Janis Espinoza, Aidan Nasser named La Mirada Athletes of the Year

■ Espinoza played softball, while Nasser played both football and basketball

LA MIRADA – With all of the great athletes at La Mirada High School, two have finished their careers being named 2021-22 Athletes of the Year.

Receiving the award was Janis Espinoza, who had a stellar career in softball and Aidan Nasser, who performed at a high level for both football and basketball.

The award is the result of all of the coaches nominating an athlete worthy of being athlete of the year

The coach then supplies all accolades the athlete has obtained over four years and all vote for the best athlete.

“Both kids had a leadership quality on campus and their teammates and peers looked up to them,” La Mirada Athletic Director Christine Mead said. “They had a great presence on the field or court. I predict great things from them over the next four years in college.

“It’s always exciting to see the athlete that wins as their name is announced.”

The announcement came in May at the school.

Both athletes excelled in their sports, as Espinoza was a four-year varsity player in softball and Nasser was a three-year varsity player in football and basketball.

They both finished their high school careers with multiple honors.

Nasser was voted both All-Suburban League first team in both basketball and football in his senior year. In addition, the 6-5 tight end in football, who also played defense, caught 12 passes and scored three touchdowns in his last high school game in the CIF-SS Quarterfinals.

For his efforts, he was offered scholarships to Air Force, Cornell and eventually committed to play at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota.

“It was definitely an honor to win this award,” said Nasser, who transferred to La Mirada from La Serna after his freshman year. “When I first transferred here in my sophomore year, I had no clue and I never thought I’d be able to get this distinction. It’s so great knowing all of the hard work has shown for in this award.”

Espinoza, who will play at six-time CCCAA State Champion Mt. SAC, finished her senior year as All-CIF DI, Suburban League MVP, Ultimate Silver Slugger Award (1.123 OPS), batted .366 and had a .935 fielding average.

“It’s definitely a big honor (winning the Athlete of the Year Award), since my freshman year wasn’t as smooth as I’d liked to be, but ending my senior year strong and receiving this award is definitely a huge appreciation and I’m very grateful.”

Espinoza, who is a true utility player who has played all positions except pitcher and was the fastest player in the program, finished with a 4.2 GPA and took several AP classes.

The all-around player had an injury in her freshman year and would come back playing at a top-level the following season.

“I had to learn a lot,” she said. “There was some trials and tribulations, but eventually I was able to manage my way through it. It worked out in the end.”

Espinoza, who will be playing at Mt. San Antonio College next season under coach Ruby Rojas, said this of her time at La Mirada

– “Playing at La Mirada for four years was definitely a bittersweet experience,” she said. “It’s not easy coming into a team as a freshman that is full of some of the best in our city. But it was an incredible experience to get to be alongside those players and build upon my own athletic abilities and grow.

“Along with some setbacks and seasons being cut short, my senior year was the year for me to really prove myself and show what I was capable of. So, receiving this award and others is an extreme honor.”

Espinoza talked about her team this past season in her senior year, which was a special one.... “I can’t talk about LM softball without talking about the girls I closed out my senior year with. This team was so special and the memories I formed with many of the girls are memories I will hold close to my heart.”

She also talked about the underclassmen and what the future of La Mirada softball holds.

“The underclassmen not only pushed me to be a better leader as a senior, but a better teammate as well,” Espinoza added. “This team, in particular, is packed with fresh athleticism and amazing talent, so definitely do not miss out on what any of those girls do this upcoming season and seasons to come.

“Every single one of those girls has a very bright future ahead of themselves.”

Matadores Softball Coach, Brent Tuttle, who has won 95 games (5, 20-plus winning seasons) in his seven years at the helm and four Suburban League titles, received much praise from Espinoza – “Playing for coach Tuttle taught me a lot of things,” she said. “One, being that sometimes it may seem like your hard work is going unnoticed. However, with some patience and dedication, your time will eventually come. It wasn’t an easy experience for me but when that time finally came for me to step out onto the field, for sure didn’t take it for granted. But, that’s the beauty in softball. Many of the lessons you experience on the field are lessons that you carry with you as you go through life.”

In addition to coach Tuttle, Espinoza also had great things to say about all of her coaches: “I do want to give a quick shout out to varsity coach Mario (Alvarado), coach Kevin (Helms) and JV coach (Christine) Mead,” she said. “Your contribution to the LM softball program will not go unnoticed. So, thank you for everything you do.”

Espinoza ended with a special thank you – “Finally, there is someone special I would like to dedicate my senior year to,” Espinoza said. “He goes by coach Ed (Kelly). “Although he was only my coach for my freshman year, he had the biggest impact on me, as I was going through one of the hardest times of my high school season. His never-ending love is something I will forever carry through my softball career.”

Nasser, who went on his official visit to St. Thomas in January of this past year with his dad, Erick, decided on his destination for the upcoming year.

Perhaps, for some odd reason, snow had something to do with it as Aidan enjoyed the 9” deep snowpack on the football field.

“I was doing snow angels on the field during my visit in 25 degree weather,” Aidan Nasser said.

“The University of St. Thomas has a great culture in their football program that I just couldn’t pass up,” Aidan Nasser said. “Coach Glenn Caruso is at the helm of the great culture and reminds me similarly of Coach Moschetti, making it a great fit.

“The story behind being the first team to take the jump from Division III to Division I was truly inspiring. Plus, I wanted to take on the challenge of cold weather and experience something new for a change.”

Aidan praised his coach of three years at La Mirada saying, “Playing for Coach Moschetti was awesome,” he said. “He’s the type of coach that makes you want to run through a wall for him. Definitely a true competitor on and off the field. He got the best out of his players all the time.”

Nasser attended La Serna for his freshman year, but transferred to La Mirada as a sophomore.

“I originally transferred here (LM) to play basketball in my sophomore year, but when I was working out in the weight room, coach Moschetti said I should try out for football,” said the younger Nasser. “The next thing you know I signed up and here we are and I’ll be playing tight end next year for St. Thomas.”

Managing his time while playing football was a challenge as it was for all of the players – try to fit in homework during the day, then get home late and maybe study for a test the next day.

On the hardwood, Nasser fondly remembered their run in the 2022 CIF playoffs.

“Our run in the CIF playoffs this year was incredible,” Nasser added. “Although we didn’t win it all, getting to the championship game was a dream come true.

“After our second-round win against Tesoro we were ecstatic.

We finally jumped over the second-round hurdle that ailed us the past couple years. Being the first La Mirada team to make the CIF Finals brings a great sense of pride.”

That run Nasser was talking about was especially special as they were playing in their newly remodeled gym.

The Matadores opened the playoffs with a 95-64 first-round win over Beckman, followed by that close, 52-50, win over Tesoro to advance to the quarterfinals against Calabasas and another close win, 57-54.

Next up came the 67-48 semifinal win over Edison to advance to the title game in 2A against San Juan Hills. Unfortunately, the run ended with a 10-point, 59-49 loss to San Juan Hills.

However, the season wasn’t over as they advanced to the CIF-State tournament.

They opened with a 65-60 win over King Drew but the season ended with a 55-37 loss to Los Altos in Round II.

“I believe winning the league championship for the first time in five years really propelled us into our championship run,” said Nasser, who had a 4.2 GPA.

Nasser was named the 2022 Defensive Player of the Year for the Matadores.

Nasser summed up his run on the La Mirada campus saying, “One thing that I could take away from my time at La Mirada was that I gained mental toughness, he said. “From the long nights studying the books to grinding during hot summer practices in football and finally ending out the year in basketball, tough was an understatement, but also a blessing.”

What they said:

Mike Moschetti, Varsity Football coach/AD, La Mirada HS: “Aidan (Nasser) was a great player that grew and got bigger and more physical as each year we had him. He is 6-5, athletic, great hands and

a great athlete. He turned down DI offers from the Air Force Academy and an Ivy League school (Cornell) to play at St Thomas. He is a big-time academic kid that will be very successful in life after football. He played defensive end and H-Back for us.”

Randy Oronoz, Varsity Basketball coach, LMHS: “Aidan (Nasser) was a good choice for Male Athlete of the Year. He was a 1st team All-League in basketball and 2nd Team All-Area. Aidan was a force down low defending bigger players on a nightly basis. He continues to make plays on both the court and the football field. He will be hard to replace in following years with his size and athleticism.”

Brent Tuttle, Varsity Softball coach, LMHS: “Janis is a coach’s dream player. In four years, she never complained and always trusted the process. Janis has played almost every position for us in her four years.

She is a great team player and always chips in whenever anything is needed to be done. On top of all that she was a scholar athlete all four years.”

Janis Espinoza: “It’s definitely an honor to play here at La Mirada, especially since a lot of us softball girls do look up to Jennie Finch since we were really young.

I learned a lot along the way from my freshman year and ended out strong my senior year. It was a pleasure and met a lot of good girls and amazing players, especially going DI. It was an amazing experience here.

It was extremely hard (playing at LM), Your position is never safe and you can never get too comfortable at your position. Having to constantly work for that position and never giving up. I think that’s the part that makes it fun. It’s never-ending here at La Mirada.

Aidan Nasser: “The experience at LM was very tough and learned to battle through adversity, with the grueling summer practices and everything. In the end, through the practices, the results were magnificent as we made it to the CIF Championship (game) in basketball and quarterfinals for football.

It just felt really good to have success over the course of time because of our hard work throughout the school year.”

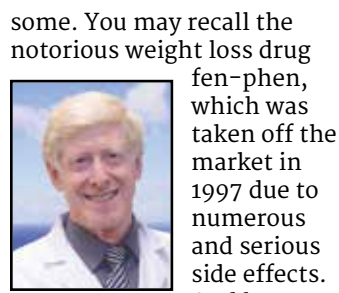

Paging Dr. Frischer...

In my practice, not a day goes by without a request for weight loss drugs. Obesity has become an enormous (no pun intended) problem in our country. If we define obesity as having a BMI (Body Mass

Index) of over 30, then over 42% of Americans are obese! For many years, the only drugs available were potentially dangerous, and had little or no lasting benefit. The weight tends to come back...and then



some. You may recall the notorious weight loss drug fen-phen, which was taken off the market in 1997 due to numerous and serious side effects. And how can we forget Xenical, which can indeed lead to some weight

loss...along with diarrhea? This drug is still on the market, along with several others.

There may finally be a more effective and safer drug available, and I feel that it is worth sharing here. (I am aware that it may appear that I'm being paid by a pharmaceutical company. I am NOT.)

The FDA (Food and Drug Administration) has approved Semaglutide, a once a week, injectable drug. It was originally used as a diabetes medication to lower blood sugar levels...and also happened to cause weight loss. This GLP (glucagon-like peptide) drug is now available for weight-loss purposes, and it is no longer necessary to be diabetic in order to have prescribed. (Fortunately, this product does not lower blood sugar levels in a non-diabetic.) Note that, like all newly approved medications, it may not be covered under your insurance.

For weight loss, Semaglutide will be marketed as Wegovy. Wegovy is intended for the obese, or for those who are merely overweight, but also have at least one weight-related ailment. It is not intended to work magically on its own, but is to be used along with reducing calories and increasing physical activity.

The FDA approved it for weight loss in 2021, after analyzing its safety and efficacy. Study participants showed an average 15% to 18% weight loss over 68 weeks. No other drug has come close to producing this level of weight loss. It appears to reduce hunger and increase the feeling of fullness, by mimicking a hormone that targets areas of the brain that regulate appetite.

This drug does have some gastrointestinal side effects, but they appear to be brief, and range from "mild to moderate." There is one dangerous potential

side effect (carrying with it a "black box" warning): It's possible that it may increase the risk of thyroid tumors, including thyroid cancer. The FDA and medical experts have concluded that the huge health benefits of weight loss outweigh the risk of this possible side effect. So, unless you are at risk for this rare cancer, your doctor is allowed to prescribe it.

Obesity carries with it a high risk for so many serious health conditions, including heart disease, diabetes, and high blood pressure. I urge you to discuss with your doctor whether this new treatment option might be a good choice for you.

Chinese aggression over Taiwan hurts its own cause

The Chinese government is mad about House Speaker Nancy Pelosi's visit to Taiwan. Really mad. It fired missiles over the island and sent fighter jets, bombers and warships into the surrounding area and vowed that it would punish "any invaders who would wreck unification of the motherland, and would show no mercy."

It was, The Washington Post reported, "an unprecedented show of force." Maybe President Xi Jinping carried it out in the hope that he can terrorize Taiwan and the U.S. into acts of appeasement. Or maybe he was conducting a dry run-in preparation for an attack on Taiwan that he intends to undertake sooner or later.

Either way, he's making a big mistake. Xi's regime has more to lose than to gain from trying to intimidate or conquer the self-governed province. Already, his efforts are backfiring, to the detriment of China's long-term interests.

If Beijing would like to displace the U.S. as the dominant power in the western Pacific, this is the wrong way to go about it. Xi may hope to frighten neighboring countries into submission, but his aggressive policies have had the opposite effect.

President Joe Biden has expanded the American commitment, affirming that he would use military force to defend Taiwan from an attack. Public opinion in Japan and Australia has moved overwhelmingly against China. The nations of the "Quad" — the U.S., Japan, India and Australia — have upgraded their military cooperation with a wary eye toward Beijing.

Everything the Chinese government does seems designed to sour the people of Taiwan on reunification with the mainland. Its oppressive measures in Hong Kong, whose Western-style freedoms it had promised to respect at least until 2047, have made it painfully obvious what they could expect from mainland rule.

Xi may regard having his way with Taiwan as so critical that he has to do whatever it takes to bring it about. It's been generally assumed that China has no plans to invade the island anytime soon. But it was generally assumed that Russia wouldn't invade Ukraine last winter, and it did.

The fate of that invasion ought to deter China from launching a full-scale attack on Taiwan. Armed with a vast array of American weaponry, from fighter jets to Patriot missiles, Taiwan's military may not be able to win, but it can make Beijing pay a heavy price. If the U.S. intervenes, the price to China — and the dangers — would be greater yet.

Even a low-cost victory would be a dubious achievement, with no obvious benefits. In the first place, China would be saddled with ruling a uniformly hostile population of 23 million people who are accustomed to both democracy and de facto independence. It would be the equivalent of an imperial conquest, not a fraternal reunion. Years of unrest and violence

could ensue.

In the second place, it would likely erase much of the island's economic value. China is highly dependent on Taiwan for the most advanced semiconductor chips. Reuters reported that the plants where these are made "could easily become a casualty of the fighting, severing the supply of chips to China's vast electronics industry." Taiwan would also be abruptly cut off from the world economy, crippling its productive sector.

For a country as dependent on foreign trade as China, a war could be ruinous. The U.S. and other countries would impose economic sanctions that would be a drag on the Chinese economy, which has already stalled. Exports, which have powered China's economic rise, would go begging. At least some Western corporations operating in China would do what they've done in Russia — get the hell out.

The world response to the Ukraine invasion, writes Ohio State University scholar John Mueller in Foreign Affairs, "is not so much about winning as making sure that the country that started the war is far worse off than if it had not done so. That has already been substantially achieved." It would likely also be achieved against China if it invaded Taiwan.

In the 21st century, threatening war and embarking on war are a terrible way to achieve prosperity, stability, security or international influence. Putin's experience has reaffirmed that elementary truism in ways that Xi would be supremely foolish to ignore.

Letting Taiwan continue its self-government and its partnership with the U.S. may not be something that Xi can easily swallow. But he should realize that it's the worst option, except for all the rest.

Kansas's stunning primary, and the message it sends

Two days after Kansas voters overwhelmingly rejected a ban on abortion in their state, the other front-runner for the Republican nomination, Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis, went out of his way to cement his hardcore anti-choice stance. On Thursday, he issued an order suspending a county prosecutor who had signed a pledge not to prosecute doctors or patients for abortion-related care.

There are all kinds of reasons why what DeSantis did is wrong: punishing a prosecutor for disagreeing with the governor on the exercise of prosecutorial discretion is unprecedented, according to local legal experts, who point out that the prosecutor is accountable to the voters, not the governor. The prosecutor in question has been elected twice. He signed a similar pledge last year not to prosecute those who provide medical care given to transgender people.

As for DeSantis, he has signed into law a ban on abortion after 15 weeks of pregnancy with no exception for rape or incest. That makes sense — not if you care about women's health, in which case it makes no sense at all, but if you buy the conventional wisdom about Republican primary

politics.

Generally, primaries and especially caucuses skew toward the most ideological voters. Democrats skew left; Republicans skew right; moderates treat primaries the way casual watchers treat spring training, which is to say that they wait until the World Series to really pay attention.

It follows that you can't go wrong in a Republican primary by going all the way to the right on an issue like abortion. Or gay marriage. And if it's always the economy by November, you can always ignore the social issues and count on most moderate voters to do the same.

But then there's Kansas. The tornado that touched down there on Tuesday may well signal weather to come. It's not just that the pro-choice side won decisively in an overwhelmingly Republican state. It's how they won.

A stunning number of people turned out to vote, in numbers literally comparable to a general election. This is a state where Republicans outnumber Democrats among registered voters by nearly 2-1, that Donald Trump carried by 15 points and that hasn't supported a Democrat for president since Lyndon Johnson. According to a Washington Post analysis,

some 14 counties — where nearly a third of the state's population live — backed Trump by 20 points in 2020 and voted no by 13 points on Tuesday. In a primary election. These were primary voters, which is the shocking part.

Much is being written about the impact of Kansas on the coming midterm elections, and whether abortion initiatives on other states ballots may produce similar turnout and voting patterns. Maybe it was just a coincidence that the prediction markets are more rosy this week about Democrats holding the Senate. But it's not just Congress that's at stake.

It's also the next presidential election. Conventional wisdom would tell you that you can't be too far to the right on abortion in a Republican race. The challenge is not to go so far to the right that you get branded as an arch ideologue. DeSantis is already taking that risk, but the bigger one may be a miscalculation of the Republican primary electorate and what it may look like in two years. The bad news for DeSantis: It might well look like Kansas. The bad weather could spread for Republicans as their fondest wish — the overruling of Roe v. Wade — turns into an electoral disaster. Beware what you wish for.

The choice voters need to make

This is an election year. But the issues this year are not about Democrats and Republicans. The big issue is whether this nation has degenerated to a point of no return — a point where we risk destroying ourselves, before our enemies can destroy us.

If there is one moment that symbolized our degeneration, it was when an enraged mob gathered in front of the Supreme Court and a leader of the United States Senate shouted threats against Supreme Court Justice Brett Kavanaugh, saying "You won't know what hit you!"

There have always been irresponsible demagogues. But there was once a time when anyone who shouted threats to a Supreme Court Justice would see the end of his own political career, and could not show his face in decent society again.

You either believe in laws or you believe in mob rule. It doesn't matter whether you agree with the law or agree with the mob on some particular issue. If threats of violence against judges — and publishing where a judge's children go to school — is the way to settle issues, then there is not much point in having elections or laws.

There is also not much point in expecting to have freedom. Threats and violence were the way the Nazis came to power in Germany. Freedom is not free. If you can't be bothered to vote against storm-trooper tactics — regardless of who engages in them, or over what issue — then you can forfeit your freedom.

Worse yet, you can forfeit the freedom of generations not yet born.

Some people seem to think that the Supreme Court has banned abortions. It has done nothing of the sort.

The Supreme Court has in fact done something very different, something long overdue and potentially historic. It has said that their own court had no business making policy decisions which nothing in the Constitution gave them the authority to make.

Get out a copy of the Constitution — and see if you can find anything in there that says the federal government is authorized to make laws about abortion.

Check out the 10th Amendment, which says that the federal

government is limited to the specific powers it was granted, with all other powers going to the states or to the people.

Why do we elect legislators to do what the voters want done, if unelected judges are going to make up laws on their own, instead of applying the laws that elected officials passed?

This is part of a very long struggle that has been going on for more than 100 years. Back in the early 20th century, Progressives like President Woodrow Wilson decided that the Constitution put too many limits on the powers they wanted to use.

Claiming that it was nearly impossible to amend the Constitution, Progressives advocated that judges "interpret" the Constitutional limits out of the way.

This was just the first in a long series of sophistries.

In reality, the Constitution was amended 4 times in 8 years — from 1913 through 1920 — during the heyday of the Progressive era.

When the people wanted the Constitution amended, it was amended. When the elites wanted the Constitution amended, but the people did not, that is called democracy.

Another great sophistry was using the federal government's authority to regulate interstate commerce to call all sorts of other things interstate commerce. In 1995, elites were shocked when the Supreme Court ruled — 5 to 4 — that carrying a gun near a school was not interstate commerce.

States had a right to ban carrying a gun near a school, and most of them did. But the federal government had no such authority. Nor did the Constitution give the federal government the right to make laws about abortion, one way or the other.

What both state and federal laws do have the right to stop is threats against judges and their families.

This is not a partisan issue. The Republican governor of Virginia is providing protection to Supreme Court Justices who live in that state. But the Republican governor of Maryland seems to think that harassing judges and their families is no big deal.

Voters need to find out who is for or against mob rule, whether they

are Democrats or Republicans. We are not going to be a free or decent society otherwise.

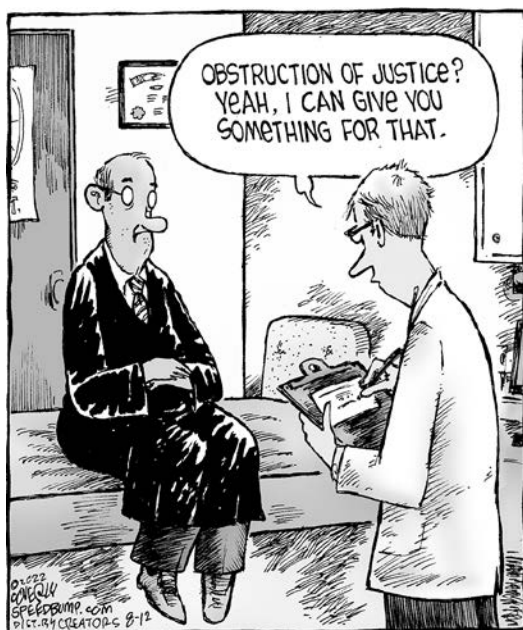
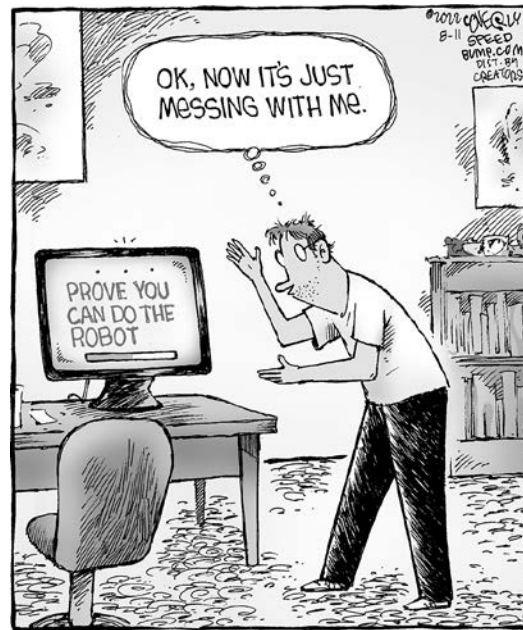
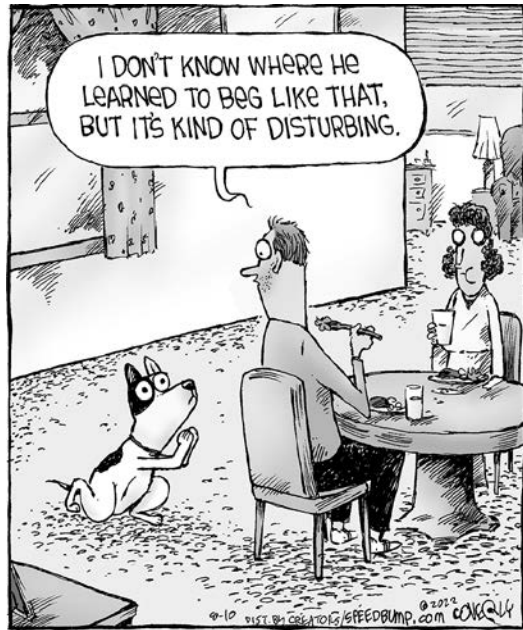

Without that direct link to Google Ads, I don't think their analytics will be nearly as useful as Google's.

I know tech companies are easy targets, and it's trendy to believe that big always equals bad. But digital tools have helped my small business grow, and I can't afford to go backward. I urge Sens. Padilla and Feinstein to oppose the American Innovation and Choice Online Act and stand with California's small business community.

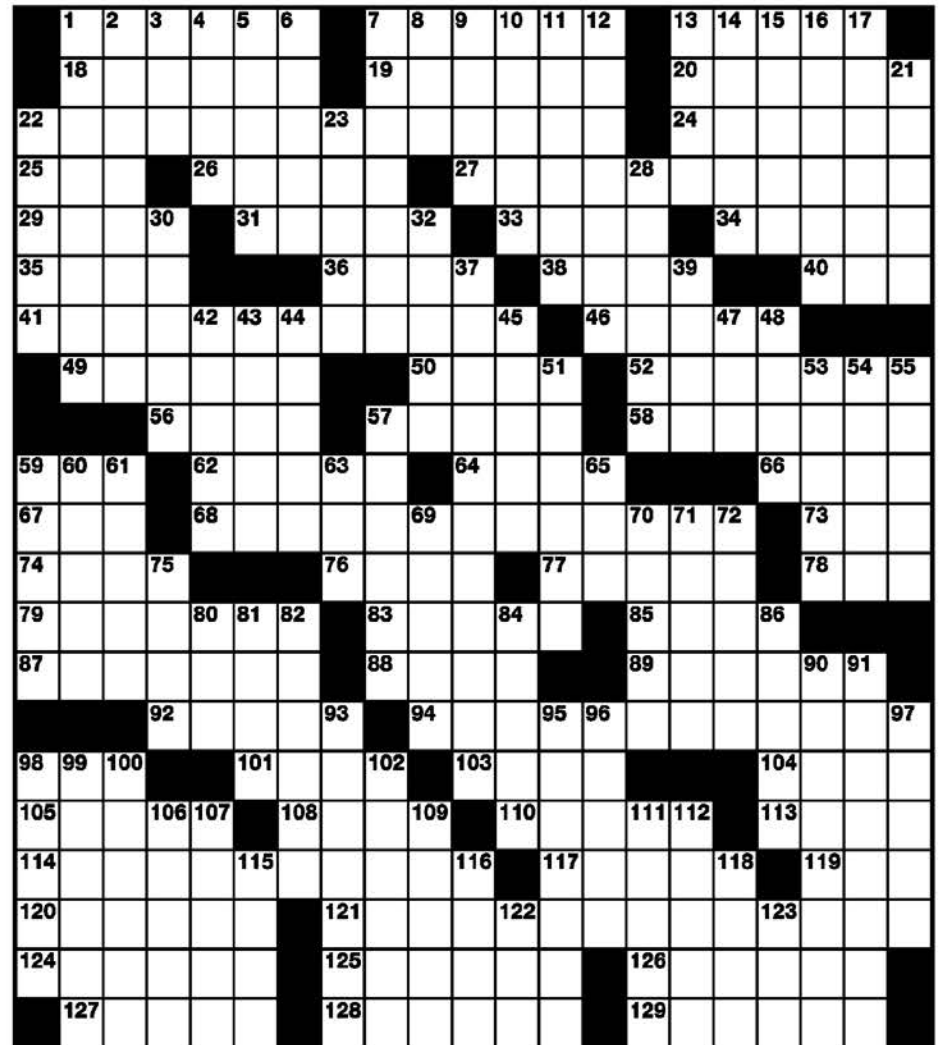

Arrests made in fatal Downey shooting of Monterey police officer

Officer Gardiel Solorio, 26, was just a few weeks out of the Police academy when he was shot and killed Monday afternoon.

DOWNEY - A 20-year-old man and a teenager are behind bars in connection with the fatal shooting of an off-duty Monterey Park police officer during what the district attorney called an attempted robbery in Downey -- and the adult is tentatively scheduled to be arraigned Thursday on murder and other charges.

Carlos Delcid, 20, is tentatively scheduled to be arraigned in Downey on one count each of murder, attempted robbery and being a felon in possession of a firearm. According to jail records, he was arrested around 9:30 p.m. Monday, roughly six hours after the shooting that killed Officer Gardiel Solorio, 26.

The murder charge includes a special-circumstance allegation of murder during a robbery.

Delcid will face a maximum sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole if convicted as charged, according to Los Angeles County District Attorney George Gascón, who has vowed not to seek the death penalty against any defendants.

A 17-year-old suspect was also arrested for allegedly acting as the getaway driver, Gascón said during a Wednesday afternoon news conference. That suspect, who was not identified, is being charged in juvenile court, and the exact charge or charges were not immediately clear.

The off-duty officer was in his vehicle in the parking lot of an LA Fitness gym in the 12700 block of Lakewood Boulevard around 3:30 p.m. Monday when Delcid allegedly got out of a car nearby and approached Solorio "with a gun drawn in what appeared to be an attempted robbery," the district attorney said.

"Officer Solorio attempted to flee by backing up his vehicle when the suspect fired multiple times," Gascón said. "The defendant then

returned back to the vehicle where a juvenile was behind the wheel and they fled the scene."

Solorio was found unresponsive in the seat of his car, and was pronounced dead at the scene, according to Downey police.

Funeral arrangements were still pending for Solorio, a rookie officer just weeks out of the academy. Monterey Park Police Department Chief Kelly Gordon called his killing "a senseless act of violence."

Gordon said at a Tuesday afternoon news conference that Solorio, who grew up in Bell Gardens and graduated from Cal State Los Angeles with a degree in criminal justice, joined the department as a recruit in January, and had just graduated from the sheriff's training academy on July 22 before beginning his field training on July 25.

"Although his time with (the department) was very short, we all knew from the moment we met him that he had the heart of service and was going to be a great officer," Gordon said.

"And I could tell that from the moment he walked in and did our first introductions in my office. The family and department are grieving right now, and this is an especially difficult tragedy. It's a senseless act of violence. He was only 26 years old. I don't know about all of you, but I have children that age. So to me this is particularly difficult."

Gordon added that training staff at the sheriff's academy told her Solorio was "hard-working, dedicated and took every aspect of training seriously," and that he was family oriented.

"The 'why' in the biography he wrote was to be a good role model for his nephews, and he really wanted to make an impact on the community," Gordon said. "His classmates shared that Officer Solorio had all the characteristics of a great officer -- he was humble, dedicated, selfless and hard-working, but even a better person. He brought laughter and joy to many of us."

A solemn procession involving officers from the Downey and Monterey Park police departments and Downey Fire Department escorted Solorio's body to the Los

Angeles County Coroner's Office on Monday night.

Solorio is survived by his parents, brothers, sisters and fiancée.

His fiancée and one of his sisters attended the Wednesday news conference when the charges against Delcid were announced.

"It's a tremendous loss. It's a loss of life," Gordon said earlier. "In law enforcement, but especially in the Monterey Park Police Department, we're a family. That's the bottom line. We have worked very hard to build a culture within our department that we take care of each other. This is a tragedy. This is a tragedy for his family, but this is a tragedy for the Monterey Park Police Department as well."

On Wednesday morning, the flag at the Monterey Park Police Department was flying at half-staff and the department had received numerous floral arrangements for the fallen officer.

On a GoFundMe page

established to help cover expenses for family to attend his funeral, Solorio's sister-in-law, Wanda Marie Lane Solorio, wrote that it was his "lifelong dream" to be a police officer.

"His dream of becoming a police officer after years of hard work and dedication had finally come to fruition, when life was abruptly taken away due to a senseless act of violence," she wrote. "He was taken from his family way too soon. He was and has always been true American success story."

She said Solorio was the youngest of 13 children, and the family is hoping to raise money so all of his brothers and sisters can attend his funeral.

As of Wednesday afternoon, the family had raised more than \$16,000.

"(He) was a first generation college graduate, and the first in his family to become a police officer and brother in law enforcement," Wanda Marie Lane Solorio wrote.
