October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month and we here in Norwalk are doing our part to promote, educate and support those that are battling this disease and all other cancers. And we invite you all to participate! We have City Leaders who are participating in "Los Angeles County Wears Pink", (formerly Real Men Wear Pink) while businesses and residents support the campaign by donating or purchasing from one of the restaurants who are participating with a fundraising night! Each of you can do your part to help by lighting the sky up with pink porch lights, pink ribbons on your trees or wearing your best pink clothes this month. Stay tuned for news from our leaders as they challenge others around the county to help raise funds for the fight. Look for canisters to put your change into as you shop local, because every penny helps! We work together to bring awareness of not only resources for fighting breast cancer, but fighting all cancers! Visit www.cancer.org if you need support as a fighter, survivor, or supporter. Our Kick Off event for National Breast Cancer Awareness Month was on Monday, October 3rd at Starbucks Restaurant. At this event we handed out canisters, provided information on resources and had great conversations about the importance of early detection.

As we head into National Breast Cancer Awareness Month, we want to remind you about the importance of getting your cancer screenings. Finding breast cancer early and getting state-of-the-art cancer treatment are two of the most important strategies for preventing deaths from breast cancer. Breast cancer that's found early, when it's small and has not spread, is easier to treat successfully. Getting regular screening tests is the most reliable way to find breast cancer early. The American Cancer Society has screening guidelines for women at average risk of breast cancer, and for those at high risk for breast cancer. When you follow the suggested screening timelines you can catch this disease in its early stages and that gives you a potentially better outcome from a cancer diagnosis. If you visit www.cancer.org the American Cancer Society has a timeline of when you should be screened for different cancers. Below you will find information about screenings for breast cancer.

#### Breast cancer

- Women between 40 and 44 have the option to start screening with a mammogram every year.
- Women 45 to 54 should get mammograms every year.
- Women 55 and older can switch to a mammogram every other year, or they can choose to continue yearly mammograms. Screening should continue as long as a woman is in good health and is expected to live at least 10 more years.
- All women should understand what to expect when getting a mammogram for breast cancer screening what the test can and cannot do.
- All women should be familiar with the known benefits, limitations, and potential harms linked to breast cancer screening.

Studies show that you can help reduce your risk of cancer by making healthy choices like eating right, staying active and not smoking. But they also show that it is important to follow recommended screening guidelines. This behavior can help detect certain cancers early and the earlier that cancer is detected the better the chance you have to have a positive outcome for survival.

One thing to remember is that men can get breast cancer also. While not as common as in women, it still happens. Aging is an important risk factor for the development of breast cancer in men. The risk of breast cancer goes up as a man ages. On average, men with breast cancer are about 72 years old when they are diagnosed. Possible symptoms of breast cancer to watch for include:

- A lump or swelling, which is often (but not always) painless
- Skin dimpling or puckering
- Nipple retraction (turning inward)
- Redness or scaling of the nipple or breast skin
- Discharge from the nipple

Similar guidelines and strategies for men to reduce the risk of getting cancer include maintaining a healthy weight, avoid or limit alcohol and be physically active.

As we get head into October, we encourage you all to light up your life with PINK! From pink porch lights, to pink ribbons on your trees and even pink hair, you can all promote the "LA County Wears Pink." There will be opportunities to participate in fundraising activities at our local restaurants, you can get a coin canister and put it on your desk at work and invite others to contribute or you can just encourage someone you know to take advantage of the resources provided by the American Cancer Society.

We are also holding different restaurant fund raising days during the month of October to help raise funds for breast cancer awareness and support. Restaurants taking part in this year's activities are Chick-fil-A, Mr. Rosewood Family Restaurant, Don's Teriyaki Grill, and So-Cal Pizza. You can view the different fundraising dates on the flyer that is included in this month's newsletter.
