Norwalk lands \$8.5M park grant

The funding will help transform Hermosillo Park with new fields, walking trail, basketball courts, and a recreation center.

The grant money was included in the state's 2021-22 spending plan, city officials said, and is funded by a 2018 California ballot measure approved by voters and intended to bolster parks and outdoor spaces.

Upgraded amenities include a new community recreation building, an outdoor plaza, a loop walking trail with fitness stations, two multi-use sports fields with shade structures, bleachers and lighting, a splash pad, picnic area, one and a half basketball courts, and three handball courts.

There will also be public art, walkways, a larger parking lot, as well as new lighting and landscaping throughout the park.

Norwalk has also applied for other grants to improve the city's other parks, and will make park improvements a focal point in the coming year.

Whittier bank building sold

Whittier Kennedy Wilson Brokerage, a division of Kennedy-Wilson Properties, Ltd., has facilitated the sale of a 14,203 square-foot office property at 7355 Greenleaf Ave. in Whittier on behalf of Banc of California National Association.

The purchase of the drive-thru corner location at Greenleaf Ave. and Mar Vista St. by a private investor includes a five-year leaseback to the bank.

Kennedy Wilson Brokerage President Ed Sachse, Executive Vice President Lee Shapiro and Senior Vice President Gary Goodgame completed the \$4.2 million sale on behalf of the seller.

"Drive-thru retail and office product continues to be highly sought after in urban infill markets," said Gary Goodgame, Senior Vice President of Corporate Services at Kennedy Wilson Brokerage. "With a second-floor vacancy and five-year leaseback by the bank for the ground floor, this property generated multiple cash offers and closed within two weeks of going under contract."

Situated on a 0.63-acre lot in Whittier's historic uptown district, the property serves as Banc of California's flagship location in the submarket. It features parking on the ground floor, signage and branding visibility, a wrap-around balcony, and is located within a Federally Qualified Opportunity Zone.

The buyer plans to operate the asset as a leased investment.

Norwalk man killed after Tijuana kidnapping, feds say

The Norwalk resident was killed after his kidnappers demanded ransom money from his mother.

NORWALK - Six people were charged Tuesday with running a Mexico-based kidnapping ring that took nine people hostage and demanded ransom from their U.S. relatives but killed six of them, including a San Diegan who was killed after the money was paid, officials said.

A federal grand jury in Los Angeles charged the alleged ringleader, German Garcia Yera Hernandez, 37, and five others with crimes, including extortion and conspiracy to commit hostage-taking resulting in death, according to a statement from the U.S. attorney's office in Los Angeles.

All six were being held in Mexico, where they face additional charges, and it wasn't immediately clear whether they had attorneys to speak on their behalf.

The indictment alleges that from January to April of last year, the Tijuana-based gang took people for ransom in Mexico by luring them into meetings where they were taken hostage at gunpoint, tied up and sometimes badly beaten.

Family members in the U.S. were then called for ransom. Some who didn't have family members who could pay were

killed and some hostages were killed to protect the conspiracy even after being ransomed, according to the U.S. attorney's office's statement.

Six people were killed, including three U.S. citizens, authorities said.

In one case, a man, who court papers only identify as Victim D and who is described as "a United States national who resided at the time in San Diego," was kidnapped on March 27 of last year.

"On March 28, 2020, through Facebook, after Victim D's adult son paid the ransom, defendant YERA sent defendant LOPEZ messages stating, 'it's done bro' and 'this was good job done,' followed by a video of a large amount of currency," the court papers state.

Victim D was killed even though his adult son left a \$25,000 ransom payment that was collected in the women's restroom of a McDonald's restaurant in San Ysidro, according to the indictment.

Victim D was murdered the day the ransom was paid, prosecutors said. Two days later, his alleged killers callously discussed how to dispose of his vehicle.

"On March 30, 2020, through Facebook, defendant YERA sent CC-1 a photograph of Victim D's Ford Explorer and stated, 'we should sell the [E]xplorer,'



to which CC-1 responded, 'you should keep it,'" the indictment states.

They were beaten and killed after the kidnappers learned that they had no money, the indictment said.

In another case, two people from the U.S. and Mexico were abducted after meeting one of the kidnappers at a Tijuana nightclub and being invited to a home, according to the indictment.

In a third case, a U.S. national living in Norwalk was kidnapped while visiting a relative in Tijuana.

The victim "was forced to call his mother, say he was in

trouble and instruct her to call an individual to pay \$25,000 for his release. The victim's mother struggled to obtain the ransom money but agreed to pay the hostage takers \$1,000" along with the man's car for his release, according to the U.S. attorney's office.

But the man was killed on the same day that his mother met with the ransom collector in Norwalk, the indictment alleged.

If convicted, the six defendants could face the death penalty or life in prison without chance of parole.

Cerritos College pledges to stop using plastic products

The Norwalk-based campus becomes California's first community college to adopt policy against plastic.

NORWALK - The Cerritos College Board of Trustees recently adopted a "Break Free From Plastic" resolution, making the campus the first community college in California to adopt a policy to abandon the use of plastic products.

More than 70 percent of the world's plastic ends up in landfills, incinerators, or drifting in waterways. By 2050, there will be more plastic than fish by weight in the world's oceans, according to projections.

The Cerritos College Geography Club laid a strong foundation to help end the use of plastic products on campus. In 2018, former Club president Salvador Uribe and his successor Raul Leon, in 2019, helped lead student efforts to raise awareness about plastic's negative impact to the environment.

Current Club leaders Gisselle Delgado and Hector Ledesma brought the final resolution to the Board at its November 17 meeting. Ryan Goode, the Club's advisor, provided critical support to the students and their campaign.

"What motivated me was the lack of awareness of the effects petroleum has on the environment and everyone around. I hope to bring further awareness to this issue on campus," said Gisselle.

"I want to make a positive change in the community. The campaign was the perfect opportunity for me to take action and show others that even if the odds are stacked against us, change can and will be made," said Hector.

Cerritos College is the first California community college to join 18 campuses across the country to commit to Post-Landfill Action Network's Break Free From Plastic pledge, which calls on campuses to:

1. Establish a purchasing policy that eliminates campus and food vendor procurement of all non-essential, non-compostable, single-use disposable plastics. The goal is to keep accessibility and affordability at the forefront of decision-making to ensure that accommodations are made for all users of the system

2. Commit to monitoring plastic-free alternatives in future procurement decisions and policies regarding items that cannot currently be eliminated



due to a lack of viable alternatives

3. Invest in education, resources, and infrastructure to assist in the Plastic-Free Campus transition

Cerritos College will create an action plan to implement the new policy.

"We are incredibly proud of our student leaders who sponsored and drove this initiative. This is a great example of how education, passions, and community impact can intersect in powerful ways. As a result, the District is developing increasingly environmentally-friendly practices, and we

pledge to make Cerritos College a leader in sustainability," said James Cody Birkey, president of the Cerritos College Board of Trustees.

"When it comes to sustainability, we really should be putting student voices first - they have the most at stake. The Break Free From Plastic campaign aligns with our Green Cerritos campus initiative and reinforces the College's dedication to creating a sustainable campus environment through conscious decision-making strategies. We are beyond the talk, it's time for action."

Paging Dr. Frischer...

I've been hearing a new expression. A number of my patients, in particular those who have not been vaccinated against COVID-19, tell me: "I'll do my own research." What exactly does this mean?

Clearly, they are not claiming to be scientists, about to undertake basic original laboratory research. I believe that they are saying they intend to go online and investigate whether the vaccine is both safe and effective.

How would one approach this? Years ago, as a college and medical student, I spent an enormous number of hours in various libraries, pulling respected primary sources, culling the information, and writing papers.

These days, we have the Internet. What a difference. So much information is available in so many different forums, including government funded websites, websites connected to educational institutions, personal blog or opinion sites, political websites with a highly specific bent, and websites marketing particular products. One of the most important challenges is to identify which are reliable and factual.

Here is an effective strategy:

Step 1: Clearly identify your topic. If you are clear in your subject matter, you will likely find a number of websites. Your search engine (Google, Yahoo, etc.) will use your keywords to bring up documents and webpages. Vary your keywords if you are not getting many "hits."

Step 2: Decide whether there is sufficient information available. Often I will search for

information on a topic, only to find very little. Many subjects have not yet been exhaustively and conclusively researched.

Step 3: Evaluate your sources. This is the tricky part. Are your websites providing credible, truthful, and reliable information? The problem is that you can get an enormous number of "hits," but they may not be accurate, authoritative, or even up-to-date. Unlike medical journals, there is no review standard for Internet content. ANYONE can put literally ANYTHING out there. Therefore, your task is to evaluate information and websites extremely carefully.

To be fair, most issues are not black and white. That is the challenge in researching and writing on any subject. I have biases of my own; we all do. However, for scientific data, I aspire to be an objective, balanced, and trusted source for my articles, patients, family, and friends.

What do I suggest for those who wish to "do their own research" regarding the vaccine? Let's admit that most of us do not have the background and training to interpret the raw data. But I urge you: Do not seek scientific information from social media or from a blog. Use peer-reviewed scientific journals, medical school or respected university websites, and/or a government website such as the CDC.

The Internet has changed the way we all gather information, and we must be exceedingly cautious regarding just whom we choose to listen to.

Santa's return to Norwalk gives residents pre-pandemic nostalgia

NORWALK – Children and parents cheered at Hermosillo Park as they welcomed Santa Claus back to Norwalk on Monday after the COVID-19 pandemic prevented his visit last year.

While the pandemic is still ongoing, officials deemed Santa's visit could continue safely as approximately 66.4% of Norwalk residents ages five and up are vaccinated.

"For the kids [to see Santa], it's trying to get back to normal with COVID. They need stuff like this to come back," said Gabriela Ayala as her son Daniel Perez finished getting his photo with Santa.

Ayala says coming to see Santa as he drove through Norwalk was an annual tradition before the pandemic. She also reminisced about other city events that were canceled last year because of the pandemic, such as the Halloween celebration and Christmas tree lighting.

"Kids need to go out and play. They need to interact with kids their age. They miss all of that," said Ayala.

Santa's visit also served as a reminder to parents to continue observing COVID-19 safety restrictions, so more events can safely return and to reduce the spread of the virus.

"As long as we all follow the rules and the guidelines then I think we should be fine, and

more events can come back," said Viddy Santana as she waited with her daughter Melanie to get a photo with Santa.

She recalled an after school program her daughter attended that was shut down when the pandemic began.

"It's good for kids to see events coming back after spending so much time at home," said Santana.

Norwalk has encouraged anyone who is eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine. The Pfizer vaccine is FDA approved for people ages 16 and older, and is under emergency authorization for kids five to 11.

Most parents and children are observant of safety measures such as masking and social distancing during city events, but some remain skeptical of the vaccine.

"There isn't that much long-term study of [the vaccine's] effects. It's been out for a year now, but I'm talking about 10 years with it," said Jessica Huerta after her son Jaden Colmen took a photo with Santa.

Like most anti-vaccine advocates, Huerta says she will conduct her own research. However, she plans to look at sites like the CDC and WHO, both of which endorse and

encourage vaccinations.

Huerta also questioned the vaccine's efficacy if people can still contract COVID after vaccination, despite doctors' repeated statements that the Pfizer vaccine is 96% effective and reduces hospitalization.

Santa continued to visit children on Wednesday, and he will make final visits in Norwalk on Friday starting with New River Elementary School at 5 p.m.

FDA approval of over-the-counter hearing aids is music to Americans' ears

Millions of Americans may soon be able to hear a bit easier. The Food and Drug Administration just announced a new rule that would permit over-the-counter sales of hearing aids.

This move to liberalize the market for hearing aids is an unmitigated piece of good news. It recognizes that patients should have greater control over the care they receive. And it promises to increase competition in the market for hearing aids, saving consumers money and expanding access in the process.

Half of seniors over the age of 75 have what the National Institutes of Health classifies as “disabling hearing loss.” Younger adults can struggle with their hearing, too. The NIH says that around 14 percent of Americans aged 20–69 have some level of hearing loss.

At present, a person needs a prescription to get a hearing aid. That's limited access to -- and the potential market for -- hearing aids.

These supply restrictions have elevated the prices of hearing aids. Professionally fitted devices seldom cost less than \$1,000, and sometimes more than \$6,000 -- about 17% of the U.S. median income.

For the average senior, the outlook is even grimmer. The most expensive hearing aids would strip them of 22% of their annual income.

It's no wonder, then, that many people who would benefit from hearing aids go without. Nearly 60% of people over 55 who have hearing loss don't use them. And over three-quarters of those who do have the cash for hearing aids say they're still too expensive.

Shifting to an over-the-counter model would erase one of the chief barriers to getting a hearing aid -- the need for a prescription from a doctor or audiologist. By expanding the potential customer base for hearing aids, it could induce manufacturers to enter the space -- and reduce prices for consumers.

A possible preview of what's ahead -- speaker and headphone

manufacturer Bose already sells over-the-counter hearing aids. They cost \$850 -- much less than the thousands of dollars that prescription hearing aids can cost today.

Scrapping regressive FDA regulations on hearing devices also opens up the possibility for even more innovation. Imagine the possibilities. Wireless headphones that double as hearing aids, or hearing aids that connect with a smartwatch.

Requiring people with common forms of hearing loss to jump through hoops to procure low-risk devices that can help them is a pointless burden -- and a cruel one, too.

Parents of school shooters share the blame

After the 2012 massacre at an elementary school in Newtown, Connecticut, then-Rep. Mike Rogers, a Michigan Republican, evaded calls for banning weapons of war. But he had other ideas. The “more realistic discussion,” Rogers said, is “how do we target people with mental illness who use firearms?”

Tightening the gun laws would seem a lot easier and less intrusive than psychoanalyzing everyone with access to a weapon. But to address Rogers' point following the recent mass murder at a suburban Detroit high school, the question might be, “How do we with target the adults who hand powerful firearms to children with mental illness?”

The parents of Ethan Crumbley presented their clearly troubled 15-year-old with a high-powered weapon. He is charged with using the semiautomatic handgun to murder four students at Oxford High School.

This is hardly the first case of parents enabling a sick child to act on his violent fantasies. Nancy Lanza, the mother of the 20-year-old who killed 27 innocents at the Connecticut elementary school, left an unsecured Bushmaster .223-caliber rifle at her tidy house. Nancy was Adam Lanza's first victim.

Laurel Harper had previously placed her son Christopher in a psychiatric hospital, but that did not deter her from keeping unsecured guns at their home. Christopher brought six of them to his 2015 rampage

at Umpqua Community College in Roseburg, Oregon. Nine students died.

Both Nancy Lanza and Laurel Harper were divorced women left to single-handedly deal with children tortured by inner demons. But rather than steer their sons away from the gun culture, they both dove into it.

Nancy would go to bars at night and brag about all the guns she kept at home. Laurel, a nurse, spent long hours on forums, her subjects alternating between her son's mental illness and her gun collection.

“I keep two full mags in my Glock case,” Laurel swaggered online. “And the ARs & AKs (semiautomatics) all have loaded mags.” She criticized “lame states” that put limits on loaded firearms in the home.

Concerning disregard for the lives of others, no one would beat James and Jennifer Crumbley. The school called them in after Ethan was found having drawn pictures of a gun, a bullet and bloody figure with the words “the thoughts won't stop” and “help me.”

They came in but refused to take Ethan home. They wanted to get back to their jobs.

The day before, the school informed the parents that their son was found searching online for ammunition. Jennifer responded by sending an insanely supportive text to Ethan: “LOL, I'm not mad at you. You have to learn not to get caught.”

When these details emerged, the parents took off to hide from getting

caught. They now face four counts each of involuntary manslaughter.

The central focus of the Michigan horror has rightly moved from a mentally ill high schooler to his socially deviant parents. Which leads to these two questions:

Aren't parents who keep loaded weapons in a home shared by a disturbed child with violent obsessions themselves mentally twisted? And what could be done about them?

A woman had reportedly told investigators in Connecticut that she overheard Adam Lanza say he planned to kill his mother and children at the elementary school. She even called the local police. But since Nancy Lanza, not Adam, owned the weapons, the police couldn't take them away.

If police had removed arms from adults without criminal records, the gun rights fanatics would have exploded with outrage. How dare you go after these noble defenders of the Second Amendment?

Besides, it's easy to identify mentally ill people who use firearms, right? It's certainly easy once the massacre is over.

Democrats are stuck with Kamala Harris

A USA Today-Suffolk University poll placed Vice President Kamala Harris' approval ratings at 28%, 10 points below that of President Joe Biden. The U.K. Telegraph tweeted: “With Kamala Harris looking unelectable, the Democrats are considering the nuclear option. Whispers in Washington suggest Joe Biden's camp has a plan to find a more popular replacement ahead of the 2024 battle.”

When Harris ran for president, she dropped out before the Iowa caucus, the first contest in the primary. She garnered little support from her home state, California. Harris got called out for hypocrisy during a debate by rival Rep. Tulsi Gabbard, D-Hawaii, for — among other things — prosecuting marijuana crimes only to make light in an interview about smoking marijuana.

When Harris quit the race, she said: “I've taken stock and I've looked at this from every angle, and over the last few days I have come to one of the hardest decisions of my life. My campaign for president simply doesn't have the financial resources we need to continue.”

But the party's presidential nominee picked her as his running mate. When Harris became vice president, Biden announced her role as a border czar and also asked her to be his point person to push the passage of a proposed “voting rights” law. The border remains a mess, and the John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act was stalled in the Senate. Her

staff grumbled off the record, calling these two jobs lose-lose, and even suggested “racism” at play given the growing stature of Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg. And then there is the cackle. Critics say Harris resorts to this kind of phony, uncomfortable laughter when she struggles to answer questions for which she is not prepared.

All of this raises the question: Why did Biden choose her in the first place?

The answer is simple. The woke/identity Democratic Party could not and would not abide another presidential and vice-presidential ticket with two white males. The party's most loyal constituency is black females. According to Pew Research Center data released in 2020: “In 2018 and 2019, 48% of White women identified as Democrats, compared with 35% of White men. ... Among Hispanic women (67% identified as Democrats vs. 58% of Hispanic men. ...) ... Black women (87%) were more likely than Black men (77%) to identify as Democrats.”

So, Harris checked the necessary boxes — a female “person of color” who identifies as black. But this also presents a problem. If the Biden administration tossed her overboard it would face a withering attack of “sexism and racism.” Consider NAACP President and CEO Derrick Johnson's response to the acquittal of Kyle Rittenhouse, the teenager on trial for killing two white men and injuring a third in Kenosha, Wisconsin: “We have seen this same outcome time and time again. ... This verdict is

a reminder of the treacherous role white supremacy and privilege play within our justice system.”

In addition, while Harris may be broadly unpopular, she enjoys a 72% approval rating among black voters, and her approval among black female voters is likely even higher. So, the only possible way out is for Biden and the party to swap her for another black female. But the bench is shallow.

Michelle Obama? She hates politics and has repeatedly said she has no interest. Oprah Winfrey? Ditto. Domestic policy adviser Susan Rice? Tainted by the falsehoods about Benghazi that she peddled as former President Barack Obama's national security adviser, Rice was not put forward as Obama's secretary of state because she would not have gotten Senate confirmation. Rep. Maxine Waters, D-Calif.? Too offensive. Former Georgia gubernatorial candidate Stacey Abrams? She claims, despite a lack of evidence, that she actually won but her race was stolen. This would rob Democrats of their attack line against former President Donald Trump, who makes the same claim about the 2020 presidential election for himself. Virginia Lt. Gov.-elect Winsome Sears and former Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice? Wrong party.

No, the Dems are stuck with Harris.

Abortion bans don't protect the rights of the people

Last week, the Supreme Court heard arguments over a Mississippi law banning abortions after the 15th week of pregnancy. The law roundly defies the court's decisions affirming a right to abortion, but the state portrays the ban as the mildest of correctives.

All Mississippi wants the justices to do, insisted state solicitor general Scott Stewart, is defer to “the people.” The law, he said, came about because “many, many people vocally really just wanted to have the matter returned to them so that they could decide it — decide it locally, deal with it the way they thought best and at least have a fighting chance to have their view prevail.”

Justice Brett Kavanaugh seemed to find the argument persuasive. It's his understanding, he said, that Mississippi believes “this Court should be scrupulously neutral on the question of abortion, neither pro-choice nor pro-life.”

Letting the people decide, and aligning the court to neither promote nor prevent abortion, sounds sensible — even libertarian. What neither Stewart nor Kavanaugh acknowledged, though, is that, in a fundamental sense, these conditions have already been met.

Under the court's major abortion decisions, the people, as individuals, already have the full authority to make up their minds on the issue. Those who believe that every pregnancy should be carried to term are free to forgo abortions. Those who disagree are free to procure abortions. No woman is forced to abort her fetus, and no woman is forced to undergo childbirth.

By the same token, the Supreme Court has adopted a position of neutrality. Just as the Constitution does not let government forbid or require anyone to worship, the Constitution does not let the government forbid or require anyone to bear a child. Each pregnant woman is free to decide for herself.

But when Stewart and Kavanaugh use these terms, they have in mind a different meaning. If Roe and Casey were overturned, the people would be empowered not as individuals but as a collective. The court would be “neutral” only on the matter of whether states allow abortion or ban it.

Apply these meanings to a different constitutional right and the defects in their logic become clear. Champions of gun rights have always argued that “the right of the people to keep and bear arms” is an individual liberty — as the court agreed in 2008.

They believe the court must keep “the people” of any state from using the power of government to abridge this right. Americans who believe in free speech and religious liberty feel the same way about First Amendment guarantees.

Stewart insisted that abortion rights are different because the framers didn't explicitly protect them. The Roe and Casey decisions, he argued, “have no basis in the Constitution. They have no home in our history or traditions.”

In fact, they have a spacious place in our history and traditions. In his 2017 book “Sex and the Constitution,” University of Chicago law professor Geoffrey Stone notes that abortion was legal and widely performed in the United States at the time the Constitution was ratified — and wasn't

outlawed for more than a century afterward.

It's true that the Constitution doesn't mention the right to abortion. But the Constitution protects many freedoms it doesn't mention — the freedom to marry, the freedom to refuse medical treatment, the freedom to have children and govern their upbringing and more.

The Ninth Amendment stipulates that not all protected liberties are spelled out: “The enumeration in the Constitution, of certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people.”

If the Constitution has nothing to say about abortion, does that mean a state could require some women to have abortions — say, to prevent the birth of children with serious congenital defects?

Of course not. Requiring abortion would be a gross violation of physical autonomy, which enjoys broad constitutional protection. But banning abortion has the same effect. And the Supreme Court appears poised to let it happen.

Pro-life advocates say abortion ends a human life, as if that settles everything. But the issue is not whether a fetus is alive or human. It's whether and when its preservation is sufficiently important to override a woman's fundamental right to control her own body.

Americans have long disagreed on that question. Our disagreement is a powerful argument for leaving the choice to each pregnant woman.

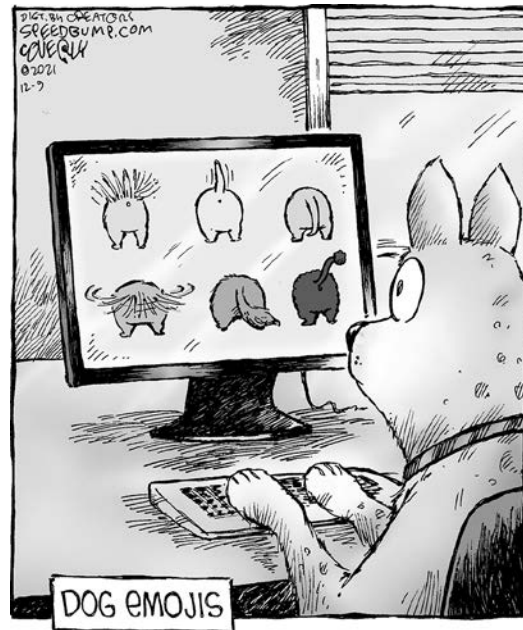
Right now, we let the people decide, one by one, under the protection of a neutral government. But probably not for long.

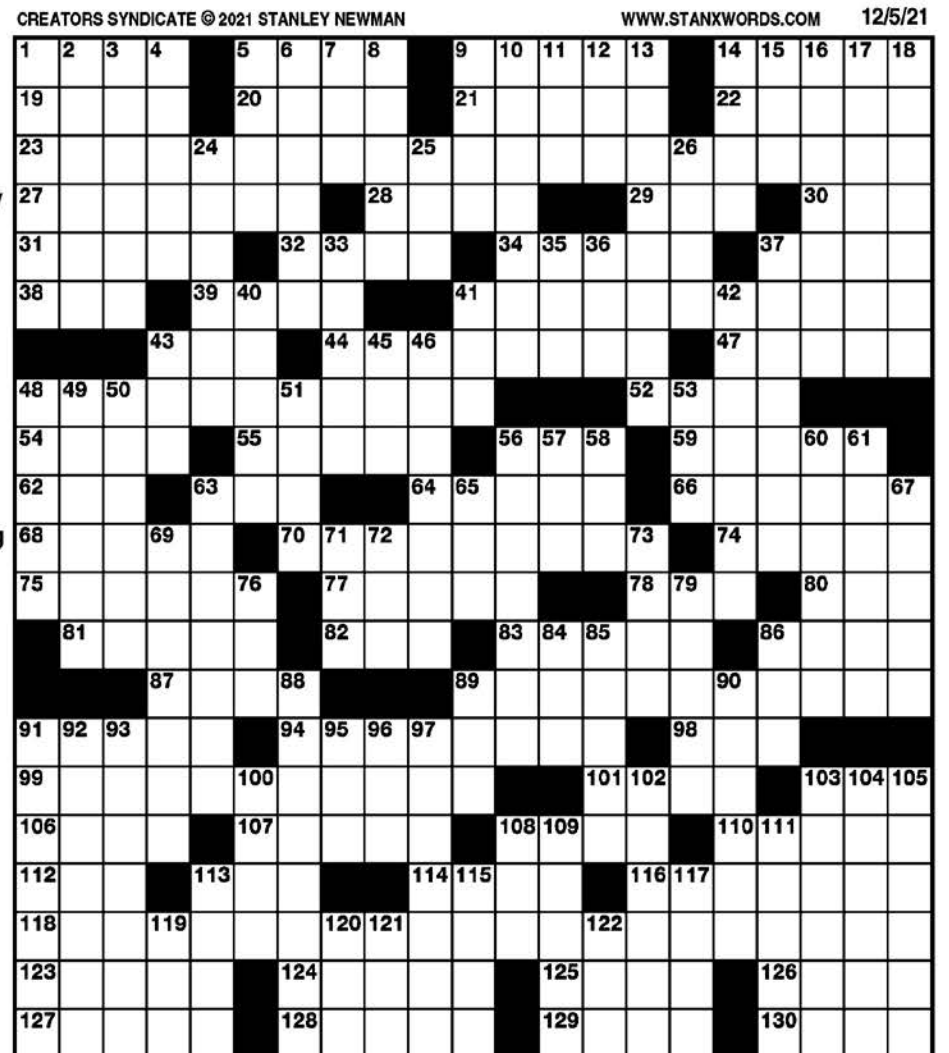

Santa Fe Boys Soccer team honors longtime coach, teacher, Carlos Casillas

■ Many former players and family joined in at the alumni game.

SANTA FE SPRINGS – Juan “Carlos” Casillas had a lot of friends and was loved by all.

The longtime Santa Fe High School social science teacher and former boys soccer coach, who passed away last February, was remembered recently at the alumni game last Friday (December 3).

In attendance were his brother Jorge and sister Martha and a huge number of former players and the current varsity team, who were all wearing shirts with a portrait and just simply the words, “In Loving Memory of Coach Casillas.”

“I’ll tell you what, it’s emotional for my family,” said Jorge Casillas, who is Carlos’ younger brother and even jumped into the game for a few minutes. “But, just to see his face on the back (of the shirts) was special.

“He dedicated his life to this school and to the school district. He did it with passion and he did it with compassion. We talked so much about his daily school life, weather it was coaching or in the classroom, he just put 100% of his life dedicated to his school.”

Martha Casillas, who brought two poster boards full of memories of Carlos through the years, echoed what her brother Jorge said: “Oh my gosh, Santa Fe was everything to him. These were his kids and he saw this place as his family.

“That they’re doing this for him is such an honor. It’s awesome for us to be here.”

“The kids had that special bond with him, to say that these were his kids, that’s for sure. It’s hard to believe that we’re going through this. I still feel him around and you know, this is just a break and we’ll see him again.”

In addition to the alumni game, a great honor was bestowed in Casillas’ memory this past August.

Prior to a football game this past season, the press box at Pioneer High School, where Casillas spent many Friday night’s announcing for his favorite team, the Chiefs, was dedicated in his memory.

A sign on the outside of the press box reads: “Carlos Casillas Press Box.”

His family, brothers Jorge and Jaime, sister Martha and mother Flora, were in attendance in the press box and viewed the beautiful plaque that adorns on the wall.

Current Santa Fe Athletic Director Steve Hendry spoke of his friend of three decades.

“I was fortunate to work with Carlos for almost 30 years,” Hendry said. “He was without a doubt one of the nicest people I have ever known. As his brother George said at the dedication, ‘Carlos was in it for the kids.’”

“Being around him as a teacher, coach, and as the voice of Santa Fe, his dedication to the students was obvious.”

The plaque inside the press box said in part, “Carlos will be remembered by many for his golden voice. Growing up, Carlos dreamed of sportscasting; this became a reality over the last 39 years as he volunteered as the official announcer at Santa Fe. He was affectionately known as ‘The Voice of the Santa Fe High School Chiefs.’ Mr. Casillas announced football games, basketball games, baseball games, and any other athletic or student event in need of his golden voice and enthusiasm.”

The alumni game, which had graduates from the past 13 years and was organized in part by boys varsity soccer coach Raul Ruvalcaba, saw a large turnout of former players.

“It was a game that represented coach Casillas’ spirit,” said Ruvalcaba, who played for Casillas. “The whole game was just everyone having fun out here. It was always about that – having fun.”

“His brother Jorge said at the beginning of the game about playing and everyone having fun and the opportunity to have the chance to come out and play. We had 25 players (alumni) out

here who knew and played for him. They all loved him and still do. He’s very alive in our hearts and we’re never going to forget him. We plan on continuing this every year.”

Ruvalcaba continued about the game and the thoughts of Casillas, “Some of my best friends in life I met here in this high school playing for coach Carlos Casillas.

“We’re very thankful with so many memories of him and we want to dedicate our season to him and want to start with this alumni game and are just thankful for his family to be here.”

Jorge spoke to the alumni just prior to the start of the game and said, “...one thing about my brother is he wanted everybody to play. I just loved the fact that he always had a couple of character guys on his team.”

“Now, go get these dog gone son of a guns and put some goals in the net.”

The alumni, with a big roster, did just that and beat the varsity.

One former coach (2006-’10) and current teacher (chemistry) at Santa Fe, Walter O’Brien said, “We always had an alumni game and when Carlos was coach, he would trot around.

“He was a great guy and mentored me a lot, not only in teaching, but in several ways in how to interact with the kids. I connected with Carlos real well with his passion with soccer.”

Recent graduate Emilio Garcia (2019) mentioned that Casillas had coached his older brothers, Ricardo Garcia (’11) and Esteban Garcia (’09).

“When I was a freshman here (Santa Fe), he would say hi, but I didn’t know who he was,” Emilio Garcia said. “The next year I recognized that he was the soccer coach. He would always share stories and always be happy. We’d all stop by in his classroom.

“Honestly, he was one of the best teachers here that made an impact on my four years of high school.”

As much as people might have thought Casillas had graduated from Santa Fe, he actually attended and went to Pioneer High, graduating in 1978.

Four years later (1982) he returned to his alma mater as a

substitute teacher. Four years after that (1988) he began his career-long love affair with Santa Fe as a teacher and coach.

Carlos spent a good part of his life on the Santa Fe Springs campus. The press box plaque continued – “He dedicated his time to attending or announcing athletic events or judging class competitions. Carlos tirelessly supported all school events and activities without regard for his own time, as long as it meant an opportunity to help students.”

Santa Fe Principal, Craig Campbell and Vice Principal, Fernie Fernandez were in attendance at the game.

Said Campbell: “It’s an awesome day for us, Campbell said. “A day like this keeps Carlos and his family in our thoughts and prayers. I’m glad that coach (Ruvalcaba) decided to put this on. We have a lot of former players to come out and play.

“It’s a great opportunity to remember him and what he did for this school and our soccer program. He was a kind and loving guy that was willing to do anything for anyone.”

The touching words on the plaque at Pioneer High also said, “For years to come, Carlos will be remembered for his kind words, passion for sports, and his love of the community to which he dedicated his life.”

The plaque ends with: “With Carlos’ spirit and voice in mind, The Whittier Union High School District Board of Trustees would like to dedicate the press box at Dick Torres Stadium, Pioneer High School, to honor the memory of Carlos Casillas.”

What they said:

Wilber Sanchez (2013), former soccer player: “(Carlos) was my JV and varsity coach. Coach Casillas would always play to win, but he made sure that everyone had fun.

At the end of the day, weather was lost by 10 goals or won by two, I guarantee we had tacos after the game. We all loved it. Those Del Tacos, soft one-dollar chicken tacos were the best.

Great memories, great person, great coach.”

Josh Rodriguez, senior, varsity soccer player: “I had him as a coach in my freshman year when I was in JV. He was always uplifting and was a very kind man. Even if you weren’t doing your best in a game, he put all of his faith in you.

He had a lot of love for the school and he was very energetic. He loved it when the school was doing well.”

Esahn Mejia, senior soccer player: “I didn’t play much in my freshman year, but in my sophomore year he made me captain for the JV team.

He helped me become better as a person. He would always let us go into his class and eat lunch. Everyone liked him as a teacher and as a coach.

We all want to honor him and celebrate his life.”

Jacob Chuang, sophomore, soccer varsity player: “I feel grateful to be a part of a program that he was a part of.

This feels like it’s going to be an annual thing. Hopefully the seniors that play in this game will come back and play against us too.”

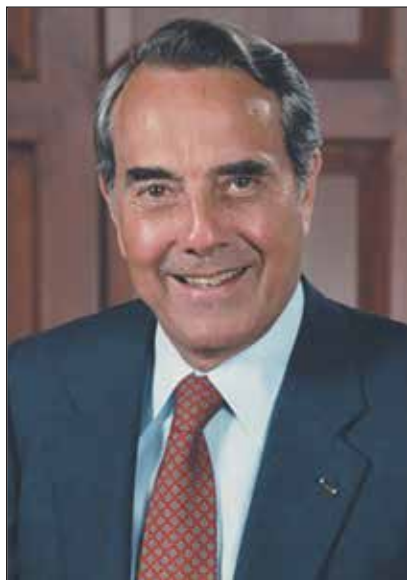

Obituaries



Bob Dole was awarded two Purple Hearts and a Bronze Star for his service in World War II. He later embarked on a successful political career.

He died Sunday at age 98.

Bob Dole, Republican senator and presidential candidate

Bob Dole, the politician who represented Kansas as a Republican in the U.S. Senate from 1969 to 1996 and ran for president against Democrat Bill Clinton in 1996, died Dec. 5 at age 98, ten months after announcing he had been diagnosed with stage 4 lung cancer.

Dole was a Kansas native, born July 22, 1923, in the small town of Russell. He attended the University of Kansas, first as a pre-med student, though he later decided to study law. His college career was interrupted by World War II, during which Dole served in the U.S. Army.

His war years had a lasting impact on his life: He was gravely injured by machine-gun fire while fighting in Italy, hit in his back and right arm. His injuries nearly took his life

both on the battlefield and again after he was sent home to the U.S. for treatment, when he had to fight a severe infection. Though Dole recovered beyond doctors' expectations, his right arm and hand remained partially paralyzed. In his political career, Dole took to holding a pen in this hand to minimize its unusual appearance. The Army honored Dole with two Purple Hearts and a Bronze Star with a V for valor.

Upon returning from the war, Dole continued his studies, attending the University of Arizona and Washburn University, and received a law degree as well as admittance to the bar. While still in school, Dole ran for the Kansas House of Representatives in 1950 and won, serving a single term. After his term ended, he practiced law and served several terms as the county attorney for Russell County.

Dole entered national politics in 1960 when he successfully campaigned for a seat in the U.S.

House of Representatives. He served there until Jan. 3, 1969. In 1968, voters elected him to the U.S. Senate. During his five terms in the Senate from 1969 to 1996, he served on committees including the Republican National Committee, Agriculture Committee and Finance Committee, of which he was chairman. He was majority leader from 1985 to 1987, minority leader from 1987 to 1995, and majority leader again from 1995 to 1996.

While serving in the Senate, Dole ran for vice president in 1976 with presidential candidate Gerald Ford, losing in a narrow margin to Jimmy Carter and Walter Mondale. He sought the Republican presidential nomination in 1980 and again in 1988, but was defeated by Ronald Reagan and George H.W. Bush, respectively.

In 1996, Dole announced that he would not run for re-election to the Senate, choosing instead to focus on a third bid for the presidency. He won the Republican Party's nomination, defeating other contenders including Pat Buchanan and Arlen Specter. Choosing Jack Kemp as his running mate, Dole challenged Democrat Bill Clinton and independent Ross Perot, losing to Clinton in a landslide. The loss made Dole the only person to have won a major U.S. party's nominations for both vice president and president without being elected to either office.

Dole retired from politics after losing the 1996 election, and in the years after his retirement, he became a writer, public speaker and consultant. He wrote several books, including two memoirs and a reflection on presidential humor, "Great Presidential Wit (... I Wish I Was in the Book): A Collection of Humorous Anecdotes and Quotations," in which he ranked the U.S. presidents in order of their funniness - Abraham Lincoln won.

He famously shilled for products including Viagra, and he made TV appearances on "Larry

King Live," on which he was an occasional commentator, as well as "The Daily Show With Jon Stewart" and "Saturday Night Live."

Eddie Mekka, supporting actor of 'Laverne & Shirley'

Eddie Mekka, an actor who played Carmine "The Big Ragoo" Ragusa on "Laverne & Shirley," died Nov. 27 at age 69.

"Laverne & Shirley" was Mekka's first major on-screen role. "The Big Ragoo" was Shirley's off-and-on boyfriend, a dancer and singer as well as former Golden Gloves boxing champion.

Mekka's character crossed over to "Happy Days" on multiple episodes, and he also appeared as a different character on the short-lived "Happy Days" spin-off "Blansky's Beauties."

Mekka had many other TV credits, including "Moonlighting," "Guiding Light," "It's Always Sunny in Philadelphia," and "The Young and the Restless."

On the big screen, he made a brief but memorable appearance in "A League of Their Own," jittersbugging with Madonna's character in a bar. Mekka also had a small role in "Dreamgirls."

Prior to his TV fame, Mekka was Tony-nominated for Best Actor for his Broadway performance in "The Lieutenant." He had other stage roles in "Hairspray" in Las Vegas and in a national tour of "Grease."

Yvonne Wilder, actress in original 'West Side Story'

Yvonne Wilder, an actor known for playing Consuelo in the classic film "West Side Story," died Nov. 24 at the age of 84.

Wilder played Consuelo in the classic 1961 movie adaptation of "West Side Story" which starred Natalie Wood and Rita Moreno. She also played the role in the first international touring production of the musical. She co-starred in the 1980 movie "Seems Like Old Times" with Goldie Hawn and Charles Grodin.

Wilder had many TV credits including "Operation Petticoat," "Room 222," and "Full House." She was also a noted painter and sculptor.

Claude Humphrey, hall of fame football player

Claude Humphrey, a Pro Football Hall of Fame defensive

end who played with the Atlanta Falcons and Philadelphia Eagles, died Dec. 3 at age 77.

Humphrey was one of the NFL's elite pass rushers during his career as a defensive end for the Atlanta Falcons and Philadelphia Eagles. He was the third overall draft pick in 1968 by the Falcons after a standout college career at Tennessee State.

He was a six-time Pro Bowl selection while with the Falcons and finished his playing days with the Philadelphia Eagles. Quarterback sacks were not an official statistic when he played but he has been retroactively credited with 130 sacks.

Humphrey was elected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2014.

Darlene Hard, hall of fame tennis player

Darlene Hard, a Hall of Fame tennis player who won 3 major singles championships and 13 major doubles championships, died Dec. 2 at age 85.

Hard was taught a powerful serve and volley game on the hard courts of Los Angeles by her mother. She won the U.S. championship and the French championship in 1960 and defended her U.S. championship with a victory in 1961. She played in two Wimbledon finals, losing to Althea Gibson in 1957.

Her game was well suited for doubles and she won 13 major doubles titles. Hard was ranked in the top ten in the world from 1957 through 1963 and was the top ranked woman in the U.S. from 1960 through 1963.

Her last Grand Slam title came when she won the U.S. Open doubles title with Francoise Durr in 1969, coming out of retirement after becoming a teaching pro.

Stonewall Jackson, country music singer in '50s and '60s

Stonewall Jackson, a country music singer who was a longtime member of the Grand Ole Opry, died Dec. 4 at age 89.

Jackson was a longtime member of the Grand Ole Opry who was a country music star during the honky tonk era of the 1950s and 1960s.

After serving in the Navy, he went to Nashville in 1956 and his career quickly took off. He had number one country music hit songs in 1959 with "Waterloo" and again in 1964 with "B.J. the D.J." He continued to have songs on the country charts until the 1970s.

Jackson was a longtime performer at the Grand Ole Opry and he was the last living solo artist to have been inducted in

the 1950s.

Jonshel Alexander, up and coming actress

Jonshel Alexander, an actress who starred as Joy Strong in the movie "Beasts of the Southern Wild," died Nov. 27 at age 22 in a shooting in New Orleans, according to the New Orleans police.

Alexander played the role of Joy Strong when she was 12 years old in the critically acclaimed 2012 movie "Beasts of the Southern Wild."

The film, which was directed by Benh Zeitlin, told the story of a poor community in the Louisiana Bayou threatened by a storm through the eyes of a child called Hushpuppy, who was played by Quvenzhané Wallis. Alexander played her friend Joy.

According to the New Orleans Advocate, Alexander was involved in dance and acting classes as a child. After graduating high school, she worked in restaurants and took care of her daughter.

Frank Williams, race car driver

Frank Williams, an English Formula One racing driver who founded Williams Racing, died Nov. 28 at age 79.

Williams fell in love with driving as a young man, and he began racing as soon as he could, driving in Formula Three races. However, after a number of crashes in his early driving career, Williams shifted his focus to managing a team.

He founded Williams Racing in 1967, and by 1969, his drivers were racing in Formula One. Williams Racing became one of the top Formula One teams, one of only a handful of teams with more than 100 victories.

In 1986, Williams was in a severe accident in a rental car he was driving; he wasn't initially expected to live. He was paralyzed from the neck down and had to use a wheelchair for the rest of his life, but he continued as principal of Williams Racing until its sale in 2020.

Williams was knighted in 1999.

Greg Tate, musician and newspaper cultural critic

Greg Tate, a longtime cultural critic for The Village Voice as well as the founder of the band Burnt Sugar, died Dec. 7 at age 64.

Tate began writing for The Village Voice in 1981, covering Black culture including music, politics, literature, and more. He became a staff writer for the paper in 1987 and remained there until 2005.

He was one of the first critics to cover hip-hop in the genre's early days. Tate also wrote for publications including Rolling Stone, Vibe, and the BBC.

He wrote books including "Flyboy in the Buttermilk: Essays on Contemporary America" and "Midnight Lightning: Jimi Hendrix and the Black Experience."

Also a musician, Tate founded the improvisational band Burnt Sugar, for which he played guitar. He also co-founded the Black Rock Coalition, a collective of Black musicians who play rock music.

He was truly a man of the people. He touched many lives and provided an immense amount of happiness to every single person he came across.

Ramiro Gallegos passed away on November 20, 2021, in his home in Norwalk, California. Although resilient, he was unable to withstand the fight with cancer. Despite the difficult battle, he never gave up hope and never stopped fighting until the very end. His family is eternally grateful for the amount of time, and memories that they were able to share with him. He left this world with a positive presence and he will dearly be missed.
