

Norwalk lays out \$1 million CARES spending plan

Norwalk will spend \$1.3 million in CARES funds, over an estimated \$580,000 of which on public health expenses.

NORWALK - Norwalk will spend \$1.3 million in CARES funds to offset some of the costs of the Coronavirus, staff told council at their meeting Tuesday.

Of the sum, public health expenses will receive an estimated \$581,504, which includes communication/enforcement of public health orders, acquisition of medical, protective, and cleaning supplies for public health and safety staff, disinfection of public areas, technical assistance on mitigation, public safety measures in response to COVID-19, and quarantining individuals.

Compliance and mitigation will receive \$407,523, which includes telework capabilities for staff, paid sick, family and medical leave, and care for the homeless and other vulnerable population.

Economic support will receive \$150,532, followed by substantially dedicated payroll expenses (\$139,893) and medical expenses (\$25,850).

Staff also requested \$94,787 from the Department of Justice grant awarded to the city for partial reimbursement of COVID-19 related expenses incurred in the previous fiscal year, which has already been approved. They will also seek reimbursement from the FEMA Public Assistance Grant in an estimated total of \$339,308.

"We are thrilled to see the completed Sports Performance Center as part of our Chase Gym

refresh," Dr. Bethany Miller, senior director of athletics said. "This expanded, branded space will provide a spacious and comfortable facility for our over 330 student-athletes to work towards accomplishing their athletic goals now and into the future."

The center is not open yet, but everyone, including Frank Ramirez is a buzz on the potential the center has for those athletes.

Ramirez, who has been at the university since 2016 as the first full-time Director of Sports/strength and conditioning, is preparing for the alternative.

The alternative for the athletes is a temporary weight room setup in the first floor of the parking structure next to the

baseball field.

The training sessions will be outside. "It's actually not a bad situation," Ramirez said.

"The weight room looks good," Ramirez said. "I'm happy and it looks like a college weight room should. We want to compete in our conference. We're (NCAA) Division II now."

"All of the kids are coming back and the athletes are champing at the bit."

However, in the meantime Ramirez has been making alternative plans as athletes are returning to campus and Ramirez is preparing to lead weight-training workouts. These workouts will be in compliance with current guidelines.

"My role with athletics is to train athletes in the weight room," he said. (They will) do some conditioning outside. Basically this prepares athletes to compete at the highest level.

"I'm happy to see the athletic department grow," said Ramirez, who will be getting an assistant in the Fall.

Renovations to the new Sports Performance Center were completed over the summer and gave Ramirez more space along with new equipment.

"The special part is, it creates a recruiting tool and creates a space for athletes that is their own," added Ramirez.

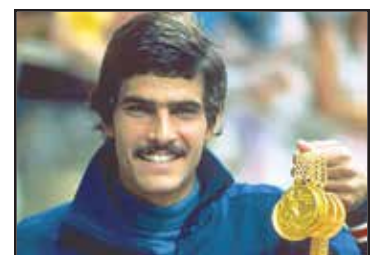

“Previously, we were sharing our old weight room with the student body and kinesiology.

“This is going to be solely an athletic weight room, which creates a separation of space, which is what they want. It creates ownership of this space and obviously we have state of the art equipment. It allows us to train in a capacity that is fitting for that.”

One of those athletes that is patiently awaiting the opening of the center is, Alex Wright, of the Biola Men’s Basketball team.

“The facilities are done and I looked in and it looks nice,” said Wright, who is a 6-5 junior guard. “I’ve seen pictures through Instagram and it looks really spacious.”

Wright, who was named to the PacWest All-Tournament team this past season, is excited

about the future.

“For me, it’s a testament that Biola is ready to invest in their athletes. That’s a good sign.

“I’m sure Frank (Ramirez) is excited and is doing a good job this summer with programs at home. He’s very thorough.”

Ramirez had to move all of the weight room equipment late last year to allow for the renovations.

He has led workouts for the student-athletes in three spaces over the last year.

During the renovations, Ramirez ran workouts for groups up to 30 in the fitness center, which included the general university population, in half the space from January until March when the pandemic shut everything down.

The student-athlete needs to return to fitness before competition and many have limited access to the facilities.

Ramirez is doing some important work this Fall to improve health, safety and performance.

Ramirez graduated from Long Beach State University in 2010 and holds a bachelor’s degree in kinesiology, with emphasis in exercise science. He has his Certified Strength & Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) certification and is also a Registered Strength and Conditioning Coach (RSCC) through the National Strength & Conditioning Association.

Navy engineer among four arrested for stealing government documents

NEWPORT BEACH – Federal authorities on Tuesday arrested four defendants across the country on charges alleging a civilian employee of the United States Navy downloaded technical drawings and manuals related to U.S. military weapons systems and sold the items to a Newport Beach company, which later resold the documents to domestic and foreign customers.

The arrests were made pursuant to a criminal complaint filed in United States District Court in Los Angeles that charges all four defendants with theft of government property. The affidavit in support of the complaint alleges that the thefts have been occurring since at least 2012, and possibly since 2008.

The four defendants arrested this morning are:

·Mark Fitting, 53, of Berlin, New Jersey, an engineer employed by the Navy at a facility in Philadelphia;

·Melony Erice, 54, of Lighthouse Point, Florida, who formerly cohabitated with Fitting in New Jersey;

·George Posey IV, 36, of Costa Mesa, an employee of Newport Aeronautical Sales Corporation (NASC), a Newport Beach company that sells technical aircraft data; and

·Dean Mirabal, 52, of Costa Mesa, another NASC employee.

All four defendants are expected to make initial appearances in federal court in the districts in which they were arrested.

The investigation started when military investigators began looking at Fitting in

relation to claims that he “was interfering with the quality assurance process for aircraft canopies intended for use in U.S. military aircraft,” according to the affidavit. The agents with the Defense Criminal Investigative Service (DCIS) and the Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS) discovered two dozen emails from Fitting’s Navy email account to Erice’s Gmail account, all of which contained government-controlled technical drawings or manuals related to various military weapons systems, including aircraft.

“[S]ome of those drawings and manuals were specifically labeled with International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR) distribution warnings related to export control and destruction, as well as DOD contractor proprietary markings,” the affidavit alleges.

Investigators have concluded that Fitting also had access to Erice’s Gmail account, which allowed both of them to sell the documents and drawings to NASC. “Between September 21, 2012, and June 20, 2019, Fitting and Erice together unlawfully sold NASC at least 5,000 government-controlled technical manuals and drawings,” according to the affidavit.

Over the same nearly seven-year period, NASC issued Erice 150 checks totaling \$509,845, but the two shared the proceeds of the sales, as evidenced by Fitting having access to one of Erice’s bank accounts and Erice being an authorized user on one of Fitting’s credit cards, according to the affidavit. Furthermore, the affidavit contains a lengthy

email from Erice to Fitting obtained pursuant to a search warrant that outlines how Fitting was entitled to 75 percent of the proceeds, with the balance going to Erice.

The affidavit outlines how Fitting and Erice obtained documents and sold them to NASC, sometimes obtaining specific documents at the request of NASC. “In one such instance, on December 8, 2018, at the request of Mirabal, Fitting accessed and downloaded a government-controlled technical drawing for a military landing craft air cushion that he and ERICE sold to NASC, along with at least 16 other government-controlled technical drawings and/or manuals, for \$5,025,” the affidavit states. “Knowing the drawing was unlawfully procured outside of official government channels, Posey paid Erice for the drawing,” which NASC sold to a customer.

The affidavit notes that Fitting was allowed to access military computer systems after promising to safeguard controlled data. The affidavit also notes that Posey and Mirabal “are aware of the appropriate processes to procure government-controlled technical manuals and drawings and, as a result, they know that the acquisition of such manuals and drawings from Erice and/or Fitting is unlawful.”

The felony offense of theft of government property carries a statutory maximum sentence of 10 years in federal prison.

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The lockdown has gone from a mistake to a crime

Four months ago, I wrote a column titled “The Worldwide Lockdown May Be the Greatest Mistake in History.” I explained that “‘mistake’ and ‘evil’ are not synonyms. The lockdown is a mistake; the Holocaust, slavery, communism, fascism, etc., were evils. Massive mistakes are made by arrogant fools; massive evils are committed by evil people.”

Regarding the economic catastrophe in America and around the world — especially among the world’s poor who are dependent upon America and other first-world countries for their income through exports and tourism — I wrote, “It is panic and hysteria, not the coronavirus, that created this catastrophe.”

Unfortunately, I was right.

The world should have followed Sweden’s example. That country never locked down and has even kept children under 16 in school the entire time. As Reuters reported on July 15, the number of Swedish children between 1 and 19 years of age who have died of COVID-19 is zero. And the percentage of children who contracted the illness was the exact same in Sweden as it was in Finland, which locked down its schools.

As regards teachers, Sweden’s Public Health Agency reported that “a comparison of the incidence of COVID-19 in different professions suggested no increased risk for teachers.” Nevertheless, with few exceptions, teachers in Los Angeles and elsewhere refuse to enter a classroom that has students in it. Their disdain for their profession has been superseded only by that of the Los Angeles teachers union, which announced that teachers will not resume teaching until the police are defunded.

People who defend lockdowns and closing schools point out that Sweden has the eighth-highest death rate per million in the Western world. But, needless to say, this has no bearing at all on the issue of whether Sweden was right to keep schools open or whether our country was wrong to close them, let alone keep them closed now. The overwhelming majority of deaths from COVID-19 in Sweden were

among people over 70 years of age, and most of those were people over 80 and with compromised immune systems.

Reuters reported that three separate studies, including one by UNICEF, “showed that Swedish children fared better than children in other countries during the pandemic, both in terms of education and mental health.”

For more than a month, Sweden has had almost no deaths from COVID-19 while the entire society remains open and almost no one wears masks. (In Holland, too, almost no one wears masks.) For all intents and purposes, the virus is over in Sweden.

I live in California, a state governed by that most dangerous of leaders: a fool with unlimited power. Despite the fact that California ranks 28th among the 50 states in deaths per million, Gov. Gavin Newsom has destroyed and continues to destroy tens of thousands of small businesses and untold numbers of livelihoods. His continuing to forbid — a half-year after the onset of the pandemic — indoor dining in restaurants is leading to a projected permanent closure of approximately 1 in every 3 restaurants in the state. The same catastrophic destruction will likely affect retail businesses and services such as hair and nail salons. But all this human tragedy — not to mention increased depression and suicides among the young and increased abuse of children and partners — means nothing to Newsom, to Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti or to the Los Angeles Times, whose editors and columnists continue to advocate for the lockdown while they receive their salaries.

Why can people eat with no mask in an airplane — inches, not six feet, from strangers — but cannot eat in a California restaurant, which is so much bigger than the inside of an airplane, while sitting six feet from others? Because Newsom ordered it, the Los Angeles Times supports it and, like sheep, Californians have accepted it.

According to the California Association of Museums, “Museums are losing over \$22 million a day due to the statewide quarantine. As of August 1, 2020, California museums have lost more than \$2.9

billion in revenue. Museums have a \$6.55 billion financial impact on California’s economy, support 80,722 jobs, and generated \$492 million in tax revenues for the State of California in 2017 and over \$1 billion in federal taxes.”

And the American Alliance of Museums issued results from a survey on July 22, 2020, that warned 1 out of every 3 museums may shutter forever as funding sources and financial reserves run dry.

On Aug. 3, The Wall Street Journal wrote, “In March ... There was broad public support for the prudent goals of preventing hospitals from being overwhelmed and buying scientists time to develop therapies.” But the left — the media and Democratic governors and mayors — immediately moved the goal posts to “bending the curve” and “saving one life,” enabling them to get away with destroying lives and livelihoods.

I conclude with the words of a Swedish medical doctor, Sebastian Rushworth:

“Covid is over in Sweden. People have gone back to their normal lives and barely anyone is getting infected any more. I am willing to bet that the countries that have shut down completely will see rates spike when they open up. If that is the case, then there won’t have been any point in shutting down in the first place ... Shutting down completely in order to decrease the total number of deaths only makes sense if you are willing to stay shut down until a vaccine is available. That could take years. No country is willing to wait that long.”

The lockdown is a crime. But even more upsetting is that it is supported by so many Americans. This country is unrecognizable to those of us who lived through the 1968-1970 pandemic, which killed, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, approximately 100,000 Americans — the 2020 equivalent of 170,000 Americans. Nothing shut down. Not one mask was worn.

Trump, Biden on criminal justice reform

Alice Johnson’s appearance at the Republican National Convention last week was a rebuke to Democratic presidential nominee Joe Biden, who for decades promoted the draconian policies that sent her to prison for life as a first-time, nonviolent drug offender. Johnson’s case was also meant to show that President Donald Trump, who commuted her sentence in 2018 and pardoned her the day after her speech, offers a more enlightened alternative.

The truth is a little more complicated. While Biden’s record on criminal justice issues is long and awful, Trump’s is short and pretty good. But when it comes to promises for the future, a repentant Biden supports several ambitious reforms, while Trump sounds like the Biden of the 1980s and ‘90s.

Johnson, who received a life sentence in 1997 for participating in a Memphis-based cocaine trafficking operation, was introduced during the president’s State of the Union address last year, and she was featured in a Trump campaign Super Bowl ad last February. Her case exemplifies the unjust penalties that Biden — whom the Trump campaign describes, with only a little hyperbole, as “the chief architect of mass incarceration and the War on Drugs” — supported as a senator.

Trump seems to have been genuinely moved by Johnson’s story, and so far he has commuted 10 sentences in addition to hers. By comparison, Barack Obama, who eventually commuted a record 1,715

sentences, approved just one petition during his first term.

The convention also highlighted Trump’s support for the FIRST STEP Act, a 2018 law that included some modest but significant sentencing reforms. One of those provisions dealt with the irrational disparity between the smoked and snorted forms of cocaine, which was created by a 1986 law that Biden wrote.

More than two decades later, in the midst of his unsuccessful bid for the 2008 Democratic presidential nomination, Biden introduced a bill aimed at eliminating that distinction, which had led to strikingly unequal treatment of Black defendants. While the bill went nowhere, Biden as vice president continued to advocate correction of what he last year described as “a big mistake” that had “trapped an entire generation.”

The Fair Sentencing Act, which Obama signed in 2010, shrank but did not eliminate the gap between crack and cocaine powder, and it did not apply retroactively, meaning that thousands of prisoners continued to serve sentences that nearly everyone agreed were excessive. The FIRST STEP Act, which passed the House and the Senate with overwhelming support, addressed the latter problem; it also reduced sentences for repeat drug offenders, expanded “good time” credits, prevented the stacking of multiple firearm charges in a single drug case and widened the “safety valve” that allows low-level, nonviolent offenders to avoid mandatory minimums.

Trump deserves credit for supporting that law, which has freed thousands of federal prisoners, and for using his clemency powers not only to help his cronies but also to ameliorate some genuine injustices. Yet his campaign has nothing to say about further reforms, and his second-term agenda echoes the “tough on crime” Biden, calling for more police on the streets, opposing bail reform, and advocating harsher punishment without explaining why current penalties are inadequate.

Biden, meanwhile, claims to have seen the error of his ways. In addition to equalizing the sentences for crack and cocaine powder, he supports abolishing the myriad mandatory minimums and death penalties he once championed and decriminalizing pot possession, although he still resists repealing the federal ban on marijuana.

“Against all odds,” the president’s daughter said at the convention, Trump “brought together Republicans and Democrats, and passed the most significant criminal justice reform of our generation. And we’re just getting started.” That last part requires some explanation.

“My father did not campaign on this issue,” Ivanka Trump added. “He tackled this injustice because he has a deep compassion for those who have been treated unfairly.” While I am inclined to believe her, Trump needs to clarify the future implications of that impulse.

Don’t let politics impede a vaccine

Trump-haters are so determined to defeat the president that they’re opposing emergency authorization of a COVID-19 vaccine. What a callous disregard for human life. Without a vaccine, another 100,000 fatalities are expected by year’s end, according to Washington University epidemiologists. On Friday, Food and Drug Commissioner Stephen Hahn ignited a firestorm when he said the FDA might grant emergency use authorization to one of the COVID-19 vaccines this fall, if clinical trial results indicate it’s safe and effective.

Emergency use authorization would allow the vaccine to be rushed to frontline health care workers, cancer patients, first-responders, mass transit workers and the elderly. But only those who want it. It’s voluntary, just like “right to try.” Full-fledged FDA approval will take months longer, and most Americans won’t be able to stop in a drug store to get vaccinated until mid-2021.

Emergency use authorization is customarily granted when early results are so promising that waiting would amount to a cruel disregard for the lives that could be saved. The European Union and the United Kingdom also have announced they’re considering emergency or conditional approval.

Joe Biden accuses Donald Trump of meddling in vaccine development rather than leaving it to the experts. Truth is, Trump is revolutionizing how vaccines are developed for this pandemic and

future ones. He learned what not to do from the pathetic performance of the Obama-Biden administration when the H1N1 virus, also called the swine flu, struck in 2009.

The first victim was a 23-month-old Texas baby who died in April 2009. The Obama administration promised to develop and manufacture 100 million vaccine doses by October, but came up with only 11 million, due to a flawed plan and bungled manufacturing. As the delay dragged on, infections tripled to 60 million.

Trump isn’t risking failure. Instead of relying on one vaccine production method, like Obama did, Trump’s Operation Warp Speed has eight companies working on vaccines based on four different scientific platforms. Each company recruits 30,000 volunteers, administers the shots and waits to see if these vaccinated volunteers are significantly less likely to contract COVID-19 than unvaccinated people. The first trials, run by Pfizer, Moderna and AstraZeneca, are expected to finish in December.

Formal approval will be in the hands of Vaccine and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee experts drawn from industry and academia. They meet publicly, examine the data, vote and make a recommendation to the FDA. It often takes months.

But even for emergency use authorization, that committee will be consulted, explains Peter Marks, who runs FDA vaccine approval.

Hahn insists emergency use hinges on data, not politics, but

anti-Trumpers accuse him of trying to boost Trump’s reelection chances. These are the same voices that bash hydroxychloroquine, attack emergency use of Remdesivir, and wish failure on whatever breakthrough could stop the COVID-19 carnage.

Highly respected Anthony Fauci is another matter. His caveats are being touted by the anti-Trumpers. But parse his words. Fauci says, “The one thing you would not want to see with a vaccine is getting an EUA before you have a signal of efficacy.” Hahn has already confirmed emergency use depends on that signal of efficacy. If it’s powerful, then waiting for all 30,000 results would cost too many lives.

Fauci also worries granting emergency use for one vaccine would make it harder to recruit volunteers for other vaccine candidates, because everyone will want the real deal. Sorry, but that’s bureaucratic thinking at its worst. Tell that to a nurse treating COVID-19 patients and desperate for protection.

Meanwhile, Biden announced that if the virus continues, then he’ll consider locking down the country again. Americans have suffered enough from lockdowns.

Trump’s idea is better: “We will achieve a victory over the virus by unleashing American scientific genius.” In short, a safe vaccine developed at warp speed. The naysayers need to get out of the way.

The real America is not on fire. It’s sick.

The Kenosha, Wisconsin, police department immediately took the officer who shot Jacob Blake seven times off the streets, as city, state

and federal officials investigate what happened. They also made a speedy arrest of the 17-year-old who is charged with shooting two demonstrators dead.

Wedge between an incident of possible brutality against a black man and the need to curb right-wing violence, the police did their best. The last thing they needed was President Donald Trump fanning the anger of both unruly protesters and white supremacists clashing with them.

Both the Kenosha mayor and Wisconsin governor asked him to stay away and not make things worse. Of course, he ignored them.

In Portland, mass demonstrations have shrunk into a kind of gang warfare between the worst of the left and the worst of the right. So Trump tries to further inflame the situation by threatening to send the federal forces back into Portland, against the city’s wishes.

“Your offer to repeat that disaster,” wrote Portland Mayor Ted Wheeler, “is a cynical attempt to stoke fear and distract us from the real work of our city.” And it leaves Portland police with the miserable job of managing a bigger mess.

Donald Trump’s America centers on daily arousal of public stress and anxiety, trapping our police departments in no-win confrontations. Inciting disorder in the streets is, of course, how he moves attention away from his spectacular failure during the coronavirus crisis.

Who said the following?

“The police are doing an impossible job. They’re trying to deal with the protesters. They’re trying to stop looting. And they’re trying to keep themselves safe.”

Answer: New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo.

Regarding the George Floyd video, James Rovella, former Hartford detective and now Connecticut’s top cop, said, “If you wear a badge and aren’t appalled by that what you saw, please turn it in and find a new profession; we don’t need you.”

This is the intersection of reality and decency. To repeat, the police have a very hard job, and most do it well. But some people should not be cops. These are not contradictory statements.

There is no justification for rioting or looting. Some of the current protests, however well meaning, do attract a criminal element that takes advantage of the chaos. They’re also a magnet for mayhem tourism, whereby outsiders drive in to trash other people’s downtowns.

Note that several black council members in New York City are infuriated by fringe-left calls to “defund” the police. Their neighborhoods sorely need good policing. The council’s liberal majority leader, Laurie Cumbo of Brooklyn, called these demands “colonization” pushed by white progressives and the movement behind them “political gentrification.” She’s right.

The long game for those who want Trump gone is to refrain from staging emotionally fraught events that he can turn nasty. Do they really care to play extras in his extravaganzas, all designed to portray some ugly skirmishes as an America in flames?

Good Americans who put Black Lives Matter signs on lawns would do well to add Blue Lives Matter signs — and vice versa. Again, no contradiction here. (And in most urban police forces, many of the blue lives, the police, are African American.)

Joe Biden should continue to forcefully condemn violence whether by the right or the left. Running mate Kamala Harris, formerly California’s top law enforcer, might express added support for police doing their impossible job.

Despite some troubling events on which Trump throws gasoline, the real America is not on fire. It is, however, sick — hurtling toward 200,000 dead from a virus that has left the real economy in shambles. This is Donald Trump’s America.

Robbery crew ringleader sentenced to nearly 4 years in prison

SANTA ANA – The ringleader of a prolific robbery crew that targeted traveling jewelry salespeople, following them for many miles at times and inflicting at least \$835,000 in losses, was sentenced last week to 45 months in federal prison.

Federico Santiago Quiroz Lucca, 52, a.k.a. Christian Sergio Alessandro Hernandez Valenzuela, of the Rampart Village neighborhood of Los Angeles, was sentenced via videoconference by United States District Judge James V. Selna, who also ordered him to pay \$835,000 in restitution.

Lucca pleaded guilty in December 2019 to one count of conspiracy to interfere with commerce by robbery.

From October 2017 until April 2019, Lucca and his co-conspirators surveilled and conspired to rob a series of jewelry salespeople and bank customers in the Los Angeles metropolitan area, the San Francisco Bay Area and Denver.

Lucca led and organized the crew's activities, enlisting help from several Colombian nationals who traveled to Los Angeles to participate in the conspiracy and robberies. He also used his apartment as a base of operations and meeting place where some co-conspirators lived, and equipment and stolen goods were stored.

The various heists followed a similar pattern: a member of the crew known as a "scout" identified a victim who was likely to be carrying jewelry or cash. The victims typically were

jewelers conducting business at jewelry stores or malls in Orange County, the Jewelry District in downtown Los Angeles, or at various trade shows.

The scout followed the victim and would wait for an opportunity when the scout and co-conspirators could rob the jeweler.

The co-conspirators followed victims to locations such as gas stations and hotels, where the defendants used a ruse, such as puncturing a car tire to stop the victim, and then posed as a Good Samaritan, or simply used force, to rob the victims.

For example, on February 8, 2018, Lucca and his crew spent four hours following a traveling jewelry salesman making rounds on behalf of his employer to jewelry stores in Orange County. As the victim returned to his car after stopping in Cypress, he was violently pushed from behind, falling into his car door, and his bag containing approximately \$400,000 in jewelry was stolen.

In a January 2019 incident, a couple who operated a jewelry business in Connecticut was participating in a jewelry show at the Los Angeles Convention Center, when a man wearing a yellow and orange safety vest asked to help them pack up their belongings. The man in the safety vest ended up pushing their large cart with all their belongings – including a bag containing approximately \$400,000 in jewelry – and the bag was later discovered to be missing.

Evidence subsequently

developed by investigators determined that Lucca's robbery crew had tracked the victims for days.

Lucca and two co-conspirators were arrested in April 2019 in Northern California after they surveilled various locations, including jewelry stores, a residence, and the Santa Clara Convention Center, where a jewelry show was scheduled to occur. They have been in federal custody since that time.

The total admitted losses in this case were at least \$835,000.

Three of Lucca's co-conspirators – Jose Manuel Lopez Molina, 48, a.k.a. Nestor Eduardo Munoz Laguna, of Colombia; Roberto Alonso Castellanos, 51, a.k.a. Pablo Garzon Leon, of Pomona, and; Jose Oscar Cupitre Nuñez, 48, of Australia, -- pleaded guilty to criminal charges in this case. Castellanos and Molina received prison sentences. Nuñez's sentencing hearing is scheduled for September 14. A fifth defendant, Roberto Melendez Falcon, 54, a.k.a. Arnulfo Delgado Rengifo, of Los Angeles, is scheduled to go on trial in this matter on January 26, 2021.

Chinese national under FBI investigation charged with destroying computer hard drive

LOS ANGELES – A Chinese national and researcher at UCLA has been arrested on federal charges of destroying evidence to obstruct an FBI investigation after he was observed throwing a damaged hard drive into a dumpster outside his apartment, the Justice Department announced.

Guan Lei, 29, of Alhambra, was arrested last week pursuant to a one-count criminal complaint unsealed during his initial appearance in United States District Court.

The criminal complaint alleges that Guan, who was in the U.S. on a J-1 non-immigrant visa, threw a damaged hard drive into a trash dumpster near his residence on July 25. The FBI recovered the damaged hard drive after Guan was not allowed to board a flight to China and after Guan refused the FBI's request to examine his computer.

The affidavit in support of the complaint notes that the internal hard drive "was

irreparably damaged and that all previous data associated with the hard drive appears to have been removed deliberately and by force."

According to the complaint, Guan is being investigated for possibly transferring sensitive U.S. software or technical data to China's National University of Defense Technology (NUDT) and falsely denying his association with the Chinese military – the People's Liberation Army – in connection with his 2018 visa application and in interviews with federal law enforcement.

Guan later admitted that he had participated in military training and wore military uniforms while at NUDT. One of Guan's NUDT faculty advisors in China was also a lieutenant general in the PLA who developed computers used by the PLA General Staff Department, the PLA General Armament Department, Air Force, military weather forecasts, and nuclear technology.

NUDT is "suspected of procuring U.S.-origin items to develop supercomputers with nuclear explosive applications" and has been placed on the Department of Commerce's Entity List for nuclear nonproliferation reasons, according to the affidavit.

In addition to destroying the hard drive, the complaint alleges that Guan concealed digital storage devices from investigators and falsely told federal officials that he had not had any contact with the Chinese consulate during his nearly two-year stay in the U.S.

During his initial court appearance, Guan was ordered detained by a United States Magistrate Judge, who scheduled an arraignment for September 17.

The felony offense of destruction of evidence carries a statutory maximum sentence of 20 years in federal prison.

Lakewood woman charged with DUI crash

LAKEWOOD – A motorist has been sentenced for killing one man and injuring another in a DUI crash earlier this year.

Charlette Anne Colton, 50, of Lakewood entered a no contest plea last week to one count each of gross vehicular manslaughter while intoxicated, DUI causing

injury within 10 years of another DUI with admitted great bodily injury and hit-and-run causing death or serious injury.

Colton was immediately sentenced to 12 years and eight months in state prison.

A restitution hearing was set for October 26 at the Los Angeles

County Superior Court, Long Beach Branch.

On March 24, Colton crashed her minivan into a car, killing a 61-year-old man and seriously injuring a 71-year-old man in Long Beach.

Colton then fled the scene on foot, prosecutors said.

Norwalk man charged with murder

NORWALK – A Norwalk man was charged today with killing two people and injuring others in a DUI crash on the 605 Freeway.

Alex Barragan (dob 8/27/86) faces two counts of murder and one count of driving under the influence of alcohol within 10 years of another DUI offense and driving with a .08 percent blood alcohol content causing injury within 10 years of another DUI offense.

Arraignment was scheduled for Wednesday at Los Angeles County Superior Court, Bellflower Branch.

On July 16, Barragan was allegedly driving his car on the freeway near Alondra Boulevard when he rear ended a disabled van, prosecutors said. The van erupted in flames and two people died and three others were injured, prosecutors added.

If convicted as charged, Barragan faces a possible maximum sentence of 44 years to life in state prison.

Bail is set at more than \$2.19 million.

The case remains under investigation by the California Highway Patrol, Santa Fe Springs Area.

Freeway off-ramp closed for 3 months

Got stress? Here's how 2020 is wrecking your health

Has the stress of 2020 left you grinding your teeth?

Or perhaps you're suffering from headaches, jaw pain, or severe discomfort in and around your ears, all of which can be brought about by the tension many people are experiencing this year as a pandemic, a recession, social unrest and a divisive presidential election create strain in nearly everyone's life.

"All of these symptoms can be connected to TMJ disorders," says Dr. Cathy Hung (www.drcathyhung.com), an oral surgeon and author of Pulling Wisdom: Filling Gaps of Cross-Cultural Communication for Healthcare Providers.

TMJ stands for temporomandibular joint, which is the name for the right and left joints that connect the jaw to the skull. Those joints do yeoman work every day as people talk, eat, yawn or otherwise keep their jaws moving. But the joints also can become the source of extraordinarily unpleasant sensations when things go awry.

"There are a number of reasons a person might suffer from TMJ disorders, including a physical injury or disease," Hung says. "But stress is also one of the major causes, and I have seen patients with TMJ due to stress from the pandemic. When people are tense, they often clench or grind their teeth, tightening their jaw muscles and putting stress on the TM joints. Sometimes severe clenching also can lead to

a cracked tooth or cracked dental crown."

Hung offers a few tips on what to do when the stress in people's lives manifests itself in oral ailments:

Teeth grinding. Technically known as bruxism, this is when someone grinds, gnashes or clenches their teeth. This can happen unconsciously while people are awake, Hung says, but also takes place while they are asleep. Severe cases can lead to TMJ, headaches, and teeth damage. Treatments can include efforts to reduce stress. A doctor can also prescribe muscle relaxants that can help, or a dentist or oral surgeon might fit the person with a mouth guard to wear while sleeping.

Tension headaches. Many people likely wouldn't associate a tension headache with their oral health, but in some cases, there is a connection. A tension headache is a band-like headache that wraps around the temples, Hung says. How does that relate to TMJ disorder? Tension headaches can come from clenching. Headaches associated with TMJ often have other symptoms connected to the jaw, such as jaw pain or restricted movement of the jaw. Over-the-counter pain medications can help, but if they don't a visit to a medical professional is in order, Hung says.

Other TMJ symptoms. Hung says there are a few signs that indicate a person is suffering from TMJ disorder. "For example, you may have a misaligned bite,

or pain and a clicking or grating noise when you open your mouth," she says. "Or, you may have trouble opening your mouth wide." To combat the problem, oral surgeons such as Hung can use a number of treatments, including the aforementioned stress management and nighttime mouth guards that are recommended for teeth grinding. In many cases, physical therapy can help. Other treatments

could include bite adjustment, orthodontics with or without jaw reconstruction, or restorative dental work. "Surgery is sometimes needed, but only in the most severe cases and as a last resort," Hung says.

2020 has produced one source of stress after another, and in many cases people can do little about the events that are putting a burden on their emotional and

physical well being. But that's not the case if stress caused you to suffer from TMJ disorder and other related problems.

"Certainly, treatment can take time to be effective," Hung

says. "But you'll be glad to know that problems associated with TMJ disorder are more easily diagnosed and treated than they were in the past."

GOAT, jabroni among new words added to dictionary.com

Dictionary.com announced Tuesday it has added 650 new words to its database, according to a press release obtained by CBS News. The site also made changes to over 15,000 current entries in a wide range of topics to mark its biggest update ever.

Common phrases, hashtags and slang with roots in the digital sphere and pop culture are now available to those searching the site. The acronym GOAT, which stands for Greatest Of All Time; the slang term amirite, an informal spelling of the phrase "Am I right"; and the term sharent, "a parent who frequently shares [photos and other details about their child] on social media" made the cut.

Another new word is jabroni, defined as a slang term to describe a stupid, foolish or contemptible person.

Many words and terms were added or revised to reflect the

use of language relating to race, gender and mental health.

"The work of a dictionary is more than just adding new words. It's an ongoing effort to ensure that how we define words reflects changes in language and life," Dictionary.com senior editor John Kelly said of the changes. "Among our many new entries are thousands of deeper, dictionary-wide revisions that touch us on our most personal levels: how we talk about ourselves and our identities, from race to sexual orientation to mental health."

Some of the terms reflect changes to language used to discuss race and race-related issues. The site capitalized Black in its entries, "as a mark of respect and recognition that's in line with capitalizing other cultures and ethnicities," the release said. The site also created a separate entry for Black, as it

refers to a person.

The word brownface was also added to the lexicon, defined as the "imitation of a minority group member's appearance, speech, traditional dress, etc., by a person who is not a member of that group."

Other added terms include language concerning gender identity, expression and sexual orientation. Gender-inclusive, meaning "relating to or intended for any gender" and trans+, defined as "of or relating to people with gender expressions outside traditional norms, as transgender, genderqueer, agender, or nonbinary," both made the list.

Tuesday's update also reflect changes in how addiction and mental health are discussed. The release said the site revised all entries to change language used to discuss both suicide and addiction, "to eliminate language

that implies moral judgement or incorporates historical prejudice." For example, uses of the word "addict" as a noun is replaced with "person addicted to or habitual user of," according to the release.

The phrase MeToo was also added to the site, defined both as a hashtag used in solidarity by survivors of sexual harassment or assault "to demonstrate the prevalence of abuse" and "a social movement drawing attention to sexual harassment, sexual assault, and other abuses of authority, especially those resulting from gendered power imbalances in social institutions."

Terms surrounding environmental issues and work, such as "extinct in the wild" and "conservation status," are now searchable as well.

Pizza Hut, Tommy's fined for paying below minimum wage

Three Southern California-based companies that operate two popular restaurants -- Original Tommy's and Pizza Hut -- reached a settlement with regulators Monday for violating L.A. County's minimum wage laws.

The County of Los Angeles Department of Consumer and Business Affairs (DCBA) is announcing settlements with three Southern California-based companies that operate two popular restaurants—Original Tommy's and Pizza Hut—for violations of the County's Minimum Wage Ordinance, which covers work performed in the unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County.

As part of the settlement, the restaurants agreed to pay \$476,777 in back wages and fines to 132 low-wage workers and the

County of Los Angeles.

"During the pandemic, it is crucial that our essential workforce is paid what they are owed. As a former U.S. Secretary of Labor, I am well aware that a smaller paycheck at this critical moment means that some households may have to decide between putting food on the table and paying rent," said Los Angeles County Chair Pro Tem Hilda L. Solis. "I am pleased that our Department of Consumer and Business Affairs has protected the livelihoods of our essential workers at these two establishments."

"Paying employees less than permissible by law will simply not be tolerated in the County," added Los Angeles County Supervisor Mark Ridley-Thomas. "Employers need to be put on notice."

Following a DCBA investigation, the owners of two companies, Tomdan Enterprises Inc. and Koulax Enterprises Inc. DBA Original Tommy's World-Famous Hamburgers, have agreed to pay \$397,775 in back wages and fines for violating the ordinance.

Investigators found that the companies had underpaid 96 of its employees over three years dating back to July 2016. The companies agreed to pay \$147,775 in back wages and \$147,000 in fines directly to the affected employees, plus \$103,000 in fines to the county.

Based on the review of payroll records of Southern California Pizza Company, a franchisee of Pizza Hut headquartered in the City of Orange, DCBA wage investigators cited the company for violations at

six Pizza Hut locations in the county's unincorporated area, including \$19,002 in back wages owed to 36 employees, most of whom worked at the company's location in the unincorporated community of Los Nietos.

The company agreed to pay back wages and total fines of \$60,000 to aggrieved workers and the county.

"Wage theft always causes harm, but during a pandemic, economic injury and inequity are compounded," said DCBA Director Joseph M. Nicchitta.

"I am proud of our wage enforcement program for helping underpaid workers recover what they are owed during this time of economic uncertainty."
