Mother & young daughter killed in violent collision

■ Shannon Alvarez and her 13-year-old daughter, Ashley, both died in the violent collision. A Las Vegas woman was arrested and charged with manslaughter but has since been released.

NORWALK – Ashley Alvarez, 13, died on impact when Brittany Lopez's vehicle burst into the intersection of Foster and Studebaker Road, colliding with the passenger side of her mother's Camaro.

Her mother, Shannon Alvarez, later died on Sunday after suffering from traumatic internal injuries.

The two were returning from a weekend getaway. Shannon Alvarez's boyfriend, Juan Zuniga, said the two often took trips to local hotels to get some time out of the house.

Enrique Zuniga, the brother of Juan Zuniga, lives near the crash site and heard the impact of the vehicles.

"I heard a car speeding, which is common on Studebaker Road. One second later, I heard an explosion, and I jumped out of bed," said Zuniga. "When I walked out, I could see the accident, and I walked over to see if I could help."

He did not realize who was driving the Camaro until the airbag was lifted and he saw Shannon Alvarez's face.

Zuniga said that Alvarez was screaming but he could not understand what she was saying. He called to her, asking about her daughter.

Two nurses attending Grace Brethren Church ran out to help, too. They tended to Ashley but she was unresponsive.

"Immediately, I feared the worst. I called for my wife to call my brother," said Enrique Zuniga. "The firemen pulled up and they pulled out Shannon. They laid her down, and she was complaining about her back."

Despite the first responder's efforts to revive Ashley, the young teen remained unresponsive.

Juan Zuniga was preparing to go out later Sunday with Shannon and Ashley. As he was getting ready, he received a call from his sister-in-law.

"I got the call from my sister-in-law telling me Shannon was in a car accident, but I didn't know how serious it was," he said. "As I was getting dressed to go, she called back and told me that Ashley was unresponsive and

Shannon was really hurt."

When he arrived, the young girl was already taken to St. Francis trauma center, and her mother soon followed.

"I don't really remember much after I got there. Everything was happening so fast. There was so much to process," said Juan Zuniga.

His sister-in-law took him to see Alvarez's mother, Linda Seagroves, to tell her about the accident.

As people worked to help the mother and daughter, the 26-year-old Lopez was focused on the damages to her vehicle.

Margaret Mitchell came out of the church when the accident happened and saw the wreckage. She saw that Lopez was trying to gather her belongings to flee the scene.

"She was standing at the driver's side door when I came out. I told her to move off to the side, and she said, 'I need to get out of here,'" said Mitchell. "She walked around the car to open the passenger door to get her stuff, but the door was stuck."

Mitchell said she saw the young woman rummage through her belongings and make a phone call to someone. Afterward, Lopez started to take her belongings from the car.

"By the time the police got there, she was already walking away," said Mitchell. "But I pointed her out to the police."

When the police caught her, Lopez allegedly tried to deny her involvement in the fatal crash and said she was not the person driving. However, security camera footage shows the entire crash and that Lopez was the only person in the vehicle.

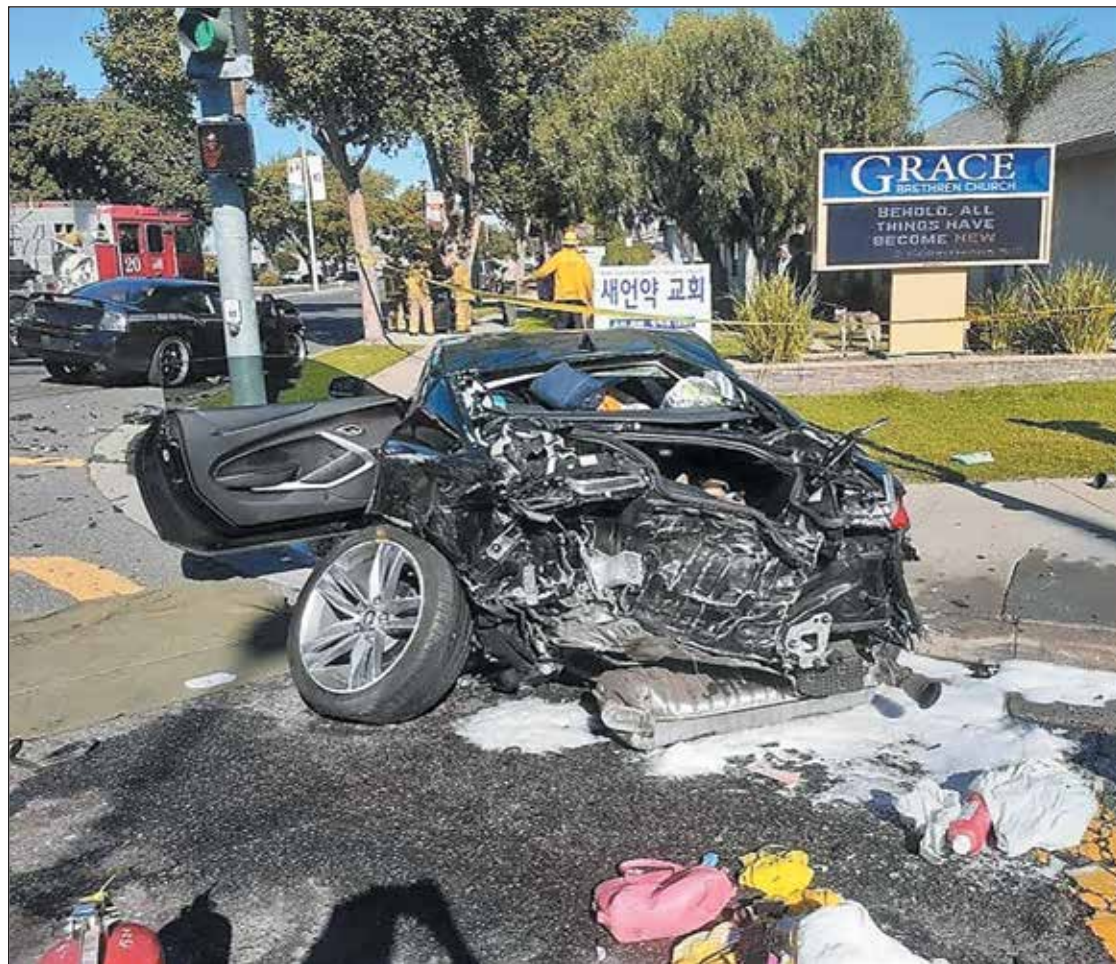
The Las Vegas resident was arrested for vehicular manslaughter and driving without a license. Authorities believe drugs and alcohol played a role in the collision but are still waiting for a toxicology report.

At St. Francis hospital, the Zunigas and Seagrove were informed that Ashley was already dead. Doctors informed them that the force from Lopez's car was so great that her heart stopped on impact.

"She was my little girl. She was like my daughter," said Juan Zuniga. "We spent some time grieving and crying over her body."

Juan Zuniga said he pleaded with the doctor but there was nothing else they could do for the young girl.

"I was so shaken up. I don't remember much other than when

they told me my granddaughter was dead," said Seagrove. "I wanted to see her, and they let me go in and spend time with her."

Zuniga and Seagroves wanted to see Shannon Alvarez, but when they went upstairs, the nurse informed the family that the 50-year-old had died from her internal injuries after surgery.

"They said she was given multiple pints of blood. When we went to see her, there was blood on the bed, on the floor, everywhere," said the mother.

Shannon Alvarez adopted Ashley after a surgery prevented her from having children, said Seagroves. The mother and daughter became inseparable.

Juan Zuniga recalls that Ashley attended Ross Middle School, and was in eighth grade. She was a musician and artistically gifted.

Seagroves and the Zuniga brothers were furious that Lopez was released Tuesday evening before they received the toxicology report.

Enrique Zuniga plans to pursue legal action against Lopez.

The families are also angry at the Norwalk City Council for ignoring calls to make the

intersection safer. Community members previously started petitions to add speed bumps to the accident prone street, but said they received no response from the city government.

Seagroves and the Zunigas plan to address the council on Jan.18, during the public comments portion of the meeting.

They also plan to hold a candlelight vigil for the mother and daughter on Jan. 9, outside Grace Brethren Church.

A GoFundMe page is also set up for Shannon and Ashley Alvarez.

Downey mayor announces candidacy for State Assembly

DOWNEY – Downey Mayor Blanca Pacheco on Wednesday formally entered the race to represent the newly-drawn 64th State Assembly District.

As mayor, Pacheco already represents the largest city in the new 64th, with Downey

encompassing 24% of the district.

She has been endorsed by L.A. County Supervisor Janice Hahn and La Habra Mayor Jose Medrano.

The newly-drawn district encompasses Downey, Bell, Bell Gardens, Norwalk, Santa Fe Springs, La Mirada, La Habra and portions of unincorporated Whittier.

The new 64th district

replaces the current 58th district, which is represented by Assemblywoman Cristina Garcia, who is vacating the seat in an effort to replace retiring Rep. Lucille Roybal-Allard in Congress.

"California is at a significant crossroads," said Pacheco. "After two years of this pandemic, it's clear that we need leaders in the state legislature who have a deep understanding of the many challenges that people across the newly drawn 64th district grapple with on a daily basis. While our state has navigated this reality better than others, the fact remains that we can and we must do more."

"I'm running for the State Assembly to be a voice, an advocate on behalf of, and a fighter for, the people of the 64th Assembly District. In Sacramento, I'll stand up for working people, create more good paying middle class jobs, invest more in public schools

to ensure our students receive a world class education, expand affordable housing, urgently address the climate crisis and ensure affordable and accessible healthcare for every Californian.

"I am hopeful and optimistic about California's future, and I know that together, we can build a stronger, fairer and more just state for all people across the 64th Assembly District."

"We need Mayor Blanca Pacheco in the State Assembly," said Supervisor Hahn. "When it comes to fighting for the people she represents, Blanca brings heart, courage, and most importantly, unyielding, undeterred determination. I know Blanca will be an effective leader on behalf of the new 64th State Assembly District. I am proud to endorse Blanca Pacheco for State Assembly."

Pacheco also has early

support from La Habra mayor Jose Medrano.

"I am thrilled to endorse Blanca because I know she will be a fighter for every community, every neighborhood and all people across this new district," he said. "Blanca is highly-qualified, well-prepared and profoundly equipped to be a champion for the people of AD-64."

Pacheco, an attorney by trade, was elected to the Downey City Council in 2016, becoming the first Latina to serve on the council. In 2019, she became the first Latina to serve as Downey mayor.

She is a graduate of Downey High School. Pacheco graduated from UCLA in 1996, with a bachelor's in Political Science and a specialization in Chicano/a Studies. She went on to graduate from Loyola Law School and passed the California State Bar Exam in 2003.

Downey councilwoman faces recall

■ More than 4,000 people signed a petition to recall Downey Councilwoman Catherine Alvarez.

Her criminal convictions for welfare fraud and shoplifting were made public after she was elected.

DOWNEY - The recall effort against Councilwoman Catherine Alvarez pushed forward in its attempt to oust Downey's District 3 representative, turning in its signatures ahead of schedule earlier this week, setting the stage for a recall election.

Campaign volunteers handed 4,016 signatures over to the city clerk on Tuesday, surpassing the 3,454 it needed before its Jan. 5 deadline.

The signatures were tallied by city clerk Alicia Duarte upon submission. They will also need to be verified by the LA County Registrar-Recorder's office within 30 days.

Should the number of signatures be deemed sufficient, then the matter will come back

to the City Council, which then has 14 days to call for a special election. Should they fail to do so, the county would have five days to schedule the election.

The election would need to take place between 88 and 125 days after that order is called.

According to the city charter, the initial vote would only be to recall Alvarez or not; there would be no candidates attached to the ballot.

After the initial recall vote, if Alvarez is removed, then prospective candidates could file to run to serve the over two years remaining of her term.

Morale was high with recallers.

"We are energized; we feel we are doing the community a big service with everybody that thanks us for doing what we were doing," said Dorothy Pemberton. "It's going to be a monumental time in our history, but we're doing it for the best possible reasons: Good decision makers in crucial seats to make good judgements for Downey."

According to former mayor Mario Guerra, this is the first time in Downey's history that a council person faces a recall.

"We've never had such an

unethical council person on there with this kind of history," said Guerra. "What happened is the voters, once they found out, these amazing people that are passionate about our community went out there and got the signatures to put this on the ballot."

"That shows you love of community. They're not getting paid; this is a volunteer situation. I've never seen a more dedicated group of passionate people, only for the love of their city."

Since serving Alvarez recall papers last July, the recall committee has maintained that its motivation for seeking Alvarez's removal stems from her not disclosing her criminal history to voters while running for office.

Alvarez has been arrested numerous times, including convictions for welfare fraud and shoplifting, none of which was publicly revealed before the November 2020 election.

The recall committee released a statement to the Downey Patriot, saying in part:

"Councilwoman Catherine Alvarez didn't disclose her criminal record before running for office and the recall election will give voters the opportunity

to vote to remove her, now being fully informed of her past.

"She hid her criminal record from the public because she knew Downey residents would never have voted for her knowing she was convicted, and pled guilty, of welfare fraud; has a lifetime ban from Michael's at Downey Landing for shoplifting; and had two warrants for her arrest. Her evictions and bankruptcies do not factor into the recall although it does show a moral indifference."

"Our mission was simple: inform Downey voters of Councilwoman Catherine Alvarez's criminal record and give them a chance to remove her now that they know the facts and her true character is exposed. An election to do just that will now happen."

In a statement, Alvarez called attempts to recall her an attack.

"This recall effort is an attack on the voters that democratically elected me to represent them in November 2020. That the political machine that I defeated is unwilling to respect the voters' wishes and is now spending thousands of dollars to undo their decision. These dirty tactics are going to cost Downey taxpayers several thousands of dollars."

Motown legends performing in Cerritos

CERRITOS - "Motown Legends," a live show featuring Thelma Houston, The Miracles Review and The Contours, will be presented at the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts (CCPA) on Sunday, Jan. 30, at 3 pm. Tickets start at \$45.

Hailed by the Los Angeles Times for her "high-powered ... interactive energy," Grammy winner Thelma Houston started her musical career with roots in gospel. But her soaring, versatile vocals quickly dominated the world of pop and R&B.

Houston's rendition of the disco single "Don't Leave Me This Way" earned her the distinction of being the first Motown solo

female artist to win the Grammy Award for Best R&B Female Vocal Performance.

The songbird held firm to her dominance on music charts with more hits: "If It's the Last Thing I Do," "You Used to Hold Me So Tight," and "Lean on Me." Her latest release is "Turn Your World Around."

A Dance Music Hall of Fame inductee, she has appeared on ABC's Motown 45 and The Disco Ball and PBS' Love, Rhythm and Blues. Houston has also performed on Fox's American Idol and NBC's America's Got Talent.

Rock and Roll Hall of Famer The Miracles, known as Motown's

"soul supergroup," dazzled the world with 26 Top 40 hits, including the No. 1 hits "Tears of a Clown" and "Love Machine."

Top 10 songs include "Shop Around," "I Second that Emotion," and "You've Really Got a Hold on Me."

The Miracles Review features lead singer Mark Scott, who won the Motown Alumni Lifetime Achievement Award and was honored by the City of Detroit for his contributions to the music industry.

In 1962, the tune "Do You Love Me (Now That I Can Dance)" roared to the No. 2 spot on the Billboard music charts, launching The Contours into what was

then Motown mania. The single earned gold status and remained on the charts for five months. It still holds the record as Motown's fastest rising song of all time.

The band's other hits include "Can You Jerk Like Me" and "Just a Little Misunderstanding."

The Contours' dance style - which encompassed synchronized splits, flips, and an occasional somersault - thrilled audiences nationwide and soon became the group's trademark.

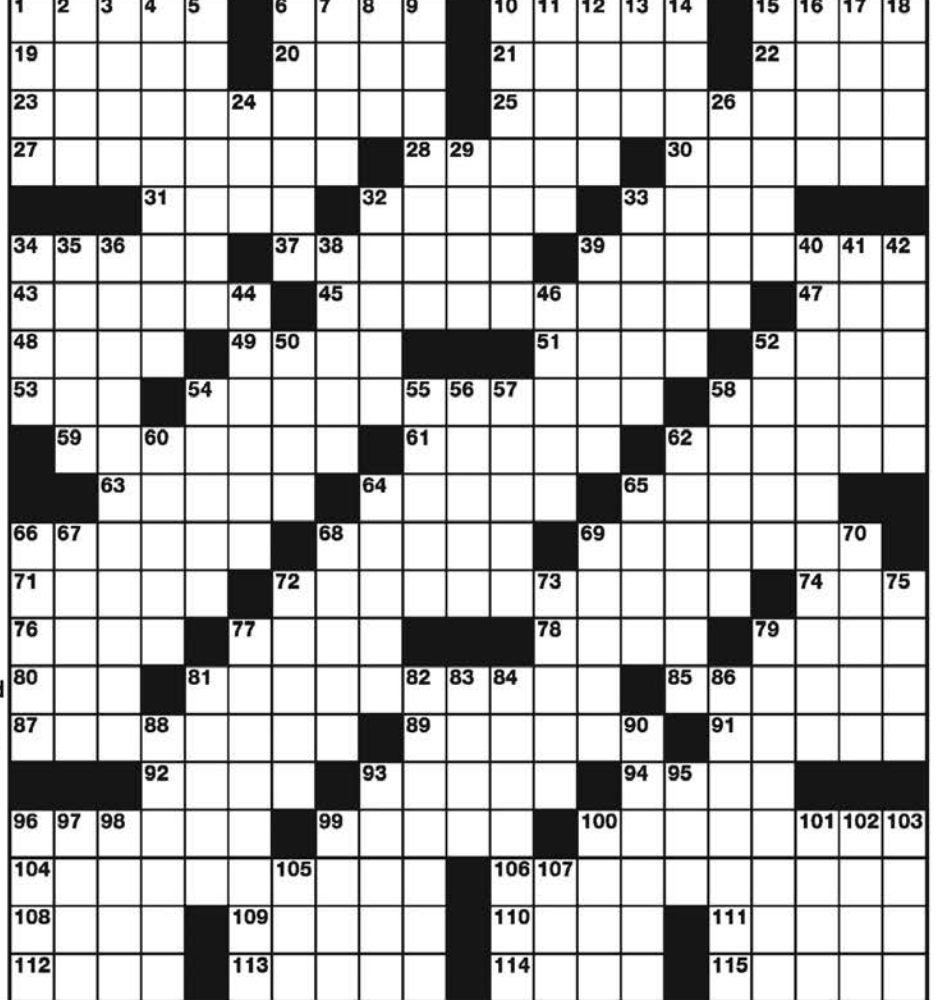

Description: The City of Norwalk (City) is preparing a Bicycle Master Plan (BMP), which establishes the City's vision and comprehensive approach to improving biking in Norwalk. The BMP is a program level planning document that lays out the steps for the City to promote and enhance biking in the City. The BMP identifies facility needs, recommended improvement projects, programs, and policies intended to encourage biking throughout Norwalk.

Environmental Review Information: Pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and the CEQA Guidelines of the City of Norwalk, a Mitigated Negative Declaration has been prepared for the proposed project. The public comment period for the Mitigated Negative Declaration will begin on January 7, 2022 and end on February 7, 2022 at 5:00 p.m. Pursuant to the State of California Public Resources Code and the CEQA Guidelines of the City of Norwalk, this notice is to advise you that the City intends to adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration for the project described above. A public hearing date will be scheduled on February 15, 2022.

Norwalk shuts out La Mirada, 2-0, in Suburban League soccer opener

■ Both teams off to a great start and are ranked in the top 10 in CIF Division 2.

NORWALK - Coming into Tuesday's Suburban League opener at John Glenn High School, both the Norwalk and La Mirada boys soccer teams looked even on paper.

Both teams had identical 6-1-2 records, they are both ranked in the top 10 in the latest (Jan. 3) CIF-Southern Section Division 2 poll and have nearly scored the same number of goals.

La Mirada, which is the defending league champ, had scored 24 goals and had given up only six, while Norwalk had scored 20 and allowed 13.

As for the score, Norwalk's defense shined and the Lancers shutout host La Mirada, 2-0, to open league play.

With the win, No. 2-ranked Norwalk raised its record to 7-1-2, 1-0 while No. 6-ranked La Mirada is 6-2-2, 0-1.

"(La Mirada) has a great team," Norwalk coach Vinson Pluma said. "They're in D2, we're in D2, they're ranked, we're ranked and we might see them in the playoffs, you never know. For a league, it makes us look good."

Next up for Norwalk is a game at home against Mayfair, Thursday, Jan. 6 (results not available at press time) and the Matadores take on Bellflower Tuesday (Jan. 11).

"That's the first time we've been shut out all season," La Mirada coach Philip Yovino said. "You can't say we didn't create chances. Sometimes it doesn't go that way. I was telling the boys, 'You can't tempt the soccer Gods. When you don't put the chances away, the game usually comes back to haunt you sometimes.'"

Norwalk, which has a good mix of seniors and underclassmen, took a 1-0 lead near the halfway

mark of the first half.

The ball was deflected by La Mirada junior goalie Ryan Moreno-Rojas and was then kicked in by Lancers junior midfielder Diego Martinez in the 19th minute.

Despite the loss, Yovino praised his senior defender, Jackson Peck. "I thought he was solid in the back," he said. "He's been sick for the last week and gave a good performance in the back. He's one of our center backs."

Even though the Matadores didn't score, three of his midfielders were active - seniors Diego Ramirez and Ivan Palomares along with junior Jaylinn Mitchell.

"Diego and Ivan are kind of the service guys in the middle and Jaylinn is kind of the point of our attack a lot of the times for us," he added. "We didn't have a good first half and (it) put us in a place where we looked rusty and it looked like we hadn't played in almost two weeks."

The Lancers' second goal for the 2-0 lead was their first shot on goal in the second half, coming in the 65th minute by junior forward Saul Hernandez, on an assist from junior midfielder Martinez.

On the score, Pluma talked about how the goal was set up.

"We have a lot of good, quality players on our team and I really liked that interchange with Diego," Pluma said. "He was dribbling and he pulled the guys (La Mirada players) and then he fed (Hernandez). He already knew where he wanted to go and received it on his left, and then take the keeper and put it in on the far post."

"He knew what he was doing. He's a good quality player."

Pluma also praised Martinez for his play.

"Diego can almost play on any academy team," Pluma said. "We're fortunate to have him. He should actually be on an academy team but likes to stay. I'm glad."

Norwalk was unbeaten to begin the season in the first

seven games, winning five of those games. In all five games the Lancers scored three goals in each one.

"We started off on fire (seven games)," said Pluma, of the hot start. "Then we started petering out with the seniors going through college Apps and finals and everything and some players going out of town before the (Christmas) break. We were playing with a different team and the feel wasn't there."

Pluma was probably referring to their only loss of the season so far, a 2-0 setback to Anaheim on December 15.

The Lancers rebounded with a 2-0 non-league win over Schurr two days later.

"Coming back after two weeks, I was nervous and I wasn't sure what we were going to get," Pluma added. "The same with (La Mirada), they haven't been playing for two weeks either."

"So now, we're both (Norwalk and La Mirada) going to have to win all of our games and they're going to have to win every single game and then they are going to have to challenge us at the end at our place. I'm hoping that's what it's going to have to come down to and then we can take care of business at home."

La Mirada actually outshot the Lancers in the second half, 10-2, and Yovino pointed out their missed opportunities.

"I felt good and we created six good chances in the second half," he said. "We hit the post twice, we created set pieces, we got behind them."

"We did a lot of good things. The first half we just put ourselves in a hole and we came out sluggish and looked more rusty than we should have."

Even with the two goals in the game, Yovino had nothing but great things to say about his captain between the pipes, Moreno-Rojas.

"The goals were unfortunate, but Ryan has been stellar for us all season," Yovino said. "He would say that would not be a thing that he would be happy or proud of. He's a competitor and has been solid throughout."

All six of the Matadores wins are shutouts.

Both teams still have to play the remaining three teams, Mayfair, Firebaugh and Bellflower, before meeting again to start the second half of league play. That big re-match takes place at Norwalk in less than two weeks, January 20.

Norwalk last won league in 2018 and both have been going back and forth in the top two spots in league, other than 2019 when the Matadores finished in fourth place.

The teams split games the last two seasons. Last year, Norwalk won the first game, 2-0, and La Mirada won the second-half matchup, 6-0.

In addition, both teams have been moved up to D2 recently.

Norwalk moved up two divisions from D4 to D2 last season and La Mirada competed in D3 last season.

The Matadores advanced to the quarterfinals last season, losing to eventual CIF runner-up, Norte Vista.

Norwalk also made it to the quarterfinals this past season, losing to eventual CIF Champion, Aliso Niguel.
