

## Good Samaritans help deputy in fight

**WHITTIER** – The Norwalk Sheriff’s Station thanked three Good Samaritans for coming to the aid of a deputy who was involved in a fight Sunday.

The deputy was dispatched to the 15000 block of Leffingwell Road at 3:10 p.m. to investigate reports of a suspicious person.

The deputy -- a rookie in his 20s who is transitioning from training -- encountered the man, described as a 24-year-old transient. The suspect became combative with the deputy and a fight ensued, authorities said.

During the struggle, the suspect attempted to unholster the deputy’s gun and managed to eject a magazine.

Three Good Samaritans saw the struggle and came to the deputy’s defense, officials said. One of the men kicked the magazine away while the other two held down the suspect, allowing the deputy to handcuff him.

The suspect was later identified as Joshua Taylor. He was arrested on charges of resisting arrest and attempting to disarm an officer.

Authorities did not identify the Good Samaritans but said they plan to publicly thank them later.

The deputy suffered only minor injuries.

## L.A. County adds new equipment to fire trucks

**NORWALK** – Three new pieces of basic life support equipment have been added to Los Angeles County Fire Department’s fleet of emergency vehicles.

The new equipment includes:

**Fingertip Pulse Oximeters:** These blood oxygen monitors will assist emergency medical technician (EMT) providers in recognizing hypoxic patients.

**Glucometers:** This device will allow EMTs to conduct proper testing of glucose levels in a patient’s blood.

**Nasal Naloxon (Narcan):** Nasal naloxone is a medication administered through the nasal passage of the patient and can reverse the effects of opioid overdose.

“[The] introduction of this new equipment is part of Los Angeles County’s multi-agency and multi-level approach to bring comprehensive solutions and innovative treatment options to the vast number of residents within our communities facing an opioid crisis,” L.A. County Fire officials said.

“The misuse of prescription pain medications has become an epidemic in many cities and rural communities throughout the United States, which has led to the need for additional life support saving tools for EMT providers.”

# Vaping on the rise among L.A. County teens

Flavored nicotine consumed through vaping is hooking a new generation of high school students, a study finds.

**LOS ANGELES** – More than 30 percent of L.A. County high school students have reported using e-cigarette products and another 10 percent of students regularly use electronic cigarettes, according to the results of a survey conducted by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health.

The results represent a 6.4 percent increase in high school students using e-cigarettes on a consistent basis.

E-cigarettes used for vaping were the most commonly used tobacco product among high school students, while cigarette smoking prevalence for high school students in Los Angeles County reached a historic low of 1.7%.

“A new generation has become addicted to nicotine through flavored vape products like e-cigarettes,” said Barbara Ferrer, PhD, MPH, MEd, Director of Los Angeles County Department of Public Health. “The epidemic of our youth becoming addicted to nicotine by flavors and flavored tobacco is unacceptable, and we will work to reverse this trend as we partner with others to ensure a tobacco-free generation.”

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) found that the younger a person is when they start to use tobacco, the more difficult it is to quit. Ninety percent of adult smokers began smoking before the age of 18.

Flavored tobacco products are driving youth experimentation; more than 80 percent of youth



who ever used a tobacco product started with a flavored product. To reverse the increasing use of e-cigarettes among youth, CDC recommends state and local government to implement a ban on the sale of flavored tobacco products.

The survey findings highlight:

6% of current high school students reported using any tobacco products with e-cigarette use accounting for the majority of current tobacco users with ten percent;

83% of current high school student tobacco users reported using a flavored tobacco product;

61% of current high school student tobacco users bought e-cigarettes from vape shops;

Most current high school student tobacco users reported using a flavored tobacco product; and,

Fruit and/or sweet were the most popular reported flavors for most tobacco products.

Selling any tobacco products to youth is illegal. Retailers in 46

cities in Los Angeles County and the unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County are required to obtain a license to sell tobacco products and can have licenses revoked if found selling to minors.

In 2018, over 20% of licensed stores in unincorporated Los Angeles County sold tobacco products to minors. In California, 35 cities and counties have prohibited the sales of flavored tobacco products.

The 2017–18 California Student Tobacco Survey (CSTS) was administered to 8th, 10th, and 12th grade students from September 2017 to June 2018. Schools were randomly selected within Los Angeles County. The project was conducted by the University of California, San Diego.

Throughout the 2017–18 academic year, 28,071 students from 75 schools in Los Angeles County participated in the survey.

desire – or lack thereof – for a tree in general.

Saab specifically asked about homes that do not have a traditional parkway or sidewalk. According to Tree People’s representative at the meeting, those cases would require “more engaging and talking with the residents to inform them what’s part of the city and what’s not.”

Trees will be planted in front yards on the city’s right-of-way and maintained weekly for two years by Tree People, after which the responsibility for upkeep will shift to the city.

The uproar has only increased recently as Tree People has begun to map out and select where each of the trees will be

planted.

Suzanne Dodd, a resident of Downey since 1975, said she was upset to find a small circle painted on the curb in front of her home, which many have reasoned to believe signifies an incoming tree.

“Trees are good for the environment; I get that...I realize the city has a 12 ft. legal easement,” said Dodd. “My concern was we get no say so at all, period. A lot of people have planned their lawns with what they want it to look like, and how much care they want to put into it... what if people have allergies?”

September is Happy Healthy Cat Month & Responsible Dog Ownership Month

**FUN FACT:** A cat has the power to sometimes heal themselves by purring. A domestic cat's purr has a frequency of between 25 and 150 Hertz, which happens to be the frequency at which muscles and bones best grow and repair themselves.

**FUN FACT:** Dogs have a sense of time. It's been proven that they know the difference between an hour and five. If conditioned to, they can predict future events, such as regular walk times.

**Do you have an overweight dog or cat?**

Many pet owners don't realize their pet is overweight, and that can be costly for a pet's health and an owner's wallet. Owners with overweight dogs or cats spend as much as five times more than owners with average weight pets on veterinary expenses for musculoskeletal ailments such as cruciate (ACL) ruptures, lameness, and limping. Obese pets are also more prone to diabetes. Owners with obese dogs or cats spend over 10 times more on diabetes treatment than pet owners of pets at an average weight. The good news is that you can help your pet maintain a healthy weight.

**How to check your pet's weight**

When running your hands along your pet's chest, you should be able to easily feel their ribs with slight padding. If the ribs protrude or are undetectable, your pet is likely at an unhealthy weight.

*Tip:* Some breeds have more visible ribs than others, and it's harder to feel the ribs of dogs with long or thick hair. Your veterinarian can help you identify and safely manage your pet's weight. It's easier to maintain a healthy weight than it is to lose excess weight. In humans and pets alike, the key to weight loss is to remain committed and dedicated, and to combine healthy eating with regular physical activity. Just a few pounds above your cat or dog's ideal weight can put them at risk for developing serious medical conditions including diabetes, respiratory and heart disease, joint problems, and a shorter life expectancy.1

*Tip:* Check with your veterinarian before embarking on any diet program. They can ensure your pet loses weight safely, and that excess weight is not a side effect of a medication or an underlying medical condition.

**9 trim down tips for your obese dog or cat**

- Swap for fruits and veggies. Use pet-safe fruits and veggies as treats and to supplement your pet's smaller-portioned meals.2 Not only do they provide nutrition, they can also help your pet feel fuller without all of the calories.
- Portion control starts with calorie counting. Talk to your veterinarian about your pet's caloric needs and measure portions of food for your pet instead of free pouring or "eye-balling" it. Be sure that everyone in the family who feeds your pet uses the same measuring scoop!
- Cut back on snacking between meals. The calories in common treats for pets can really add up; they should only make up about 10% of your pet's caloric intake. Cut up small pieces of fruits and veggies, such as apples, carrots, or bananas for yummy treats with fewer calories.
- Get into a routine. If you feed your pet at the same time every day, they will learn to expect food at that time and be less likely to beg for food throughout the day.
- Don't make quick, drastic changes. Gradually transition your pet to their diet food over one or two weeks by combining it with their current food.
- Just because it's diet food, doesn't mean it can't taste good. Try warming up food, adding oregano, mashed pumpkin or sweet potato, or a splash of a fish oil supplement, chicken broth, or salmon juice to make diet food more enticing.
- Control cravings with distractions. When your pet begs for food, divert their attention to something else they enjoy, like taking a walk, playing with a ball or toy, or simply enjoying some good old-fashioned TLC from their favorite person — you!
- Don't eat where you sleep. Place your pet's food bowl far away from their favorite spot to lounge so they have to get up and move during the day.
- Make them work for their food. There are several different toys that you can fill with kibble that make your pet put in a little effort for their meal. These toys keep them busy and prevent them from gobbling up their dinner in record time.

In 1934, when I was 10 years old, I had my tonsils taken out. After I came home from the hospital, I had a hemorrhage and almost died.

It caused a heart murmur as I lost so much blood. I was so sick that I missed a full year of school.

My mother thought I would need a good school to get caught up with my studies. She decided that I should go to a private school. I began attending a convent boarding school called Mount Merci in Waterville, Maine. It was taught by Ursuline nuns. I would board there Monday through Friday and return home each weekend.

Life in a convent was quite an experience for a child of 11. The sleeping quarters consisted of a long line of beds, head to head, in the middle of a large dorm room. The room had sleeping alcoves along the walls, with drapes that could be drawn for privacy. I had one of these private rooms with the bedspread and curtains of my choice. It was quite nice.

We ate our meals at long tables in a large dining hall. The nuns would walk up and down to see that everyone ate all their food.

We wore black stockings, black dresses with white hard collars and cuffs that needed to be scrubbed every week with Bon Ami. A big black bow tie completed the costume.

If anyone in the dorm came down with a cold, every child was given a dose of castor oil. There was only one bathroom at the end of the dorm. Needless to say, it was a very disturbing situation when we had to stand in a long line waiting for our turn to use the bathroom. Everyone was hopping up and down in great distress. But I guess we must have managed to live through it.

We had great fun on our time off from our studies. There were many activities to fill our spare time. We roller-skated in the fall and spring, and we ice-skated in the winter. We put on plays, and I had many singing parts in our musicals.

I boarded at Mount Merci for three years. By then I was caught up with my studies, so I was able to go to public school for my remaining school years.
