WHITTIER REGIONAL SYMPHONY PRESENTS A HOLIDAY EVENT

Whittier Regional Symphony partnered with "The Wiseguys Big Band Machine" on Friday, December 9th for an outstanding performance. Conductor Kimo Furumoto led the Symphony in a number of classic hits for the first part of the performance. They were then joined by "The Wiseguys Big Band Machine" for a joint performance. After the intermission "The Wiseguys Big Band Machine" closed down the show with some amazing songs from the Big Band era. President Fred Zermeno spoke on behalf of the Symphony, thanking all for attending and also for supporting the raffle fundraiser in the foyer. He also shared that they Symphony will be celebrating 90 years as an organization in 2023 and he is looking forward to what the celebratory year will bring. Here is some information about the Symphony and their mission and their goals.

The Whittier Regional Symphony performs four admission free classical music concerts each season at the Vic Lopez Auditorium at Whittier High School, Whittier Ave. in Whittier California. The concerts start at 3 PM, have one intermission, and are completed before 5 PM. Two concerts are held in the fall, and two in the spring.

Their Goals:

- To enrich the cultural life of the communities it serves.
- To expand the musical knowledge of youth and adults.

• For more than 20 years the Symphony has been sponsoring a **Music Education Program** which reaches 8,000 children each year. Three professional musicians present 45-minute performance demonstrations to 3rd, 4th and 5th graders throughout the Greater Whittier area.

• Each year the Symphony presents at least one special **Children's Concert** for 4th, 5th and 6th graders. The concerts are created especially for the young audience. Most of the youngsters enjoy the experience of hearing a live symphony orchestra for the first time. They also learn a bit about proper concert etiquette.

• The **Young Artists Competition** was established to give young musicians an opportunity to compete against one another and, in doing so, to be motivated towards musical excellence. The winners have the priceless opportunity of appearing as soloists with the orchestra.

• To provide an **outlet for the talents of the musicians through the performance of symphony music.** When the Conductor and Music Director selects the music for each concert, he must think not only of the audience but also the musicians. The compositions should be challenging to them. The performances give the musicians a chance to display their talents to a live audience; the conductor has an opportunity to inspire the musicians to perform to their full potential.

Many California cities will ring in 2023 by increasing their local minimum wage rates. Employers should confirm what cities their employees work in to determine if any minimum wage ordinances apply.

State Minimum Wage Reminder

Beginning January 1, 2023, the California state minimum wage will be \$15.50 per hour for all employers, regardless of size. This state minimum wage rate is also used to determine the salary threshold for the administrative, executive and professional exemptions - the threshold is two times the statewide minimum wage. This means, for 2023, you will need to ensure all exempt employees earn at least \$64,480 per year.

In jurisdictions without a local minimum wage ordinance or with a local wage rate that is lower than the California state minimum wage, the state minimum wage rate will apply.

2023 Local Minimum Wage Rate Increases for specific cities:

There are minimum wage increases for specific cities that are different than the State minimum wage increase. If your business is location in any of the following cities, check with the city on their specific increases: Belmont, Burlingame, Cupertino, Daly City, East Palo Alto, El Cerrito, Foster City, Half Moon Bay, Hayward, Los Altos, Menlo Park, Mountain View, Novato, Oakland, Palo Alto, Petaluma, Redwood City, Richmond, San Carlos, San Diego, San Jose, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Rosa, Sonoma, South San Francisco, Sunnyvale, and West Hollywood.

Notice/Posting Requirements

Each of the above local minimum wage ordinances have notice, posting and recordkeeping requirements. Failure to comply with these obligations may subject you to fines, penalties or even civil action. If you have any employees working in one of the above cities, ensure you comply with the applicable ordinance and that you post an updated poster in a conspicuous location at your business — such as a break room. You should provide a physical copy of the poster to your remote employees as well.
