

Health officials urge masks indoors

**NORWALK** - If you're vaccinated, you are protected from the highly transmissible Delta variant and in most cases you can keep your mask off. That's the message both the California Department of Public Health and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention are putting out this week.

Los Angeles County updated its masking guidelines earlier this week, calling on all people, regardless of vaccination status, to put their masks on indoors in public places due to the Delta variant spreading across the L.A. area. The World Health Organization also released a statement over the weekend reiterating its longstanding recommendation that everyone wear masks to lessen the spread of the virus.

These announcements created some confusion and led many to wonder if more changes were coming to mask rules.

California's health department said in a statement Wednesday that guidance for face masks will remain in alignment with the CDC recommendations, allowing fully vaccinated individuals to resume everyday activities without wearing a mask in most settings.

"Unvaccinated individuals must continue to wear masks in indoor public settings and businesses to help protect against the risk of infection or infecting others," said Dr. Tomás Aragón, the state's public health officer. "Under this guidance businesses have the option of requiring all customers to wear a mask, even if they're already vaccinated, and local health jurisdictions may impose stricter guidance or provide additional recommendations as a result of local conditions."

Aragón reiterated that getting vaccinated is the best line of defense against the Delta variant.

"The California Department of Public Health is closely monitoring the spread of COVID-19 and its variants across our state," Aragón said. "Currently, the Delta variant accounts for approximately 15 percent of cases sampled in California, and we anticipate this percentage will increase. The most important thing we can do to stop the spread of COVID-19 is ensure everyone who is eligible gets vaccinated."

According to the L.A. County Department of Public Health, fully vaccinated people appear to be well protected from infections with Delta variants, however, people with only one vaccine dose of Pfizer or Moderna are not as well-protected.

The smaller number of COVID-19 infections identified in people who are fully vaccinated have been mild illnesses.

"While COVID-19 vaccine provides very effective protection preventing hospitalizations and deaths against the Delta variant, the strain is proving to be more transmissible and is expected to become more prevalent," said health director Barbara Ferrer. "Mask wearing remains an effective tool for reducing transmission, especially indoors where the virus may be easily spread through inhalation of aerosols emitted by an infected person."

L.A. County health officials "strongly recommends" people wear masks indoors in settings such as grocery or retail stores; theaters and family entertainment centers, and workplaces when you don't know everyone's vaccination status.

## Norwalk increases sheriff's patrols as illegal fireworks rage

**NORWALK** - Norwalk residents hear illegal fireworks explode throughout the nights leading up to the Fourth of July. As the holiday approaches, city officials and local sheriffs

are cracking down on illegal fireworks in an attempt to prevent a potentially dangerous Independence Day.

Any firework that explodes or shoots in the air is considered illegal.

Road signs and social media posts remind the community of the penalties for possession, transportation and discharge of illegal fireworks. While jail time is unlikely, the perpetrator can face fines up to \$3,000.

"We have seen an increase in

the use of illegal fireworks in the city," said Norwalk Mayor Jennifer Perez. "The signs and social media posts are reminders to our residents that illegal fireworks are prohibited and there are financial consequences."

Norwalk Sheriff Station Watch Commander Lieutenant Brian Sanford says law enforcement has not yet found any large caches of illegal fireworks in the city. He stated that there is no specific area where the fireworks are coming from, but law enforcement usually finds them in the days leading up to the holiday.

"July 1 through July 5 is when we catch most of the illegal fireworks," said Sanford. "As it gets closer to July Fourth, we will get anonymous calls with addresses that our team will follow up on."

Mayor Perez said she sympathizes with the community, as she also hears fireworks explode throughout the night.

"The public safety department will be at maximum deployment and extra LASD deputies will be actively patrolling the city on the Fourth of July," said the mayor. "Historically we see an increase in the number of calls on July Fourth."

Illegal fireworks can cause

harm to everyone around them, as the explosives are known fire hazards.

"Rockets go up, it's dry, and palm trees catch fire. We get a lot of calls about that on July Fourth," described Sanford. "Sometimes they go off faster than people think. They blow up in people's faces and fingers get blown off."

When a firework goes off during the night, there is often confusion among the community of whether the explosion was a firework or a gunshot.

"They sound very similar. On the fourth, it could be a gunshot, and oftentimes it is a gunshot late in the evening," says Sanford. "It gets hectic out there, but if we get reports of a gunshot, we will of course come check it out."

The lieutenant encouraged residents to report anyone they see with illegal fireworks and their location, so they can follow up later the next day.

"Norwalk Sheriff's Department and Public Safety Department do all they can to catch offenders and hold them accountable," said Mayor Perez. "Stopping the use of illegal fireworks requires a team effort, and we rely on our residents to assist by reporting illegal firework usage."

## Sanchez reiterates support for DACA

The Norwalk congress member said Dreamers need a path to citizenship.

**NORWALK** - On the ninth anniversary of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA), Congresswoman Linda T. Sánchez (D-CA) reiterated her call for permanent solutions for 11 million immigrants living in the United States.

Sánchez highlighted a local constituent and DACA recipient, Aidee, who the congresswoman helped with her DACA permit renewal, as an example for the need for permanent solutions.

"DACA has helped hundreds of thousands of students and young people in this country, but that relief is temporary and simply not enough," said Sánchez. "DACA

has served as a temporary solution for so many students like Aidee. But Aidee is one of thousands forced to renew their applications for deferred action after nearly a decade of inaction from Congress.

"Aidee and DACA recipients across Southern California embody exactly what immigrants bring to our communities and to our economy every day. It is long-overdue that we deliver a pathway to citizenship not only to them, but to the 11 million immigrants in this country who live and work right here in our very neighborhoods."

Aidee is originally from Mexico and now lives in Pico Rivera. She has been a DACA recipient since 2012 and in June of this year, her permit was set to expire.

When she did not hear back about her renewal application, she

called Congresswoman Sánchez's district office for assistance with her Employment Authorization Document (EAD) renewal.

With help from the casework team in the congresswoman's office, Aidee received her renewal ahead of the June deadline.

"I have been a DACA recipient since 2012. Thanks to DACA, I now work for one of the largest counties in the nation with first responders," said Aidee. "Alongside that, I am completing my degree in management with a full ride scholarship to a California State University."

"I do hope Congress votes on something soon to help the many Dreamers like myself that rely on people like Congresswoman Linda Sánchez make our voices be heard."

Sanchez continued: "I am

proud to join my colleagues in championing a path to citizenship for Dreamers, but we can and must do more. We need relief for the undocumented immigrants who came to this country to work hard, who drive our economy, and who contribute to our communities every day.

"Since the founding of our nation, immigrants have played a vital role in creating the diverse and dynamic country we all call home. This is especially true in California, which has the largest population of undocumented immigrants in the country. It is far past time for Congress to provide an earned path to citizenship for them."

## Family of convicted murderer happy to get help from Gascon

An advisor for the L.A. County District Attorney appears to be studying the case.

**LOS ANGELES** - In a recorded phone call from the courthouse lockup in the Antelope Valley, a convicted killer receives good news from his mother.

"Hi Mijo, you know who that was? Andrew, you know who that was? That's freaking Gascon's -- that's Gascon's special advisor. Oh, my God!"

Bertha Cachu was overjoyed to share the news with her son Andrew Cachu, a documented gang member who was convicted of killing 41-year-old Louis Amela outside of a Palmdale restaurant in 2015.

"She's gonna be coming in your case, Mijo. Did you hear her? Man, she's good! She's the one that I've been emailing back and forth," said Bertha Cachu.

Cachu goes on to explain to her son that Alisa Blair, a special assistant to Los Angeles County District Attorney George Gascon is studying his case and will be helping him.

In 2016, Cachu was convicted

of murder and sentenced to 50 years to life in prison. Since he was 17 years old at the time of the murder, his case was transferred to juvenile court for a judge to decide if it should stay there or be transferred to adult court.

Blair is pushing for the case to remain in the juvenile system which means Cachu will most likely be released in a few months after serving just six years behind bars.

"It's like being in the twilight zone, I can't believe this is going on in California," says Barbie Perez.

Perez is the murdered victim's cousin. She says no one from the DA's office has contacted the family.

Perez believes the prosecutor is acting more like a defense attorney.

"My heart just aches knowing that the prosecution is not on our side anymore," she said.

Marsy's law attorney Kathleen Cady agrees.

"You have two people in court representing the defendant. You have no one representing the people or the victim and that is what's most upsetting about the

call," Cady said.

Cady has filed a motion demanding that a judge disqualify Blair from the Cachu case for showing bias towards the defendant.


Two longtime LA County Deputy DAs, Jonathan Hatami and John McKinney, are both speaking out about the call.

Hatami says, "It appears from the phone call that she's actively working with the defense, with the juvenile who committed the murder. It doesn't look right. It doesn't sound right. Most prosecutors wouldn't do something like that."

McKinney adds, "We hear a phone call where a mother is telling her son that the DA representative is saying things like, 'Don't worry, I got your back.' That can only be attributed to the DA being more interested in advocating for the defendant than the public."

The LA County DA's office would only comment on the motion filed by Cady to have Blair removed from the case. Alex Bastian, a special advisor to Gascon, issued the following statement:

"There are objective pieces

of evidence that contradict the motion and the attached declaration, namely the complete transcripts of both the jail call and the court proceedings. This motion lacks merit and we look forward to addressing it at the next calling of the case."

The next hearing on this case has been scheduled for Thursday, July 29.

# Biola softball finishes season as NCAA DII national runner-up

■ The Eagles came within one win of a national championship.

**LA MIRADA** – Biola who?

That question was quickly answered in the NCAA DII softball postseason on the Biola University softball program in 2021.

The Eagles made a historic run this past season that came just one game short of the national title last month in Denver, Colorado.

After the 2020 season was cut short due to the pandemic, Biola was making its first-ever appearance in its first season eligible for NCAA Division II postseason.

And did they ever make an appearance.

Biola, which finished with a 26-16 overall record, won the NCAA DII West Region title, advanced to the national tournament, defeated the No. 1 team in the country and made it to the championship final.

With those accomplishments alone, the Eagles made a name for themselves and finished the season as the No. 2-ranked team in the country.

“I’m obviously proud of my team for making history today (June 1),” said third-year Biola Softball Coach Nikki Udria, in the post game press conference. “Making it this far in the season is an accomplishment in and of itself. “I think it’s a blessing for these seniors (Kayla Neff, Haley Martinez and Ruth Munoz) sitting to the left and to the right of me and to finish their careers in the national championship game. I don’t think a lot of people can say that they’ve done that.

“I’m proud of them and the success they’ve had and all

that they have poured into the program. I’m very proud of my team and their performance.”

The Eagles, who had a 7-3 postseason record, won the West Region title with a 3-1 record and defeated No. 1 seed Concordia University, 2-1, in the championship game.

Biola advanced to the Regional title game with wins over No. 3 seed Northwest Nazarene (4-3) and No. 5 seed Hawaii-Hilo (9-0, 6 Inn.).

Biola lost to Concordia in the first of two games in the championship, 3-2, but came back in the second game with the win.

They advanced to the National tournament against seven other Regional Champions, which included top-ranked Augustana (South Dakota).

Biola opened up its first-ever NCAA National Finals with a 4-0 shutout over No. 4 seed North Georgia. That win was historical for the Biola program.

“I think nerves are natural,” said Udria, after the win. “I tell the girls, you are going to be nervous. We were nervous, obviously. But it’s just how we channel it. Being able to make plays that we practice all the time.”

The second game of the national finals was just as big, as the Eagles faced the Vikings (Augustana), who entered the NCAA Division II postseason for the 27th time in school history. They have two NCAA Division II national titles (1991 & 2019) and this is their ninth national tournament appearance under current head coach Gretta Melsted.

Biola defeated Augustana, 3-0, behind the four-hitter by junior pitcher Paige Austin. Austin, who led the team in wins with 16 in the season, added to her finals shutout inning total with 14 after the first two games.

Austin would continue her dominance in the circle in her

five innings of work against North Georgia once again, extending her scoreless streak to 19 innings. The Eagles defeated NGU, 5-2, to advance to the best two of three national championship final.

Biola continued to shock the DII softball world, but not themselves, with a 5-0 victory over West Texas A & M in the opening game of the final series.

West Texas took the second game, 7-4, to even up the series at 1-1, setting up the dramatic final game.

Behind a solo home run by Neff to left field gave the Eagles a 1-0 lead heading into the sixth inning.

However, that was the end of the run for the Eagles, as North Texas first baseman Gabriella Valforte hit a grand slam to give them a 4-1 lead in the bottom of the inning.

Biola came up empty in the seventh and finished as the 2021 National Runner ups.

Neff, who started all 42 games for the Eagles this season, finished with the most hits (41), which included seven home runs, four doubles, a triple and a team-leading 31 RBIs.

Neff said it best on the accomplishments of the 2021 team – “It’s awesome to be able to come here and play, you know, on the biggest stage,” she said. I’ve been telling my teammates I’m just so proud of where we’ve come. This is it – the nerves are there, but this is as far as we have come and I’m proud no matter what happens.”

Finishing tied with the second most hits on the team with 36 was senior outfielder Jennifer Morinishi. She scored 17 runs and had five doubles.

Morinishi, who stopped by the Biola softball complex recently, had this to say about what the Eagles have been building towards these past few seasons.

“It’s just a testament to what

we’ve been trying to cultivate here at Biola,” Morinishi said. “I feel like we’ve had the talent in past years and just have not quite gotten the opportunity to showcase that on a national level.

“Being able to finally show other people in the nation what we can do here, even though we are a small Christian school, what we’re still capable of achieving.”

Morinishi was also on the team in 2018 that was runner-ups in the National Christian College Athletic Association

On getting to the championship series, Morinishi said, “We had nothing to lose going out there,” she said. “No one ever expected us to get this far. We were kind of the underdog going into all of it. We didn’t feel like our backs were pushed against the wall. We just wanted to go out there and play.

“Now people know us and now we’re on the map and we just have to continue to show them what Biola softball is all about.”

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# The Founding Fathers' trouble with women

The Founding Fathers, a great group of guys, gathered in Philadelphia in July of 1776 and again in 1787. What a wonder, 55 bright lights met in one room to start a revolution that isn't over yet.

We know the Declaration of Independence signers and Constitution framers were also flawed human beings. Many were rich slave owners, Virginians most of all. They preferred to say "planters."

But who was the "woked" of them all? I mean, from a woman's point of view.

Not Alexander Hamilton, ladies and gentlemen, despite fabulous Broadway fame. Thomas Jefferson or John Adams? They dearly loved their wives.

For the Fourth of July, let's see about that.

Washing ashore, Hamilton was inventive and clever, charming but a bit ruthless in career-climbing. He was George Washington's adored young aide in the Revolutionary War and later his Treasury secretary.

Hamilton was no champion for women. He publicly confessed to bribing another man to keep quiet about his philandering. His wife Betsy was loyal and sweet — a tad drab — from a New York political family.

Meanwhile, Thomas Jefferson is an enigma, but he clearly wrote the words, "All men are created equal." And he really meant to leave us out of that beautiful sentence.

Jefferson was tall, engaging and played the violin, among his many talents. He thought he was a dreamy catch with women, and indeed he was. After he and his wife Martha had two daughters, she died young. He

soon made Sally Hemings his slave mistress — Martha's own half sister with the same white father. He had a second family with Hemings.

Jefferson never wrote a word about women rising in the public sphere, just as he never recognized his family of color. He was blind to inclusion for women and Blacks for all his long life. He died on the Fourth of July in 1826.

John Adams? No better. He had a peppery Yankee wife in Abigail. They wrote letters often, over long distance from Massachusetts to his diplomatic and political posts.

Oh, we know Abigail's famed line, "Remember the ladies," in her plea to write women into the Declaration. Adams was away in Philadelphia that July, editing Jefferson's work on parchment.

In an irony, John gets credit for that line, though he roundly scoffed at his wife's proposal. Please don't tell me that Adams cared about women in general — fond as he was of Abigail.

Adams also died on the Fourth, the very day that Jefferson died, on the nation's 50th birthday. They were once allies, then enemies and then friends again in old age. They were white men of grand privilege and power who liked to keep it that way in the North and South.

Washington danced perfectly, but that's it. He married the richest widow in Virginia.

Who, then, was the best man for women at the start of the rocky American journey?

First, I'd put in a good word for two Philadelphians among the founders: William Penn and Dr. Benjamin Rush. Visionary in city planning

and medicine, both were born into the Quaker belief in equality.

But you'll never guess who the best man was for us: Aaron Burr, the dashing man who slew Hamilton in the 1804 duel.

Burr and Hamilton were stars at an American Revolutionary patriots party on July 4, where Hamilton sang a solo that wrenched the company.

The secret duel was already set for July 11. Hamilton knew it was his last public stand.

Burr's wife Theodosia died rather young, like Jefferson's. He educated his daughter, also named Theodosia, privately, with all the rigor of his Princeton studies. She was the smartest girl in America.

Burr went beyond the personal. He read Mary Wollstonecraft's fiery political tract, a vindication of the rights of women.

"A work of genius," Burr told fellow senators in the 1790s. Nobody was interested.

I love him for that. Burr held nothing back on the revolutionary rights of women. He also cherished the minds and company of women.

The rest: a closed club of men's men.

On this 245th Fourth, the Capitol is clearing out its Confederate statues and busts.

In times that try our souls to the core, clarity on our past is one bittersweet gift.

# Why hasn't legal weed killed the illegal market?

Legal marijuana is becoming the norm in America. Nineteen states have legalized recreational cannabis, and 36 allow medical use. In all five states where liberalization was on the ballot in November, voters supported it — even in such conservative states as South Dakota and Mississippi. One in three Americans now lives in a place where adults can legally buy weed just because they feel like it.

The shift has come about for a couple of main reasons. The first is that more than half of Americans have used cannabis, and people know from experience it's not a demon drug. The second is that the national war on drugs, launched half a century ago by President Richard Nixon, has proven utterly futile in preventing such use.

There are other good reasons behind the change in laws and attitudes. By fostering a huge black market, pot prohibition rewarded street dealers, criminal gangs and foreign drug cartels. It also exposed users to a product that may be contaminated with harmful ingredients. Legalization promised to dry up the illicit trade, ensure safer products and force weed merchants to find honest work.

But it has fallen short of that promise. In Illinois, where the first legal recreational dispensaries opened on Jan. 1, 2020, black market sales reportedly remain bigger than legal ones. In Massachusetts, the illegal market is estimated to be twice as large as the state-sanctioned sector. Californians have supported a thriving underground trade.

All this may be taken to prove that legalization was not the solution it

was advertised to be. But what it really proves is that undoing the effects of an ill-advised and long-entrenched policy is not an overnight project. The unwanted effects of the war on marijuana, like the effects of most wars, take years to subside.

If you've been buying weed from a reliable supplier for years, you may feel some loyalty to someone who's risked jail for you — and you may be perfectly satisfied with the product you've been getting. Many veteran consumers feel no urgent need to put their friendly neighborhood dealer out of work.

Pot users often have another incentive to avoid state-licensed outlets: cost. One of the attractions of legalization for state governments was the chance to tax cannabis sales to boost revenue. Since permitting recreational marijuana in 2014, Colorado has reaped \$1.6 billion in taxes on cannabis. Illinois took in \$175 million last year.

But those taxes have a downside: higher prices to get high. Illinois has among the stiffest levies of any state, ranging from 10% to 25%, on top of a 7% wholesale tax. Washington state has a 37% retail sales tax. These charges create a generous space in the market for sellers who laugh at tax laws.

Regulation is another hurdle for legal suppliers. One big problem is the scarcity of dispensaries. The entire state of Illinois, which has a population of nearly 13 million, has only 110 legal outlets for recreational cannabis — compared to more than 1,300 liquor stores. California's United Cannabis Business Association reported that the state has three times as many black-market suppliers as legal ones.

It's not just state governments that restrict the number of places where weed users can make purchases. So do local governments. Many cities and villages in Illinois have banned recreational cannabis dispensaries. Some 80% of the municipalities in California have refused to allow pot shops. Lynda Hopkins, a Sonoma County supervisor, told The New York Times, "In California we've done what we always do — regulate, regulate, regulate." But pretty much every community has illicit dealers.

Oregon, by contrast, tried to make licensing cheap and easy. As a result, it has more legal dispensaries than California, which has eight times as many people. "If you're an Oregonian living in a town or county with legal pot and you want to buy marijuana, there is no reason to shop illegally," wrote Natalie Fertig in Politico.

The federal government doesn't help by continuing to outlaw marijuana, which creates headaches for legal outlets by limiting their access to the banking system. The federal ban also prevents farmers from growing cannabis to ship to other states, which would strengthen the legal trade. And most states still allow only medical marijuana.

For now, our national venture into legal recreational cannabis is young and only partial — and so far, it's only a partial success. That beats complete prohibition, which was a complete failure.

# Happy birthday, America. Thank you to all who make us possible.

As we celebrate the 245th anniversary of our nation's independence, we can look back and ponder our history. Armed conflict between bands of American colonists and British soldiers first broke out in 1775, more than a year before we declared our independence.

After about a month of debate, and after a committee drafted a statement justifying independence from Great Britain, on July 2, 1776, the Continental Congress voted to become independent of Great Britain.

On July 4, they adopted the Declaration of Independence. We have

the blessing of hindsight and know the Revolution was a success, but at the time, members of the Continental Congress were not certain that the country — this new country, one they would have to fight for — would be successful. And, after all, they were committing treason in the eyes of Great Britain.

When Benjamin Franklin signed the Declaration, he spoke for many of those in the room when he said, "We must all hang together, or most assuredly, we will all hang separately."

Our Founding Fathers did not take treason lightly, but they firmly believed in the arguments laid out in the Declaration and, 11 years later, the concepts in the Constitution: "We the people of the United States, in order to form a more perfect union, establish justice, ensure domestic tranquility. To provide for the common defense, promote the general welfare, and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America."

And over the years, we have added a Bill of Rights and a total of 27 Amendments to the Constitution to further enshrine and expand what it means to be an American. The right of a free press, the right to vote, to peacefully assemble, the separation of church and state, the right to a speedy trial by a jury of one's peers and protections for citizens are all things that new citizens to our country cite when asked why they wanted to become Americans. With the privileges accorded to us by the Constitution, we have both civic duties and civic responsibilities to ensure our freedom is protected.

As a citizen of this great country, we have the civic duty, for example, to participate in the democratic process by voting and serving on juries when we are called. Our civic responsibilities are a little different. As citizens, we have a responsibility to stay informed of current events and encourage social participation in our democracy. We have a responsibility to make our communities better places to live and work, and we have a responsibility to volunteer and give back to our communities.

This is part of what it means to be an American, and it's why we celebrate Independence Day. The Fourth of July, our Independence Day, is about the freedom that we enjoy as Americans.

But that freedom did not come easy. This year, as we commemorate our independence, let's remember how hard our ancestors fought so we

could be free.

They fought in the Revolution to ensure we could be free from England. They fought in the War of 1812, and in both World Wars, and now, we fight on a modern battlefield that includes cyber and space. Freedom, as the saying goes, isn't free. It's very costly. It costs money, it costs time and it costs lives.

The United States — our great nation — did not become what we are in one day, one month or one year. It took two plus centuries of effort and hard work to get to where we are today. The dream of our Founding Fathers was to make America the prime example of real freedom in this world. The struggle to attain this goal, and to be worthy of their vision and sacrifice, has sometimes been difficult, but it's a struggle worth fighting for.

We are a country constantly working to become a more perfect union, with our citizens embodying the light and the hope of our founding documents. If we continue to do better...and we must do better...then we truly do get closer to fulfilling our principles of liberty, equality and justice.

Our future is in our own hands. It is in the choices we make, each and every day. And it rests within each of us, trying to be better persons for ourselves and those around us...for our communities and society...for our nation and the world.




# Declaration of Independence

The following text is a transcription of the Stone Engraving of the parchment Declaration of Independence (the document on display in the Rotunda at the National Archives Museum.) The spelling and punctuation reflects the original.

## In Congress, July 4, 1776

**The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America,** When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.--That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, --That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and accordingly all experience hath shewn, that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same Object evinces a design to reduce them under absolute Despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for their future security.--Such has been the patient sufferance of these Colonies; and such is now the necessity which constrains them to alter their former Systems of Government. The history of the present King of Great Britain is a history of repeated injuries and usurpations, all having in direct object the establishment of an absolute Tyranny over these States. To prove this, let Facts be submitted to a candid world.

He has refused his Assent to Laws, the most wholesome and necessary for the public good.

He has forbidden his Governors to pass Laws of immediate and pressing importance, unless suspended in their operation till his Assent should be obtained; and when so suspended, he has utterly neglected to attend to them.

He has refused to pass other Laws for the accommodation of large districts of people, unless those people would relinquish the right of Representation in the Legislature, a right inestimable to them and formidable to tyrants only.

He has called together legislative bodies at places unusual, uncomfortable, and distant from the depository of their public Records, for the sole purpose of fatiguing them into compliance with his measures.

He has dissolved Representative Houses repeatedly, for opposing with manly firmness his invasions on the rights of the people.

He has refused for a long time, after such dissolutions, to cause others to be elected; whereby the Legislative powers, incapable of Annihilation, have returned to the People at large for their exercise; the State remaining in the mean time exposed to all the dangers of invasion from without, and convulsions within.

He has endeavoured to prevent the population of these States; for that purpose obstructing the Laws for Naturalization of Foreigners; refusing to pass others to encourage their migrations hither, and

raising the conditions of new Appropriations of Lands.

He has obstructed the Administration of Justice, by refusing his Assent to Laws for establishing Judiciary powers.

He has made Judges dependent on his Will alone, for the tenure of their offices, and the amount and payment of their salaries.

He has erected a multitude of New Offices, and sent hither swarms of Officers to harrass our people, and eat out their substance.

He has kept among us, in times of peace, Standing Armies without the Consent of our legislatures.

He has affected to render the Military independent of and superior to the Civil power.

He has combined with others to subject us to a jurisdiction foreign to our constitution, and unacknowledged by our laws; giving his Assent to their Acts of pretended Legislation:

For Quartering large bodies of armed troops among us:

For protecting them, by a mock Trial, from punishment for any Murders which they should commit on the Inhabitants of these States:

For cutting off our Trade with all parts of the world:

For imposing Taxes on us without our Consent:

For depriving us in many cases, of the benefits of Trial by Jury:

For transporting us beyond Seas to be tried for pretended offences

For abolishing the free System of English Laws in a neighbouring Province, establishing therein an Arbitrary government, and enlarging its Boundaries so as to render it at once an example and fit instrument for introducing the same absolute rule into these Colonies:

For taking away our Charters, abolishing our most valuable Laws, and altering fundamentally the Forms of our Governments:

For suspending our own Legislatures, and declaring themselves invested with power to legislate for us in all cases whatsoever.

He has abdicated Government here, by declaring us out of his Protection and waging War against us.

He has plundered our seas, ravaged our Coasts, burnt our towns, and destroyed the lives of our people.

He is at this time transporting large Armies of foreign Mercenaries to compleat the works of death, desolation and tyranny, already begun with circumstances of Cruelty & perfidy scarcely paralleled in the most barbarous ages, and totally unworthy the Head of a civilized nation.

He has constrained our fellow Citizens taken Captive on the high Seas to bear Arms against their Country, to become the executioners of their friends and Brethren, or to fall themselves by their Hands.

He has excited domestic insurrections amongst us, and has endeavoured to bring on the inhabitants of our frontiers, the merciless Indian Savages, whose known rule of warfare, is an undistinguished destruction of all ages, sexes and conditions.

In every stage of these Oppressions We have Petitioned for Redress in the most humble terms: Our repeated Petitions have been answered only by repeated injury. A Prince whose character is thus marked by every act which may define a Tyrant, is unfit to be the ruler of a free people.

Nor have We been wanting in attentions to our Brittish brethren. We have warned them from time to time of attempts by their legislature to extend an unwarrantable jurisdiction over us. We have reminded them of the circumstances of our emigration and settlement here. We have appealed to their native justice and magnanimity, and we have conjured them by the ties of our common kindred to disavow these usurpations, which, would inevitably interrupt our connections

and correspondence. They too have been deaf to the voice of justice and of consanguinity. We must, therefore, acquiesce in the necessity, which denounces our Separation, and hold them, as we hold the rest of mankind, Enemies in War, in Peace Friends.

We, therefore, the Representatives of the united States of America, in General Congress, Assembled, appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world for the rectitude of our intentions, do, in the Name, and by Authority of the good People of these Colonies, solemnly publish and declare, That these United Colonies are, and of Right ought to be Free and Independent States; that they are Absolved from all Allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain, is and ought to be totally dissolved; and that as Free and Independent States, they have full Power to levy War, conclude Peace, contract Alliances, establish Commerce, and to do all other Acts and Things which Independent States may of right do. And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor.

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# Obituaries

## Donald Rumsfeld, Secretary of Defense

Donald Rumsfeld, the U.S. Secretary of Defense under President Gerald Ford from 1975 to 1977 and again under President George W. Bush from 2001 to 2006, died June 30 at his home in Taos, New Mexico of multiple myeloma at the age of 88.

In his first term as Secretary of Defense, Rumsfeld was the youngest ever to serve in that role, at 43, while at the time that he reentered the position in 2001, he was the oldest Secretary of Defense ever appointed, at 68.

As Rumsfeld was appointed Secretary of Defense in 1975, the long Vietnam War had only recently ended, and the U.S. military was transitioning back to a voluntary force with the draft no longer necessary. The U.S. was also not at war when Rumsfeld arrived at the Pentagon in 2001 to revisit the job - but that would shortly change. After the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001, he oversaw the Afghanistan and Iraq Wars, establishing the "Rumsfeld Doctrine," a strategy that called for quick response to threats with small numbers of ground forces and heavy reliance on air strikes.

Rumsfeld was widely criticized for his handling of the Iraq War, including by a prominent group of retired generals that spoke out about what they called his incompetence. Also controversial in Rumsfeld's term was his support for torture of prisoners of war, and several lawsuits were filed against Rumsfeld and other government officials over the treatment of prisoners in facilities including Abu Ghraib. Rumsfeld resigned in 2006, though he was unwaveringly defended by President Bush.

A U.S. Navy veteran, Rumsfeld also represented Illinois in the U.S. House of Representatives from 1963 to 1969 and was Ford's Chief of Staff from 1974 to 1975. He was a business leader in the pharmaceutical and technological industries, at companies including G.D. Searle & Company and Gilead Sciences, Inc., in the years between the Ford and Bush administrations. Rumsfeld was an early mentor to Vice President Dick Cheney.

## Delia Fiallo, wrote Spanish telenovelas

Delia Fiallo, a Cuban-American romance novelist and screenwriter who wrote dozens of popular telenovelas for Latin American television, died June 29 at her home in Coral Gables, Florida at the age of 96.

Born in Cuba, Fiallo began writing radionovelas for Cuban radio in the 1940s. As television became more widely available in the 1950s, she made the switch to writing telenovelas, finding a large audience with her melodramas.

Fiallo left Cuba for Miami in the 1960s and continued her writing career there, writing romance novels as well as telenovelas. Her telenovelas included "Kassandra," "Cristal," "Peregrina," and dozens more.

"A telenovela is basically about sentiment," she told Variety in 1996. "If you don't make the public cry, you won't achieve anything."

## John Langley, created 'Cops' TV show

John Langley, a TV producer best known for creating the hit reality show "Cops," died June 26 of a heart attack while competing in an off-road race in Baja, Mexico at the age of 78.

When Langley came up with his idea for "Cops" in the mid-1980s, reality TV was not yet the phenomenon it would become. In fact, he had trouble finding a network that was interested in his concept.

No other show was doing anything like what Langley envisioned for "Cops," filming police in action and presenting the results without a narrator - and without reenactments, relying instead on the actual

footage.

But Fox finally took a chance on "Cops" in 1989, and the show went on to run for 32 seasons, moving to the Spike network in 2013 before being cancelled in 2020.

"Cops" - and its iconic theme song - became a cultural phenomenon, influencing the development of reality TV and earning Langley the nickname "the Godfather of Reality TV."

Langley also produced shows including "Inside American Jail," "Undercover Stings," and "Video Justice."

"I really believe in the show, obviously, and I kept turning down anybody's modifications of it," Langley told Parade in 2014. "They wanted me to put in music. I'd said no. They wanted me to add a narrator. I said no. They wanted me to do recreations. I'd said no. I just stuck to my guns. I thought it was a pretty simple idea that was straightforward and doable, but no one quite saw it. Now everybody sees it, of course."

## Stuart Damon, starred in 'General Hospital'

Stuart Damon, an actor best known for his 30-year starring role as Dr. Alan Quartermaine on the soap opera "General Hospital," died June 29 of kidney failure at the age of 84.

Damon was a Broadway actor in his early years, starring in productions including "Do I Hear a Waltz?" He played the Prince in a popular 1965 TV version of "Cinderella," and he appeared on the British stage and on British TV shows including "The New Avengers" and "The Adventures of Black Beauty."

Damon joined the cast of "General Hospital" in 1977, playing the hospital's chief of staff. He remained with the show for three decades.

His character died in 2007, but Damon continued appearing as a ghost through 2008 and in occasional episodes through 2013.

He won a Daytime Emmy Award for Best Supporting Actor in 1999, as well as a Soap Opera Digest Award in 1996.

Damon also appeared on the "General Hospital" spinoff, "Port Charles," as well as on other soap operas including "As the World Turns" and "Days of Our Lives."

## Johnny Solinger, metal band singer

Johnny Solinger, the singer for the metal band Skid Row from 1999 to 2015, died June 26 after announcing he was suffering from liver failure at the age of 55.

Solinger joined Skid Row in 1999, after the band decided to reform without original lead singer Sebastian Bach following their 1996 breakup.

Skid Row released several albums during Solinger's tenure, though they didn't have the success of their early days. Among their singles was "I Remember You Two," a new version of their 1989 Top 10 hit.

Solinger also released a solo country album in 2008, and he had previously formed the band Solinger in the early 1990s.

"We are having as much fun as we've ever had and we've always had fun," Solinger said in 2012. "I think there were 20,000 people as far as the eye could see at last weekend's shows. People are having a great time, they're not finding what they're looking for on the radio so they are going back to the rock and roll they love which is why these festivals are just getting bigger and bigger."

## Ray MacDonnell, actor on 'All My Children'

Ray MacDonnell, an actor best known for starring as Dr. Joe Martin on "All My Children" for 40 years, died June 10 at his home in Chappaqua, New York of natural causes at the age of 93.

MacDonnell was an original cast member of "All My Children" when it debuted in 1970. His Dr. Joe Martin was the patriarch of the show's Martin family.

MacDonnell remained on the show until 2009, retiring when production moved from New York to California. Later, he returned for several additional episodes, including the 2011 series finale.

Prior to his time on "All My Children," MacDonnell played Philip Capice on "The Edge of Night" in the 1960s. He played the title character in a 1967 pilot for a live-action "Dick Tracy" TV show that was never picked up.

## Ellen McIlwaine, singer and guitarist

Ellen McIlwaine, a singer and slide guitarist known for her bluesy rock music, died June 23 at a hospice center in Calgary, Alberta of esophageal cancer at the age of 75.

McIlwaine began playing professionally in the 1960s, impressing listeners with her skill as a guitarist. She played with notable musicians of the day including Jimi Hendrix, Muddy Waters, and Taj Mahal.

McIlwaine formed the band Fear Itself in the late '60s and released a self-titled album in 1968, but she left the band before long, frustrated that being a woman set her apart from her bandmates.

One of the first successful female rock guitarists, she excelled even in the face of sexism in the music world. She went on to record memorable covers of Stevie Wonder's "Higher Ground" and Blind Faith's "Can't Find My Way Home."

Though McIlwaine didn't find significant fame in the U.S., she was more successful in Canada and Australia.

## Jack Ingram, NASCAR hall of famer

Jack Ingram, a NASCAR Hall of Famer known as "The Iron Man," who won Xfinity Series championships in 1982 and 1985, died June 25 at age 84.

Ingram got his start in NASCAR at the New Asheville Speedway in Asheville, North Carolina. He had 31 Xfinity Series wins, setting a series record that held until 1997.

In his earlier racing days, Ingram raced in the Late Model Sportsman series, winning three titles and 286 races. His victorious NASCAR years came relatively late in his career, when he was in his 40s and 50s.

Ingram was a member of the NASCAR Hall of Fame and the International Motorsports Hall of Fame.

"Back in those days you had to race several times a week all over the place if you wanted to win a championship," Ingram said in 2017. "One weekend over Labor Day in 1973 I raced in six races over five days, five states. I raced over 1,750 laps over that period and won four of those races. After that people started calling me the Iron Man."

## Jackie Lane, actress in 'Doctor Who'

Jackie Lane, an English actress best known for playing Dorothea "Dodo" Chaplet, the First Doctor's companion, on "Doctor Who," died June 23 at the age of 79.

Lane appeared on "Doctor Who" in 1966, starring alongside William Hartnell as the First Doctor. She was the eighth person to play a companion, the men and women who travel alongside the Doctor as friends and assistants.

Lane starred in 19 episodes during the show's third season. She also appeared on TV shows including "Coronation Street" and "Compact," as well as joining the 2013 special "Doctor Who Live: The Afterparty."

In later years, Lane headed an acting agency's voiceover department.

# Downey school district launches early education program for kids as young as 3



■ The optional program will run daily from 8 am to 4 pm at Pace Education Center, with after-school care available.

**DOWNEY** - For the first time in the district's history, Downey Unified will be expanding its program offering to include preschool aged children with the addition of a new early education initiative called the Leap Program.

Leap is a fee-based program that will serve children ages three to five years old beginning on Aug. 16, 2021. Housed at the district's Pace

Education Center, the Leap Program will join the Downey Unified Virtual Academy as the second new program to make its debut this upcoming 2021-22 school year.

"Downey Unified is excited to integrate the Leap Program to our already robust program offerings. Not only will our young Leap students be more prepared, studies show that early childhood education has positive impacts on students' likelihood to graduate from high school and move onto higher education and successful career opportunities," said Dr. Wayne Shannon, Assistant Superintendent of Elementary

Education.

"We are proud to now be able to extend our educational offerings to younger learners to benefit our families."

As a full-day program, Leap students will receive instruction Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The Leap Program will have a \$100 registration fee charged annually with program fees of \$165 weekly, billed on a monthly basis.

For families that enroll more than one child, Leap will offer a discount on the second tuition. Additionally, through the district's partnership with

the Downey Foundation for Educational Opportunities (DFEO), families will have the flexibility to add before and after-school extended care options to better fit their schedules, at an additional cost.

Included with Leap's program fees are all the necessary materials and supplies for students to fully participate in daily instruction. Leap students will also receive breakfast, lunch and snacks - students are also allowed to bring their own meals if they so choose.

As a requirement, students

must be potty trained prior to starting the program, be between three to five years old to enroll and cannot be eligible for Transitional Kindergarten (TK) or Kindergarten based upon their date of birth. For next school year, children born on or before Dec. 2, 2016 may be eligible to enter TK or Kindergarten for the current school year and thus are not eligible for the Leap Program.

As the Leap Program is fee-based and not part of any Federal or State programs, families are not required to fall into a certain income bracket in order to qualify as there are no financial (federal or state) requirements or aid subsidies.

"Leap will offer students developmentally appropriate learning experiences and enrichment activities to allow them to successfully transition to elementary school and beyond," shared Lisa Rawlings, Early Education and Extended Learning Programs Coordinator.

"Students will be taught research-based curriculum, have access to 21st-Century technology, and gain valuable exposure to social emotional learning designed to be hands-on and instill curiosity in young learners."

Staffed by dedicated early learning instructors and assistants, each class is

expected to accommodate between 16-18 students, with a teacher ratio no larger than 1-to-9, at all times. This makes Leap's teacher to student ratio well below the state maximum of 1-to-12 for classes in this age group.

The Pace Education Center grounds are expected to undergo major upgrades this summer and into the fall in anticipation of Leap's opening. Planned renovations include a freshly painted facility, thoughtfully designed classrooms and office spaces, new fencing and gates as well as a newly installed outdoor playground appropriate for young learners.

Applications for the Leap Program will open to the community in early July and informational parent meetings will soon be announced to guide families through the enrollment process. Current Downey Unified families, as well as parents and guardians who commute to the area, are encouraged to stay tuned for updates.

Patty Jenkins, award-winning director of the recent “Wonder Woman” films, said


Warner Bros. sits on a “treasure trove of legendary history.”

### Norwalk man charged with murder

**NORWALK** — A Norwalk man was charged today with killing his partner and injuring others in a 3-1/2 crash on the 605 Freeway.

Alex Barragan (36) faces two counts of murder and one count each of driving under the influence of alcohol within 10 years of another DUI offense and driving with a .08 percent blood alcohol content causing injury within 10 years of another DUI offense.

Arraignments was scheduled for Wednesday at Los Angeles County Superior Court, Del Mar Branch.

On July 16, Barragan was allegedly driving his car on the freeway near Alondra Boulevard when he rear-ended a disabled van, 300ccators said. The van erupted in flames and two people died and three others were injured, prosecutors added.

If convicted as charged, Barragan faces a possible maximum sentence of 44 years in state prison. Bail is set at more than \$2.2 million.

The case remains under investigation by the California Highway Patrol, Santa Fe Springs Area.

### Freeway off-ramp closed for 3 months

**NORWALK** — Caltrans announced the scheduled closure of the Norwalk Boulevard off ramp from northbound 5 (Santa Ana Freeway) at 10 p.m., Sunday July 15.

The off ramp will remain closed for up to 90 days for reconstruction and paving.
