a senator. President Obama's defense secretary, Robert Gates, observed Biden was wrong on almost every foreign policy crisis over four decades, which buttresses alarm bells at home.

Politics means having to say you're sorry, if you're running for president for the third time.

The cost of monitoring your prescriptions

Prescription drug monitoring programs do not seem to be very effective at preventing abuse of opioids or other controlled substances. Yet PDMPs amount to a massive invasion of patient privacy, inviting unconstrained government snooping that violates our Fourth Amendment rights

The number of states with PDMPs tripled between 2001 and 2012, from 16 to 49. These programs are aimed mainly at reducing deaths involving prescription analgesics by preventing "doctor shopping," the practice of obtaining multiple prescriptions from different physicians and filling them at different pharmacies.

But as John Lilly, a family doctor in Springfield, Missouri, notes in the latest issue of the Journal of American Physicians and Surgeons, doctor shopping was never very common, and PDMPs do not seem to have curtailed it. According to the National Survey on Drug Use and Health, the percentage of "nonmedical" users who directly or indirectly obtained opioids through multiple prescriptions rose from 3.6% in 2011 to 4.8% in 2014.

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The survey's questions about prescription drugs changed in 2015, so the numbers for more recent years are not directly comparable. But Lilly calculates that doctor shopping that year accounted for 2.3% of prescription opioid "misuse," a rate that fell to 1.7% in 2016 before rising to 2.5% in 2017.

"Since doctor shopping was the source of only 2.5% of misused pain medicine in 2017," Lilly writes, "it is clear that the problem is not doctor shopping. Even with the entire country under a PDMP, this small percentage is increasing, but 97.5% of the misused opioids will never be

Meanwhile, deaths involving prescription analgesics continued to rise from 2011 through 2017, while deaths involving all opioids · primarily illicitly produced heroin, fentanyl and fentanyl analogs more than doubled. PDMPs may have contributed to that trend by deterring analgesic prescriptions and driving nonmedical users, along with some legitimate patients, to the black market, where the drugs are much more dangerous because their potency is highly variable and unpredictable. Several studies have found that PDMPs are associated with increased deaths involving illicit drugs.

The privacy cost of PDMPs is harder to measure but nevertheless undeniable. New Hampshire is currently engaged in a legal battle with the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration, which asserts the authority to obtain PDMP information through administrative subpoenas rather than the probable-cause warrants required by state law.

Relying on the "third-party doctrine," the DEA argues that it does not need a warrant because examining PDMP records does not qualify as a search under the Fourth Amendment. The U.S. Supreme Court has

repeatedly ruled that no warrant is required to obtain information that people voluntarily share with third parties such as banks and phone companies.

But last year, the Court declined to extend the third-party doctrine to cellphone location data, noting that such information is collected automatically and "provides an intimate window into a person's life." The American Civil Liberties Union, joined by the New Hampshire Medical Society, argues that the logic of that decision clearly applies to information about the medications people take.

The ACLU notes that patients do not in any meaningful sense consent to the collection of their prescription records. If they seek medical treatment and it involves a prescription drug covered by New Hampshire's PDMP law, that information is automatically added to the database, where it stays for three years.

Furthermore, the ACLU says, a patient's prescription records include highly sensitive information that "can reveal her physician's confidential medical advice, her chosen course of treatment, her diagnosis, and even the stage or severity of her disorder or disease." Letting federal drug warriors peruse those records at will not only compromises patients' privacy; it could have a chilling effect on medical treatment, deterring people from seeking care and confiding in

It's debatable whether these burdens would be acceptable even if PDMPs worked as intended. Given their actual track record, the sacrifices they entail are even harder to justify

Is climate change inconvenient or existential? Only supercomputers can do the math

Earth is warming, and we know why. Light is reflected and absorbed by clouds, air, oceans, ice and land. Greenhouse gases are released and adsorbed by organic and inorganic sources. Both exchanges depend on a variety of factors such as temperature, ocean acidity, the amount of vegetation and — ves — the burning of fossil fuels.

What's less clear is what climate change means for our future. "It's not like this is string theory," said Timothy Palmer, professor of climate physics at the University of Oxford. "We know the equations." But we don't know how to solve them. The many factors that affect the climate interact with one another and give rise to interconnected feedback cycles. The mathematics is so complex, the only way scientists know to handle it is by feeding the problem into computers, which then approximately solve the equations.

The International Panel for Climate Change based its latest full report, in 2014, on predictions from about two dozen such computer models. These models were independently developed by institutions in multiple countries. While similar in methodology, the models arrive at somewhat different long-term predictions. They all agree that Earth will continue to warm, but disagree on how much and how quickly.

In a paper that recently appeared in Nature Reviews Physics, Dr. Palmer summarized a controversy that has smoldered in the climate community for 20 years. The claim: The current method neglects an important source of uncertainty.

The root of the problem is one of the most basic assumptions of the computer simulations, the possibility of dividing up the atmosphere and oceans into a "grid" of small pieces. Computers then calculate how the pieces interact with one another in small time increments. While doing so, information that is smaller than the size of the pieces — socalled sub-grid information about clouds, ocean eddies and the capacity of soil to retain water — must be approximated.

According to Dr. Palmer, this method of calculation may be overly simplistic and suffers from severe shortcomings. The formula used to calculate changes of the atmosphere and oceans — the Navier-Stokes equation — has what physicists call "scale symmetry," meaning it works the same on all distances. However, as Dr. Palmer points out, this symmetry is violated when calculations approximate the sub-grid information. The consequences for climate predictions are serious: We underestimate the durability of extreme weather situations and, at the same time, overestimate how likely our predictions are to be correct.

The Navier-Stokes equation, central to predicting Earth's climate, is famously difficult to solve and has caused mathematicians and physicists headaches for 200 years. To this day, turbulences and eddies have remained challenging to understand. The Clay Mathematics Institute has named the Navier-Stokes equation one of its millennium problems and will award progress toward solving it with a \$1 million

In this situation, the best we can do is improve computer models to obtain more accurate, approximate solutions. It is knowledge we urgently need: As Earth continues to warm, we face a future of drought, rising seas and extreme weather events. But for all we currently know, this situation could be anywhere between a mere annoyance and an

There are two possible ways to arrive at better climate predictions. The best way would be to use a higher resolution for the models: to divide up the land and oceans into much smaller pieces. But doing this with existing computing facilities would take too long to be of any use.

The second-best option, according to Dr. Palmer, is to randomize the sub-grid processes. Counter-intuitively, this additional randomness has the effect of stabilizing extreme weather conditions. Weather forecasts that take into account random (or "stochastic") processes make more accurate predictions for the frequency of tropical cyclones, the duration of droughts and other weather phenomena, such as the long-lasting heat spell over Europe in the summer of 2018. It seems only reasonable, then, that long-term climate predictions should use this method too.

Climate scientists have begun to take note of Dr. Palmer's argument. The new British climate model, known as UKESM1, in use since 2018, uses this method of randomness, and others are sure to follow. Björn Stevens, director of the Max Planck Institute for Meteorology in Hamburg, Germany, agrees with Dr. Palmer's assessment. For the next generation of models, he said, his institution "will be interested in exploring the role of stochastic treatments."

But Dr. Palmer does not want to settle on the second best, and still hopes to bring the grid size of climate models down. A horizontal grid of about one square kilometer, or 0.6 miles, he believes, would significantly improve the accuracy of our climate models and would give us the information we need to accurately gauge the risks posed by

To do this, we need supercomputers capable of performing these calculations. Centers of exascale supercomputers — computers able to perform at least a billion billion calculations per second — would be up to the task. But these computing resources are more than any one institution or country can afford: Getting more accurate predictions would require an international initiative and an estimated \$1.1 billion in

We need an international collaboration, what Dr. Palmer calls "A CERN for climate modeling." It's an apt comparison: CERN — the European Organization for Nuclear Research — was founded to pool resources into a jointly used facility, thereby enabling megaprojects like the Large Hadron Collider that are beyond the budget of any one country. Importantly, this joint effort does not compete with research at national institutions, but instead builds on it. And if that worked for particle physics, Dr. Palmer thinks, it can work for climate science too.

In 2018, together with climate scientists from 18 European institutions, Dr. Palmer proposed such a computing initiative (called Extreme Earth) as a flagship project to the European Research Council. The proposal passed from the first to the second stage of evaluation. But this year, the E.R.C. canceled the 2020 flagship initiatives altogether. No other funding body has stepped up to fund the climate

But hesitating to fund better climate models makes no sense, neither scientifically nor economically. Climate change puts us all at risk. To decide which course of action to take, we need to know just what the risks are and how likely they are to come to pass. Increasing the resolution of current models from 100 kilometers to one kilometer would not be an incremental improvement but would make the predictions significantly more reliable.

The benefits of an international initiative for climate science would well outweigh the costs. We created this problem together, now we must solve it together.



Our Humble Home

It was 1963 and the war in Vietnam was brewing.

We'd been married a year when my husband, Vic, and I moved into our first home, a government-issued 28-ft. silver trailer in the middle of a record summer heatwave without the benefits of air-conditioning. We improvised our own way of cooling off our metal abode by crisscrossing two garden hoses atop the roof and letting water run off the wall sidings.

These trailers were built in the 1940's and issued to Marine Corps "grunts" who were awaiting deployment overseas so they may live at Camp Pendleton with their spouse.

This was the first home Vic and I lived alone in as husband and wife. The inside looked like a doll house. It had a tiny sink and a little refrigerator, with a freezer compartment with room for only one ice tray. The bathroom was so small that one could sit on the commode and wash their hands in the bathroom sink at the same time.

I moved in with my combination record-player/stereo radio, Elvis L.P's, a few pots and pans, a Monopoly board game, medium shopping bag of maternity clothes, and the one pair of sandals that I could get my toxemia swollen feet into.

It was near midnight when we arrived at the trailer. Vic had to leave immediately for his guard post on base. I had never seen the trailer prior to moving in. I failed to notice, or ask Vic, if the trailer was on tires or secured to the ground and locked in position. I was concerned about walking or moving in the trailer because I had gained 60 pounds during my pregnancy. I feared all my weight may start the trailer rolling down the street

In the early morning when Vic got back, he was shocked to find me still dressed in the same clothes, sitting on the corner of the little sofa where he left me the night before. My bedclothes, toothbrush and comb were still in the shopping bag just a few feet away from me.

At first sight of him, I yelled out my question, "Is this trailer stabilized?"

He thought I was kidding.

I said, "Do I look like I'm kidding?" A flood of tears raced down my face. My eyes and bladder couldn't hold any more water.

Vic put his arms around me, helped me to the bathroom, then down the two wobbly wooden steps out of our front door. He showed me where the trailer was indeed anchored to the foundation. He kissed my wet face. Soon he fixed and stabilized those steps. From then on, I felt safe in our illustrious home.

Vic got paid every two weeks, as did everyone in our neighborhood. That is why we didn't feel any worse off than anybody else, even if on occasion we ate from cans containing food rations that were packed during World War II.

We experienced such bliss that being poor was an adventure. It was fun having to "make do." We made curtain rods by stretching out wire clothes hangers for the curtain valances. The ends of the wires were twisted and hooked to nails attached to each side of the windows. "Voila!" We transformed the trailer in to our home.

Our bedroom barely accommodated the built-in, double-size bed, a little bassinet and two orange crates that we spray-painted white and stacked on top of each other for storing diapers in anticipation of the birth of our first baby, Yvette. I enjoyed going to the commissary. It made me feel so mature and independent to choose what "I" wanted to buy for our home.

Affordable entertainment was going to the free drive-in movies on Camp Pulgas Base; ironically and appropriately named. In Spanish, the word pulgas means fleas.

One of the drawbacks was having to leave the car windows rolled down to hear from the only speaker that was on the outside atop the projector shed. There were no individual car speakers.

Another small inconvenience was the mosquitoes. We had to take a net to put over us as we watched the movie to prevent being bitten by a multitude of mosquitoes that plagued the base that summer. Still, we'd cozy up and eat our homemade sandwiches, popcorn, and drank Kool-Aid.

The way in which we combated the mosquitoes at our trailer was to leave the light on in the bathroom at night and fill the bathtub with water. In the morning, we'd find swarms of them drowned. I never got more than a few mosquito bites. In fact, several neighbor girls on our street that were also pregnant didn't get many mosquito bites either. My sweetheart, on the other hand, seemed like a main course for the little pests.

We didn't own a TV. We played marathon games of Monopoly. In the morning, I'd love to bring Vic breakfast in bed. I served him fried baloney and eggs on a makeshift bed tray. By his goofy expression, I knew that it made him feel special. I wanted him to feel like the king of our trailer-home.

Our neighbor, Patricia, was a little older than I; she was about 18 or 19 years old. She showed me how to make a meatloaf. I was so excited to serve it to Vic for dinner. I didn't own a loaf pan, so I made do by baking it in a heart shape cake pan. I frosted the meatloaf with mash potatoes and spelled out I love you with string beans on top of the potatoes. He was impressed and I was delighted.

The bliss we experienced living in the trailer was all too soon bittersweet. On a cool autumn morning, Vic got his "shipping out" orders and had to report to the barracks. We were given notice to vacate the trailer. Another couple waiting deployment was due to move in.

My record player, Elvis records, bassinet, Monopoly game, and other acquisitions were all stacked by the curb while I, sadly, waited with my 3-month-old baby daughter to be picked up by my mother and godfather, Uncle Brown, to take us back to my parent's house.

Though their home was spacious with many conveniences, I had never felt more destitute having to leave our little home with its sense of fun and bliss that we created in the midst of our meager means. Still,

it would all be meaningless if Vic could not be there to share it with our daughter and me.

Those early years taught me that love is unconditional; love is steadfast, and it perseveres not just in good times, but in time of trials as well.

In our nearly 60 years together, we've paid off our home, cars, RV and accumulated many possessions. Yet when I think of our happiest times, my mind wanders back to our small humble trailer filled with abundant laughter, creativity, and new self-discoveries that taught me the meaning of enduring love.

After mom was diagnosed with lung cancer and it was determined that she wasn't a candidate for chemotherapy, she began her months' long treatment of radiation therapy.

While undergoing treatment, she expressed to "her girls" the desire to have a Bible study in her home. So, we each got busy, contacted family and friends, and her request was soon brought to fruition. Jim Kielty and Robin Wilkinson, long-time Calvary Chapel members, were also contacted and readily agreed to conduct the study each Tuesday evening.

Mom served coffee (probably

from her famous Gleason Street 20-cup aluminum percolator). We alternated providing a snack, and the Bible study began.

Jim and Robin selected the subject matter each week; we took turns reading Bible verses and had an in-depth discussion afterward.

This took place in late 1976 and went on for several months before one of the regulars suggested that we take up a weekly collection of \$2 each to be given to a charitable cause. All agreed it was a great idea; we were all on board, and just had to decide on the charity. We ended up contacting World Vision International and sponsoring Reina Silvas Ramos, a young girl from Honduras. I volunteered to be in charge of collecting the monies and forwarding it to World Vision on a monthly basis.

Mom passed in November 1977, and the Bible study continued for a time. We still had the World Vision obligation; the monies were sent to me for awhile after the study discontinued.

However, when that completely stopped, I took on the sole responsibility of the commitment. It was very rewarding to receive a letter from them, years later in 1991, that Reina had progressed to the point that she was holding a job and making good progress toward making her own way in the world. Thank God, it sounded as though she had a bright future ahead, and that was confirmation that our Bible Study monies had been put to good use.

Another request Mom made during the Bible study months was that she wanted to be baptized. "Her girls" got on the ball again, spread word again, and voila, the extravaganza that glorious night was that mom and 11 of her children and grandchildren were baptized at the then-popular Melody Land in Anaheim.

And, as an added extravaganza, the dad who always told his kids when they were growing up that, "If I went to church the roof would fall in," was baptized 10 days later, after mom's passing.
