December was a busy month for the Chamber with Ribbon Cuttings and Ground Breakings. We started with a ground breaking at Coast Plaza Hospital for the new Behavioral Health Care Center. This new center is going to be a much needed addition to the residents of Norwalk and the surrounding communities. Coast Plaza CEO Patrick Rafferty welcomed the attendees to the event and provided an overview of the work that has taken place and what will be needed to finish the center. Norwalk Transit System began operations originally in 1974 and it serves the of City of Norwalk and surrounding communities of Artesia, Bellflower, Cerritos, El Monte, South El Monte, La Mirada, La Habra, Santa Fe Springs, Whittier and unincorporated areas of Los Angeles. Currently Norwalk Transit System operates a fleet of 34 buses, which include 21 CNG buses, 9 Gasoline/Electric Hybrid buses and four Battery Electric Buses. These four Battery Electric Buses will soon be placed into service in the current system. The Ribbon Cutting was held to celebrate the installation of bus charging stations in the transportation yard for these new buses. Speaking at the event were Mayor Jennifer Perez, Congresswoman Grace Napolitano and Executive Director of Regional Transportation, James C. Parker.

On Friday, December 17th, the City of Norwalk and the Norwalk Chamber welcomed Pick Up Stix to the Norwalk Fitness Village with a Ribbon Cutting event. The program began with Mayor Perez who welcomed everyone and shared some words about how important the business was to Norwalk. Then Steve Gratz, Senior Vice President of Pick Up Stix spoke on behalf of the restaurant. He introduced a number of key individuals for Pick Up Stix and how they came to open this store in Norwalk.
