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College receives \$1 million gift

■ Cerritos College will use the endowment to help students pursue Jainism, an Indian religion.

NORWALK - The Cerritos College Foundation this week announced it received a \$1 million gift commitment to establish the Bhagavan Kunthunath Endowed Scholar of Jain Thought Leadership.

This is the first-known Endowed Jain Scholar at a United States community college.

The donors are docors Jasvant and Meera Modi and Harshad and Raksha Shah. The endowment will further thought leadership on nonviolence, the environment, historical contributions, spirituality, meditation, food, and culture.

The foundation named Credit ESL Professor Lee Anne McIlroy as the college's Endowed Scholar for 2021. Lee Anne, who is also the college's Student Learning Outcomes Coordinator, has an extensive background in Jainism, having been introduced to the philosophy when she was eight by her father. Jainism has been a consistent influence throughout her life.

In 2017, she adopted the five Jainist vows or Anuvratas, and she tries to use them in her daily life. She earned degrees in linguistics from UCLA and California State University, Long Beach and a certificate in French language and literature from the University of Neuchâtel.

In 2013, Lee Anne was the Senior English Language Fellow in Tanzania and has worked as a Language Specialist for the U.S. Department of State and Georgetown University's Center for Intercultural Education and Development in Tanzania and the Comoros Islands.

Dr. Jasvant Modi, a prominent Jain philanthropist, was instrumental in the creation of this opportunity.

"We want as many people as possible to be exposed to this philosophy; ideas which were promoted by Mahatma Gandhi, Martin Luther King, and many conscientious others who solved the great problems of the day with nonviolent approaches," said Dr. Modi.

To date, the Jain community has made a \$14 million investment in US education. The Modis, Shahs, and other Jain philanthropists have already established chairs and scholars in perpetuity at eleven universities and have termed relationships at another five.

The Federation of Jain Associations in America (JAINA) assigns an official name to each Jain studies scholar to represent one of the 24 Tirthankaras, or spiritual teachers of the dharma (righteous path). Lee Anne will bear the name of the 17th Tirthankara, Bhagavan Kunthunath. Jainism is the sixth largest religion and one of the oldest in the world. However, most Americans are unaware of the religion and the impact it has had on nonviolent protest, peace principles, and sustainability.

"Our ability to establish the nation's first Endowed Jain Scholar at a community college is a testament to the incredibly strong relationship we have within our Indian American community across the district," said Cerritos College president and superintendent Dr. Jose Fierro.

"The College is deeply honored to receive this generous gift that will enhance our diversity efforts and expose our students, staff, and faculty to a more culturally rich learning environment. The Modis and Shahs have created a lifetime of opportunities for Cerritos College students, faculty, and community members to discover the beauty of Ahimsa parmo dharma and we are eager to continue working with the Jain community.

"This Sanskrit phrase, popularized by Mahatma Gandhi, demonstrates the universality of Ahimsa. Ahimsa means non-violence, paramo means topmost or supreme, and dharma means duty," he continued.

LA County looks to add electric vehicle charging stations

■ With GM doing away with gas-powered cars, county leaders explore ways to dramatically increase electric charging stations.

LOS ANGELES - The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors approved a proposal Tuesday to create an LA County Zero Emission Infrastructure Plan that will identify gaps in the county's current electric vehicle charging infrastructure and create a strategy to close them, especially in the county's low-income areas.

"It is not surprising that the vast majority of the electric vehicles in LA County and the charging stations they depend on are in high-income neighborhoods," said Supervisor Janice Hahn, who proposed the plan with Supervisor Sheila Kuehl.

"But if we are serious about getting more electric vehicles on the road, we need to dramatically expand our charging station infrastructure and make these cars practical for every driver, no matter where they live or where they work."

The LA County Sustainability Plan set the goal of installing 60,000 new zero-emission vehicle charging stations by 2025, 70,000 by 2035 and achieving 100% of all new light-duty private vehicles are zero emission vehicles by 2045.

According to the California Energy Commission, there are less than 20,000 public and shared-private chargers in LA County today. The ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach have committed to transitioning terminal equipment to zero emissions by 2030 and on-road trucks by 2035.

"This is a terrific time to put our pedal to the metal," said Kuehl. "GM is ending its manufacture of gas-powered cars; The president is investing in electric vehicle charging stations; The governor's plan wants all new cars to be zero emission. It's time for LA County to build a Zero Emission Infrastructure Plan to meet our ambitious goals of installing 60,000 zero emission charging stations in the next four years as called for in the County's Sustainability Plan. This motion makes sure that we can meet that goal."

The plan, which is due back to the board in 120 days, would include:

a GIS analysis of current charging stations across the county, not limited to county property;

a list of possible locations including county facilities, housing developments, county road right-of-way, parks, libraries, etc. where infrastructure can be placed, including county-owned lands along the I-710 corridor that can be used for the charging of medium



and heavy duty vehicles;

Ways to partner with private, government and non-governmental entities in low-income communities to ensure equitable access to infrastructure and address issues of EV adoption disparity;

Possible funding strategies for the installation, operations, and maintenance of electric vehicle equipment;

A plan to provide technical assistance to cities to support streamlining of codes for electric vehicle charging equipment using the county's code as a model;

A partnership with the Workforce Development, Aging and Community Services, California Conservation Corp/LA Conservation Corp and other apprenticeship organizations to create green job workforce training opportunities for future electric vehicle infrastructure installations and maintenance.

The motion passed by supervisors also directs LA County's legislative advocates to support any proposals that provide resources and funding for electric vehicles and electric vehicle infrastructure in Los Angeles County.

Lynwood considers lawsuit over faulty high school construction

■ Lynwood school officials claim the high school was built with structural deficits that did not meet state standards.

LYNWOOD - Further investigation of Lynwood High School buildings revealed extensive construction issues that extend beyond those initially discovered, with egregious construction defects that threaten the basic structural integrity of the buildings, and the Board of Education is reviewing their options to litigate and recuperate construction costs associated with fixing Lynwood High School's classroom building, officials said this week.

The review was launched out of an abundance of caution after the unexpected failure of exterior ceiling panels, called soffits, in one of the high school's buildings in June 2020.

LUSD's Board of Education immediately initiated an independent engineering review of all campus structures in June to ensure the integrity of the buildings.

Since the initial failure of the soffits at LHS, the area under repair - as well as the majority of the campus - was closed to students, staff and faculty while the inspection proceeded. It was determined early on that certain buildings on campus were safe, such as the library and gymnasium.

According to newly released engineering reports, further inspections revealed extensive structural issues with some faults related to the collapse last summer, and additional issues related to the original contractors' failure to construct the buildings in accordance with the approved plans and specifications.



The inspection found that of the 49 locations on campus, only three areas were in compliance with approved documents. The internal structural issues include, but are not limited to:

Screws were attached on one side of metal studs but not on both, as required.

Metal studs were attached to a metal deck with shot-pins; shot-pins are not allowed by the Division of the State Architect (DSA), which regulates school construction.

Electrical conduit pulling apart and exposed wires.

Plywood decking was used at archways and overlapping, instead of the nonflammable metal decking required.

Concrete was glued together and glued in place to the metal frame, instead of being attached with screws as required.

Required seismic bracing was omitted.

California law typically prevents lawsuits for hidden construction defects more than

10 years after construction.

However, there are exceptions, including where a party's misconduct is so serious and prevalent that it was either the result of a deliberate decision to cut costs or of a virtually reckless failure to adequately supervise subcontractors.

"The Board of Education believes that the Lynwood High School construction issues fall within the narrow exception in California law and the District is continuing to investigate and evaluate the issue," Board of Education President Maria G. Lopez said.

"Since the initial incident last summer, the Board and District have taken our time to identify the best path forward that focuses on our top priority of ensuring safety of LUSD students and staff."

In an effort to support student and staff safety, Lynwood Unified is in the process of realigning campus instruction in 2021-22 as the District works to resolve the structural issues. The

realignment includes physically moving instruction off Lynwood High School's campus.

"Lynwood Unified is evaluating the potential liability of all parties involved in the design, construction and inspection of Lynwood High School, and considering all of its options in seeking to address the egregious defects that were discovered through the engineering review," Lynwood Unified Superintendent Gudiel R. Crosthwaite said.

"The District is committed to maintaining its financial viability by seeking compensation from those parties responsible."

Lynwood Unified will continue to provide regular updates via the District website, social media and community eblast messages as new information becomes available.

Construction of Lynwood High School began in January 1995. The \$98.4 million school partially opened with substantial completion in 1998. Final construction work was completed in July 2000.

Iturralde, a high-achieving scholar with a 4.2 GPA, has been recognized as a 2021 Dell Scholar by the Michael and Susan Dell Foundation, supporting her journey to becoming a first-generation college student.

She will receive a \$20,000 scholarship spread over four years, a laptop and access to Dell Scholars Connect, a mentoring

program that offers support from other Dell Scholars.

"Receiving the Dell Scholarship has been unbelievable," Iturralde said. "Beside receiving financial support, I know I will not be alone in this new stage of my life. Being guided through this new journey gives me confidence to accomplish the new goals I have set for myself. I want to thank my mom for always trying her best to help me and hope to make her proud in obtaining my degree."

As a single working mom raising two children, Iturralde's mother has played a prominent role in Idaly's education over the years, making time to drive Iturralde to the library for tutoring services, even after a long shift at work. This work ethic has greatly informed Iturralde's academic achievements and has helped to guide her post-secondary plans and career path.

Iturralde plans to major in public health, then apply for medical school. Her volunteer work at PIH has led her to focus on providing assistance to Hispanics, emphasizing healthy diets to prevent potentially life-threatening medical conditions like high cholesterol, high blood pressure and diabetes.

Iturralde's proudest academic achievement is being selected to Pioneer's Top 25 students during her sophomore and junior years. She has served as a tutor for the Pioneer Summer Math Academy, helped young children learn the alphabet as a preschool tutor, has written letters to children with disabilities, and volunteered as a poll worker for the 2020 election.

"My favorite moments at school have to be making new friends in class," Iturralde said. "My friends are always there to pick me up and I am grateful for that. When we've had a difficult test day, they are the ones who bring the laughs out and reduce the stress."

Iturralde is still considering which college to enroll in, and has narrowed her choices down to UC Berkeley or UC San Diego.

"I am so happy for Idaly and proud that she has been recognized as a Dell Scholar," Pioneer Principal Lilia Bozgian said. "Idaly is a Titan leader and role model at school, and her volunteer spirit has brought joy to so many people. I wish her the best of luck in her career pursuits."

College course prepares students for careers in microbrewing

The class at Rio Hondo is the first of its kind to be offered by a Southern California community college.

WHITTIER - Rio Hondo College student Kimberly Yanez carefully measured out seven grams of dry hops into a glass beaker, the first step in a classic formula for converting processed grains into a liquid wort before placing it into a fermenter, ultimately becoming a delicious British ale.

The lesson in microbrewing is part of Rio Hondo College's new introductory level biotech course, Fermentation Technology. Inspired by the ever-expanding craft beer industry, Fermentation Technology is the first class of its kind offered by a Southern California community college, with the goal of training the next generation of professional microbrewers.

"Los Angeles County is home to nearly 100 breweries and they are looking for new hires who are fully trained in the science of fermentation and beer making," Rio Hondo College Biotech Professor Robert Bethel said. "Although anyone can use a homebrewing kit to make their own beer, to become a professional you need to have a thorough understanding of the biotechnical process."

Fermentation Technology covers a variety of topics, such as the technique known as batch yeast fermentation, the biology and genetics of yeast, the influence of raw materials such as hops and malt, the history of beer brewing and current status of the industry, analysis of equipment and technical aspects of brewing, and the design, formulation and execution of brewing beer in a hands-on environment.

For Yanez, who works as a bartender, the class offers an opportunity to research her

profession as she considers opening her own drinking establishment and, possibly, her own brewery.

"I had no idea what an extremely complicated process it is to brew beer," Yanez said. "There is a lot of math and a lot of attention to detail. You need to know how to use your ingredients, incorporate the right equipment, strictly adhere to a recipe and plan your time. It's fascinating. I love it."

According to Bethel, the advantage of a profession in brewing is that it can be done anywhere at any time of the year, as opposed to winemaking, which requires an ideal climate and is restricted to a limited vinting season.

Additionally, while wine is expected to change from year to year with each new crop, beer must taste the same every time.

"Beer has a very dedicated customer base, which must be kept happy and loyal, especially

now with so much competition," Bethel said.

"Not only do we cover the scientific aspects of brewing, we teach the students the nuances of each ingredient, where to source them and how to perfect their product. The goal is for students to walk into a brewery and get hired."

Fermentation Technology students are preparing to take their first field trip to a local brewery to gain firsthand knowledge of the industry. Rio Hondo College has partnered with an advisory committee of local brewers, who will lend their advice and expertise to students.

"Thank you to Mr. Bethel and our biotechnology department for creating this dynamic new course that further fulfills the Rio Hondo College mission of providing career pathways to our students," Rio Hondo College Superintendent and President Teresa Dreyfuss said.

It's good business to save democracy

Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell had a warning for American business: "Our private sector must stop taking cues from the Outrage-Industrial Complex." The sector's complaints centered around Republicans' going state to state to undermine free and fair elections.

And so, are companies outraged? Damn straight they are. They have good reason, and it's not because their chief executives are "woke" or the left pressured them. It's because a healthy democracy is in their corporate interests.

The Trump-led push to overturn the 2020 election results, Rebecca Henderson writes in Harvard Business Review, "is a threat not only to democracy, but to the long-term health of the economy and to the strength of American business." Similar attacks wrecked democracies in Europe in the 1930s, and South America in the 1960s and '70s, with dire economic repercussions.

American businesses, Henderson adds, "assumed that someone else would ensure that democracy, the rule of law, and the kind of robust, respectful discourse that keeps societies healthy would simply survive."

Now they have to take up that burden. Top executives at hundreds of companies — including giants such as Amazon, Google and BlackRock — joined to oppose voting restrictions. CEOs remain widely trusted by the American public, and the 2020 Edelman Trust Barometer found that 92 percent of employees want their companies to speak out on the issues. Amazon alone employs more than 800,000 Americans.

And the corporate anger goes beyond the extraordinary piece of democratic vandalism Georgia passed last month. Drawn in the dead of night, the voting law empowered partisan lawmakers to dismiss the authority of elected county voting officials and the elected secretary of state to count the ballots.

When the CEO of Atlanta-based Delta Air Lines protested, Georgia's Republican-controlled House voted to repeal a \$35 million tax break for the airline. (The bill hasn't gone through the state Senate, which has adjourned for the year.)

Boycott threats are flying. Some defenders of voting rights call for boycotts of companies in Georgia and other states that are making it harder for Blacks and poorer Americans to vote. Former President Donald Trump, meanwhile, has called on his followers to boycott companies that opposed the Georgia law. He even offered a list that included Coca-Cola, Major League Baseball and Delta.

The Jan. 6 rampage on the Capitol convinced corporate leaders that a crisis was at hand. In a straw poll of 33 CEOs conducted by Yale School of Management professor Jeffrey Sonnenfeld right before the insurrection, 88 percent said that officials supporting Trump's claims of a stolen election were "aiding and abetting sedition." Most said they would consider cutting investment in those senators' states, and all agreed on no longer giving money to politicians who deny the election results.

A later discussion with 120 CEOs, Sonnenfeld wrote in The Wall Street Journal, revealed that "their spirit was defiant against politicians trying to muzzle them."

Corporate America must also consider the environment into which it seeks to draw talent. "Companies have to be aware of the views of the people that they're trying to recruit," Tony Fratto, founder of the communications consulting firm Hamilton Place Strategies, told Business Insider. "And the most competitive people that they're trying to recruit — those people can go work anywhere."

These prized workers are often labeled progressive, though one hopes that protecting the sanctity of the democratic process transcends the left-right political discourse.

"Free markets cannot survive without the ... kind of capable, accountable government that can set the rules of the game," Henderson wrote. "And only democracy can ensure that governments are held accountable, that they are viewed as legitimate."

Corporations that defend the democracy are seeing to their own interests. But they may save us all.

Credit unions throughout the state have always served their communities by providing affordable financial products to their members to ensure they do not fall victim to predatory products that exist in the market. This is the reason we are left wondering why there is any need for Assembly Bill 1177, a bill that would create a highly risky, high-cost government banking system that is completely duplicative to what is already being offered by credit unions in the state. If the goal is to access more of the unbanked or underbanked populations, why not use the tool that already exists (credit unions)?

The state could spend a fraction of what AB 1177 would cost to help educate the unbanked population on the benefit of community lenders, such as credit unions.

Republicans make things worse by doubting vaccine

Hot tempers at last week's House hearing on the battle against COVID-19 highlighted again the hatred that America's hard right continues to harbor for Dr. Anthony Fauci, director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases. It's both ironic and fitting that America's preeminent warrior against infectious diseases is despised by those infected by America's second-most dangerous disease: the anti-fact, anti-science, pro-conspiracy extremism that grips a slice of this country.

Testifying before a House committee last year, Fauci had the temerity to reiterate a warning with which every public health expert in the country agrees: We should "avoid crowds of any type no matter where you are because that leads to the acquisition and transmission. ... When you're in a crowd, particularly if you're not wearing a mask, that induces the spread. ... You should stay away from crowds, no matter where the crowds are."

You might suppose that with almost 32 million Americans infected and nearly 570,000 dead, even Trump loyalists who embraced the old con man's assurance that COVID-19 was a media "hoax" would make it a point to sound sober. And you might suppose that would apply to Rep. Jim Jordan, R-Ohio, who, as one of the Master of Mar-a-Lago's most stalwart acolytes, was reliably wrong about COVID-19 right from the start. At a March 2020 hearing of the House oversight committee, after Fauci warned bluntly that COVID-19 was going to get worse, Jordan insisted that "the risk to Americans remain low."

Jordan proved to be a chump, and Fauci proved to be prescient. But Washington is a town short on memory and even shorter on sheepishness; and Jordan, always sneering and rarely correct, could not contain his fury at Fauci, whose sin, in the eyes of the looneys who loathe him, was that he was right about the disease when they were wrong. In July, a snarling Jordan demanded to know whether Fauci believed two individuals in some New Jersey town should have been arrested for opening up their gym in violation of state law. "You think that's okay?" Jordan yelled, rambling about how neither church-goers nor hairstylists were attacking police or committing arson.

"Where does it get to?" Jordan thundered at Fauci last week. "When it comes down, what number do we get our liberties back? Tell me the number!" After his time for questioning witnesses had expired and the committee chair had recognized another member, Jordan kept going. "The American people want Dr. Fauci to answer the question!" he snapped. This prompted Rep. Maxine Waters to exclaim what many watching were silently thinking. "You need to respect the Chair and shut your mouth!" she told Jordan.

Jordan was not well-briefed on Americans' view of Fauci. A Morning

Consult/Politico poll in February found that 60% of voters rate Fauci's handling of COVID-19 as "excellent" or "good," and only 17% said it was "poor."

But what a 17%!

The nutcases in our midst maintain that Fauci was behind the COVID-19 outbreak, likely in order to profit from vaccine sales. Fox personality Tucker Carlson saw fit last week to suggest that, like the virus itself, the vaccine is a hoax. "So maybe it doesn't work," Carlson told his audience, "and they're simply not telling you that." After Fauci cautioned that children should continue to wear masks when playing with children from multiple households, one Boston-area columnist who had supported Donald Trump's fraudulent pronouncements one after the other made it clear that no public health expert was going to tell him anything about public health. "Go away, you nuisance," he tweeted.

The virus-deniers and the anti-vaccination crowd have made the national effort to stop the suffering and rebuild the country more difficult than it already is. The Fauci-hatred that is the staple of domestic extremism is not merely irrational. It is yet another cross that America can ill afford to bear.

The President needs a lesson on the Second Amendment

"A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed." — Second Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.

President Joseph R. Biden Jr. recently announced his determination to use his powers as the chief executive of the federal government to infringe upon the right to keep and bear arms. This is a profound violation of his oath to uphold the Constitution.

It also perpetuates an attitude about the Second Amendment that was prevalent in state and federal officeholders in both major political parties from the FDR to the George W. Bush eras. That attitude was based on a misreading of the Second Amendment, which characterized the right to own a gun as a collective and not an individual, personal right. In 2008, the Supreme Court corrected that misreading.

Here is the backstory.

In the mid-1930s, Jack Miller reduced the size of his shotgun by three inches and transported it in his automobile from Oklahoma to Arkansas. The FBI got wind of his travels and stopped his car and searched it. When they saw Miller's sawed-off shotgun, they arrested him and charged him with violating a 1934 federal statute that prohibited the transportation of shotguns across state lines with a barrel below certain lengths. The shotgun was lawful in Oklahoma and Arkansas. The offense consisted only in its interstate transportation.

Miller acknowledged having done what the government accused him of doing, but he challenged the constitutionality of the statute under which he was indicted. A federal trial judge in Arkansas agreed with Miller and invalidated the portion of the 1934 federal statute that prohibited transporting otherwise legal weapons from one state to another. The judge ruled that Congress had infringed upon Miller's individual right to keep and bear his lawfully owned sawed-off shotgun.

The feds appealed this decision directly to the Supreme Court. By the time the lawyers' briefs were due at the court, Miller himself was nowhere to be found and the lawyer who represented him in Arkansas was no longer on the case.

So, the Supreme Court, with only the brief of the federal government in hand and only federal prosecutors present at oral argument, unanimously ruled in 1939 that the statute was constitutional because the Second Amendment protected only the collective rights of state militias to keep and bear arms — not the rights of individual persons to do so. Since Miller's weapon was not state-issued and since Miller was not in any state militia, the feds — and the states for that matter — were free to regulate and infringe upon this right.

This dreadful decision of one-sided origin opened the floodgates for Congress and state legislatures to enact all sorts of regulations of firearms, both rifles and handguns. The decision gave carte blanche to all levels of government to enact any anti-Second Amendment regulations for which there was political support, so long as the regulations did not interfere with state militias — today the National Guard.

There the law stood while the states and the feds enacted infringement upon infringement — including one championed by then-Sen. Joe Biden — with abandon.

Then, in the early 2000s, Dick Anthony Heller, a Washington, D.C., police officer who was authorized to carry his service revolver in public while on duty, applied for a permit to purchase and carry a privately owned handgun in his home for self-protection. The District of Columbia licensing authorities denied Heller's request because D.C. law prohibited

handguns in homes. Heller sued in federal court arguing that he had a personal right to own and carry a handgun in his home.

In a landmark 2008 decision, written by the late Justice Antonin Scalia, the court reversed the Miller case. Scalia wrote that the right protected by the Second Amendment is the ancient personal right to self-defense. Just as you have the right to punch someone in the nose who has punched you or is about to do so, you have the right, the court ruled, to protect yourself and your home using the same means as your potential attackers.

The court was not afraid of addressing our history, and it recognized that the United States was born in a bloody revolution in which the original 13 colonies fought a war to secede from Great Britain. Thus, the court held that the framers of the Second Amendment recognized that a second ancient purpose served by this right is resistance to tyrants when they take over the government.

The court called the origin of this right "pre-political." That is a secular phrase for a natural right. Whatever one wishes to call it, the right does not originate with the government. Like all rights protected in the Bill of Rights, the Second Amendment offers a negative right. The amendment does not grant the right to keep and bear arms; rather, it negates the government from infringing upon this right that has existed in all adults — predating the government.

The law today is not what it was when Joe Biden came of age. Today, the right to keep and bear arms is recognized unambiguously as a personal, fundamental, pre-political, natural right.

This is not academic hairsplitting. If a right is personal or fundamental or pre-political or natural, then the government — state or federal — may not interfere with it absent due process. Stated differently, the government cannot constitutionally interfere with gun ownership by executive order or even legislation. It can only do so if the owner of the gun has used it to harm someone else, and then only after a fair jury trial.

Scalia also offered a practical observation: Can the government argue with a straight face that its armed police can protect us better than we can protect ourselves when armed? The answer is obvious.

Walter Mondale

Walter Mondale, 42nd vice president of United States

Walter Mondale, the 42nd vice president of the United States, serving under President Jimmy Carter from 1977 to 1981, died April 19 at his home in Minneapolis at the age of 93.

Known as "Fritz," Mondale was an active vice president, breaking new ground for the role as he maintained an office in the White House and served as a close advisor to the president in a way no vice president had done before.

Prior to his vice presidency, he was a Democratic U.S. senator from Minnesota, serving from 1964 to 1976, and the attorney general of Minnesota from 1960 to 1964.

Mondale ran for president in 1984, winning the Democratic nomination, though he lost the general election in a landslide to incumbent President Ronald Reagan. Mondale made history during his presidential run by choosing Geraldine Ferraro as his running mate — she was the first woman nominated for vice president by a major party.

In later years, Mondale served as U.S. Ambassador to Japan.

As he campaigned for the presidency in 1984, Mondale advocated passing the Equal Rights Amendment and supported the nuclear freeze movement that aimed to deescalate the Cold War-fueled nuclear arms race between the U.S. and the Soviet Union.

The economy was also a key point in his platform, as he pointed out the budget deficits that had grown under Reagan's tenure and criticized the president's supply-side economics.

It may have been Mondale's frankness about the country's budget woes that sank his campaign in the end. He knew raising taxes was crucial to turning the deficit around, and he said so in his acceptance speech at the Democratic National Convention: "Let's tell the truth. Mr. Reagan will raise taxes, and so will I. He won't tell you. I just did."

But as it turned out, voters didn't like being told point-blank that their taxes would be raised, and in the end, Mondale won just 13 electoral votes, from Minnesota and the District of Columbia.

"I love public life," Mondale said in 2009. "I love the issues. I love working with people. I am an old progressive. I like building support for and getting things done. I think in many ways, it is one of the best things you can do for your friends, your family, and our community. The goal is to try to make a more trusted and just society. In America, we have a real opportunity in the most impressive of nations to do that."

Mike Mitchell, guitarist on 'Louie Louie'

Mike Mitchell, the guitarist for the Kingsmen, best known for playing the iconic solo on the 1963 hit song "Louie Louie," died April 16 at the age of 77.

Mitchell was one of the founding members of the Kingsmen in 1957, when he was still a teen. The group found their greatest success with their 1963 cover of "Louie Louie."

Recorded in a single take,

1956, she had become the highest paid burlesque performer in history, making \$100,000 per year. The following year, she insured her breasts for \$1 million.

Legally changing her name to Tempest Storm, she became a popular headliner on the Las Vegas Strip, where she continued to headline well into her 50s. Storm was an integral part of Las Vegas culture, rubbing elbows with the Rat Pack and dating Elvis Presley.

She toured widely, selling out clubs nationwide and continuing to perform until 2010.

"The secret to a good striptease is to leave as much as possible to the imagination," Storm said in a 1968 interview. "No matter what men may think, they don't actually want to see a performer just come out and take off her clothes. There's got to be communication, there's got to be contact. In my act, although I eventually do get down to the legal minimum, I actually put on more clothes than I take off. There's some psychology in this. A performer who can communicate a feeling of modesty is sexier than one who just strips."

Frank Jacobs, Mad magazine writer

Frank Jacobs, a longtime writer for Mad magazine, best known for his song parodies, died April 5 at the age of 91.

Jacobs first joined Mad in 1957, when he picked up a copy of Mad. He was so inspired that he reached out to the magazine's leadership with a pitch: "Why I Left the Army and Became a Civilian." It was published, and it was the beginning of Jacobs' 57 years with the magazine.

Jacobs wrote a wide variety of features for Mad, but he was most associated with his song parodies, including "Blue Cross" (a parody of "Blue Skies"), "Louella Schwartz Describes Her Malady" ("A Pretty Girl Is Like a Melody"), and "East Side Story" ("West Side Story").

In 1961, Irving Berlin sued Mad over Jacobs' parodies from a pull-out section called "Sing Along With Mad;" the U.S. Court of Appeals ruled in Mad's favor.

Unlike other greats of Mad, such as Mort Drucker and Al Jaffee, Jacobs wasn't an illustrator. His writing was often illustrated by Mad's cartoonists. He also wrote Mad paperback books, including "The Mad World of William Gaines."

"Before I started contributing to Mad, I was in a public relations company that bored the hell out of me because there wasn't enough to do. I just sat around most of the time," Jacobs said in 2006. "About that time I'd collaborated on a musical revue for a summer stock company, and I might have tried to be a Broadway lyricist. But a week after the PR firm folded, I picked up a copy of Mad, said, 'I can do this stuff,' and discovered that I could. ...I don't know what I would have done if there hadn't been a Mad. I have no idea."

Helen McCrory, starred in Harry Potter films

Helen McCrory, an English actress known for roles including Narcissa Malfoy in the final three "Harry Potter" movies, died April 16 at her home of cancer at the age of 52.

McCrory was already a well-established actress in the U.K. before she joined the Harry Potter cast for 2009's "Harry Potter and

the Half-Blood Prince." In fact, she had intended to take an earlier Harry Potter role, playing Bellatrix Lestrange beginning with 2007's "Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix." But she had to drop the role due to her pregnancy, and she was replaced by Helena Bonham Carter.

McCrory was also well known for starring as Polly Gray on the BBC period crime drama "Peaky Blinders," beginning in 2013. Her notable movies include "The Queen" (2006), "Hugo" (2011), and "Skyfall" (2012).

She had a role on the Showtime series "Penny Dreadful," as well as making appearances on TV shows including "Doctor Who" and "His Dark Materials."

"I just want to see what she feels and what she thinks, McCrory said of playing complex characters. "To fill the screens with women who are walking around in six-inch stilettos and telling everyone what to do is as uninteresting to me as filling them with bimbos in bikinis falling into pools and laughing at your jokes. Neither are particularly interesting."

Felix Silla, played Cousin Itt on 'The Addams Family'

Felix Silla, an actor and stuntman known for roles including the hairy Cousin Itt on TV's "The Addams Family," died April 16 in Las Vegas of pancreatic cancer at the age of 84.

Silla, who was 3 feet 11 inches tall, began his career as a circus performer in his native country of Italy. He began doing stunt work, coming to Hollywood and sometimes standing in for children in films including "The Towering Inferno" and "Battlestar Galactica."

When Silla began acting, audiences couldn't always recognize him. He often wore costumes that covered his face, as when he played Cousin Itt, or a hang-gliding Ewok in "Return of the Jedi," or the robot Twiki, voiced by Mel Blanc, on TV's "Buck Rogers in the 25th Century."

His other movies included "The Black Bird," "Spaceballs," "The Golden Child," and "Poltergeist."

"I did work on some great shows," Silla said in 2010, "but my favorite was playing Cousin Itt in the original Addams Family in the 1960s."

Black Rob, East Coast rapper

Black Rob, a rapper best known for his 2000 hit single, "Whoa," died April 17 at Grady Memorial Hospital in Atlanta of cardiac arrest at the age of 52.

Born Robert Ross, Black Rob grew up in Harlem and began rapping before his teens. He began appearing as a featured rapper on other artists' songs, including 112's "Come See Me," Faith Evans' "Love Like This," and Mase's "24 Hrs. to Live."

His debut album, "Life Story," was released on Bad Boy Records in 1999 and went platinum. It yielded the 2000 hit "Whoa," which was a Top 10 rap single and reached the Billboard Hot 100.

Black Rob collaborated with P. Diddy and Mark Curry on the 2001 hit "Bad Boy for Life," and he had a minor R&B hit in 2005 with "Ready."

In later years, he did time in prison for grand larceny, and he recently struggled with his health and homelessness.

"What inspired me was what was going on around me — the music," Black Rob said of his inspiration to become a rapper. "When I heard that, I wanted to be in."

Paging Dr. Frischer...

It has been over a year since the world came to a sudden halt due to the COVID-19 pandemic. I notice that many of my patients, friends, and family are still feeling rather melancholy, in spite of what appears to be light at the end of the tunnel. This phenomenon actually has a name: the "anniversary effect."



For most of us, it had been a long time spent without hugging our friends, visiting our relatives, going to the movies or favorite restaurant, traveling, etc. Some of us have been very much alone. If the weight of all of that is taking an extra toll on you, you are not alone. Our bodies and minds store painful memories that can be triggered by certain dates or seasons, such as the death date of a loved one, the annual reminder of a serious diagnosis, a once happy holiday or anniversary...or the one year anniversary of the start of a pandemic.

Some of my patients have expressed feeling a kind of persistent dread. Even if you have not been touched by a death or hospitalization from the pandemic, you have still lost plenty. Important events were either postponed or cancelled. Our routines, social lives, religious rituals, and sense of security have shifted dramatically. The magnitude of deaths (now surpassing 567,000 in this country alone, and a whopping 3,000,000 worldwide) affects us all, whether we consciously realize it or not. Anxiety is a normal and even typical reaction.

Our responses to this anniversary effect will change over time. Common symptoms can include

difficulty sleeping, problems focusing, irritability, fatigue, frustration, anxiety, and depression.

These feelings are normal. Acknowledging grief anniversaries is healthy. Allowing yourself to feel the emotions that come up with difficult anniversaries is the right thing to do. Avoiding these true feelings by using denial is not.

Let's focus on what we have learned and gained during these difficult times. Let's practice kindness, consideration and compassion, and gratitude for what we do have. If needed, find a therapist — knowing, however, that at this time, demand is high and therapists are in relatively short supply.

Here are some tried and true self-help suggestions that may work for you. Practice a daily routine that includes exercise and nutrition, and maintain structure in your life. Sleep is critical, so do your best to get seven or eight hours every single night. Seek out safe human contact and physical touch. (One of my daughters adopted a dog, as so many have over this past year. If you're up for the work and the expense, it works wonders!) Gradually we will all become comfortable re-entering the world in ways that were once familiar.

And, critically, if you have not done so already, get vaccinated. That will safely expand your bubble, and will help to bring about everybody's return to "normalcy." Let's be gentle with ourselves and with others, and we will all get through this together.

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St. Paul beats Santa Fe in rivalry game

NORWALK - It was just a neighborhood rivalry between two schools that have had some tough losses of late.

St. Paul had lost seven of the last 10 and Santa Fe had lost six of eight, with both teams having a couple of lopsided losses.

Tuesday however, was different.

With both teams battling all the way, St. Paul edged out the visiting Chiefs, 3-2, in a nonleague game.

"It's a neighborhood deal," St. Paul Baseball coach Casey Morales said. "When you're competing against your neighbor and somebody that you want to one up, those results live for a long time. It means a lot.

"These guys were going after it and I thought we got one heck of a pitching performance from our whole staff (Wednesday)."

With the game tied, 2-2, in the fifth inning, the Swordsmen

(6-8) pushed across the go-ahead run with two outs and held on for the win.

"Ethan Moran (5.2 IP, 4 H, 2 R, 6 K) came out and got it going and battled through some situations that easily could have gone awry for him," Morales added. "He did a great job there."

Santa Fe (5-10) opened the scoring in the top of the first when leadoff hitter Ryan Galvan was hit by a pitch. He eventually scored on a wild pitch to give the Chiefs a 1-0 lead.

St. Paul answered with two runs in the bottom half of the inning.

Leadoff hitter Xander Orozco was hit by a pitch and scored on a double to center field off the fence by senior catcher Elias Gomez (1 for 3, R, RBI).

After a walk to junior Sahir Gomez and a single by junior Jimmy Salas (2 for 3, RBI), a bases-loaded walk to Isaiah Castillo forced in Elias Gomez for the second run and 2-1 lead.

Galvan (0-2), who pitched six innings, settled in and allowed only two hits and struck out seven through the fifth inning.

Meanwhile, Moran struck out five batters through the next four

innings and stranded two Santa Fe runners on third in the second and fourth innings. Included in that stretch, Moran struck out the side in the third inning.

The Chiefs finally tied the game up at 2-2 in the fifth inning, with a two-out rally. Junior left fielder Roman Macias singled to center and came home on a single to left by Galvan.

The Swordsmen again answered in the bottom half of the inning with a go-ahead run. It proved to be the difference.

With two outs, senior Sean Garcia singled to right field and advanced to second when Galvan attempted a pickoff for the third error of the game for the Chiefs.

Salas hit a sharp single to left field and took off for second on the throw in from the Santa Fe left fielder.

As Santa Fe catcher Brandon Aranda threw back to second trying to get Salas, the shortstop cut off the throw and threw it wild to home and Garcia scored the third run.

The Chiefs came right back and were threatening to tie the game up as senior right fielder Jayme Valdez hit a one-out single to center.

Valdez stole second and went to third on a passed ball.

After the sixth strikeout by Moran in the game and the second out of the inning, Morales went to the bullpen.

Senior right handed pitcher Gordon Gandara came in and got a ground out to end the Santa Fe threat.

"One of the biggest outs of the year was Gordon Gandara having to come in and get a guy with the tying run on third base," Morales said. "He did a great job and battled back from a 3-0 count to get a ground ball and get us out of the inning."

Santa Fe's Macias came in to relieve Galvan and stranded a runner on third in the St. Paul sixth.

"We're struggling and not getting timely hits," Santa Fe
