

Norwalk updates codes, permits

■ City officials say the updates are intended to simplify the permit process for local businesses.

NORWALK – The Norwalk City Council unanimously voted to amend some of their municipal codes on Tuesday, making things simpler for the business community.

According to Community Development Director John Ramirez, businesses have expressed desire to be able to open their businesses faster, get permit's quicker and cheaper, and for the city to pull back on some of its burdensome standards, specifically in regards to parking and signage.

The code changes look to do many of these things, while creating a more user-friendly code.

“Some of the key points for this update is that we're taking our list of 3-400 uses at minimum – maybe even more – and we're distilling it down to about 60 to 70 uses,” said Ramirez. “We're simplifying and updating this list of permitted and conditionally permitted uses, we're creating a new administrative director review process, and we're reducing certain application requirements as well as updating some of our standards to promote business investment and expansion.”

Ramirez added that the city was also making updates to reflect current planning practice and law.

For items that require a public hearing, the new administrative review process will condense a formerly four to six-month process to four to six weeks at one third of the cost to businesses. However, it still maintains the public notice process, studies as needed, and referendum to the Planning Commission if needed.

Special events were also addressed, reducing requirements for events on private property and expanding the list of exempted events.

Caren Spilsbury, Executive Director of the Chamber of Commerce, called the move “another step in the right direction.”

“In the 11 years that I've worked in the city of Norwalk, I've appreciated everything that the council and the staff have done to help support the business community,” said Spilsbury. “I could not be more happier than I am right now with the changes that [staff] are proposing that will help our business community whether it's a new business coming in, a current business that wants to do an expansion, or a non-profit that wants to run an event.”

“One of the frustrations over the years has been an unwieldy code that had a lot of requirements that seemed not to match what the current situation was in our business community.”

A similar code overhaul for residential purposes could be visited next year.

Norwalk Covid

As of Wednesday, COVID-19 has infected 5,258 residents and killed 96.

Santa Fe's Damian Hernandez, a Chieftain for life

■ The junior lineman started as a ballboy for Santa Fe's football team at only 5 years old. Today, he hopes his athletic prowess earns him a college scholarship.

SANTA FE SPRINGS – Damian Hernandez is a Chieftain for life.

Hernandez, a junior on the football team and an offensive and defensive lineman, has been on or around Santa Fe High School football fields since he was a baby.

He's gone through a devastating leg injury before his sophomore season and now, of course, the pandemic has delayed the season.

“It's funny, back in 2004 when he was born, I brought him out to practice and that's when he met the legendary Jack Mahlstedt,” said Damian's father, Hector Hernandez, who has coached at the school for 16 years.

He started coaching with Mahlstedt the year Damian was born and continues as an assistant under current coach Dave Pierson.

“He was a baby when he met Jack and even early in mommy's (Barbara) tummy,” Hernandez said. “That's how long he's been here.”

Now that's a Santa Fe baby.

“Jack just said one day, ‘your kid's going to be our ball boy,’” Hector Hernandez added.

Damian did just that, even at the ripe ol' age of five.

“He took the role of ball boy very seriously and took pride in being part of a team he long wished to be a part of,” Hector Hernandez said.

Mahlstedt, who passed away in 2019, coached more than 40 years at the school and won 16 league titles.

Damian Hernandez (Class of 2022) even took some of his first steps on what is now known as Jack Mahlstedt Field on the Santa Fe campus.

Damian gives tons of credit to his coaches.

“I grew up within the program and I treasure everyone that has passed by my life and remains in it,” Damian Hernandez said. “I would not be the player I am today without the coaches, trainers, friends and my family.”

“To be a great player, you have to be coachable. I've learned so much from all my past and current coaches. I apply every bit of advice into my work ethic.”

Santa Fe became a very tight-knit group for both Hernandez's.

“The coaches became extended family and the players became big brothers,” Hector Hernandez said. “Damian felt honored to be a part of the Mahlstedt dynasty. The Mahlstedt's, along with the rest of the coaching staff, embraced Damian as one of their own.”

Mahlstedt would often encourage Damian.

Hector Hernandez would hear Mahlstedt say, ‘Give it your all kid. You will do great things one day’... and walk off by saying ‘who's the greatest?!’, as he smiled at Damian.

“Coach Mahlstedt was very supportive of Damian,” Hector Hernandez said. “Mahlstedt became more than just a coach to Damian. He became an uncle, a mentor, and a friend. Coach Mahlstedt's devotion for the team, his witty ways, and energetic character influenced Damian to want to be a Chieftain.”

After hearing of Jack's illness, Damian visited Jack and his

beloved wife Billie and Mahlstedt told the young man, ‘you know the culture and tradition behind Santa Fe football. You know what it takes to be a part of the program. Make me proud kid, I'll be rooting for you.’

“Those were Jack's last words to Damian before he passed away,” Hector Hernandez said.

Because of coach Mahlstedt's encouragement through the years, Damian plays with such intensity of leaving everything on the field and attempting to make (him) and everyone around him proud.

Pop Warner football is where Damian got his start on the field with the Santa Fe Springs 49ers. In addition, he played for the Los Alamitos Griffins.

“During that time Damian would show up to Santa Fe (High School's) practices and participate on certain drills with the team,” Hector Hernandez added.

In 2012, after Mahlstedt retired, Pierson became the coach and knows how much energy Damian Hernandez has put in to football.

“He's a kid that's invested a lot of time, only to see it slip away,” said Pierson, who coached for Mahlstedt in 1995 through '97.

“He's a hard-working kid who holds himself very well and he's pretty much grown up a Chief.”

There was an immediate admiration from Damian to Coach Pierson.

“Damian admired how intelligent and driven Coach Pierson was and continues to be,” Hector Hernandez said.

Pierson became a friend, mentor and a person of trust for Damian.

Two Chiefs assistant coaches worked wonders for Damian.

Coach Dave Krumins, who is a longtime family friend, taught Damian to never give up and worked with his ethics on the D-line.

In addition, coach Tony Chavarria, who has been known as the heart of Santa Fe football and has a heart of gold, had a lot do with shaping Damian into the young man he is now.

Damian's freshman season was filled with success, as he was named captain, Lineman of the Year and was promoted to varsity for the last three games, in which he started.

His sophomore year was expected to be his breakout year, as he was chosen to start on the offensive and defensive side of the ball. It was not to be, as he suffered a devastating leg injury - a left femur fracture running through his growth plate which required emergency surgery.

"Tragically, in fall camp, (2019) he injured his knee and was out for the season and now this with COVID-19," Pierson said. "It's just been even more difficult with them as a family and for us as a coaching staff and for us as a program."

"We want to see our kids have the opportunity to be successful, play sports and he has been limited because of the injury. We were looking forward to this year, obviously."

Beginning with his injury, Damian Hernandez, has seen his previous two seasons go by the wayside.

"My season came to an end my sophomore year due to an injury and now it is in jeopardy due to Covid-19," Damian said.

He felt everything was being stripped from him.

"The pain was no longer in his femur but in his heart," Hector Hernandez remembers. "His face showed devastation, disappointment, and disbelief. It was definitely an emotional roller coaster for Damian."

Damian began physical therapy, in which he was told he would be unable to walk for a period of three months. Damian refused to live by that and set a goal. He wanted to be able to walk without any assistance.

He was cleared a couple months later and began to rehabilitate and train once again with his personal trainer, former NFL player Justin Cheadle.

Damian worked around the clock to build his strength and stamina. He went from being a 5'-8", 225 lb sophomore to a 6 foot, 265 lb Junior.

"It has been a year of mixed emotions," Damian Hernandez said. "The past eight months have been hard."

The last day I was able to train with my team as a whole was March 13, 2020."

As for interested colleges after high school, Hector Hernandez said, "...A lot of small D III's and Azusa Pacific reached out and La Verne and a couple of schools back east. At the end of the day, he wants to go DI, but whatever is going to pay for school."

Both Damian's parents, Hector and Barbara, who is also the Santa Fe football booster club Vice President, are very proud of their son and just hope for the best in 2021 and '22.

Damian Hernandez is a God-

loving, faithful young man, who pursues his dreams and goals to someday play at the next level.

Damian remains hopeful for a season, which was to be his comeback season.

What they said:

Damian Hernandez (on a possible upcoming season): "Chances are increasing because CIF hasn't given that decision to the state and county and the opportunity to clear us."

"I want to bounce back this year and get my name out there and hopefully colleges start looking at me and just be dominant this year."

"I want colleges to look at me at the center position because I'm not the tallest, but I will be the smartest on the field and the meanest. This year I've been in the backyard weight room everyday working on my technique. I've been going to camps and they have really been helping me."

"It is hard to believe that our season is in jeopardy. Many of us who have dreams of playing at the collegiate level need this season for film. It is hard to understand how it is ok to protest in the streets and we can't practice as a team. We are following all CDC guidelines. We sanitize, keep our social distance, and unfortunately I cannot play a game that I played all my life. I have been preparing myself a lifetime to be able to reach my goals but Covid-19 and those who don't practice CDC guidelines are making it hard for kids like me to play."

Hector Hernandez: "Unfortunately, with this virus, it's not a good time. Fortunately for him (Damian), it's supposed to be his comeback year. He did the necessary things in the offseason to get better. Now the opportunity is basically slim right now. In football you need film and CIF is up in the air. All

these schools are asking, but no film. That hurts more."

Dave Pierson, Santa Fe coach: "It was extremely devastating for us as a team (to lose Damian in his sophomore year). We were really looking forward to him. He's been playing football his whole life. He's pretty much grown up around Santa Fe and played Jr. All-American here locally. He was Santa Fe's ball boy under Jack (Mahlstede) when he was still the head coach. He's culturally been situated to be a Santa Fe Chieftain."

"For Damian, he has been one of those kids that have worked extremely hard. Not only in his rehab, but he was seeking out professional advice, when it came to rehabbing the leg."

"But on top of that he was also working diligently to improve as a football player."

As he started to clear the knee injury protocol, he was able to transition into football drills. In doing so, he continued to work hard this offseason to prepare for it. He was doing mini camps and camps with linemen and all those different types of things that are out there for kids now days where they can go for specialized training. Then the

setback with COVID happened.

"So, for Damian, it's been a double whammy. That's what's compelling for me, because here is a kid that has been out of the game for a number of years now and he's still chomping at the bit to play. That's exciting for us as a team as coaches and we love kids like that."

Whittier votes to oppose county's health order

WHITTIER - Whittier adopted a resolution last week opposing L.A. County's decision to shut down outdoor dining as a result of a recent surge in positive COVID-19 cases.

The resolution formally opposes the shutdown citing "the anticipation of a considerable loss of local jobs and permanent business closures as cause for immediate concern."

Whittier restaurants fall under the purview of the L.A. County Department of Public Health, making the resolution mostly symbolic.

"We are extremely

disappointed in the decision made by the County to impose further restrictions on our already struggling local businesses who have suffered through a catastrophic year," said Mayor Joe Vinatieri. "Although we recognize the actions taken are to preserve public health and safety, there has been no data, no science, to support a link between outdoor dining and a surge in COVID transmissions."

"This is especially devastating to our restaurant owners, to their employees and to their families who are most impacted as we begin the joyous holiday season."

Covid isn't up for debate

"I'm letting my boss know that we're in COVID hell, so I might be a little distracted."

That's what my mom just said to me a few moments ago, right before I sat down at my desk to start my usual work routine.

It was around two weeks ago that we found out that my uncle Fred - who lives in Texas - was COVID-19 positive. A day or so after, his wife Nyla began showing symptoms. Their youngest son, Sam, was next.

It's Fred's birthday as I'm writing this; he's 70 years old. He's also currently in the ICU on a ventilator.

Then this morning word came in from Colorado. Bob - husband to Jody, my late-grandmother's sole remaining sibling - was airlifted to the hospital unable to breathe. Bob, too, is COVID-19 positive, and struggling with complications of the disease.

I wish I could say that I was sad, frustrated, or even angry. But in all reality, the spectrum of my current emotional state falls more along the lines of fatigued, tired, and desperate.

It's hard being a reporter in a pandemic.

I've watched as cases steadily rose in Downey. I know some who have ended up with the disease; thankfully, no one that I know of has passed. Friends of mine have lost their jobs in the meantime.

I feel like I've heard it all when it comes to response to the pandemic. Mask or no mask? What should open and when? Outdoor

dining or take-out only? Hybrid or full-distance?

All while I have felt somewhat (if potentially naively so) safe in my little socially distanced bubble, with a mask securely over my nose and mouth.

Yet here I now sit, scared to leave the house, suspicious of my own family and closest friends. Even over 1,000 miles away, suddenly Texas felt like my own backyard.

I don't believe that this pandemic is a hoax; I view the coronavirus as very, very real.

However, as credible a threat as I believe it to be, it pales in comparison to the sad fact that the virus is treated more as an area of contention with one another than a problem to be tackled.

Nearly all year, we have treated the coronavirus as a subject of argument. Instead of collaborating and finding solutions, we choose to point fingers back and forth at one another. COVID-19 isn't just an illness; it's a political bullet point.

We are all hurting, some more than others in different ways. We have all been affected at this point, in some way, shape or form.

I'm not asking everyone to agree overnight; that is simply illogical.

But the time for debating is over. We desperately need unified action.

As cases once again rise and new public health mandates are placed into effect, we need to realize that we are past the window of



what is right and what is wrong; we are simply at the point of what is.

Only together will we be able to turn this around and - hopefully - get our lives back to some form of normalcy.

COVID-19 makes it hard enough to breathe without the rest of us grasping for each other's throats.

New Congress needs to get tough on trade

Now that election day is behind us, new and returning lawmakers in both parties are looking ahead to next year. They're strategizing for what surely will be a momentous legislative session.

Trade enforcement deserves a spot high on my former colleagues' to-do list. Holding our trading partners accountable to existing pacts, and negotiating robust new agreements with our allies, would create jobs and help our economy fully recover from COVID-19.

International trade has long been a boon for the U.S. economy. Last year, the United States traded nearly \$6 trillion worth of goods and services with foreign nations. Nearly 39 million U.S. jobs rely on international trade. At a time when one in 10 Americans who want to work cannot find jobs, it's never been more important to preserve and strengthen these economic opportunities.

Unfortunately, foreign trade barriers threaten many of these economic benefits.

For instance, local content requirements in Canada, Brazil, South Africa, and India limit the amount of U.S. television programming that can be broadcast within their borders. And the world's preeminent form of audio IP theft, "stream ripping" -- illegally downloading an audio file from a legitimate streaming platform onto your own devices -- is a regular occurrence in Canada. These

practices unfairly devalue U.S. creative content and keep our artists from being fairly compensated for their work.

Similarly, unfair and often discriminatory medicine price controls in countries like Canada, Japan, Korea, and the United Kingdom undervalue U.S. biopharmaceuticals. These practices make it difficult for U.S. drug companies to break into foreign markets, sell new medicines at fair market prices, and recoup R&D investments to develop new cures.

Congress has an essential role to play in stopping these trade violations. After all, it funds the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative -- which negotiates and enforces trade treaties on our country's behalf -- and gives the final go-ahead to trade agreements. And, consistent with its constitutional authority to "regulate commerce with foreign nations," lawmakers already have demanded robust U.S. trade negotiating objectives through the 2015 Trade Promotion Authority law. Now, Congress and the administration need to work together to advance their goals and eliminate onerous trade obstacles once and for all.

Policymakers can start by enforcing our existing trade deals, like the U.S.-Korea Free Trade Agreement (KORUS). Since signing the deal in 2018, Korea has continued to undervalue American intellectual property, particularly when it comes to medicines. The United States should hold Korean officials accountable and demand

that they "appropriately recognize the value of . . . patented pharmaceutical product[s]," like they promised.

Members also have a duty to pay close attention to ongoing trade negotiations, such as the phase two U.S.-Japan talks. During phase one discussions -- which produced a limited treaty earlier this year -- U.S. trade officials failed to negotiate robust protections for U.S. intellectual property. Lawmakers can wield their trade authority to ensure that American negotiators don't make the same mistake during their second go-around.

The impending U.S.-UK trade agreement provides Congress with yet another opportunity. The United Kingdom routinely devalues U.S. pharmaceuticals and impedes U.S. agricultural exports. Addressing these trade barriers would create American jobs and set a good precedent for all other future trade deals.

In the next legislative session, lawmakers will inevitably find international trade negotiations on their dockets. Driving a hard bargain is the only way to establish a fair playing field for American companies and ensure a strong economic recovery.

Obama's failure in Afghanistan

Shortly before becoming vice president, Joe Biden traveled to Afghanistan in his role as chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. When he returned, he had a succinct assessment of the situation there: "a real mess."

When he takes the presidential oath on Jan. 20, Biden will find not much has changed. He will find himself saddled with a host of serious problems -- a raging pandemic, a struggling economy, a toxic political environment -- that are largely the fault of Donald Trump. But the blame for being stuck in Afghanistan lies mostly with Barack Obama.

The first volume of his presidential memoir, "A Promised Land," is a reminder that when it came to America's longest war, Obama was an unequivocal failure. He expanded the war, sacrificed far more lives, spent hundreds of billions of dollars and departed with the war dragging on and with success as far away as ever.

His book reveals Obama to be a cogent critic of the American effort. When he arrived, his Pentagon officials wanted him to send 30,000 more troops, and Obama was reluctant. The people advising him, he laments, were part of "a U.S. military that prided itself on accomplishing a mission once started, without regard to cost, duration, or whether the mission was the right one to start with."

He understood the scale of the task in Afghanistan. "We needed to drastically improve the (President Hamid) Karzai government's ability to govern and provide basic services," Obama recalls. "We needed to train up the Afghan army and police force so that they would be competent and large enough to maintain security within the country's borders without help from U.S. forces." And unless

Pakistan stopped helping the Taliban, he says, "our efforts at long-term stability in Afghanistan were bound to fail."

Obama should have realized he was buying oats for a dead horse. It dawned on him, he says, "that even in the best-case scenario -- even if Karzai cooperated, Pakistan behaved, and our goals were limited to what (Defense Secretary Robert) Gates liked to call 'Afghan good enough' -- we were still looking at three to five years of intense effort, costing hundreds of billions more dollars and more American lives." Note: That was his best-case scenario.

In the end, he narrowed the strategy proposed by the generals and set a timetable for drawing down. He discarded the idea of

nation-building. But he tripled the size of the U.S. force.

The excuse he gives now is that "the alternatives were worse" -- namely, that if we pulled out, the Afghan government would collapse and the Taliban would take over. But that prospect is as real now as it was then.

The ultimate fear was that a Taliban government would once again grant al-Qaida a base to attack America. But if the Taliban have learned nothing else, they have learned that facilitating terrorism on the United States is not a winning strategy.

Today, the Kabul government has control of only a third of the country's districts. The number of civilian deaths attributable to the Taliban has risen steadily this year, despite the peace agreement the U.S. signed in February. In May, the inspector general for the defense department reported, "Pakistan continues to harbor the Taliban and associated militant groups in Pakistan."

Nothing of importance has changed since 2009. But in the Obama years, more than 1,700 American service personnel gave their lives for this futile enterprise -- triple the death toll under George W. Bush.

Obama would have done well to heed his vice president's counsel. Biden opposed the 2009 troop surge. In 2015, the president had to decide whether to stick to his plan to withdraw entirely before he left office. Biden saw little to be gained from investing more lives and money. Obama, however, elected to stay in Afghanistan (a decision that presumably will be covered in his second volume). Trump has done the same, at least so far.

Obama, who knew all the reasons this war was a waste, lacked the courage of his doubts. So Biden will face the same dismal options Obama did.

The difference is that Biden has long had a better understanding of our mistakes. In the administration's internal 2015 debate, The New York Times reported, he "argued that the country would revert to chaos, regardless of how long the United States stayed there. 'It doesn't matter if we leave tomorrow or 10 years from now.'"

It still doesn't.

Dear Editor:

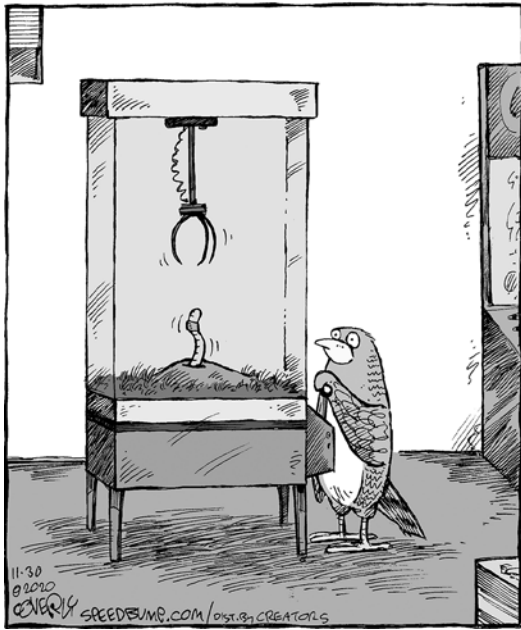
1. Voter I.D. must be required in all states. Period.

The Norwalk City Council, at a meeting held December 1, 2020, introduced proposed Ordinance No. 20-1720, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORWALK AMENDING TITLE 5 OF THE NORWALK MUNICIPAL CODE AS IT RELATES TO SPECIAL EVENTS AND PAWNBROKERS AND TITLE 17 OF THE NORWALK MUNICIPAL CODE AS IT RELATES TO DEFINITIONS, APPROVAL PROCEDURES, SPECIFIC USE REQUIREMENTS, OFF-STREET PARKING AND LOADING REQUIREMENTS, SIGN STANDARDS, AND PERMITTED LAND USES AND FINDING THE ORDINANCE EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT, by the following roll call vote:

AYES: Councilmembers Ramirez, Rios, and Valencia, Vice Mayor Ayala, and Mayor Perez
NOES: None
ABSENT: None

The Ordinance will amend Title 5 and Title 17 of the Norwalk Municipal Code to support the economic recovery of existing and proposed businesses, facilitate development and streamline the development process. The following outlines the amendments staff is proposing to Title 5 and Title 17, to promote economic recovery within the City:

- Improve the special events process by reducing requirements for events held on private property and expand the list of exempted events;
- Implement an administrative review process, which will allow Director discretion over certain land uses, minor variances, and limited improvements;
- Establish more flexible sign standards by allowing a greater number of signs and increase the duration for temporary signs;
- Relax parking standards by lowering the parking requirements for various commercial uses and improve readability of parking ordinance by creating a parking matrix that is also consistent with the proposed land use matrix; and
- Establish a more user-friendly code by creating a land use matrix.

In addition, the Ordinance proposes to establish a new fee that will be associated with the creation of the administrative review process, titled "Director Approval Request"; this will allow staff to recover full costs reasonably borne in providing such services.

Protect yourself against West Nile virus

■ Vector control officials are advising residents to protect themselves against potentially dangerous mosquitoes.

NORWALK - Mosquitoes can transmit diseases such as West Nile virus, Zika, dengue, yellow fever and chikungunya, which can cause debilitating illness and death to humans as well as birds, horses and other wildlife. The Greater Los Angeles Vector Control District (GLACVCD) stresses the importance of taking preventative steps against mosquitoes.

A local government and public health agency dedicated to reducing populations of public health vectors and preventing human infection associated with mosquito-transmitted diseases, GLACVCD has issued the following tips to stay safe.

Eliminate standing water around the home in clogged rain gutters, rain barrels, discarded tires, buckets, watering troughs or anything that holds water for more than a week. Mosquitoes lay eggs on the walls of water-filled containers and those eggs can hatch into biting adults in as little as five days. Scrub the containers to remove mosquito eggs as they stick like glue and hatch when exposed to water.

Tightly cover water storage containers so mosquitoes can't get in to lay eggs.

Ensure that swimming pools, spas and ponds are properly maintained.

Change the water in pet dishes, birdbaths, flower pots and other small containers weekly.

Request mosquitofish from your local vector control district for placement in ornamental ponds.

Report neglected (green) swimming pools to your vector control district.

Mosquitoes are most active from late afternoon to the evening hours. Anyone outside during these hours should wear long-sleeved shirts and pants and use insect repellent containing DEET, Picaridin and oil of lemon eucalyptus.

To help West Nile virus surveillance and control efforts, report dead birds at westnile.ca.gov.

SoCal's post-pandemic recovery will be slow, experts say

LOS ANGELES – An inclusive economic development strategy is critical to Southern California's long-term economic prospects as the region begins a slow and prolonged post-pandemic recovery, experts said Tuesday.

More than 400 leaders in business, public policy, housing and education participated in the 11th annual Southern California Economic Summit, held virtually this year by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG). The summit featured forecasts from the region's top economists and a focus on "Charting an Inclusive Regional Recovery," which SCAG has prioritized as one of its key initiatives this year.

"We face challenges on multiple fronts – a pandemic unlike anything we've experienced in our lifetimes, a resulting economic downturn worse than anything we've seen since the Great Depression and an equity gap that has reached historic levels. As we build our recovery strategy, creating an environment where everyone has the opportunity to succeed is essential to building a strong, resilient, sustainable economy," said SCAG President Rex Richardson, a Long Beach City Councilmember.

That theme was echoed in the economic forecasts presented Tuesday, which showed that lower-income segments of the population have experienced dramatically more negative impacts, including deeper job losses and a projected longer recovery. Those challenges are exacerbated by Southern California's higher cost of living, particularly in the area of housing.

Overall, the six-county SCAG region saw employment drop by more than 1.78 million jobs – or 19.7% – between February 2020 and April 2020. The hardest-hit industries were leisure and hospitality (down 45.4%), other services (down 27.3%), information (down 22.7%) and nondurable goods (down 17.4%).

Despite that, housing costs have continued to increase, with home prices alone jumping 2.6% from August 2020 to September 2020.

The disproportionate loss of low-wage and entry-level jobs "places additional pressure on affordability concerns which were impacting the region long before the pandemic took hold," said Wallace Walrod, Chief Economic Advisor for SCAG.

Every county in the region faces a slow, prolonged recovery, the economists said.

In Los Angeles County, the tourism sector "will likely take years before it reaches post-pandemic highs as global travel recovers and people feel more comfortable," according to Shannon Sedgwick, Director of the Institute for Applied Economics and Tyler Laferriere, Associate Economist for the Los Angeles County Economic Development Corporation.

Similarly, in the Inland Empire, tourism-related sectors were the hardest hit and "will still be lagging pre-pandemic highs well after 2021," said John Husing, of Economics & Politics Inc.

In Orange County, the hardest hit sector was Leisure and Hospitality, which saw considerable losses as restaurants, hotels, and of important note – Disneyland – shut their doors for the first extended period since opening in 1955. Despite these losses, Orange County's diversified industry base has already made progress in

rebuilding its labor market and business and consumer sentiment in the region is already improving.

Ventura County, which had experienced sluggish growth leading up to the pandemic, "is likely to see a slow and prolonged recovery period with growth rates likely to lag those at the state level over the next few years," according to Matthew Fienup and Dan Hamilton, from the Center for Economic Research & Forecasting at California Lutheran University.

In Imperial County, as with the region as a whole, a lack of additional federal stimulus along with rising COVID case counts "will likely result in a much more prolonged recovery, if not additional job losses," said Michael Bracken, of the Development Management Group.

All of that said, the economists believe Southern California has some fundamental advantages over many other parts of the

country.

"While the recovery may take time, Southern California's strong economy, robust healthcare infrastructure, and strong education system will all serve as valuable drivers in the process of recovery and resilience," Walrod said. "The region also faced significant hurdles recovering from the Great Recession, but stepped up and helped fuel the state's economic recovery. To build resilience in the long run, leaders in government and across sectors are using this opportunity to not just recover but to reimagine the future."

"The opportunity before our region is that COVID-19 has provided clarity on the weaknesses and inequities in our economic structure, and we must now embark on the changes needed to assure a resilient and inclusive recovery," said Kome Ajise, SCAG Executive Director.
