

## Norwalk City Council denies SuperStar Carwash

■ After strong public opposition to the proposed SuperStar Carwash, city council voted to uphold the planning commission's denial of the business.

**NORWALK** – City Council denied an appeal for Red Mountain Group [RMG] SuperStar Carwash at Studebaker Road and Rosecrans Avenue during Tuesday's meeting.

RMG's request to build the carwash had already previously been denied by the planning commission.

Had RMG earned the commission's approval, the Norwalk True Value Hardware store, TNT Mexican Restaurant and Vic's Barber Shop would have been demolished and replaced with the automated facility.

RMG director of development John Clay tried to dismiss the public's concerns to the council and cited initial approval from staff.

"One of the issues from the public was the false perception that there are too many car washes and actually there's only three car washes in the area," Clay said. "The staff report on this table

recommended approval process, citing consistency with the general plan land use compliance with the performance standards required under the Norwalk Municipal Code and consistency."

Kyle McDonald counseled the property owner and spoke on their behalf. McDonald criticized the planning commission because he believed they listened to public opinion over the facts of their proposal.

"We addressed all of the factual concerns and what we were left with was really basically our opinions," McDonald said. "And the decision that was handed down on the commission was based on opinions that are nonsense."

Community residents spoke out in strong opposition to the car wash.

Ken Vice expressed the concern that the car wash will reduce businesses in the area and addressed RMG's lack of concern for public opinion.

"In terms of whether they've done their due diligence in listening to the community if we need this business, they haven't succeeded in doing this," Vice said.

Sylvester Ani also opposed the car wash, stating that the business

would not be used given the large public opposition.

"The Commission is doing this business favor by denying the project because if the community isn't in support of that project, now, that's not going to change after it gets built," Ani said. "And that's not going to be a good evening. So, I think that it benefits all parties as

well, to not try and force a square peg into a round hole."

After hearing public testimony, the council voted unanimously to uphold the planning commission's denial.

"We take this role of care very seriously. We're accountable and beholden to the residents of the city

of Norwalk," Mayor Rick Ramirez said. "We see developers coming in with what they want, but it's not what Norwalk wants, it's not what Norwalk needs."

Clay and the members of the RMG left abruptly as the community residents applauded the decision.

## Local religious leaders speak out against abortion

■ Following the overturning of Roe v. Wade, Christian and Catholic leaders are speaking out

**NORWALK** - Christian and Catholic leaders in Norwalk and Downey are expressing pro-life views and belief that abortion is murder following the U.S. Supreme Court's decision to overturn Roe v. Wade.

The case ruled that the constitution protected women's right to choose to have an abortion.

Pastor Raymond Decipeda from Saint John of God church in Norwalk said the Catholic faith believes life starts in the womb.

"Life begins at conception," pastor Decipeda said. "If a person was already sick and in the hospital just because his hands swivel and he could not feed himself, does that mean I kill him? Life is precious from the moment of conception until natural death."

Pastor Art Reyes from Calvary Chapel in Downey said alternatives should be considered instead of terminating a pregnancy.

"I think our government should fund adoptions not abortions," Reyes said. "There's always an option for life."

After the case was overturned 15 states immediately banned abortion, including Ohio, where a 10-year-old girl was raped and needed to cross state lines to have an abortion.

Under the Christian faith, pastor Chris Reyes, brother of Art Reyes, said the young girl should have

carried the baby to term.

"We think that rape and incest and those circumstances are extremely unfortunate, we condemn it," Chris Reyes said. "In other words, rape doesn't constitute for what we believe is the murder of a baby."

Pastor Decipeda was presented with a similar scenario of a 12-year-old girl. He also agreed that she should carry the baby to term, and her age would not be an exception for abortion.

"There are other ways if you don't want to raise a child. You don't have to kill the child," Decipeda said.

However, Decipeda did acknowledge that abortion would be an exception if the life of the mother and the child were at risk.

"You need to have an abortion because it threatens the life of the child or the life of the mother. Does that mean it's murder? No," Decipeda said. "Because that's the principle of double effect. You're doing it not to kill the child. You're doing it to save the mother."

Pastor Chris Reyes holds the women and doctors accountable for the abortion, and considers them to be committing murder.

"In the eyes of the church, the act of committee and abortion or allowing one or going from one is a murdering of a baby taking their life," Chris Reyes said.

Members of the Calvary Chapel have expressed their beliefs against abortion by advocating outside the FPA Clinic in Downey every Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday between 8:30 am - 11 am.

■ Saints football helps prepare players for higher level of play.

**NORWALK** – Next month, the Norwalk/Santa Fe Springs (NSFS) Saints youth football program will celebrate its 60 years as an organization, which has been a big part of those two communities.

For the first time in three years, there will be an opening ceremony, as teams from all levels will gather at Little Lake Park in Santa Fe Springs on Saturday Aug. 20, at 10 am for an afternoon of scrimmage games to open the 2022 season.

After the final conditioning, which was held in June, the first official practices will take place on Monday July 25.

However, for five young athletes, the program has been a springboard to a higher level of competition, which could go even higher in the future.

In fact, all five are at the next level playing for the same team – Bishop Amat High School in La Puente.

Those five players – seniors Carlos Alvarez, Jr., Dominic Rubio and Mason Viramontes and juniors Matthew Salazar and Richard Munoz – have or will be starters for the Lancers and hope to have a breakout season.

In fact, two (Alvarez and Munoz) of the five were named to the All-Mission League for Bishop Amat and all five were named to youth all-conference teams throughout their years.

Three of the players (Alvarez, Viramontes and Rubio) have had a bond since 2014 until now and the other two (Munoz and Salazar) joined forces with the Saints in 2016 season, which was a championship year for the Saints.

The coaches for those years were head coach Jose Alvarez, David Jaimez (Offensive Coordinator), Mike Weltz (Defensive Coordinator), George Martinez (Offensive Line Coach) and others.

Coach Alvarez remembers those early days, playing at Santa Fe and St. Paul, when he first started with the Saints program.

"It started in 2011 with myself and a few random dads signing up our 6-year-old kids at a NSFS stand at a Holifield Park baseball closing ceremony," said Alvarez, who

eventually teamed up with Jaimez. "They apparently had too many kids signed up and were looking for coaches to coach up a few kids on the waiting list. We all looked at each other knowing we all played for NSFS as kids and decided what the heck, let's do it."

And it all started from there.

After the two coaches joined forces, they eventually finished 7-1 and made it to the Super Bowl, but lost to powerhouse Lynwood Knights.

This would all lead to a building of a better team after a summer of winning multiple championships on the 7-on-7 11U team.

Enter Munoz to the team. He started out as a linebacker and his arm helped him play the quarterback position. He was nicknamed "the Mexican LeBron James", because of his freakish athletic things on both sides of the ball.

"The boys all instantly had a vibe and created a brotherhood, which is where I believe most of our success came from," added Alvarez.

That success ended with a 2016 championship, as the 11U Saints began to receive plenty of recognition in Southern California as coaches across the Snoop League, Pacific Coast Conference (PCC), Orange County Junior All American (OCJAAF), AAU, Pop Warner and others ranked them in the top 10.

They completed the regular season undefeated and capped

2021 season with Bishop Amat playing Damien.

"All we heard on the speaker from the announcer on 90% of the plays were these names and it was one of my proudest moments as a coach," Alvarez said. The names were: Rubio, Munoz, Devon Jones, Salazar, Carlos Alvarez, Jr. and Viramontes.

"Just a little insight in the journey of the 'little Cinderella team from the NSFS Saints,'" concluded Alvarez.

Assistant coach Jaimez said of that championship team: "First off, our Norwalk Saints team was a blessing to have," he said. "We had a lot of coachable players. It was a coach's dream come true. We preached discipline and hard work and were family on and off the field.

"We did a lot of activities off the field to make sure our boys were tight nit. That IIU season went 11-0 and I want to say we had eight shutouts and we averaged over 40 points a game. We went out to Florida for a National tournament and the boys were able to play teams from Ohio and Florida. It was definitely a great experience for them. It was the first time playing on a national level. But that's what we always did for our guys. We made sure we played against the best, win or lose."

**What they said:**

Babetta Gomez, President, Norwalk/Santa Fe Springs Saints: "This year marks 60 years for the Norwalk/Santa Fe Springs Saints Program. We serve the communities of Norwalk, Santa Fe Springs and surrounding cities.

"We have seen thousands of athletes go through our program, and continue on in high school and some have gone on to the college football level and continue to play the sport they are passionate about.

"It's amazing to see them

start at four to five years old, not knowing which way to run to becoming exceptional young men and women as scholar athletes. As president of the Saints, I'm proud to see these athletes gain a passion for the sport and continue their journey once they have aged out of our program. The NSFS Saints Board Members and Coaches wish these athletes all the best and definitely want them all to succeed at the next level. Hopefully they come back as adults to volunteer and keep our program going another 60 years."

Mason Viramontes - Sr. Offensive Lineman: "Playing with these guys gave me a sense of somewhere I belonged so I didn't fall into other things. It gave me somewhere to go after school. It carried over from (the Saints) to over here (Bishop Amat). They are probably my closest friends on the team. Our relationships kept building off of each other. We started in youth ball when I was about nine years old when I first started and to now when I'm 17."

Comments from coach Jaimez on Viramontes: "Mason started on both the O-Line and D-Line for us on our Saints team. He was our best pass blocker and he made some big plays for us on defense. Mason is also a very athletic big man playing tight end in 7-on-7. His recruitment is also starting to pick up."

Note: Viramontes' cousin, Kayla Viramontes, was named Female Athlete of the Year at Santa Fe High. (See Norwalk Patriot July 1, 2022).

He transferred from Santa Fe after his freshman year and is a 3-year varsity (freshman through junior), standing 6 ft. 4 inches tall. He is a life-long resident in Norwalk and also plays volleyball. Academics, along with athletics, is very important to the senior as he maintained a 4.06 cumulative GPA through his junior year.

"Looking into the future, I plan to apply to top tier colleges,

such as Stanford, Cal Berkeley, Yale, Brown, Pepperdine, and Princeton," Viramontes said. "As I look back on what allowed me to enter my high school years so strongly, I must emphasize that it had everything to do with the adults surrounding me.

"My favorite memory of my youth football years playing for the Saints is definitely seeing both the Spanish-speaking and English-speaking communities rally together to support our youth football trip to Florida. These amazing previous years and memories are definitely never going to be forgotten."

Dominic Rubio - Sr. Wide Receiver: "It was really cool and we (Saints players) had a fun time. We made some great bonds together. We went to each other's houses and went to Florida for the national championship. We also went to a Super Bowl and won it."

Comments from coach Jaimez on Rubio: "While at the Saints, Dominic was definitely one of our better athletes and playmakers. He made plays on defense with hard hits and interceptions. On offense, he could catch, run and even play QB if we asked him to.

"He's worked really hard in the off-season for this and his recruitment is starting to pick up. And he is also a great player on the basketball court."

Rubio has a 3.4 GPA. He started playing football at four years old with the Saints. He is an all-around athlete as he plays basketball for the Lancers. He also played baseball for seven years.

His college interests are USC, UCLA, Oregon, Utah Tech, Duke and a few others.

Carlos Alvarez, Jr. - Sr. Safety: "It was fun playing on the Saints. We were just kids and we were all having fun. It just became a brotherhood and everyone bonded with each other. We learned how to be with each other and outside of football we would hang out with

each other. It's still fun now that we're all older now but we still hang out like we were before. Everyone is still friends and the kids that were on the Saints together, we're still closer than we are with most of the other kids that came here."

Comments from coach Jaimez on Alvarez: "Carlos was always our lockdown cornerback and sure tackler on his side of the field. He made a huge touchdown-saving tackle for us in our championship game. Carlos also played some running back. He is a day one guy for me since he was six years old. He was also named to the All-Mission League this past year. Carlos is being recruited by Ivy League schools amongst others.

Alvarez has been on varsity all four years, including playing on the freshman team for Santa Fe. He was named Co-Freshman Defensive MVP at Santa Fe before transferring to Amat.

During his junior year, Alvarez was a 1st Team All-League with a 4.28 GPA.

Matthew Salazar - Jr. Defensive

Line: "It was fun with the Saints. We had fun at every practice and mess around. There's a saying, 'Iron sharpens Iron'. We'd just go to practice and work hard every day. We'd get each other ready for now in high school.

"We have a good bond now in high school and we always talk a lot about our memories. It just kept us closer and coming here (Amat) we had people we knew already. It's fun and when we take the field we talk about memories. We'll probably all be friends forever. We went from youth to high school and that bond is there."

Comments from coach Jaimez on Salazar: "Matt started both sides of the ball for us at the Saints on the O-line and D-line. He was one of our best run blockers and he is super athletic for a big kid. He's played tight end and linebacker in 7-on-7. Matt has worked really hard and the results of that was starting as a sophomore at defensive end last season for the Lancers. I expect him to have a lot of accolades this season."

Richard Munoz - Jr. Linebacker/Quarterback: "I feel like the Saints prepared us to play at this level of competition. The Saints played some good teams and now we're playing good (CIF) D1 teams. It prepared us a lot. I like playing with these guys a lot. They're my guys since day one. Now we're like best friends.

"One of the memories was going to Florida with them. It was a good time and one of my favorite trips I've ever been to. It's more of a brotherhood here and everybody is closer and that's a good thing."

Comments from coach Jaimez on Munoz: "Rich was our MVP (Saints). Football is the ultimate team sport, but by far Munoz was our best player. He led our team in tackles and interceptions playing linebacker. He was also our Quarterback. He was the leader of our team and his football knowledge was far beyond his years. He's definitely a player you want on your team."

# When it feels like 10%

The latest inflation figures for May were better than some expected, with a rate of only 6.3%.

Could have fooled me. It feels like 10%. And I'm not alone.

According to the latest Monmouth University poll, more than 4 in 10 Americans now say they're struggling to stay where they are economically, the highest number since they started asking the question five years ago, and an 18% increase just in the last year.

This is what inflation feels like.

Granted, it's particularly bad here in the land of \$7 gas (they even advertise those prices!), but anyone who buys groceries on a regular basis knows that a hundred-dollar bill no longer buys you more than a bag-full, and forget about change for a 20 when you take the kids for fast food; forget about the 20 being enough. There's the no change for a 20 situation, and the fact that everything that used to cost \$7 or \$8 now costs \$10, not to mention the advent of the \$15 sandwich. Forget about meat and even poultry. Everything costs more, and you're reminded of it every single time you take out your wallet.

The most troubling number on the poll, from a political point of view, is the right-track/wrong-track number. That's the measure that predicts whether the party in power is likely to stay there.

The number of Americans who think the country is on the wrong track, according to that same poll, is 88%.

That is a stunning number. If this were a presidential year, it would be grounds for a decision not to run. It is certainly not where House Speaker Nancy Pelosi wants the country to be heading into a fight for both the House and the Senate.

If there is any good news for Democrats in the poll, it is that the country is equally divided on who should run Congress, which may help some Democrats in close races but hardly paints a rosy picture for the president and his policies.

For all the criticism that has been aimed at the president and his team, the polls and the pundits are remarkably short on solutions. People do blame Washington — the same polls show that, by astronomical margins, they see national policy as hurting and not helping — but there's no consensus on solutions.

In the short run, at least, the one set of numbers the president can work on is the number of Americans who think he cares about people like them and is trying to help them. In a country where virtually all of us identify as middle-class, the fact that the polls show that most Americans don't think his policies help the middle class leaves open the question of who they do help. Not the poor, either, according to the poll.

And certainly not the rich, if you listen to the rhetoric. Whoever is being helped — there must be someone — apparently doesn't know it. The president has, at the very least, a very serious communications problem.

We are at a troubling point in our politics. The president's approval/disapproval numbers are bad: 36/57, meaning he isn't even carrying the Democratic base. But Congress' are lower still, with only 15% of Americans approving of the job Congress is doing. This is against a backdrop of hearings that have called into question the very foundation of our democracy as it existed on Jan. 6.

Who is there to trust?

President Joe Biden came into office as the decent and honorable alternative. He is still that. And that still matters. But it isn't enough, at least not when inflation is soaring and nearly half of us say we're struggling to stay even. It's always the economy.

# A pearl of hope for an unhappy birthday

Some birthdays are better or worse than others. America's 246th was a lot like 1863.

In a dark gloom, a civil war without cannons is now on, full blast.

On one side, we have a relentless truth-seeking missile, the Jan. 6 committee. I was in the stately room when Cassidy Hutchinson testified that former President Donald Trump lunged at a Secret Service agent because he wanted to direct his coup, literally, every step of the way to the Capitol.

The hearing was jaw-dropping, even for the press. Through Hutchinson's crystal calm words, it became clear beyond doubt the armed mob assembled to seize the election for Trump with force and blood. They came at his beck and call. Its sound and fury was astounding, about 30,000 strong.

I was in the Capitol when the House chamber was under siege. Even now, I can scarcely stand viewing the gruesome attack on democracy's citadel.

On the other side, the Supreme Court just declared war on the American people. Five men and one woman, to be exact, showed no restraint in lashes on common sense, law and custom in the public square.

It's not enough to take 50 years of human rights away from women and young girls. All six Republicans also lifted gun restrictions and environmental regulation of carbon emissions. Then they skipped town.

This comes as July 4 marks another mass shooting, in Highland Park, Illinois, as the parade was about to begin.

The Trump trifecta on the court is cold enough: Neil Gorsuch, Brett Kavanaugh and Amy Coney Barrett, who took the late Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg's place on the bench days before the election, no tears.

But it's the petulant senior Republicans, Samuel Alito and Clarence

Thomas, who bear the blame for this hard right turn against the will of the American people.

Chief Justice John Roberts, who puts on a show of being centrist, can be counted as a confederate in this war.

After all, he favored dark money as free speech and led striking down parts of the Voting Rights Act.

Now Roberts has sided against women and girls, gun safety and action on climate change, like the rest of the Republican supermajority. He can't coast anymore with his polished manners.

What's more, Roberts was named by George W. Bush, who lost the popular vote. He has no connection with "we the people." The same is true for Alito and the new Trump wing.

Being linked with unpopular presidents further undercuts their authority to sit in judgment on us. And it makes it harder to accept their harsh decisions.

If you don't believe me about the crisis of confidence in the Supreme Court, author Norman Ornstein, the leading expert on Washington politics, had this to say:

"Since the Civil War, we have not had anything as dangerous as what we face now. The Supreme Court has gone completely rogue and cannot be trusted to protect our constitutional framework.

"Too much of the public is simply unaware of the danger. And chillingly, many don't really care."

A pending case on state legislatures overseeing federal elections is also truly alarming, Ornstein says.

Let me tell you about my Fourth. I went down to the National Mall to be inspired by the Folklife Festival. Under the hot sun I spied the Smithsonian partnership this year: the United Arab Emirates.

A curious choice, given our democracy needs a helping hand.

Yet here's a pearl of hope that never fails on the Fourth. Gen. Robert E. Lee, daring and reckless, led his Confederate army farther North than ever into Pennsylvania.

(Compare that move to the brazen Supreme Court.)

The Confederate army clashed with a huge Union army. The mighty battles they fought in the Devil's Den, the Peach Orchard and finally, in vain, Pickett's Charge, took place on July 1, 2 and 3.

Then the smoke cleared, cannons fell silent and casualties were strewn all over beautiful farmland.

Lee lost the turning point of the Civil War by the Fourth of July, 1863. The Union won the midway battle under Gen. George Meade.

On July 4, 1863, the Civil War was ours to lose.

But it was — and is — a close call.

# New York Times pays for opposition research into talk radio

The answer is "yes" at the New York Times. Their front page on July 5 carried a story titled "Right-Wing Radio Sows Doubt About a Vote Yet to Take Place." This is a weird take coming from liberals who often bombastically talk about how we may never have another free and fair election.

The Times reporter is Stuart A. Thompson. They say he "writes about online information flows." The liberal media hates the idea that there are "information flows" allowed in America that say mean things about Democrats. Reporters on the "misinformation" beat (as well as the "extremism" beat) are laser-focused on villainous conservatives.

Thompson's story began by complaining, "To many conservative commentators, the fix is already in. Democrats have cheated before, they say, and they will cheat again. Never mind that the claims are false." They found radio hosts who said Democrats will lose control of Congress unless they cheat. That's a prediction. It can't be false in advance. Do they really want to claim it's untrue that "Democrats have cheated before"?

Here's the money graf, as in where the Times spent their money: "Mentions of 'Democrats cheating' and similar ideas were raised more than 5,000 times on syndicated radio shows and local broadcasts this year, according to an analysis of data from Critical Mention, a media monitoring

service. Similar ideas were mentioned a few hundred times on television shows and podcasts tracked by Critical Mention during the same period."

How much money did the Times spend for Critical Mention to find these 5,000-plus examples? There was no "online information flow" on that question. They just want to use their front-page real estate to discourage anyone from saying the words "Democrats cheating."

The story includes a pile of quotes from offending right-wing radio hosts (and audio clips to imbibe online).

It would make sense for a newspaper that says "truth" is everything to focus on anyone who would echo former President Donald Trump's claim of a "sacred landslide victory." That's not true. They report Trump proclaimed in his Jan. 6, 2021, rally that Democrats changed voting laws "because they want to cheat."

Thompson wrote, "Republican politicians and cable outlets like Fox News have carried the torch for Mr. Trump's conspiracy theories ever since." Is that entirely true? Or does it have some partisan spit on the ball?

Deep in the article on page A-13, Thompson asserted, "Liberal commentators have also claimed Republicans cheated or will cheat again, but to a far lesser extent." Did the Times pay a "media monitoring service" to prove "a far lesser extent"? Or was it just a hunch?

Thompson noted that, after the 2018 election, Stacey Abrams refused

to concede in her race to be governor of Georgia, and a big petition on her behalf was titled "Don't Let Georgia Republicans Cheat and Steal the Governor's Mansion from Stacey Abrams." But he lamented that, since then, conservative radio hosts have "painted her efforts to improve voter access, particularly for historically disenfranchised groups, as a way to enable cheating."

Claims of voter fraud or cheating are used to influence (and discourage) voting. But so are claims that anyone who tries to tighten election eligibility is "Jim Crow 2.0," and we can be sure the Times won't spend money to count how many times the liberals have falsely compared conservatives to violent segregationists.

# Mass shootings are terrorism

In a sense, the mass murder at a Fourth of July parade in Highland Park, Illinois, was a symbol of how badly off-track our country has gotten. Amid the bunting and marching bands and families on lawn chairs, a disturbed idiot with a powerful rifle fired randomly at grandfathers, children and couples holding hands. Blood, bones, eyeballs and guts spilled onto the pavement alongside dropped thermoses and American flags. A 2-year-old was found, covered in blood, wandering alone. Both of his parents were dead. When his grandfather picked Aiden up at the hospital, the boy asked, "Are Mommy and Daddy coming soon?"

Mass shootings in public places are different from ordinary violence. I wish I had a dime for every time some Republican has complained that "the media" don't pay enough attention to shootings in Chicago and Detroit that happen on a regular basis. All murders are horrific of course, but the right is making a mistake if it tries to say that these mass shootings are a drop in the bucket when compared with the overall levels of violence that plague this country, or when they object that suicides actually account for 54% of gun deaths. Those deaths are indeed horrific, which is all the more reason to bring a sense of urgency to reducing them. It's sophistry to simply cite those statistics to wave away the epidemic of mass shootings.

Massacres at supermarkets, churches, classrooms, shopping malls and, good God, July Fourth parades are not like other violence. They shatter our sense of safety. They destroy our sense of normal life. Who among us has not wondered whether we might fall victim to this madness at a ballgame or a concert? This epidemic of mass random shootings is not like gang killings in cities. It's like terrorism. It invades the normal, peaceful world — the places

in which we must feel secure.

After 9/11, we went to war and spent trillions of dollars on security. Arguably, we overreacted, but the sense of an overarching menace was powerful. It may have been true that an American was more likely to die in his bathtub than as the result of a terror attack, but people have some control over their bathtubs. They have control over their cars (another big source of annual deaths). And they use their cars and tubs every day without incident, whereas any encounter with a violent jihadist is bound to end badly. Terrorism by those attempting to destroy your way of life has a way of activating every primitive us-versus-them/fight-or-flight impulse in our brains. So even if the chance of any particular American becoming a victim of a gun-wielding jihadist shouting "Allahu Akbar!" was minimal, the smoldering ruins of the World Trade Center and the Pentagon were imprinted on our minds and shouted "Defense!"

One of the least savvy things Barack Obama ever did was to downplay the threat of terrorism. He called ISIS the "JV team" and urged Americans not to respond with fear to attacks in San Bernardino, California, and elsewhere. Attempting to talk people out of their fear of terrorism was futile, and arguably played into the hands of Donald Trump, who used the San Bernardino attacks as the springboard for his vicious call for a ban on all Muslims entering the country.

Now it is Republicans who are attempting to talk people out of their fear. They're saying there's nothing we can do and that, actually, your kids are safer in school than in your living room and what about Newark? If

Democrats were smart, they would seize upon this and be the party that takes your safety seriously.

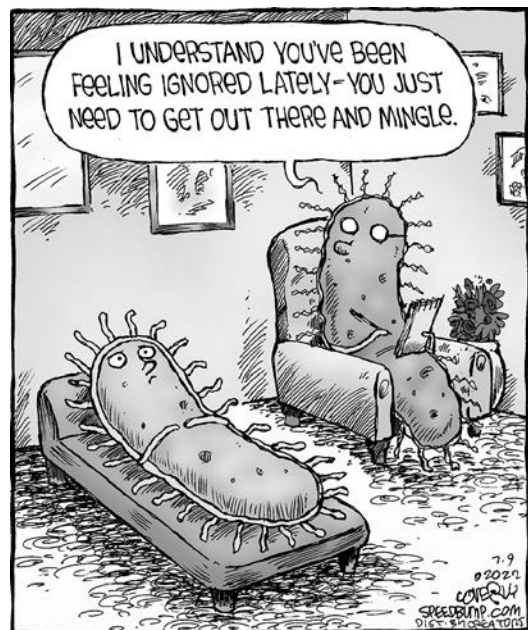
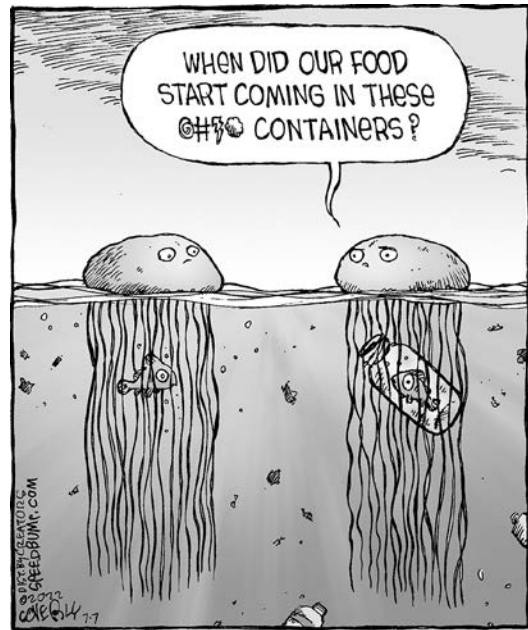
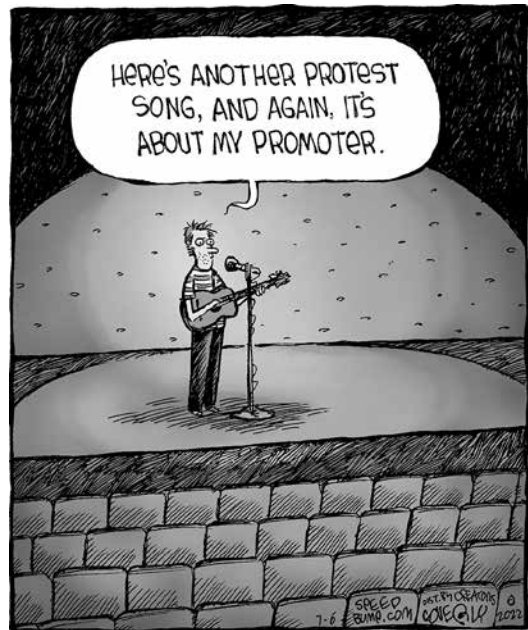
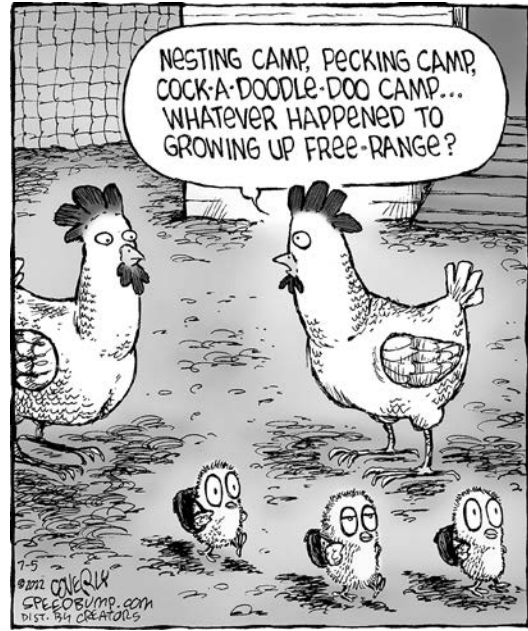
And it's not dishonest. These mass shootings are a greater threat to our security than Islamic terrorism was. If a Fourth of July parade is not safe, nowhere is safe. America is a free-fire zone.

It is too damn easy to get powerful weapons. We don't need to repeal the Second Amendment (impossible anyway) to restrict the easy availability of powerful weapons. In the Highland Park case, just as in dozens of recent mass shootings, the young killer purchased his weapon legally. In the vast majority of these recent mass shootings, the killers just waltzed into gun stores and bought them. As my Bulwark colleagues have argued, we could raise the age to purchase a weapon to 25. We could require extensive training on gun safety. We could limit magazine sizes. We could restrict the sale of body armor. We could improve the background-check system (the Illinois creep passed his). In short, we could respond to the demoralizing fear that our country is so sick on the subject of guns and so divided that we cannot be safe in public. Not even on the Fourth of July.

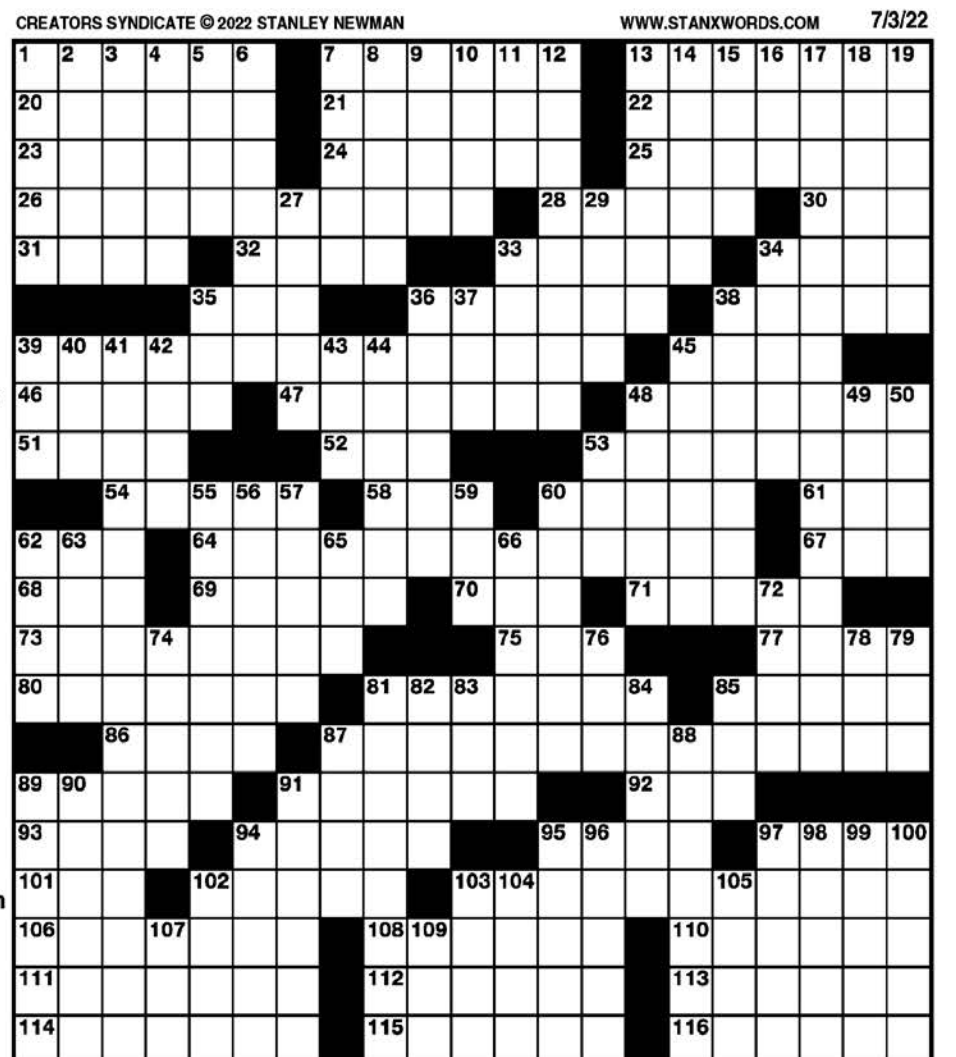
