ARTURO SANCHEZ SENIOR ANNUAL HALLOWEEN PARADE RETURNS TO NORWALK

On a cloudy day in October, after a two-year hiatus, the Arturo Sanchez Senior Halloween Parade returned for the 37th year. This parade is a collaboration between the Arturo Sanchez Senior Halloween Parade Foundation (ASSHPF) and the City of Norwalk. The parade was originally founded by Arturo Sanchez Senior, and the Sanchez Family continues to help bring the parade to the community each year. The ASSHPF was founded to help support the parade financially, but also to provide scholarship to local high school students. They raise money with different fundraisers each year to be able to provide those student scholarships. The ASSHPF is a 501(c)3 organization, approved by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) to accept donations for both the parade and the scholarship which are tax deductible to the extend allowed by law. This year the Grand Marshall for the parade was Elijhaa Penny, who recently became a free agent with the NFL after spending four years playing for the New York Giants. A graduate of Norwalk High School, he attended both Cerritos College and the University of Idaho before he was signed by the Arizona Cardinals. Elijhaa and his brother Rashaad (also an NFL player) founded the 2 Cents Family Foundation here in Norwalk in 2018 to provide recreational experiences and educational resources to children. The Foundation offers a football camp that teaches young players about sportsmanship, teamwork and hard work while incorporation mentorship from both Elijhaa and Rashaad.
