'Don't panic' says Chamber of Commerce

Norwalk's Chamber of Commerce continues to keep business owners informed as more details come out about the COVID-19 emergency.

NORWALK Though things still remain uncertain surrounding the total impact of the coronavirus, the Norwalk Chamber of Commerce says not to panic.

It's no secret that businesses across the nation are already feeling the dramatic effects of the COVID-19 outbreak.

According to Caryn Spilsbury, Executive Director of the Chamber, the chamber has been preparing for the ramifications of the coronavirus for around three weeks.

"I pay attention to the news, stay informed," said Spilsbury. "It was about three weeks or so ago that people started running Costco out of toilet paper. I said, 'okay, this is going to be an issue.'"

Spilsbury has been in contact with other chambers locally, and says that all involved have continued to communicate.

She says, "everyone is sharing."

Chambers Alliance that I am the out." interim executive director for, so I work with 121 other chambers locally," said Spilsbury. "We've been in conversation for about a week and a half on our events, on how we can best serve as a gatherer and processor of information for our members."

"Right now, we are in an email chain right now about how everybody is providing information and perhaps trying to gather as much information as we can as a group to support each other in getting that information

At this point, Spilsbury says that she thinks a lot of chambers are "hunkering down," and that there's not much a chamber can do other than provide information and stay supportive

Still, she says that the best thing for businesses to do right now is to stay calm.

"My best advice to anybody is to not panic, because panicking doesn't create solutions," said Spilsbury. "Whether that's panic

buying, whether that's social media hysteria, whatever it is, just stay calm.'

"This is something new that the entire world is dealing with, and none of us have the right answers yet. But I believe that our government is on top of things as best they can be, that they will find those answers, and that we will all come out on the other side of this - probably a little worse for the weather – but

Training dogs means training their owners, and that's "No Bull"

WHITTIER— Sometimes training a dog means training its human as well.

No Bull Rehab officially kicked off around a year ago, with partners Sarah Peel and Drew Camarillo coming together after several years of doing volunteer work in shelters prior.

"My business partner Drew and I have been working together with rescue dogs for just over five years now," said Peel. "We started just kind of volunteering in rescues, going in and finding their dogs that needed the most help, they felt weren't very adoptable. I put my behavior knowledge and [Camarillo] put some of his training knowledge towards that. We kind of teamed up and realized we were helping a lot of dogs get adopted, who actually didn't really have issues, they just weren't being supported by the environment in the

Surprisingly, Peel's "behavior knowledge" comes not from a background in animal training, but from a career in special education.

"I currently work for Whittier Union High School District, with adults with special education," said Peel. "I have my Master's in special education and then I also have my under-grad in child development." "I used to work primarily with students who have autism and behavioral needs in the classroom. Now I work with a much wider range of students who have an array of disabilities and needs, but still really supporting behavior."

So, how does this fit in with man's best friend?

"Really what dog training is is training humans to be able to understand their dog," said Peel.

And there is a fair amount of "human training" that goes on.

"People need to adopt or own dogs that are appropriate for them and their lifestyle and what they'd like to be doing," said Peel. "Dogs need certain things. If you get a working dog – a border collie – or a herding dog, there's certain behaviors like nipping at heels and stuff like that that we see all the time with these high-drive dogs."

"So often, we see pit bulls in the news who have very highdrive who are set up for failure by human error. That's sort of my stance on that; always own a dog that's right for your lifestyle... any dog can display behaviors if they're not in the right situation, because they're frustrated. They have no outlet."

No Bull – as one might guess

- deals primarily with pit bulls, however works with "all breeds of dogs." According to Peel, No Bull has already worked with

Peel says that No Bull focuses on the "other side" of training dogs.

hundreds of canines

"There's a lot that goes into training, and I think there's a little bit difference between training obedience and rehabilitating behaviors," said Peel. "Yes, obedience is important, but state of mind and teaching our dogs how to have coping skills to be neutral to their environment and not be scared [is as well]."

Peel says that eventually, things come to "make sense" for their clients, which leads to more success with their pets.

"There's something with clarity and peace of mind – even if you're still dealing with that behavior – there's a plan there, you know," said Peel. "That's really why I do it; I do it to keep dogs in-home."

County buildings close to COVID-19

Los Angeles County will close all of its buildings to the public effective Monday as a precautionary measure to help slow the spread of COVID-19, Board of Supervisors Chair Kathryn Barger announced.

The announcement comes as Gov. Gavin Newsom directed closure of California's bars, brewpubs and wineries, and called on people over 65 and others at higher risk of serious complications from exposure to the virus to stay at home.

"We need to do all we can to protect the public and our employees in the midst of this expanding public health crisis," Supervisor Barger said. "Our departments will continue to provide essential services to our residents, but it is prudent to limit public access to our facilities at this time. We will continue to monitor the situation and urge the public to follow the guidance of the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health."

"Our goal is to slow the transmission of COVID-19, but we can't do it alone," said Barbara Ferrer, PhD, MPH, MEd, Director of Public Health. "Each and every one of us, both businesses and residents, must do our part by practicing social distancing and taking common sense infection control precautions.

"We urgently need to flatten the curve of COVID-19 in order to keep our hospitals and emergency rooms from becoming overwhelmed with COVID-19 patients," she added. "Flattening the curve requires conscientious social distancing efforts by all our L.A. County residents during this time of crisis. Our collective efforts during this pandemic can literally save the lives of our loved ones and most vulnerable residents."

County hospitals and clinics will remain open. Essential services from first-responders will continue, and many departments will continue to operate with modified services to minimize in-person contacts.

Los Angeles County libraries and museums are also closed, along with every school district in the county.

Amazon slowing non-essential orders

Amazon is banning sellers from shipping any non-essential items to its warehouses as it grapples with overwhelming demand for basic staple items as the coronavirus pandemic

The Seattle-based e-tailing giant sent an email to sellers Tuesday announcing that it would only be accepting "household staples, medical supplies, and other high-demand products" for the next three weeks so that it can "more quickly receive, restock, and deliver" the products to customers.

"We are seeing increased

online shopping, and as a result some products such as household staples and medical supplies are out of stock," Amazon told sellers, according to an email obtained by NBC.

Sellers who use the Fulfillment by Amazon program normally send their goods to Amazon's warehouses, which store and deliver the products for a fee.

Goods in high demand include baby products, groceries, pet supplies and personal care products.

Amazon on Monday announced plans to hire 100,000 additional warehouse and delivery workers to deal with the surge in orders. It also said it would raise the pay for its current workers by \$2 an hour through the end of April.

FDA commissioner: Be wary of anyone claiming they can cure COVID-19

The spread of novel coronavirus (COVID-19) has captured the attention of the world.

Understandably, people are concerned about the best ways to protect themselves and their loved ones. Along with the heightened focus surrounding this global outbreak comes the potential for consumers to be lured into buying unproven or fraudulent products or medicines that claim to treat, prevent or cure infections, including COVID-19.

While the Food and Drug Administration is working full speed, in collaboration with public and private sector partners, to help diagnose, treat and prevent this disease, presently there are no FDAapproved products to prevent, treat or cure COVID-19.

We are aware that unscrupulous marketers are hawking products online and in stores that claim to do just that. Consumers should be wary of anyone making these claims and instead talk with a licensed health care professional before taking or using any such product. Taking matters into your own hands by purchasing and using unproven products without consulting your doctor puts you and others at risk for serious health consequences.

Part of the FDA's mission is to protect Americans from health fraud. This includes warning about the dangers of purchasing and using medical products or devices that have not been proven safe and/or effective for the uses they claim. Health fraud scams can cause

serious injuries or death, all the while wasting American consumers' hard-earned dollars.

The FDA and the Federal Trade Commission have already issued warning letters to seven companies for selling fraudulent COVID-19 products. The products cited — teas, essential oils, tinctures and colloidal silver — are unapproved drugs that pose significant risks to patient health and violate federal law.

We will continue to use authorities like this for other bogus products claiming to treat, prevent or cure COVID-19. When the FDA takes action in these cases, it is important to note that numerous unapproved and potentially unsafe products will continue to be sold directly to consumers, in part because in the age of the internet, companies or individuals can simply move their products to another platform once the original site is shut down by authorities.

The FDA has dedicated staff closely monitoring for the sale of products making false claims related to COVID-19. The products we are seeing range from herbal products and ayurvedic medicines to protective masks and hand sanitizers. Some are offered for sale in the United States, while others are marketed outside the country to

As part of our effort to combat deceptive activity, we are working closely with major retailers who are monitoring their online marketplaces for fraudulent products with novel coronavirus and

delays in proper diagnoses and treatment and may even lead to more other pathogen claims. To date, the FDA has received reports of more than 90 products marketed with unapproved claims to prevent, treat or cure COVID-19. The agency has found 50 products marketed on popular online marketplaces with similar, unproven claims. All of these listings have been removed by their respective marketplaces.

> We are also monitoring retail stores, websites that appear to be legitimate pharmacies and social media platforms. The FDA will take action against unscrupulous actors who are marketing unlawful products related to this outbreak. Companies that fail to take corrective action immediately may be subject to federal enforcement action, such as seizure or injunction.

> Consumers and health care professionals can help by reporting suspected fraud to the FDA's Health Fraud Program or the Office of Criminal Investigations. To report adverse reactions or other problems with FDA-regulated products, consumers can contact their state's FDA Consumer Complaint Coordinator.

> The FDA, in conjunction with our federal and international partners, will continue to help advance response efforts to combat the COVID-19 outbreak, and that includes warning consumers against becoming victims of health fraud and taking action to stop

For most of us, the amount of change and information we have absorbed in the past few weeks is overwhelming. As humans, when we are overwhelmed, we are scared; when we are scared, we panic; and when we panic, we tend to make bad decisions. Our first goal should be to slow down and just breathe — even if it's only for a few

we can. This will also give us a sense of control. Make a daily checklist. Eat right. Sleep enough. Meditate. Work out. Drink lots of water. Get outside and soak up some sunshine, if possible. And connect with other people (while remaining at least six feet away).

I am grateful that we have the internet, internet service providers and other technology that allow us to connect to one another. If this outbreak had happened while I was in high school, my sister, Kathy, our mother and I would have been fighting over who got to use the household's one phone, which had a long cord and was located in the kitchen. Use this time to learn to use technology to connect with

The changes have been stomach-churning. Yes, the stock market has fallen. Then it's gone up. Then it's fallen again. Where this will end, no one knows, but volatility is going to stay in the market for a while, at least until the number of new coronavirus patients begins to drop. This will happen faster if we all remain physically distant from

Since the number of test kits available is still relatively small and people with mild symptoms are not being tested, the safe assumption is that anyone you "run into" could be infected and, therefore, could infect you. This is why public health authorities recommend keeping at least six feet away from others. This is also why people should stay in their homes whenever possible.

So, what else can you do? What can you control? You can wash your hands. If you feel sick stay at home, and if you are diagnosed with COVID-19, whoever else lives with you should stay home as well.

Why should you take such drastic precautions? After all, the vast majority of us will be able to fight off the coronavirus without suffering major consequences. The reason all of us need to take these steps is because some of us are at greater risk than others. For example, my sister Kathy has rheumatoid arthritis and is taking a biologic drug to help control the disease. This has compromised her immune system and left her at greater risk of coronavirus. My father, who turns 77 this year, is also at greater risk because of his age (the older the person, the great the likelihood that the coronavirus could prove fatal). My mother-in-law has had previous bouts with

This past weekend, I helped my second-year college student pack Our second goal should be to maintain our own health as much as up her dorm room and drive home to Atlanta for the rest of the school year. This week, she starts distance learning. My son, a high school senior, also started distance learning this week. 




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Red Cross pleads for blood

The American Red Cross now faces a severe blood shortage due to an unprecedented number of blood drive cancellations in response to the coronavirus outbreak. Healthy individuals are needed now to donate to help patients counting on lifesaving blood.

Individuals can schedule an appointment to give blood with the Red Cross by visiting RedCrossBlood.org, using the Red Cross Blood Donor App, calling 1-800-RED-CROSS or enabling the Blood Donor Skill on any Alexa Echo device.

As the coronavirus pandemic has grown here in the U.S., blood drive cancellations have grown at an alarming rate. To date, nearly 2,700 Red Cross blood drives have been canceled across the country due to concerns about congregating at workplaces, college campuses and schools amidst the coronavirus outbreak. These cancellations have resulted in some 86,000 fewer blood donations. More than 80% of the blood the Red Cross collects comes from drives held at locations of this type.

Here in the Southern California Region, more than 160 blood drives have been canceled, resulting in 5,500 fewer blood donations. The Red Cross is adding appointment slots at donation centers and expanding capacity at many community blood drives across the country over the next few weeks to ensure ample opportunities for donors to give.

The Red Cross expects the number of cancellations to continue to increase, which is causing heightened concern for blood collection organizations and hospitals across the country. This blood shortage could impact patients who need surgery, victims of car accidents and other emergencies, or patients suffering from cancer.

T am looking at the refrigerator that contains only one day's supply of blood for the hospital," said Dr. Robertson Davenport, director of transfusion medicine at Michigan Medicine in Ann Arbor. "The hospital is full. There are patients who need blood and cannot

"In our experience, the American public comes together to support those in need during times of shortage and that support is needed now more than ever during this unprecedented public health crisis," said Chris Hrouda, president, Red Cross Biomedical Services. "Unfortunately, when people stop donating blood, it forces doctors to make hard choices about patient care, which is why we need those who are healthy and well to roll up a sleeve and give the gift of life."

Blood drive safety

"We know that people want to help, but they may be hesitant to visit a blood drive during this time. We want to assure the public that blood donation is a safe process, and we have put additional precautions in place at our blood drives and donation centers to protect all who come out," said Hrouda.

The Red Cross has implemented new measures to ensure blood drives and donation centers are even safer for our donors and staff, including:

Checking the temperature of staff and donors before entering a drive to make sure they are healthy.

Providing hand sanitizer for use before the drive, as well as throughout the donation process.

Spacing beds, where possible, to follow social distancing practices between blood donors.

Increasing enhanced disinfecting of surfaces and equipment.

At each blood drive and donation center, Red Cross employees already follow thorough safety protocols to help prevent the spread of any type of infection, including:

Wearing gloves and changing gloves with each donor.

Routinely wiping down donor-touched areas.

Using sterile collection sets for every donation.

Preparing the arm for donation with an aseptic scrub.

There is no data or evidence that this coronavirus can be transmitted by blood transfusion, and there have been no reported cases of transfusion transmission for any respiratory virus including this coronavirus worldwide.

"Volunteer donors are the unsung heroes for patients in need of lifesaving blood transfusions. If you are healthy, feeling well and eligible to give, please schedule an appointment to give now," added

Jury recommends death for man convicted of Downey triple murder

DOWNEY — A jury on Monday recommended that a man convicted of killing two women and a man in Downey nearly eight years ago be

Jade Douglas Harris, 37, was convicted last month of three counts of first-degree murder, two counts of attempted murder, four counts of kidnapping for carjacking and one count of felon with a firearm.

The jury also found true the special circumstance allegations of multiple murders and murder during the commission of a burglary, carjacking and kidnapping.

Sentencing is scheduled on April 21 at Los Angeles County Superior Court, Norwalk Branch.

Harris fatally shot Josimar Rojas, 26, Irene Cardenas Reyes, 35, and Susana Perez Ruelas, 34, on Oct. 24, 2012, after responding to an online advertisement for a vehicle for sale.

According to evidence presented at trial, Rojas and Reyes were killed at a Downey business called United States Fire Protection. Both were bound and placed on their knees before being fatally shot in the

head. The defendant then kidnapped Perez Ruelas and her 13-year-old son and forced her to drive to a nearby home where the vehicle was

located. Once there, Harris shot Perez Ruelas and then her son, who survived his injuries.

Harris was found a day later and arrested.

Harris had been released from prison three months before the killings, after serving an eight-year sentence for a takeover robbery, the prosecutor said.

County files suit over sanitation district's refusal to build park

LOS ANGELES - Following years of negotiations, Los Angeles County has filed a lawsuit to compel the Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County to fulfill their decades-old obligation to fund a long-anticipated regional park on the site of what was once the nation's largest landfill.

As a condition of operating the Puente Hills Landfill from 1983 until its closure in 2013, the Sanitation Districts agreed to set aside money to pay for the development, operation, and maintenance of the future regional park on the site. Despite their promises, no money was set aside for 20 years.

Following the landfill's closure, the Sanitation Districts and the county worked together to develop a Park Master Plan, which the County Board of Supervisors adopted in 2016. The planned 142-acre regional park will serve a park-poor region consisting of communities and cities like Avocado Heights, Baldwin Park, Bassett, El Monte, Hacienda Heights, La Puente, Pico Rivera, Rowland Heights, Whittier, Valinda and beyond.

During the Master Planning process, thousands of neighbors, local municipalities, and key community stakeholders vocalized their enthusiastic support for the Puente Hills Landfill Park they had been promised for decades

"As a member of the California State Assembly representing the San Gabriel Valley, I authored legislation in 1994 requiring that the Puente Hills Landfill be converted into a public park after its closure. Now all these years later, the promises made to the surrounding communities by the Sanitation Districts must be honored," said Supervisor Hilda L. Solis. "I join with the voices of the thousands of neighbors who for far too long have tolerated living near a landfill with the promise that it would one day become a park. The time to act is

now."

In 1994, as a member of the California State Legislature, Solis authored legislation requiring the Sanitation Districts to fund the post-closure transition of the Landfill into a public park. Subsequent County permits reinforced the provision that the Sanitation Districts would provide the funding for the park in exchange for the County's blessing to continue operating the profitable Landfill.

Supervisor Janice Hahn expressed hope that the Districts would move swiftly to honor their commitment. "This community lived with a landfill in their neighborhood for decades. They were promised a park when it closed. I am hopeful that we can come to some agreement so that the Sanitation Districts fulfill that long-time promise to the community," Supervisor Hahn said.

The county's decision to sue came as a last resort after years of efforts to try to resolve the matter short of litigation.
The Sanitation Districts participated in the creation of the Park Master Plan, adopted in 2016, that included the funding and elements of the park. Unfortunately, the Sanitation Districts refuse to provide the necessary funding to construct the Puente Hills Landfill Park.

John Wicker, Director of Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation, emphasized the importance of creating public space on the former landfill site. "The Puente Hills Landfill Park is an opportunity to transform an environmental liability into an environmental, regional, and community asset," Wicker said.

The Puente Hills Landfill Park is located within the boundaries of the Puente Hills Landfill, which is owned by the Sanitation Districts, an independent governmental agency separate from the County of Los Angeles.

SoCal Gas won't shut off service during COVID crisis

Southern California Gas Co. (SoCalGas) this week announced a suspension of service disconnections to any customers who are having a hard time paying their bill. This policy will remain in effect until further notice.

Customers are encouraged to call 1-877-238-0092 to speak with a representative about their bill. SoCalGas customer service is available 24-hours a day, 7 days a week.

"We understand that our customers may be worried about paying their upcoming natural gas bill at this time," said Paul Goldstein, vice president of customer services at SoCalGas. "We want to help ease their concerns and continue to provide the reliable natural gas service they depend on to heat their homes and hot water and cook their food."

SoCalGas continues to closely monitor the COVID-19 situation with local, state and federal health agencies, as well as monitoring and implementing guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

In addition to the temporary suspension of service disconnections, SoCalGas is taking precautionary measures including:

• Asking customers a series a of health-based questions before entering the home

• Instructing employees to keep a safe distance from anyone self-quarantined or sick

• Reminding employees to stay home if they are sick and encouraging work from home and other social distancing practices.

• Implementing company travel, visitor, meeting and event restrictions

• Enhanced cleaning of SoCalGas facilities and personal hygiene practices

• Providing SoCalGas branch offices with hand sanitizer for customer use

2 suspects plead guilty to murder of Downey Police officer

DOWNEY — Two men pleaded guilty today to the 2015 murder of Downey police officer Ricardo "Ricky" Galvez.

Steven Knott (dob 8/18/97) and Jeremy Anthony Alvarez (dob 8/7/94), both of Montebello, entered guilty pleas Monday, admitting the murder and multiple charges arising from a sevenvictim crime spree between September 17 and November 18, 2015 in the cities of South Gate, Montebello, Bellflower, Paramount and Downey.

Knott pleaded guilty to one count each of first-degree murder and attempted robbery with the personal use of a firearm for the killing of Galvez. He faces a term of 50 years to life in state prison as a result of the plea.

Alvarez pleaded guilty to one count each of second-degree murder and attempted robbery for the murder of Galvez and faces 30 years to life in prison.

Knott and Alvarez also ad-

mitted an attempted murder in Montebello on October 18, 2015, shooting at an inhabited dwelling in South Gate on September 17, 2015, a take-over robbery of two victims at a Bellflower cell phone store and a street robbery in Paramount shortly before the murder of Galvez on Nov. 18, 2015.

The pair admitted multiple firearms enhancements and allegations that the crimes were committed in association with members of a criminal street

Sentencing is scheduled on April 17 at Los Angeles County Superior Court, Norwalk Branch.

Galvez, a former U.S. Marine and five-year veteran of the Downey Police Department, was dressed in plain clothes after working with the department's K-9 team when he was fatally shot as he sat in his personal car in the police station parking lot, prosecutors said.

County halts evictions

The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors has issued a moratorium halting all residential and commercial evictions in unincorporated areas amid the coronavirus outbreak.

Supervisor Hilda Solis said Tuesday the county is enacting an emergency moratorium against all residential and commercial evictions through May 31 in unincorporated areas.

The moratorium will be

retroactive to March 4, she said. The move is aimed at protecting tenants who may find themselves unable to pay rent because they lost work due to the coronavirus restrictions. Under the moratorium, tenants would be given up to six months to repay missed rent.

L.A. Mayor Eric Garcetti Sunday also announced a moratorium on evictions for people unable to pay rent as a result of the crisis. Rent can be deferred, Garcetti said.

On Monday, Calif. Gov. Gavin Newsom issued an executive order Monday calling for protections for homeowners and renters during the coronavirus pandemic. Newsom's order, which doesn't release tenants from paying rent, are in effect through at least May 31.

His order also asks for foreclosures and related evictions to be halted during this time period.

Rio Hondo College declares state of emergency

WHITTIER - Río Hondo College's Board of Trustees declared a state of emergency on March 16, providing Superintendent/ President Dr. Arturo Reyes with greater flexibility to formulate a response to issues related to COVID-19, the respiratory illness caused by the novel coronavirus.

The action was taken during a special Tuesday board meeting called specifically to address the issue.

"COVID-19 presents an unprecedented challenge to all of us. Our focus is first on ensuring the health and safety of our students, staff and administrators, and second on continuing our service to our students," Board of Trustees President Oscar Valladares said.

There are no known cases of COVID-19 illnesses at the College, but officials said it was necessary to plan for that eventuality.

The emergency declaration ensures Reyes will have more authority to determine the best path forward, including modifying activities, programs and courses, up to and including temporary closure of the College.

"During this challenging time, it has become clear that Río Hondo College is a community of staff, faculty and administrators dedicated to helping our students pursue and achieve their goals," Superintendent/President Dr. Arturo Reyes said. "We are committed to fulfilling our mission, using every innovative tool at our disposal while promoting health and safety."

HOW COVID-19 SPREADS

Person-to-person spread

The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person.

•Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).

•Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes.

These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs.

Can someone spread the virus without being sick?

•People are thought to be most contagious when they are most symptomatic (the sickest).

•Some spread might be possible before people show symptoms; there have been reports of this occurring with coronavirus, but this is not thought to be the main way the virus spreads.

Spread from contact with contaminated surfaces or objects

It may be possible to contract COVID-19 by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose, or possibly their eyes, but this is not thought to be the main way the virus spreads.

How easily the virus spreads

The ease in which a virus spreads from person-to-person can vary. Some viruses are highly contagious (spread easily), like measles, while other viruses do not spread as easily. Another factor is whether the spread is sustained, spreading continually without stopping.

The virus that causes COVID-19 seems to be spreading easily and sustainably in the community ("community spread") in some affected geographic areas.

Community spread means people have been infected with the virus in a certain area, including some who are not sure how or where they became infected
