Former Sheriff Villanueva challenging Hahn for L.A. County board seat

■ Villanueva is looking to become the first person since 1980 to unseat an incumbent supervisor.

DOWNEY – Former Los Angeles County Sheriff Alex Villanueva is expected Wednesday to formally announce he will run against Supervisor Janice Hahn in the March primary.

Villanueva said in an interview Tuesday night on Fox 11 that he would run.

“County government is responsible for the health, safety and welfare of all the county residents. In that regard the board has failed miserably,” Villanueva told Fox 11 Tuesday. “All you have to do is look at the news every day. You’re assaulted by images of violent crime, smash and grab robberies, senseless wanton violence.”

When asked how he can defeat Hahn, whose late father Kenneth was a supervisor from 1952-92 and who the Hall of Administration is named in his honor, Villanueva responded, “One thing for sure is she is no Kenneth Hahn. When he was serving as supervisor, there was a time of civility in county government, balance.”

“Today, they’re so far to the left of center that no one can even recognize them. They do not represent the will of anyone, much less the residents of the Fourth District, so we’re going to bring this back to the middle.”

Janice Hahn was elected in 2016 and re-elected in 2020 to represent the Fourth District, which now stretches from the Palos Verdes Peninsula to Long Beach and north to the southeastern Los Angeles County and the eastern San Gabriel Valley, including Huntington Park, Bell, Commerce, Pico Rivera, Whittier and La Habra Heights.

There was no immediate

response to an email sent late Tuesday night to Hahn campaign consultant Dave Jacobson seeking comment.

In a statement Wednesday morning, Hahn’s campaign called Villanueva a “fraud and a failure.”

“L.A. County voters - including District 4 - resoundingly rejected the man known as the ‘Donald Trump of L.A. County’ last November for his incompetence and corruption. L.A. County became less safe under Villanueva’s reign. He is a fraud and a failure, and L.A. County voters won’t be fooled again.”

Villanueva was elected sheriff in 2018, upsetting then-Sheriff Jim McDonnell, but lost his bid for re-election in November to former Long Beach Police Department Chief Robert Luna.

Hahn and Villanueva are both Democrats. The Board of Supervisors, like all local government positions in California, is nonpartisan.

No Los Angeles County supervisor has been defeated



for re-election since 1980 when Baxter Ward was denied a third term by Michael D. Antonovich and Yvonne Braithwaite Burke lost her bid for a full term to Deane Dana after being appointed to fill the vacancy caused by James A. Hayes’ resignation.

Villanueva is seeking to be the first man on the board since 2020 when Mark Ridley-Thomas was

unable to seek re-election because of term limits.

“The Board of Supervisors has a responsibility to provide for the health, safety and welfare of the county,” Villanueva said during a press conference Wednesday. “In that regard, they have failed absolutely miserably.”

Students defend wellness center

■ Students, staff show support for John Glenn High School Wellness Center.

NORWALK – Damien Berry, 10th grade student at Norwalk High School, explained why he supports the Wellbeing Center at John Glenn High School during their meeting on Monday.

“As a member of the trans community, I know that it’s very important that kids have somewhere they can go, especially if they don’t feel like they can’t talk to their friends or family at home. This center will offer a lot of different services at school including sexual health and self-harm prevention,” Berry said.

“For kids like me, self-harm is something that is thought about very often because we do not take into the status quo or we appear to be different than our fellow students. Please consider putting more centers like this and other

schools in our district.”

Berry’s friends and family listened and applauded him in support after he was finished.

The Wellbeing Center at John Glenn and Southeast Academy High School has been the target of scrutiny from MassResistance, an organization that has been labeled a hate group by the Southern Poverty Law Center. However, the group is a self-described pro family group.

The board of education addressed concerns from MassResistance in June, but members of the organization continued to express unfounded claims that have been discredited multiple times by the school board.

The field director, Arthur Schaper, tried to dismiss a survey released by the district to John Glenn High School parents, students and staff to get their feelings towards the Wellbeing Center, and if they felt the services were necessary.

The survey was available to parents from Sep. 1-6.

“The statistics on [the survey results], what a ridiculously low

sample size, and we have reports from parents that they were not allowed to see the survey, which is their right,” Schaper said.

“I think it’s really shallow that the school district pushed this survey and tried to do it on the Labor Day weekend, as if you could get a sample to try to lie to the public that the vast majority of people in the community wanted that student Wellbeing Center.”

Jessica Medrano, assistant superintendent of educational services (secondary) and Jennifer Padilla, principal at John Glenn High School and Southeast Academy High School, explained that approximately 103 (12%) of parents, 57 (36%) of staff and 279 (28%) of students responded to the district survey, according to the data.

The overwhelming majority of those who responded to the survey feel the services at the wellbeing center including mental health and wellness support, substance abuse, education and prevention, physical health and wellness resources and sexual health education and resources are either important or extremely important.

Paging Dr. Frischer...

Every day I listen to complaints from patients about how difficult it is to get a good night's sleep. All of us have had times when sleep is a challenge. Most sleep medications are fraught with complications, including addiction, dependency, and the simple fact that, over time, they just stop working.



Rather than putting up with being sleep deprived, or depending on meds, let me encourage lifestyle changes. Here are some of my favorite tips for how to get that satisfying night of sleep:

- **Have a consistent sleep schedule.** This helps to establish our circadian rhythms. Do note that this includes weekends as well.
- **Increase your bright light exposure during the day.** Bright light affects the brain, body, and hormones, helping us to stay awake during the daytime. It also improves daytime energy, which then helps us fall asleep at night. (When daily sunlight is not possible, some people mimic it with a light therapy lamp.)
- **Reduce your light exposure in the evening.** Blue light, which comes from electronic devices like some TVs, smartphones, and computers, is the most problematic. Consider turning off the TV and other electronic devices two hours before bedtime.
- **Cut back on daytime naps.** Naps tend to affect nighttime sleep, but of course, if short daytime power naps work for you, and don't affect your sleep at night, then by all means, carry on.
- **Avoid alcohol.** Many of my patients believe that alcohol



relaxes them and helps them sleep. Unfortunately, even modest amounts of alcohol at night can interfere with sleep by increasing sleep apnea symptoms, worsening snoring, and launching poor sleep patterns. It alters the production of melatonin, which plays a key role in our circadian rhythms. It can increase feelings of panic, anxiety and depression, which will certainly keep us awake at night.

- **Cut out caffeine after lunch.** Caffeine has a number of benefits, as most Americans are aware. It can bring about better focus, more energy, and improved sports performance. However, it is a nervous system stimulant. Caffeine levels can stay elevated for eight hours after

consumption. If you are craving coffee later in the day, let me suggest sticking with decaf.

- **Optimize your sleep environment.** This includes controlling temperature, noise, external lights, and furniture arrangement. Our mattress and pillow can have an enormous effect on back pain, shoulder pain, back stiffness, and sleep quality. Consider whether it is time for a replacement, and test before buying.

- **Don't eat late.** Studies show that eating a large meal or snacks can affect sleep and sleep hormone levels. (Note that a small bedtime snack for diabetics is often necessary.)

- **Relax and clear your mind.** Various techniques for relaxation before bed have been shown to help. These include taking a bath, listening to music, reading a book, massage, meditating, deep breathing, and visualization.

- **Exercise regularly.** Exercise is one of the very best ways to improve sleep and health. Note that while daily exercise is key, don't plan it too close to bedtime.

Be sure to rule out any underlying health condition. Sleep apnea, for example, is a sleep disorder which causes inconsistent and interrupted breathing. Urinary frequency keeps many up at night. Any condition that causes pain will disrupt sleep.

And yes, some supplements and natural remedies can help. Melatonin is a key sleep hormone that helps our brain relax and go to sleep. It should not cause withdrawal symptoms or next day hangover effects. Other popular sleep aids include ginkgo biloba, glycine, valerian root, magnesium, chamomile and lavender.

Let's improve our health and well-being by making sleep a top priority.

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Why Trump can run for President

The constitution does not disqualify Donald Trump from running for office.

Last week, six Colorado voters and the Citizens for Responsibility and Ethics in Washington (CREW) filed a lawsuit in state court to prevent former President Donald Trump from running for the presidency next year. They argue that the Constitution's Disqualification Clause in the 14th Amendment, barring those who've engaged in insurrection from holding office, prohibits Trump from appearing on the ballot. (Since the filing, Trump has asked to move the CREW challenge to federal court.)

It is understandable that Trump's critics have mounted aggressive efforts to derail the former president's candidacy. As his two impeachments and four indictments indicate, Trump is manifestly unfit to hold public office and should not become president again. (Trump denies all the charges.) But claims that the former president should be barred from running by the Disqualification Clause are misguided, and the arguments for disqualification would have troubling implications for other cases.

The Disqualification Clause was adopted as Section 3 of the 14th Amendment in 1868, and its primary purpose was to address a serious problem with elections in the Southern states. After the Civil War, Southern states sent to Congress men who had violated their earlier oaths to support the Constitution by serving in leadership roles in the Confederacy. Accordingly, Section 3 prohibits individuals from holding office if they previously took an oath to support the Constitution and then "engaged in insurrection or rebellion against" the United States.

The text of the ban is written in general terms, so it could apply to insurrections or rebellions other than the Civil War. But the drafters of the ban did not provide a definition of "insurrection," and a key question today is what the word should apply to. Does the insurrection have to be as serious as the Confederacy's secession, rebellion and civil war? Or should we interpret insurrection more broadly, such as playing a role in the violent assault on the US Capitol on January 6, 2021?

Those who would disqualify Trump certainly believe in an expansive application – but it's one that goes too far.

According to CREW, we should understand insurrection as "an assemblage of persons" who use "force" while "acting with the purpose to oppose the continuing authority of the United States Constitution." To arrive at this meaning, the organization draws on criminal insurrection statutes, academic analyses and court decisions, including that of a New Mexico trial court that last year disqualified a county commissioner because of his role in the January 6 attack on the Capitol.

The problem with the CREW definition is that it would not only apply to Trump and others who tried to overturn the 2020 election with the conduct that culminated in the January 6 violence but also to others who use force for any reason to resist governmental authority. For instance, as proponents of a definition of insurrection essentially the same as CREW's acknowledge, abolitionists who tried to prevent fugitive slaves from being returned to their owners in the years before slaves were emancipated would qualify as insurrectionists.

In fact, in defining insurrection, CREW and the New Mexico trial court drew on an 1894 criminal case involving the prosecution of labor activists, including labor leader Eugene Debs, for their participation in a nationwide strike of railroad workers. The CREW definition also would have presumably applied to those who protested our country's involvement in the Vietnam War by using force of any kind to disrupt the military draft.

The broad interpretations of the Disqualification Clause extend too far in another way – in terms of who can be ensnared by it. According to the CREW lawsuit and the New Mexico trial court, one need not personally use force to fall under the Disqualification Clause.

Rather, one can engage in insurrection with "words in furtherance of the insurrection," including words that "provoke, encourage or command others to engage in insurrectionary conduct." This view of insurrection could in theory apply to an elected official who speaks sympathetically at a protest against an unjust law were the protest to unexpectedly turn violent.

A narrow definition of insurrection makes much more sense. We should not disqualify those who strongly protest unjust laws, nor should we disenfranchise the voters who want to re-elect officials who fight against unjust laws. Indeed, such candidates may be especially desirable as elected officials. Moreover, elected officials should not have to worry whether their support for those protesters would trigger their own disqualification from running for re-election.

At the same time, we don't need to worry that a narrow definition might not go far enough for those who have undeniably engaged in insurrection. There are additional ways to prevent these people from holding public office, such as impeachment and prosecution for other crimes.

Courts have recently imposed sentences of 22 and 18 years on leaders of the Proud Boys and Oath Keepers, respectively, who played key roles in the January 6 violence. While Trump himself could still run for the presidency even if convicted in one or more of his four prosecutions, it would be very difficult to wage an effective campaign from a prison cell.

It is essential that Trump not escape accountability for his efforts to overturn the 2020 presidential election. But some of the many civil and criminal cases against him are the best way to do so. In responding to efforts to thwart Trump's re-election, courts should not interpret the Constitution in ways that would disqualify for public service people who try to block the implementation of unjust laws.

Keep chaplains out of public schools

Texas public schools could replace counselors with chaplains.

A new Texas law allows public schools to replace counselors with chaplains and to use funds earmarked for school safety and mental health to pay them. The law went into effect this month.

Each of Texas' more than 1,000 school districts now has six months to vote on whether or not to create chaplain programs. There are no requirements to be called a "chaplain" outside of passing a background check. People allowed to serve as chaplains in this program are not barred from proselytizing and do not have to have any chaplaincy training or expertise in working with children or people from different faith traditions.

"Chaplains represent God in government and are already extremely successful in helping our first responders, military, providing support in hospitals, and counseling in our prison systems," Republican state Sen. Mayes Middleton from Galveston wrote about his motivation in authoring the legislation. "I believe that chaplains will greatly benefit our school students, teachers, and other school district staff. Our schools are not God-free zones."

As a constitutional lawyer and Baptist leader committed to religious liberty, I couldn't disagree more. The very premise that the government plays a role in religious affairs betrays the foundational values of religious freedom.

Students are free to exercise their religion in ways that do not interfere with classroom instruction, but the school itself should not be in the business of propping up or denigrating anyone's religion. While there are good reasons for chaplains in certain settings where someone cannot freely access religious services, those circumstances are not present in the public school context.

But, more personally, as the parent of a child in a Texas elementary school, I have deep concerns about any move to religious indoctrination or instruction in the public schools. My husband, who is Jewish, and I are raising our son in an interfaith household. My son sits in the pew with me for worship most Sunday mornings at our Baptist church, and we'll soon celebrate the Jewish holidays together with our extended family at our Reform

temple.

He is able to access both religious traditions as he develops his own sense of what it means to be human, and whatever questions my husband and I can't answer, we have a rich community of clergy and lay leaders to help in his religious education.

To me, this is the essence of what flourishing religious freedom means, free of government interference. I don't want government chaplains inserting themselves into my family's — or any family's — religious discernment.

Texas chaplains have voiced their strong opposition to this new law. More than 100 signed an open letter to the state's school districts calling on them to reject this chaplain program.

"Government-sanctioned chaplains make sense in some settings, but not in our public schools," states the letter, which is organized by BJC, Texas Impact and Interfaith Alliance. "Many of us serve in contexts in which individuals cannot access their religious services — such as the military, a prison, or hospital — which is hardly the case for children in public school. ... Parents or guardians must have the right to choose the religious leaders who will influence their children's spiritual journey."

The Texas chaplains specifically stated that they "are not qualified for the duties envisioned by SB 763.

"We cooperate with mental health counselors — we do not compete with them. Further, professions which help children with sensitive matters, such as therapists and police investigators, typically require special training on how to interview and treat juveniles." They also explain that "[c]haplaincy programs do not train chaplains on active shooter situations or to be public safety professionals."

Texas recently required public schools to display "In God We Trust" posters if they are donated to the school. Another piece of legislation aimed to mandate the posting of the Ten Commandments in public school classrooms in the state. Fortunately, the bill died after the Texas House didn't meet a deadline to act on it.

While the Ten Commandments are central teachings in both Judaism and Christianity, there are diverse texts and interpretations in both faiths and among different Christian denominations. Teaching and talking about the Ten Commandments should be up to my family and the religious leaders at the church and synagogue where my family worships. The state of Texas should not control how my son learns about how, when, or if to worship God.

Texas parents who are Christian, Jewish, another religion or not religious should be able to unite across ideological differences to keep the government out of religious indoctrination and proselytization. It's not a conservative or liberal position to believe that houses of worship and other religious institutions are better equipped than the government to teach children about

religion.

My opposition to this and other forms of government-sponsored religion in schools is also rooted in my own Baptist faith. Baptists should be the loudest defenders of church-state separation — historically, we have been.

The organization I lead, Baptist Joint Committee for Religious Liberty (BJC), has worked for 87 years to defend religious freedom for all. We file friend-of-the-court briefs at the US Supreme Court, lead coalitions to pass legislation such as the Religious Freedom Restoration Act, and advocate for federal agencies to uphold religious freedom through their regulatory agendas. Our work is rooted in the First Amendment's guarantee of religious freedom and our Baptist conviction of "soul freedom."

Soul freedom means that each individual is free to deal personally with God. Our direct relationship with God is an individual right and responsibility, and there should be no political interference with faith. Texas is increasingly getting in the way of soul freedom.

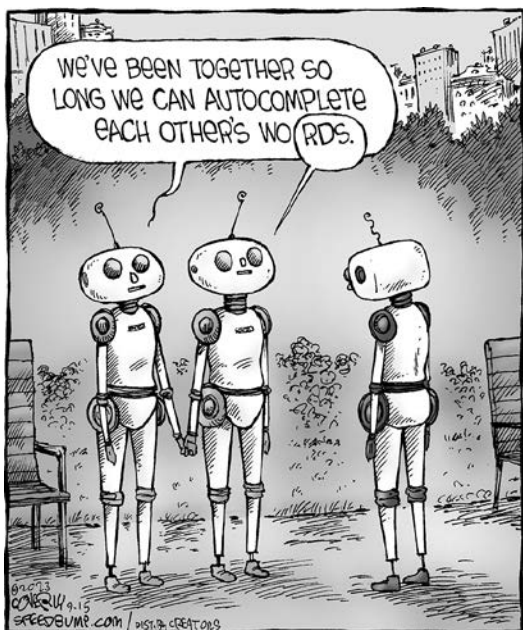
It's not just Texans who should be concerned. A public school chaplain law is being pushed in Ohio, and one was proposed earlier this year in Oklahoma. At least a dozen other states (Arkansas, Florida, Idaho, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Ohio, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Utah, and Virginia) require schools to display "In God We Trust."

These efforts are part of a resurgence of Christian nationalism, the political ideology that conflates American and Christian identities. BJC launched the Christians Against Christian Nationalism campaign in 2019 to specifically call out the ways Christian nationalism distorts our faith and to make sure Christian nationalism doesn't go unchallenged in the public square or our churches. More than 35,000 Christians across the country have already signed our statement of principles.

This increase in state-based attacks on church-state separation have been emboldened by the US Supreme Court's recent decisions that opened the door to more government meddling in religious affairs. During the 2021-2022 term alone, the Court sided with a public school football coach who had a history of leading post-game prayers with the team and decided that Maine cannot exclude religious schools from a tuition assistance program.

As challenging as the circumstances are in Texas and many other places across the country, we can't give up on the American experiment in secular democracy — one that allows all faiths to flourish by guaranteeing equal citizenship without regard to religion. Christian nationalism is a powerful ideology in a majority-Christian nation. But I'm hopeful that most Americans — of all faiths and of no faith — do not want the government deciding religious matters for our families.

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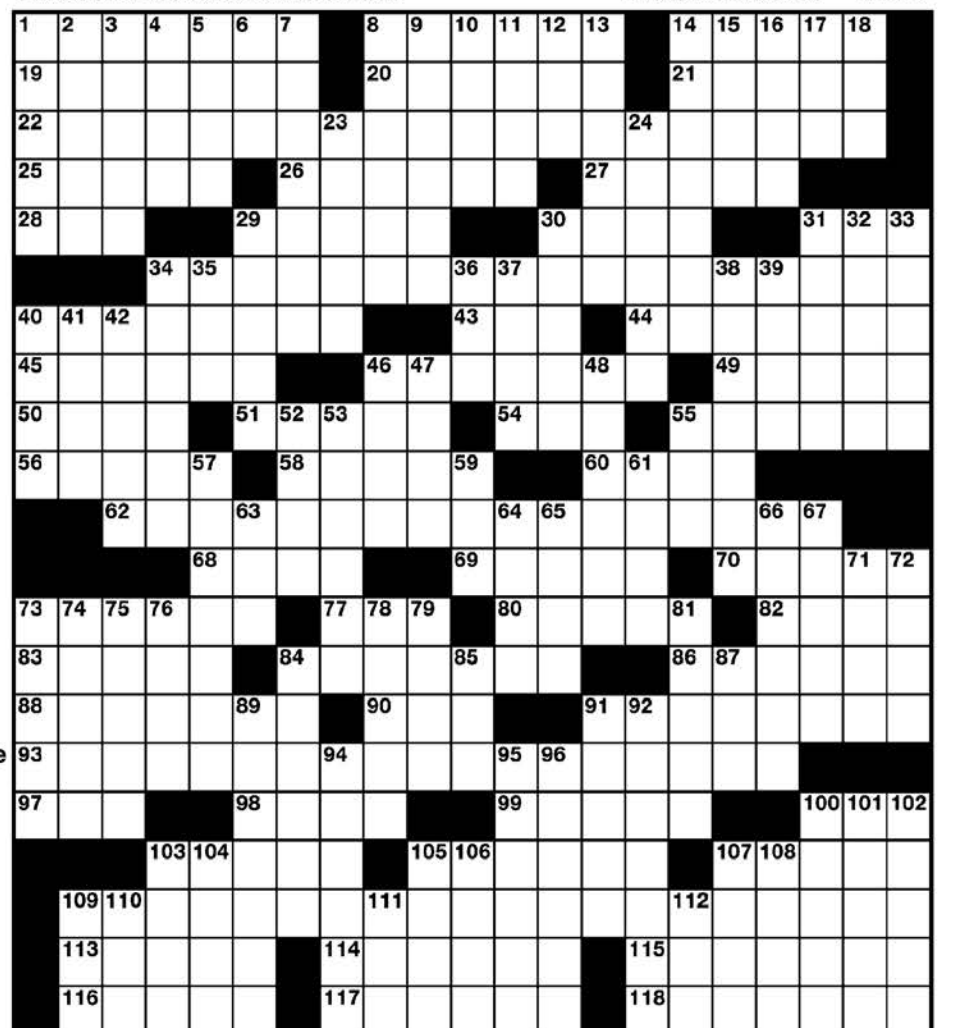

The City will be reallocating unused funds from the Business Assistance Program and Emergency Rental Assistance Program activities to the Homeless Assistance activity. The City anticipates the CDBG-CV Program to have \$206,447.88 in unused funds. The reallocated funds will provide for continuing homeless assistance to Norwalk's unsheltered neighbors.

Under the Citizen Participation Plan, reallocating funding to an activity triggers a substantial amendment to the Plan. What is USB-C, the charging socket that replaced Apple's Lightning cable?

Bye, Lightning cable. Hello, USB-C.

Apple is ditching its in-house iPhone charging plug and falling in line with the rest of the tech industry by adopting a more widely used connection standard. A big part of the reason is a European Union common charging rule that's coming soon for the 27-nation bloc.

Here's a look at the USB-C plug and what it means for consumers:

The first part of the acronym stands for Universal Serial Bus, and it replaces earlier versions of the USB cables used on everything from printers and hard drives to computer mice and Kindle readers.

The USB-C plug comes in a different shape than its predecessors — an elongated oval. It's also symmetrical and reversible, which eliminates one of the common gripes about previous versions like the

rectangular USB-A connectors because there's no wrong way to plug it in.

USB-C cables can carry more power so laptops can be charged faster, and they enable faster data transfer speeds, allowing a big trove of files to be copied from a computer to an external hard drive. At the same time, they can pump out a video signal to a monitor and supply power to connected accessories.

The USB-C connector also is designed to be future-proof. Its shape won't change but newer versions — and the devices they connect to — will come with upgraded capabilities. That means users will have to beware because older devices might not be able to support the latest specs.

It's also slimmer than boxy USB-A plugs, making them a better fit for newer devices that keep getting smaller.

Why is Apple using it?

Apple has long championed its proprietary Lightning connector for iPhones even though pretty much no one else used it. It resisted the EU's common charging push, citing worries that it would limit innovation and end up hurting consumers.

Apple held out even as others started adding USB-C connectors into their devices. But after the EU proposal won a key approval last year, the U.S. tech giant gave in and didn't look back.

A company executive unveiling the latest iPhone on Tuesday didn't even mention the Lightning cable as she introduced its replacement.

"USB-C has become a universally accepted standard so we're bringing USB-C to iPhone 15," said Kaiann Drance, vice president of iPhone product marketing.

She said USB-C has "been built into Apple products for years" and can now be used on MacBooks, iPads, iPhones and AirPods.

What role did Europe play?

Apple's shift is an example of how European Union regulations often end up rippling around the world — what's known as the "Brussels effect" — as companies decide it's easier to comply than make different products for different regions.

The EU spent more than a decade cajoling the tech industry into adopting a common charging standard. The push to impose rules for a uniform cable are part of the bloc's wider effort to make products sold in the EU more sustainable and cut down on electronic waste.

The EU's common charging rule won't actually take effect until fall 2024. It covers phones, tablets, e-readers, earbuds, digital cameras, headphones and headsets, handheld video game consoles, keyboards and mice, portable speakers and navigation devices.

It also standardizes fast-charging technology and gives consumers the right to choose whether to buy new devices with or without a charger.

Norwalk man charged with murder

NORWALK - A Norwalk man was charged today with killing two people and injuring others in a DUI crash on the 605 Freeway.

Alex Barragan (dob 8/27/86) faces two counts of murder and one count each of driving under the influence of alcohol within 10 years of another DUI offense and driving with a .08 percent blood alcohol content causing injury within 10 years of another DUI offense.

Arrestment was scheduled for Wednesday at Los Angeles County Superior Court, Bellflower Branch.

On July 16, Barragan was allegedly driving his car on the freeway near Alondra Boulevard when he rear-ended a disabled van, prosecutors said. The van erupted in flames and two people died and three others were injured, prosecutors added.

If convicted as charged, Barragan faces a possible maximum sentence of 44 years to life in state prison. Bail is set at more than \$2.29 million.

The case remains under investigation by the California Highway Patrol, Santa Fe Springs Area.

Whittier high school teachers travel to Poland for living history experience

Educators spent a week studying the Holocaust and World War II.

WHITTIER — Three Whittier Union history teachers received an up-close look at living history when they participated in the Auschwitz Legacy Program, a one-week trip to Poland in July that included tours of the infamous Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp and the Warsaw Ghetto, as well as access to archives of letters and personal items saved from Holocaust victims during World War II.

John Bellanti of Whittier High School, Gena Arriola-Salas of Pioneer High School and MaryAnn Fajardo of Frontier High School joined a group of 30 educators and Holocaust researchers from across the United States as part of an education initiative created by the Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial Foundation to keep the memories of victims alive.

For Bellanti, Arriola-Salas and Fajardo — who all include WWII and the Holocaust in their lesson plans and have worked extensively with entities such as the Los Angeles Holocaust Museum, the United States Holocaust Museum and the Anti-Defamation League — the trip was educational. Each teacher discovered new information, such as the existence of the Ringelblum Archives, a collection of letters written by Jewish families in Warsaw that were hidden in milk cans and are now preserved at the Jewish

Historical Institute in Warsaw.

During the trip, the three teachers found themselves in areas and locales where Holocaust victims arrived, slept and washed up. At the Auschwitz Museum, seeing handprints on the walls and unused canisters of Zyklon B provided images that the teachers said will stay with them forever.

“I’ve been to Pearl Harbor and Normandy. I wanted to put myself in these situations because I want to be able to explain to my students the history as best as I can,” Bellanti said. “But this one will really be hard. It will be hard to teach these lessons without getting emotional. But you have to tell them, you have to teach the history.”

For Arriola-Salas, the tours were essential for her roles as a historian and teacher, but once inside — where she could see for herself how meticulous planning and technological innovation conspired to perpetrate horrendous crimes — she said she wondered if it was right to be able to view this history at all.

“I felt torn. I’ve waited all these years to finally come to the Auschwitz Museum, then I felt like, is it O.K. to be here?” Arriola-Salas said. “It’s not easy to describe what you see to those who have not seen it themselves. But that’s the goal of the Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial Foundation, to

preserve what’s there, not to rebuild or reinterpret. They are an amazing organization that wants to ensure students are learning these lessons.”

The teachers toured the Warsaw Ghetto extensively, an area where more than 450,000 Polish Jews were held before many were taken to concentration camps. The encampment was leveled by Nazis during the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising in 1943.

The tour group viewed the remaining segment of the iron wall and remnants of the ghetto, which is now mostly apartment complexes. The group also spent a day in Krakow touring centuries-old synagogues that were spared destruction by the Nazis.

“I was humbled by the trip, both personally and professionally,” said Fajardo, who traveled to Berlin in 2019 to meet with Holocaust survivors. “Visiting the camp was impactful. Just to see what you have been teaching for so many years and see it firsthand. It’s hard to put into words.”

As Bellanti, Arriola-Salas and Fajardo work to incorporate their experiences in their classroom lessons on WWII, they agree that the best possible outcome of their overseas trip is to teach their students to be good, kind and empathetic human beings who will stand up to those who employ hateful speech and seek to eliminate our personal freedoms.

One possible outcome of the trip abroad is a joint effort by Whittier Union and the Foundation to arrange for a virtual tour of Auschwitz-Birkenau for Whittier Union’s

Advanced Placement European History or World Civilization students, which aims to give students a better perspective of the history contained within its walls.

The trip also afforded Bellanti, Arriola-Salas and Fajardo the opportunity to meet with representatives of Holocaust museums in Los Angeles, Colorado and Michigan, which could lead to a series of professional development seminars with history teachers throughout the District.

“It is an honor to have three of our educators selected to travel with the Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial Foundation and participate in this indispensable yet heartbreaking journey,” Superintendent Dr. Monica Oviedo said. “The true beneficiaries will be Whittier Union students, who will gain tremendous knowledge and a unique perspective about the Holocaust. It is more important than ever that the lessons learned from World War II are passed on to a new generation, so that no one will ever forget what happened in the ghettos and concentration camps of Europe.”

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Federal judge rules DACA illegal

■ The Supreme Court is expected to make a final decision on the program's legalities.

While a federal judge on Wednesday declared illegal a revised version of a federal policy that prevents the deportation of hundreds of thousands of immigrants brought to the U.S. as children, he declined to order an immediate end to the program and the protections it offers to recipients.

U.S. District Judge Andrew Hanen agreed with Texas and eight other states suing to stop the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, or DACA, program. The judge's ruling was ultimately expected to be appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court, sending the

program's fate before the high court for a third time.

"While sympathetic to the predicament of DACA recipients and their families, this Court has expressed its concerns about the legality of the program for some time," Hanen wrote in his 40-page ruling. "The solution for these deficiencies lies with the legislature, not the executive or judicial branches. Congress, for any number of reasons, has decided not to pass DACA-like legislation ... The Executive Branch cannot usurp the power bestowed on Congress by the Constitution — even to fill a void."

Hanen's order extended the current injunction that had been in place against DACA, which barred the government from approving any new applications, but left the program intact for existing recipients during the

ongoing legal review.

Hanen also declined a request by the states to order the program's end within two years. Hanen said his order does not require the federal government to take any actions against DACA recipients, who are known as "Dreamers."

Thomas Saenz, president and general counsel of the Mexican American Legal Defense and Educational Fund, or MALDEF, which is representing DACA recipients in the lawsuit, said it will ultimately be up to higher courts, including the Supreme Court, to rule on DACA's legality and whether Texas proved it had been harmed by the program.

"Judge Hanen has consistently erred in resolving both of these issues, and today's ruling is more of the same flawed analysis. We look forward to continuing to defend the lawful and much-needed DACA program on review in higher courts," Saenz said.

The Biden administration criticized the judge's ruling.

"We are deeply disappointed in today's DACA ruling from the District Court in Southern Texas," press secretary Karine Jean-Pierre said in a statement Wednesday night. "... As we have long maintained, we disagree with the District Court's conclusion that DACA is unlawful, and will continue to defend this critical policy from legal challenges. While we do so, consistent with the court's order, DHS will continue to process renewals for current DACA recipients and DHS (the Department of Homeland Security) may continue to accept DACA applications."

The Texas Attorney General's Office, which represented the states in the lawsuit, and the U.S. Department of Justice, which represented the federal government, didn't immediately return emails or calls seeking comment.

The states have argued the Obama administration didn't have the authority to first create



the program in 2012 because it circumvented Congress.

In 2021, Hanen had declared the program illegal, ruling it had not been subject to public notice and comment periods required under the federal Administrative Procedures Act.

The Biden administration tried to satisfy Hanen's concerns with a new version of DACA that took effect in October 2022 and was subject to public comments as part of a formal rule-making process.

But Hanen, who was appointed by then-President George W. Bush in 2002, ruled the updated

version of DACA was still illegal as the Biden administration's new version was essentially the same as the old version, started under the Obama administration. Hanen had previously said DACA was unconstitutional.

Hanen also had previously ruled the states had standing to file their lawsuit because they had been harmed by the program.

The states have claimed they incur hundreds of millions of dollars in health care, education and other costs when immigrants are allowed to remain in the country illegally. The states that sued are Texas, Alabama,

Arkansas, Louisiana, Nebraska, South Carolina, West Virginia, Kansas and Mississippi.

Those defending the program — the federal government, the Mexican American Legal Defense and Educational Fund and the state of New Jersey — had argued the states failed to present evidence that any of the costs they allege they have incurred have been tied to DACA recipients. They also argued Congress has given the Department of Homeland Security the legal authority to set immigration enforcement policies.

English teacher promoted to VP

NORWALK — Cerritos College named Dr. Frank Mixson as Vice President/Assistant Superintendent of Academic Affairs.

Mixson was approved by the Board of Trustees at its June 21 board meeting and assumed his role on July 1. The college released a press release announcing his hiring Sept. 7.
