

CDC releases LA County study

■ Unvaccinated LA County residents 29 times more likely to be hospitalized from COVID-19.

A new study released Tuesday that analyzed COVID-19 infections in Los Angeles County found that unvaccinated residents were 29 times more likely to be hospitalized from COVID-19 than those who are fully vaccinated, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

The study, published in the CDC's Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report, also found that unvaccinated people were five times more likely to become infected with COVID-19 than vaccinated individuals.

Additionally, the CDC found that more than 25% of new COVID-19 cases in Los Angeles County between May and July of 2021 were among fully vaccinated people.

During May 1-July 25, 2021, of the 43,127 COVID-19 cases in Los Angeles County, 10,895 (25.3%) were in fully vaccinated people, 1,431 (3.3%) were in partially vaccinated people and 30,801 (71.4%) were among unvaccinated people, according to the CDC.

According to the CDC, the data indicates that fully vaccinated individuals over the age of 16 were less likely than unvaccinated individuals to become hospitalized, be admitted to an intensive care unit, require mechanical ventilation, or to die from COVID-19 during a period when the Delta variant became predominant.

The CDC noted that the Delta variant became the predominant COVID-19 variant in Los Angeles County between May and July 2021. During this period, COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations increased substantially, most notably among unvaccinated persons.

As of Monday, Los Angeles County's overall death toll due to COVID was 25,078. Since the pandemic began, the county has confirmed 1,385,505 COVID-19 infections.

Over the weekend, county health officials released statistics aimed at encouraging people to get vaccinated against COVID.

According to the county, as of Aug. 7, unvaccinated adults between 18 and 49 years old were 25 times more likely to be hospitalized with COVID-19 than vaccinated adults of the same age.

Meanwhile, unvaccinated adults over age 50 were nearly a dozen times more likely to be hospitalized than their vaccinated counterparts, and 17 times more likely to die, according to the county.

The U.S. gave full approval to Pfizer's COVID-19 vaccine Monday, potentially boosting public confidence in the shots and instantly opening the way for more universities, companies and local governments to make vaccinations mandatory.

More than 200 million Pfizer doses have been administered in the U.S. under emergency provisions — and hundreds of millions more worldwide — since December. In going a step further and granting full approval, the Food and Drug Administration cited months of real-world evidence that serious side effects are extremely rare.

President Joe Biden said that for those who hesitated to get the vaccine until it received what he dubbed the "gold standard" of FDA approval, "the moment you've been waiting for is here."

"Please get vaccinated today," he said.

Norwalk man survives hit from drunk driver

NORWALK — Norwalk resident Derrek Miranda survived a car crash after a drunk driver slammed into him and three other vehicles on Aug. 15. Miranda was going to visit his son in Hesperia after work.

Miranda has set up a Go Fund Me page to help with his injuries and vehicle, as he was living out of his car and used it to commute to work.

As the 26-year-old chef stopped at the Etiwanda Avenue and 4th Street intersection in Rochester, he saw another car rapidly approach him from behind.

"It's one of those moments where you're thinking 'Oh, he's going to stop at the last minute,'" said Miranda. "I look at him and he's not stopping, he's coming up on me and he is going about 60 mph."

As he saw the car speed towards him, Miranda swerved right to avoid the vehicles ahead of him.

"When I swerved, he tended to wipe me out from my driver's side," Miranda said. "When he hit me, it collapsed the whole side of the vehicle to where I couldn't open the door."

Rio Hondo College mandates vaccines for students, staff

■ The Whittier campus voted unanimously for the mandate; Cerritos College is considering its options.

WHITTIER — The Rio Hondo College Board of Trustees unanimously approved mandatory vaccinations for all students and College employees in order to slow the spread of COVID-19 and its variants.

During a meeting on Aug. 18, Rio Hondo College administrators gave a presentation on COVID-19 facts, history, variants, trends and health compliances as well as information on improvements completed and planned by the college's COVID-19 task force.

The mandatory vaccinations coincide with the start of the fall 2021 semester, which started Aug. 21.

At the meeting, the college's task force strongly recommended the campus-wide vaccination mandate while Acting Chancellor of California Community Colleges Daisy Gonzales urged all California community college boards to mandate vaccines.

"Rio Hondo College takes the safety and welfare of our community very seriously and vaccinations against COVID-19 will go a long way in making sure everyone on our campus is safe," Superintendent and President Teresa Dreyfuss said.

"We are committed to providing a secure learning environment to our students and we believe this mandatory vaccination, coupled with our safety updates, will ensure safety against the virus."

The college's COVID-19 task force has also overseen safety updates that include plexiglass shields for classrooms and workstations, sanitation items in every classroom, physical distancing and updating air conditioning filters to protect against airborne viruses.

The college will host a free walk-up vaccine clinic on campus in lot C from noon to 4 p.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 1.

The clinic, in partnership with the Office of Los Angeles County Supervisor Hilda L. Solis and Curative (a COVID-19 vaccine

provider), will be available to anyone over the age of 12.

Cerritos College
At its special board meeting on August 4, the Cerritos College Board of Trustees passed a resolution outlining COVID-19 safety protocols for in-person attendance this fall.

The resolution took effect on August 5 and will continue through the conclusion of the academic year through June 30, 2022, with implementation set for September 30, 2021.

Nearly three weeks after the statewide relaxation of pandemic-related mandates and protocols on June 15, COVID-19 cases across California and Los Angeles County have surged again due to the emergence of the Delta variant.

As a result, on July 26, the State of California announced a requirement for all state and health care workers at in-person work environments to show proof of negative COVID-19 infection weekly or have received full vaccination.

Governor Newsom encouraged all local government employers to adopt a protocol to combat the spread of COVID-19 to protect vulnerable communities, similarly, requiring weekly test results or proof of vaccination.

The college district's leadership team, including representatives from all campus constituent groups, recommended the district implement a similar local vaccination/testing program for the safety of the portion of the Cerritos College community returning to campus.

With the resolution, the Board directed president and superintendent Dr. Jose Fierro to develop a vaccination and testing program that minimizes administrative hurdles while providing the safest possible environment for students, staff, and faculty as the campus reopens.

"Given the science and the circumstances, it only makes

"They couldn't deny service [to anyone] who was brought in, and the condition I was in," Miranda explained. "They had to work with me at that time, and they pretty much just let me out of the hospital with no medications or anything."

Miranda is waiting for the police report to be released, but it may take a long time since multiple vehicles were involved in the incident.

To the drunk driver, Miranda says, "I don't wish bad upon anyone. All I can say is make better decisions and be an adult."

Miranda is a chef for Hibachi Queens catering, and has cooked for major celebrities including the late Kobe Bryant.

Paging Dr. Frischer...

Vaccines for COVID-19 have been in distribution for some eight months now. The goal was to reach "herd immunity" as quickly as possible, in order to restore some kind of normalcy to our lives. That has not happened; numbers of cases are soaring; and we are now facing new variants and risk closing down to some degree again.



Recalling the enormous success of the polio vaccine, our U.S. government coordinated widespread domestic vaccine distribution and avoided financial disparity issues by making the vaccine free of charge. However, to date, only slightly over 50% of the population is fully vaccinated.

Just what are the ramifications of not achieving a vaccinated society? It leaves us vulnerable to risks including:

- additional outbreaks and deaths,
- new variants that can only occur if the virus spreads; variants

which may well be resistant to our current vaccines, and which put those who are vaccinated as well as our younger population at greater risk,

and the enormous economic fallout from a continuing pandemic.

Many among my own patient population have not been vaccinated, and feel strongly about their decision. Here are some of the issues I've encountered:

Vaccine access. Months ago, we were sharing stories about searching fruitlessly online to find an appointment. Today, vaccines are easily available, in major pharmacies and elsewhere, with no appointment necessary. Of course, there are still hurdles: some may lack transportation, or may have difficulty taking time from work. Others live in remote areas. Some still worry (unnecessarily) that it will cost them money, or pose a risk to their immigration status.

Is COVID-19 indeed a threat? Polls show that one of the major predictors for not becoming vaccinated is that this group does not see COVID as posing a major risk. Of course, it is common knowl-

edge that there have been almost 640,000 COVID deaths so far, in this country alone. Others believe that if they have had the virus, they have "natural" immunity. Note that current research shows that immunity from the vaccine is far more effective than the immunity one gets from having had the disease itself.

What about the side effects from the vaccine? Potential side effects include a day or two of fever, body aches, and fatigue. With well over 300 million doses already administered, and ample opportunity to observe fertility issues, there is absolutely no evidence that the vaccine affects fertility.

Also, it is literally impossible to get COVID-19 from the vaccine, because the vaccine doesn't contain the live virus strain. And, blood clots have been found in 28 out of 8.7 million people who received the Johnson & Johnson shot. This bears repeating: Blood clots have been found in 28 out of 8.7 million people who received the Johnson & Johnson shot, and these blood clots led to three deaths. Blood clots have not been found among those who received the

Moderna or Pfizer vaccines.

Some 5,000 deaths have occurred following vaccination, but were not attributed to the vaccine. By comparison, almost 640,000 people have died from COVID-19 in this country alone...so far.

There are a few extremely rare side effects from the vaccine. Anaphylaxis is seen in one out of 100,000 vaccines, and is completely treatable. Heart inflammation is seen in one out of 100,000 vaccines. On the other hand, the odds of getting severe COVID are one of every six cases.

Information about side effects varies widely, depending on the source. Studies show that at least half of those refusing vaccination believe in at least one theory unproven by science and the medical establishment. We are all only too aware that anyone can publish anything at all on the Internet, regardless of whether it has any basis in fact. It is critical that opinion leaders disseminate only the most honest, straightforward, and vetted information.

Some have the realistic concern that one or two days of vaccine side effects could keep them out of work. Of course, the disease itself, with the potential of putting us on a ventilator in the ICU, would keep us out of work far longer.

Why is there a lack of trust, among some, in the vaccines? Some feel that vaccine development was rushed, and it is certainly

true that they were created in record time. However, the FDA has now given the Pfizer vaccine full approval, and Moderna and Johnson & Johnson, which currently have only emergency approval, will soon follow.

Do note that each of these vaccines went through normal clinical trials, and met criteria for safety and efficacy. Getting full FDA approval was not a matter of better results, but rather a factor of time. A recent Kaiser Family Foundation poll showed that almost one-third of those who are unvaccinated will be more likely to become vaccinated now that full approval has been achieved.

For others, the trust issues are not about COVID or the vaccine, but rather about the institutions involved. Some don't believe that the government agencies or the companies that helped to develop the vaccines are looking out for their best interests. Or, perhaps the lack of trust is with the health care system itself. Certainly the history of Black Americans, including such atrocities as the U.S. Public Health Service syphilis study at the Tuskegee Institute, has had an impact on trust in these vaccines. It is my hope that education, opinion leaders, and even incentives will help to break down some of these barriers.

Some feel that vaccinations are contrary to their religious beliefs. I have great respect for the impor-

ance of religious freedom. I also feel that there are times when the social good may outweigh certain individual rights. If one declines a tetanus shot, they are potentially harming only themselves. If one declines a COVID vaccination, they are putting everyone around them at risk. We've cured so many diseases through thought and reason; by using vaccines, medications and public health measures. Vaccines have rid us of smallpox and have prevented paralysis from polio. Vaccines protect us as well as everyone in our community.

I care about all of my patients, both vaccinated and unvaccinated. When my unvaccinated patients explain to me why they refuse to get the vaccine, I am concerned for their well being. Unvaccinated patients make up between 90 and 99% of those hospitalized with COVID-19, depending on location. The risk of this disease is far, far greater than any risk from the vaccine.

Unfortunately, the consequence of having a partially vaccinated populace is that the virus will continue to spread, mutate, and kill. The pandemic is not over...not by a long shot. Please stay safe, wear masks, and become vaccinated.

Pulitzer Prize-winning photographer Marcio Jose Sanchez finds inspiration in Lynwood

LYNWOOD - Long before photographer Marcio Jose Sanchez made history last month as the first native of Honduras to win a Pulitzer Prize, he had a deep history with Lynwood where he discovered a passion that guided him to the ultimate career achievement.

Sanchez, who graduated from Lynwood High School in 1988, still remembers the inspiration of LHS educators

who encouraged him to pick up a camera that would ultimately change his life.

Sanchez is a member of a 10-person group of Associated Press photographers who were awarded the Pulitzer Prize in June for Breaking News Photography coverage of Black Lives Matter demonstrations.

"When I think about where my success started I think about Lynwood," Sanchez

said. "I think about the great teachers who advocated for me; the resources at Lynwood High, and the Lynwood library where I learned about photojournalism.

"Without Lynwood, maybe there is no Pulitzer Prize."

Sanchez immigrated to Lynwood from Honduras in 1983 at the age of 12. He lived on Sanborn Avenue and attended Hosler Middle School but did

not yet speak English. It was at LHS where he remembers former English teacher Janet Sampson assigning a report on a potential passion or career.

That's when Sanchez discovered photojournalism at the Lynwood library. The discovery could not have come at a better time as Sanchez, a former straight A student, had begun skipping class and was on the verge of flunking out of school.

If not for his mother, Marta Sanchez, visiting his teachers one-by-one and convincing them to give her son a second opportunity, Marcio would not have made it through.



"I had fallen into bad influences and was spending most of my time hanging out on the streets," Marcio recalls. "My mother, of course, was a guiding force, and Lynwood High also had some crusading teachers who understood the student dynamic and were on a

mission to educate us." It is mission accomplished for Lynwood educators and Marcio, who went on to graduate from San Jose State University and has traveled the world with his camera, capturing Wildlife Preservation in Africa, hurricanes in Honduras, the Super Bowl, and World Cup, to name a few highlights.

Lynwood Unified offers media and photography curriculum to secondary students as a part of its Career Technical Education program that prepares students for success in college and career.

The district has plans to invite Marcio to engage with students of the program and throughout the district.

"I want students to know that anything is possible - you can win a Pulitzer if you want to," Marcio said.

Marcio's story is an inspiration to the Lynwood community and a huge source of pride for a district committed to removing all barriers to success for its students.

"Marcio is the ultimate example for our students of what is possible for them to achieve once they find and develop their passion," LUSD Board President Maria G. Lopez said.

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Workers don't want their old jobs on their old terms

The pandemic disrupted many Americans' work lives. Some of us — generally highly educated white-collar workers with relatively well-paying jobs — were able to shift to remote work. Millions of other workers, especially many poorly paid service workers, simply saw their jobs disappear when consumers stopped eating out and traveling.

Now the economy is recovering — a recovery that will probably continue despite the spread of the Delta variant of the coronavirus. But many Americans don't want to go back to the way things were before. After a year and a half of working from home, many don't want to return to the stress of commuting. And at least some of those who were forced into unemployment have come to realize how unhappy they were with low pay and poor working conditions, and are reluctant to go back to their previous jobs.

To be honest, when businesses first began complaining about labor shortages I was skeptical. These kinds of complaints always surface when the economy begins to recover from a slump and often mean only that job applicants have gotten a bit less desperate. Some of us also remember how, seven or eight years ago, Very Serious People insisted that we faced a major "skills gap" and would never be able to get unemployment down to the levels that prevailed before the financial crisis. (Spoiler: We did.)

At this point, however, it seems clear that something really is going on. You can see this from the data on vacancies: There are far more unfilled job openings than you would normally expect to see given the current level of unemployment, which is still fairly high.

You can also see it by looking at what's happening in the sector hit hardest by the pandemic, leisure and hospitality (think restaurants and

hotels). Employment in that sector is still well below its prepandemic level; but to bring workers back, the sector has had to offer big wage increases, significantly above the prepandemic trend.

In other words, some workers really don't seem willing to go back to their old jobs unless offered substantially more money and/or better working conditions. But why is this happening? And is it a bad thing?

Conservatives insist that it is indeed a bad thing: Workers, they say, are refusing to take jobs because government aid is making unemployment too comfortable. But they would say that, wouldn't they? Remember, they said the same thing in the aftermath of the financial crisis, claiming that the unemployed were being coddled — when the actual reason recovery was slower than it should have been was the destructive fiscal austerity imposed by Republicans in Congress.

That said, the case for worrying about the incentive effects of unemployment benefits is better now than it was then. Aid to the unemployed has been far more generous during the pandemic than it was during the Great Recession; the \$300 per week supplement to existing unemployment benefits enacted in December and extended in March, although less than the \$600 per week supplement that prevailed for part of 2020, is, when combined with normal benefits, enough to replace most or all normal earnings for less-well-paid workers.

But have unemployment benefits actually had a major adverse effect on employment? No. State-level job numbers released Friday reinforced the conclusions of earlier studies that found at most a small negative effect.

This time, Republicans inadvertently provided the data needed to refute their own claims. Many red states rushed to cancel enhanced unemployment benefits earlier than their scheduled September

expiration. If these benefits were a major force holding back job creation, these states should have seen noticeably faster employment growth than blue states that kept benefits in place. They didn't.

But if it wasn't government benefits, what explains the reluctance of some workers to return to their old jobs? There may be several factors. Fear of the virus hasn't gone away, and it may be keeping some workers home. Child care is also an issue, with many schools still closed and day care still disrupted.

My guess, however — and it's just a guess, although some of the go-to experts here seem to have similar views — is that, as I suggested at the beginning of this article, the pandemic disruption of work was a learning experience. Many of those lucky enough to have been able to work from home realized how much they had hated commuting; some of those who had been working in leisure and hospitality realized, during their months of forced unemployment, how much they had hated their old jobs.

And workers are, it seems, willing to pay a price to avoid going back to the way things were. This may, by the way, be especially true for older workers, some of whom seem to have dropped out of the labor force.

To the extent that this is the story behind recent "labor shortages," what we're looking at is a good thing, not a problem. Perversely, the pandemic may have given many Americans a chance to figure out what really matters to them — and the money they were being paid for unpleasant jobs, some now realize, just wasn't enough.

Cable news needs more facts, less opinion

The heartbreaking scenes of suffering in Kabul are the kind of "hard news" that many Americans find compelling. But on most days, many Americans don't find "hard news" a compelling thing to watch. People would rather be entertained. Even political junkies want to be entertained — with political hot takes.

A new Media Research Center study of cable news coverage on CNN, MSNBC and Fox is a little depressing. Only 22.3% of the cable news hours surveyed can be defined as "hard news" — with correspondents reporting from the scene, live coverage of breaking news or an anchor just reading the latest news headlines.

It's even worse if you compare it to the commercials. On average, the "news" networks have nine minutes of news in an hour ... and 18 minutes of commercials.

CNN led the pack with 28.2% hard news, compared to 20.3% on MSNBC and 18.4% on Fox. Overall, 70% of cable "coverage" is hosts talking to guests. More than half of the news — 54% — is discussion and analysis by anchors, commentators and commentators. As CNN's Brian Stelter once admitted, cable news is "primarily a 24/7 talk show."

There's a pessimistic assumption that most people have already

seen the headlines (or longer stories) on their cellphones; that reporting the news might sound repetitive. But that presumes it's not repetitive to hear the same talking points of opinion shared over and over again.

It wasn't always this way. In 2013, the Pew Research Center found in a study of 2012 newscasts that "factual reporting" comprised 54% of CNN's content, versus 45% for Fox News and just 15% for MSNBC. That's a few years before the Trump era kicked in. Now, all the channels are deeply invested in opinion.

For this, we should blame ourselves. Ratings and focus groups have probably demonstrated this is what we want as "news" consumers. Both Republicans and Democrats — both conservatives and liberals — are looking for information that confirms a worldview; the opposing worldview is too unconscionable to consider side by side. It used to be routine to see conservative versus liberal pundit debates on the cable channels. It's much more common today for everyone on a panel to have a similar, if not identical, view on issues.

To accompany the cable numbers, the MRC also looked at a sample of ABC, CBS and NBC morning and evening news shows. Overall, 50.1% of these shows were hard news. The evening newscasts had the most hard news (71.7%), followed by the 7 a.m. hour of the morning shows (60.9%). Even the much lighter second hour of these morning shows

(24.9% hard news) beat the 22.3% tally for cable news.

All of this partisan division on partisan channels underlines why the country feels more divided and trust in the media keeps dropping. Both sides take their fights to social media sites, where both sides can assume the worst; that the other side is out to destroy democracy or abolish capitalism. The assumption is that every opponent argues in bad faith; that insincerity is rampant.

There's nothing wrong with vigorous debate, but it needs to step back from premises such as your opponent is part of a "death cult" or is not-so-secretly rooting for the Taliban, unless they're saying that crazy stuff out loud.

It would seem like the answer to building more trust in the "news" is to report more news and drop fewer opinion bombs. But with the gut check of numbers like these, is that entirely too optimistic an assumption?

A town named Paradise was lost and burned to the ground in 2018, a grim prelude to the summer's raging wildfires.

The governor recall election on Sept. 14 is the clearest indicator of California's churn, though the discontent is about more than that. Democratic Gov. Gavin Newsom is in danger of being displaced by a right-wing talk radio host, Larry Elder.

What a kiss of death that would be. Elder comes praised by conservative pundit George Will. On the other hand, a Los Angeles Times columnist cast him as a white supremacist — though he is Black. Only in California.

How far for a falling star on the national stage. Newsom was governing the pandemic pretty well until he was seen at a maskless dinner party at the French Laundry in fancy Napa Valley.

Ouch. Even the name sounds like just the wrong note for the restless natives of a state with 40 million residents.

Make that 39.5 million. California just lost population and a congressional seat for the first time ever in the 2020 census.

A Santa Monica girl, I took the breeze, sun and ocean as a common birthright, bicycling miles across the city to school. My tennis friends lived in Malibu, and I breathed in the oceanfront paradise they loved as we drove many miles along the Pacific Coast Highway.

One night on Colony Beach, we stayed up late 'round a fire with a Rolling Stone and Rick Danko of The Band, singing.

Malibu was where music and movies got born. Stardust.

"California Dreamin'" — a lovely, longing tune — was one ode. From that and others sung by Joni Mitchell, Tom Petty and the Eagles, you felt California was the American dream, magnified.

California represented to America what America represented to the world, a kind of shining free paradise. Right there where I lived.

And yet the American dream, which means a house of one's own, is drying up along with the drought plaguing the valley with some of the country's most fertile land.

Affordable housing is just not being built in the major cities — a woeful lack over the years as housing prices continue to climb out of sight for middle-class families.

The San Francisco hills by the bay are flooded with fast Silicon Valley wealth, the city's streets a study of sharp income inequality. The median house price in Los Angeles County is nearly \$800,000.

This is not unrelated: the homeless populations in San Francisco and Los Angeles are teeming. The beach community of Venice feels besieged.

The roughly 160,000 in California are an insurmountable problem without more public and affordable housing.

Both Newsom and Eric Garcetti, the Los Angeles mayor, lost local luster due to the large unhoused population. Garcetti may have given up his electoral ambitions for now by accepting the ambassador to India post. Newsom has promised a major initiative to build housing units — if he stays in office.

When we left Wisconsin in the "go West" exodus, my family drove through a desert that felt endless to a tiny, thirsty girl in the backseat. When Los Angeles rose in the distance, it didn't look like chasing paradise at first sight. The freeway complex hit me.

Los Angeles harbors a great concentration of creative minds, the factory of popular culture and the home of architect Frank Gehry. Sorry, San Francisco, you've lost some bohemian juice. Traffic jams there, too.

My mother told us San Francisco was a charming 19th century city, and Los Angeles was 20th century, built around the automobile. In the rearview mirror, the car — as personal temple — went too far over the environmental cliff.

The national political, housing and climate crises are hitting home in a state that once saw no limits on the blue horizon.

Oh, gorgeous California. Waking up is hard.

Charlie Watts

Charlie Watts, drummer for Rolling Stones

Charlie Watts, the legendary drummer for the Rolling Stones who was considered to be one of rock's greatest drummers, died Aug. 24 at a London hospital. He was 80.

Watts grew up in London and first fell in love with jazz music, especially swing and bebop. He attended art school and became a graphic designer.

Watts joined the band Blues Incorporated in 1962 and met Brian Jones who would sometimes play at Blues Incorporated gigs. The pair became friends with Blues fans Mick Jagger and Keith Richards and Watts joined their new group the Rolling Stones in 1963.

Watts was the rock steady backbeat for the Stones, never too flashy, no drum solos for him, but he drove their legendary hit songs with innovative tight rhythms.

Outside of the Stones, Watts played in various jazz bands and led his own Charlie Watts Orchestra in the 1980s, playing big band jazz.

He did not have the wild party reputation of his bandmates but he did kick an alcohol and drug problem that occurred in the 1980s. He married his wife Shirley in 1964 and she survives him along with their daughter, Seraphina.

"I don't like drum solos," he once said. "I admire some people that do them, but generally I prefer drummers playing with the band. The challenge with rock'n'roll is the regularity of it. My thing is to make it a dance sound - it should swing and bounce."

Don Everly, half of the Everly Brothers group

Don Everly, the last of the silken-voiced Everly Brothers music duo known for their harmonies, died Aug. 24, according to an announcement on the group's official Instagram. He was 84 years old.

Don and his younger brother, Phil Everly, became pop idols in the early days of rock 'n' roll, starting in the late 1950s, with chart-topping hits like "Bye Bye Love," "All I Have to Do is Dream," and "Wake Up Little Susie."

The brothers were called the "most important vocal duo in rock" by Rolling Stone, as they influenced the likes of music giants the Beatles, the Beach Boys, Simon & Garfunkel and many others.

"As a singer, songwriter, and guitar innovator, Don Everly was one of the most talented and impactful artists in popular music history," Country Music Hall of Fame CEO Kyle Young wrote on Twitter on Sunday. "His influence reverberates through the songs and ethereal harmonies he conjured with his brother Phil."

The duo was among the first inductees in the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame in 1986, and with Nashville roots and a style that embraced both country and rock, the Everly Brothers were inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame in 2001.

Don Everly was born in Muhlenberg County, Kentucky, but his family soon moved to Chicago -- where Phil was born -- so his father could pursue a

career in music, and both his mother and father, Margaret and Ike Everly, were country and western singers.

The boys sang with their parents during live shows and on the radio, and as teenagers, moved to Nashville. There, they found the song that took them to No. 2 on the pop charts -- "Bye Bye Love," written by Felice and Boudleaux Bryant.

After that, they had a top 10 hit song every four months for the next few years.

The Everly Brothers had a very public breakup in 1973, when Phil left the stage abruptly during a concert in California. They reunited a decade later.

Sonny Chiba, martial artist and actor

Sonny Chiba, a Japanese martial artist and actor known for roles in the "Kill Bill" series and "The Fast and the Furious: Tokyo Drift," died Aug. 19 of COVID-19 at the age of 82.

Chiba was a gymnast in his youth, learning martial arts while in college. He eventually became a fourth-degree black belt in karate as well as mastering several other martial arts styles.

Chiba was discovered in a Japanese talent search, and he began appearing in movies in the early 1960s. By the 1970s, he was one of the stars of martial arts movies, with his 1974 film "The Street Fighter" achieving international success.

Chiba starred in dozens of Japanese movies, including science fiction features and action films such as "Invasion

of the Neptune Men" (1961), "The Yagyu Conspiracy" (1978), and "Deadly Outlaw: Rekka" (2002).

He became one of Japan's biggest action stars and a cult favorite in the West, with his fans including filmmaker Quentin Tarantino. Tarantino cast Chiba as sushi chef and retired samurai Hattori Hanzo in his 2003-2004 "Kill Bill: Volume 1" and "Kill Bill: Volume 2."

In the 2005 film "The Fast and the Furious: Tokyo Drift," Chiba played Yakuza crime boss Kamata.

Chuck Close, popular portrait artist

Chuck Close, a celebrated artist known for his large-scale portraits, some of which were composed of many tiny paintings arranged as pixels, died Aug. 19 of congestive heart failure at the age of 81.

Close was among the best-known artists of his era, with a large body of work centered on huge portraits of friends, fellow artists, and celebrities. Some are all but indistinguishable from photographs. Others are photorealistic from a distance, but upon closer inspection become pixelated into hundreds or thousands of tiny paintings.

Close experimented with his pixelation style, composing one work with fingerprints from an ink pad and another from handmade paper pulp. He scanned thousands of his tiny paintings into a computer and digitally arranged them to create larger portraits.

Close revealed that he had prosopagnosia, or face blindness, a difficulty in recognizing faces of even those he saw regularly. He speculated that he was drawn to paint portraits because of this.

In 1988, Close experienced a spinal artery collapse that left him paralyzed from the neck down. He later regained limited movement and relearned how to paint, though he used a wheelchair for the rest of his life.

In 2017 and 2018, several women accused Close of making vulgar comments as they posed

for him in his studio. Close apologized for the comments, and an exhibition of his art planned to run at the National Gallery of Art was closed in response to the allegations.

"My art has been greatly influenced by having a brain that sees, thinks, and accesses information very differently from other people's," Close said in 1995. "I was not conscious of making a decision to paint portraits because I have difficulty recognizing faces. That occurred to me 20 years after the fact when I looked at why I was still painting portraits, why that still had urgency for me. I began to realize that it has sustained me for so long because I have difficulty in recognizing faces."

Tom T. Hall, hall of fame country singer

Tom T. Hall, a Country Music Hall of Fame singer-songwriter nicknamed "The Storyteller" who wrote "Harper Valley PTA," died Aug. 20 at age 85.

Hall earned "The Storyteller" nickname for his songs which brought his characters to life with humor. He was given the nickname by country music legend Tex Ritter, John Ritter's father.

Hall found success as a songwriter in Nashville writing a number one country song "Hello Vietnam" for Johnnie Wright in 1965. Shortly after, he signed to Mercury Records and released his own solo music.

He wrote the international pop crossover hit "Harper Valley PTA" which was recorded by Jeannie C. Riley in 1968. The anthem about a single mom inspired a movie and TV-series starring Barbara Eden.

Hall was inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame and was named in Rolling Stone's list of the 100 greatest songwriters.

Rod Gilbert, hall of fame hockey player

Rod Gilbert, a Hall of Fame forward for the New York Rangers who was known as

"Mr. Ranger," died Aug. 22 at age 80.

Gilbert played his entire career with the New York Rangers, retiring in 1978. He holds the team records for most goals and points in a career.

The Montreal native was an eight-time All-Star and was the first Ranger to have his jersey retired. He helped lead Canada to victory over Russia in the 1972 Summit Series.

After his playing career, he opened a restaurant in Manhattan called Gilbert's and was known for his humanitarian work.

"Rod Gilbert's impact on the National Hockey League and the New York Rangers over the past 62 years was profound -- both on and off the ice," NHL Commissioner Gary Bettman said in a press release. "As a player, he was revered by his teammates, respected by his opponents and absolutely beloved by Rangers' fans."

Brian Travers, founding member of UB40

Brian Travers, a founding member, saxophonist, and contributing songwriter for the British reggae/pop band UB40, died Aug. 22 at the age of 62 from cancer.

Travers and his school friends started the reggae influenced pop band UB40 in Birmingham, England, in the 1970s. They named the band after the unemployment benefit form 40.

Travers played saxophone and was a co-songwriter for the band.

UB40 found international success with their original song "Rat in Mi Kitchen" along with cover versions of "Red Red Wine" and "I Got You Babe."

The band has sold over 100 million albums worldwide and continues to perform.

"Thank God for the dole (unemployment benefit)," Travers said in 2010. "We got fed, it paid the rent and it enabled us to concentrate on developing our careers. We commandeered a cellar and started rehearsing every day, nine till five."

Next stop: new rail to Southeast LA County.

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HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL: Local teams open season with excitement

NORWALK - Highlighting the opening week of high school football was the debut of a new stadium at Norwalk High School - the first "home" game in the 65-year history of the school.

The St. Paul Swordsmen defeated Valley Christian of Cerritos, 41-14, while Norwalk fell to San Marino, 34-22. Santa Fe was shutout by Summit of Fontana, 34-0, and La Mirada's late comeback fell short to El Toro, 24-21.

John Glenn will open its season tonight against Firebaugh for an away game.

La Mirada - Game of the Week

In the spotlight this week is La Mirada, which opened the season with a three-point loss to visiting El Toro.

The Matadores, who have now started their third consecutive year away from their home stadium, opened the 2021 season at their current "home," Excelsior High.

After trailing early, 14-0, the Matadores came back and had a chance to tie the game in the last seconds of the game, but a 45-yard field goal fell short.

"For a season opener, it went down to the wire. We did some good things, but turned the ball over," La Mirada coach Mike Moschetti said. "That loss is on me. We were out of rhythm in the first."

"The key to the game was that field goal at the end of the first half. In the second half we threw an interception and they scored and went up, 24-7."

Leading the way for La Mirada was junior quarterback Neheul Garcia with 211 yards passing (20 for 32, 1 Int.) and two touchdowns.

On the ground, Matadores

senior running back Eddie Lafferre ran for 101 yards on 16 carries and a touchdown and added 22 yards receiving.

La Mirada senior running back Amel White added 34 yards on five carries.

Junior wide receiver Xavier Hicks led La Mirada with 94 yards on seven receptions and a touchdown. Seniors Aidan Nasser (1 TD) and John Ojeisekhoba added 48 and 43 yards receiving, respectively, for La Mirada.

El Toro started the scoring near the end of the first quarter to lead, 7-0.

After a short 20-yard La Mirada punt that gave the Chargers the ball near midfield, they drove the ball 60 yards on nine plays for the score. It culminated with a 24-yard TD pass from senior quarterback Blake Miller (15 for 26, 213 yards, 2 TDs) to Trey Williams (5 catches, 78 yards) with 4:04 left in the quarter.

Heading into the second quarter, La Mirada accounted for only two drives, one first down and punted twice.

With El Toro leading 14-0 midway through the second quarter, the Matadores defense, led by senior middle linebacker Ronnie Velasquez and Nasser, stopped El Toro on a third and seven at their 24-yard line.

The Matadores, who were 2-3 in the spring during the Covid five-game season, drove the ball 56 yards on 12 plays and cut the lead in half, 14-7, with a 10-yard touchdown pass from Garcia to Hicks.

Highlighting the drive was a 16-yard pass to Hicks and a first-down reception to Ojeisekhoba, fighting off defenders down to the 20-yard line.

Lafferre also caught a 20-yard screen pass to set up the TD.

"He was banged up going into the game, but he ran hard,"

said Moschetti, of Lafferre's performance in the game.

The Matadores scored four plays later with less than two minutes in the half.

El Toro took the ensuing kickoff and drove the ball down to the 17-yard line, aided by a long pass and late pass interference by the La Mirada defense. With no time left on the clock, Chargers kicker Christian Lahore connected for a 34-yard field goal and a 17-7 halftime lead.

Another interception by the El Toro defense saw Williams score a pick-six and ran it in for a 65-yard score and a 24-7 lead with 5:30 left in the third quarter.

The Matadores defense, led by Hicks and Nasser in the second half, gave the offense a shred of light near the end of the third quarter.

Starting at their own 19-yard line, the Matadores drove the ball 81 yards on nine plays, ending with a 14-yard touchdown pass from Garcia to Nasser with 9:41 left in the game to trail, 24-14.

Ojeisekhoba highlighted the drive with a 21-yard reception to the 14-yard line. Nasser did the rest as he fought off a couple of El Toro defenders for the score.

With eight minutes left, the La Mirada defense again forced Miller to scramble and set up a fourth down as he threw the ball to a receiver that was out of bounds.

Starting at their own 34-yard line, it was nearly all Lafferre on the 66-yard scoring drive, ending with a 2-yard score over the middle to trail, 24-21 with 7:04 remaining.

Lafferre caught a short 10-yard screen pass, ran for 41 yards, culminating with the short run for the TD.

On the ensuing El Toro possession, the Chargers marched down the field and two incomplete passes into the end zone, pressured by the La Mirada defense, gave the Matadores one last chance for a tie or win.

A big 50-yard catch and run

by Hicks gave La Mirada one last chance to score deep in El Toro territory with 3:21 left.

The offense wasn't able to cross the goal line, as Matadores senior kicker Aidan Petruescu came up short on a 45-yard field goal attempt.

Moschetti, was sad in defeat, but was happy for the kids and the nice showing in their opening game.

"These kids deserve to be in school and be on campus, which they are," he said. "It felt good and La Mirada supported us with a good crowd."

The Matadores traveled to Chaffey last night (August 26) for their second nonleague game of the season. (Results unavailable at press time).

San Marino spoils Norwalk stadium debut

The first real "home" game was played at Norwalk High School last Friday, with the debut of the new stadium and sports complex.

"It was such a celebratory moment," said first-year Norwalk coach Ruben Guerrero, of the opening. "The teachers lined up for the players coming on to the field. It was a great atmosphere."

"I was happy for the community and the school. Just to be a part of it was awesome and it was a great night. We played a heck of a game and led by two at the half, but couldn't hold on."

In attendance was Norwalk-La Mirada Unified School District Superintendent John Lopez and Norwalk Council member Margarita Rios.

The Lancers held a 22-20 lead at the half, but couldn't hang on as San Marino scored 14 points in the second half to win going away.

Leading the way for the Lancers was running back David Herrera with 130 yards rushing on 21 carries for 6.2 yards per carry average.

The junior also ran for two touchdowns.

Norwalk senior running back Jonathan Goodloe ran for 83 yards on 15 carries for the Lancers, while Sam Aguirre and junior Anthony Martinez (1 TD) ran for 25 and 23 yards, respectively.

Norwalk took the first lead of the game, after senior Damon Ramirez recovered a high snap by San Marino and Herrera capped off a 5-play drive with a touchdown run and the 6-0 lead.

San Marino took its first lead of the game on the ensuing possession with a 3-play drive and a two-point conversion to lead, 8-6.

Early in the second quarter, Herrera scored his second touchdown of the game, on a 1-yard run off tackle. That was followed by a 2-point conversion run by Aguirre and the Lancers led, 14-8.

San Marino tied the game, 14-14, as they failed to convert a 2-point conversion.

However, the Lancers again took the lead after a 29-yard kickoff return by Mike Mueller.

It was followed by a 5-play drive and Martinez ran the ball for seven yards and a score. Herrera ran in the 2-point conversion for the 22-14 lead.
